The Healthy Chesapeake

Major Histocompatibility Complex and Autoimmune Disease in Dogs

The Major Histocompatibility Complex (MHC) can best be described as the “factory floor” of the immune system. The MHC is an area of the human, and canine genome, which has been identified to code for the creation of proteins that the immune system uses to distinguish between foreign and non-foreign bodies. All cells within the body are “tagged”, if you will, with “self” proteins produced by the MHC. Basically the way that both the human and canine immune system functions is that the T-cells of the immune system interact with the protein coat of any material they encounter in the body – it is the MHC that gives the body’s own cells the “secret password” that tells the T-cells this is a friend, not a foe to be destroyed.

These “friend or foe” protein markers are also called antigens. In humans, they are known as human leukocyte antigens (HLA) and in canines, Dog Leukocyte Antigens (DLA). When the T-cell encounters a material and determines that the antigen does not belong there – it will take steps to attack and kill the cells that are surrounded by the foreign protein. This is how the immune system kills bacteria and other microorganisms, which get into your dog’s body.

When a virus gets into the body, it hijacks the reproductive system of the cells it invades, forcing it to make duplicates of itself, and in effect changes the protein signature of the cell. This is how the immune system can identify cells, which have been infected by viruses, and attack them to try to stop the spread of the infection.

In humans it is the MHC that leads to rejection problems in organ transplant surgeries, and why transfusion of the “wrong” blood type can be fatal. Recently, protocols for both kidney and liver transplants in dogs have been developed. As such procedures gain more wide spread acceptability among practitioners- deeper understanding of the functionality of the MHC in tissue rejection will need to be explored and anti-rejection treatments expanded, as they have in humans. However, just as it is in humans, the most significant aspect of the Major Histocompatibility Complex to your dog’s health is the role the MHC plays in so-called autoimmune diseases.

What is an Autoimmune Disease?

An autoimmune disease is basically a condition where something “goes haywire” with those codes produced by the MHC, and the body starts treating “friends” as “foes” – and basically turns on itself. “Autoimmunity” literally means “immunity against self”. The symptoms of autoimmune disease are caused by the body mounting an immune response to antigens that would normally be recognized as “self.” Most autoimmune diseases in dogs, as well as in humans, have a genetic basis. It is believed that there is genetic variance in the MHC that causes the individual or dog to be more susceptible to an autoimmune reaction, and that various environmental factors from viruses, bacteria, and allergens, to toxins can set off that susceptibility. Veterinarians identify four major factors relevant to causes of autoimmune disease in dogs,

- Genetic predisposition
- Hormonal influence
- Viral Infections
- Stress

In dogs that may be predisposed to autoimmune reactions, common vaccines for canine disease such as distemper and parvo have been known to trigger the response. Certain regularly used canine drugs have also been associated with aggravating immune response blood disorders, such as the newer combination of monthly heartworm preventives. Keep in mind too, that any drug has the potential to cause immuno-related side effects in such susceptible individuals.

Because it is known that autoimmune diseases are linked to genetic predispositions in the MHC—this is yet another reason why potential dog owners of purebred dogs should only deal with respected and reputable breeders who are aware of, and employ breeding practices designed to limit genetic disorders.

The thyroid gland plays a key role in the immune system, and thyroid disease is one of the most common autoimmune diseases in dogs. Since proper thyroid function is critical to a healthy immune system, if the dog is susceptible to thyroid disease, by inference it is also likely susceptible to other autoimmune disorders. This is why genetic screening for thyroid disease can be used in healthy animals to determine their fitness for breeding.

The animal's blood is tested for the presence of antithyroid autoantibodies. Any dog that has such antibodies circulating in the bloodstream, could potentially develop thyroid disease, and/or be vulnerable to other autoimmune diseases because his or her immune system is compromised. Responsible dog breeders use thyroid prescreening as a very important tool for selecting good breeding stock.

