National Field Trial Specialty 2011

On behalf of my Co-chair Lorraine Sarek, the rest of the Field Trial Committee, and Chesapeake enthusiasts throughout the Central Time Zone, I invite you to join us in the Virginia/Hibbing area of Northern Minnesota for the 2011 ACC Field Trial Specialty. The Specialty will be held on grounds that have hosted several recent National Amateur stakes. All-breed trials will be hosted on the same grounds by the Minnesota Iron