Common Canine Autoimmune Diseases

As stated, Lymphocytic thyroiditis, is the most common MHC related autoimmune disease in dogs, and as such actually serves as a marker for susceptibility to a myriad of other autoimmune diseases. Some of these are:

- Autoimmune hemolytic anemia (AIHA),
- Immune-mediated thrombocytopenia (IMTP or ITP)
- Autoimmune thyroiditis (hypothyroidism)
- Hypoadrenocorticism (Addison's disease)
- Systemic lupus erythematosus (SLE):
- Rheumatoid Arthritis (RA)
- Myasthenia gravis

Other MHC Functions

It would be remiss in an article about the MHC and canines not to mention this interesting sidebar. Recent studies have shown that the MHC may form the scientific basis for the continuing anecdotal reports of dogs with the ability to "sniff out" cancer in humans. The olfactory ability of dogs is well documented. Dogs can identify chemicals diluted to parts per trillion in solutions. There have long been reports of dogs alerting owners to the presence of melanomas by constantly sniffing at a skin lesion. There have been several clinical studies published in respected medical journals that have tested and confirmed the ability of dogs to detect melanomas, bladder, breast, and lung cancers. Now, a recent study published in the journal *Medical Hypotheses*, indicates that anomalies in the MHC of the humans presenting with those cancers may be the mechanism for these dogs' remarkable diagnostic abilities.

It is known that human body odor is determined by the human leukocyte antigens (HLA) that are produced by the Major Histocompatibility Complex. The study concluded that "the volatile organic compounds produced by tumors, and detected by dogs, are products of MHC genes. These HLA molecules in humans have "soluble and detectable isoforms that are present in body fluids such as blood, urine and sweat, and there is a strong association between changes in HLA and cancers."

First Ever Independent ACC Tracking Test



This first ever independent ACC tracking test (not held with a NSS) came at the end of our local tracking season that started last December. We have had a tremendously successful tracking season with team after team passing in test after test. There has never been a season like this. We started out with nine TD entries, five tracks and four alternates. Our TDX began with ten entries, two tracks and eight alternates. I had passed both the TD with Zazzy and the TDX with Dazzle earlier in the season so I withdrew my entry to give tracks to others who needed the title. With so many dogs passing and withdrawing, we had three TD entries, no alternates. Because we had two extra TD tracks, we could add another TDX, giving us four TDX. As it worked out, every dog without a title was in the test, no more alternates. How great is that!

The story of the "good luck" chocolate cake. Another tracker began bringing chocolate cake to tracking tests and she would pass. She has a TCH now. So I brought a "good luck" chocolate cake to Zazzy's test. She was first alternate with ten tracks. She was able to get in. Good luck, number one, and she passed. Ten of the eleven entries passed. Then I brought a "good luck" chocolate cake to Dazzle's test. Four of the five TDX dogs passed, including Dazzle.



Really outstanding numbers. There have been "good luck" chocolate cakes brought to the rest of the tests with "good luck" in almost all of them, both TD and TDX tests. We had our "good luck" cake brought by the handler who passed with both her dogs, one TD and one TDX. Can't get any better "good luck" than that.

On Tuesday, February 23rd, our two wonderful judges, Sally Nesbitt from San Diego, and our ACC tracking judge Sally Diess from Oregon, went out into the fields to begin our test. It had rained a few days earlier, so the fields were damp and lush. The sky was clear and blue, the temperature cool with a slight breeze. Perfect tracking conditions. All three teams passed the TD first thing. Two of the four TDX entries passes, which is way above the national average for both tests.

(Editor's note: The national average success rate for passing at any level of a tracking test is 18%)

First pass for the TD was a Boxer. We all know Boxers can't track because of their pushed in noses. She took her handler for a drag along the entire test. So much for that myth. The second was a German Shepherd who also took her handler for a drag. This team drove from Utah to compete and "flew" home on the wings of success. The third team was a local club member with her young Golden who also has hunting titles. We all know you can't allow a hunting dog to track. Then they can't mark the birds. She had just come in third out of 20, mostly Labs, in a fun super singles marking test. So much for that myth.

The TDX is a much more difficult test and so much can go wrong. The first handler missed an article her dog indicated, but she didn't see. We are giving her glasses in her next test. The second missed the last turn, a real heart-breaker. So close. The third dog, an Australian Cattle Dog had a little distraction at the first turn. Her handler had patience and encouraged her. She then took him for a drag through the rest of the track. The fourth dog, an eleven-year old Golden is owned by the same handler who earned her TD in this test. She just trotted right along, wasted no energy looking for turns, to find those articles and that glove. It was such a thrill! This is the last test of our season; her handler would not go out of town for other tests. At her age it was probably her last chance to get that title. Now how great is that!



I have to say I had a super group of San Diego trackers who came out to spend two days laying tracks, cross-tracks, driving and helping everywhere. Mary Ellen Mazzola took her hospitality job very seriously and fed us all very well. My other committee members, chairman, Maurine Coleman, Charlene Cordiero, and Mark Walsh were there to cheer us on and do whatever needed to be done. I have to thank them all. A special thank you to our judge Sally Nesbitt who provided all the equipment, gave Sally Diess a place to stay, and held my hand through this all. Sally Diess, our other judge, gets a special thank you for coming from Oregon to give up three days to help us out.

I'm already planning next year's test. With our wonderful fields and judges I expect we may be getting more out-of-town people to enter. Any Chessie trackers out there keep us in mind next year and come on down to San Diego where the teams pass at an outstanding rate.

Agility Activities

First Chesapeake Bay Retriever TDX and Second MACH3

On November 12, 2010, Pan became the first Chesapeake Bay Retriever to finish the new "Triple Q Excellent" title in AKC Agility. The TQX requires qualifications in all three Excellent B classes (Standard, Jumpers with Weaves, and FAST) on the same day. The following day, November 13, Pan became the second Chesapeake Bay Retriever to finish the AKC Master Agility Championship 3. The MACH3 requires a total of 60 DoubleQs (qualifying in both Excellent B Standard and Jumpers with Weaves classes on the same day), and 2250 points which represent the number of seconds under Standard Course Time for each qualifying run. 2010 was Pan's final year of regular AKC and USDAA agility competition, and she retires as the top of her game at ten years old. In AKC Agility, Pan holds the Chesapeake Bay Retriever record for lifetime points of 5579. In the Top Dog rankings for CBRs, Pan achieved the #1 position four times and ranked in the top three all seven years that she competed at the Excellent-B level. She qualified for six AKC National Championships, and received five invitations to the AKC Agility Invitational. In USDAA agility, Pan earned two lifetime achievement awards, qualified for eight National Championships, and received a Top-Ten (all breed) award in 2009. Thank you to Kathy Luthy for breeding this miracle girl, who is the very definition of partner and companion. - Service to the community / the public in connection with the Chesapeake Bay Retriever as a breed, in competition, to owners / through rescue efforts.

JUDGING

Nominations will be evaluated on the criteria provided above. The names of the award winner(s), if any, will be announced prior to the annual American Chesapeake Club Meeting during the National Specialty Show. The formal presentation of any award will take place at the Specialty.

AKC DELEGATE'S REPORT

MARCH 2011 MEETING

The meeting began at 10 AM with introduction of the AKC Board and Officers.

A list of new delegates seated for this meeting was read and introduction was made of each one. Minutes of the December 2010 meeting were approved.

Chairman Ron Menaker reported on a new Lure Coursing title that is now open to all breeds & mixed breeds. It is called the AKC Coursing Ability Test. There is also a new Agility title-Preferred Agility Champion effective July 1, 2011 and it will be retroactive from that date as well. Requirements are 750 pts. and 20 double Q's.

President Dennis Sprung spoke to the 40,000 increase in "specials" in competition at conformation shows due to the Grand

Champion title. There is also an AKC Grand Champion title ranking system by AKC.

This is the website address to check on the rankings per breed/state. www.akc.org/grandchampionship

James Stevens, CFO, reviewed the 2010 financials. There was a 1M operating deficit among the 4 entities that are AKC (AKC/CAR/Humane Fund/PAC). The AKC portion lost \$413,000. There was an increase in web advertising and sponsorships. The largest decrease in revenue was again in registrations- 2.8M loss. Litters were down 12 % over 2009; dogs registered were down 13 % over 2009. The loss from events was 11.3M. This was the first year in the history of AKC that registration income could not subsidize event costs-there was a 3.5M short fall. Fortunately, investments and operating reserves had a good year so that help offset the losses in registration, publications, pedigrees, etc.

Lee Arnold, Chair of the Canine Health Foundation, released information on a new way to make donations to CHF. Dial 20222 on your cell phone and text DOG to make a \$5 donation to CHF.

Concern was expressed by various delegates regarding the moratorium on new club-specifically group and specialty clubs. The Board indicated that would act quickly on this.

Election was held for the 2015 Class of the AKC Board. Elected were: Steven Gladstone 223 votes; Robert Amen 230 votes; Carmen Battaglia 202 votes. 198 votes were needed for election.

The meeting adjourned at 12:00 pm

CODE OF ETHICS - AMERICAN CHESAPEAKE CLUB

Love / respect of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever is implicit in membership in the American Chesapeake Club. Therefore, all members agree to foster the goals set forth in the Code of Ethics.

I. RESPONSIBILITIES OF MEMBERS

- a) Read / familiarize yourself with the American Chesapeake Club Breed Standard for the Chesapeake Bay Retriever that is approved by the American Kennel Club. Support / abide by the rules of the American Chesapeake Club / The American Kennel Club.
- b) Appreciate the unique nature of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever / try to develop the characteristics that they have inherited through selective breeding (intelligence, desire to work / retrieve with style, love of water / keen swimming ability).
- c) Assume the responsibility of proper feeding, maintenance, health care, and training of all times.
- d) Always conduct yourself in a manner which will reflect credit on yourself / the breed. Refrain from public criticism or malicious denigrating of others or their dogs.
- e) Never knowingly sell or place a Chesapeake Bay Retriever with unethical persons or those who would not provide proper / humane care in the dog. Refuse to sell any Chesapeake Bay Retriever to any pet shop or to any wholesale dealer in dogs.
- f) Should you become aware of the mistreatment, abuse, or need for relocation of any Chesapeake Retrievers, make every effort to be of assistance by notifying the breeder of the dog involved, the appropriate local authorities / helping in any other way in which you are able.

II. RESPONSIBILITIES OF BREEDERS / BROOD BIRCH / STUDIOS (The American Chesapeake Club Board of Directors strongly recommends that only animals with current DFA / CERF / PRA clearances be used for breeding.)

- a) Do not breed Chesapeake Bay Retrievers that are not registered by the American Kennel Club or by breed clubs recognized by the American Kennel Club.
- b) Strive in each breeding to improve the breed according to the ACC Breed Standard. Carefully plan each breeding, breed on grounds of appropriate temperament, appearance / other desirable qualities.
- c) Be aware of genetic defects which can be harmful to the breed. When breeding endeavor to select animals that will reduce the incidence of genetic problems while enhancing the positive attributes / abilities of the breed. Be open with all persons interested in the welfare of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever / discuss possible physical or temperamental defects in your own stock.
- d) Do not breed any bitch who is not mature (never before the second heat) / in good health. Do not allow puppies to go to their new homes until at least 7 weeks of age.
- e) Act responsibly toward all puppies produced by your kennel bitch or stud dog for the lifetime of the puppies. (Recommend that the breeder encourage the owner to contact him if he can no longer keep a dog at any time in the dog's life.)
- f) Understand that written contracts are strongly recommended for all transactions, such as sales, guarantees, co-ownerships, breeding rights agreements, lease leases, club services, etc. Keep accurate records / pedigrees / give your owners registration papers as toward as soon as available.
- g) Use / promote the use of the American Kennel Club non-breeding registration as per quality puppies which are sold or placed by you.

Blanche Saunders-Forward! Say heel and jerk the leash! If the chicken lags, jerk forward, if the chicken gets distracted use a series of short snappy jerks. When you get to the other side cuff him before he sits and if the chicken sits crooked cuff it again.

Electric Collar Advocate: whenever the chicken does not cross the road I give it an electric shock. But do not worry, the shock is no more than you would feel if you walked on a carpet wearing socks and it does not bother the chicken at all. The feathers standing up and the smell of burning flesh mean nothing. In fact, they are happier having nice clear communication than they would be otherwise.


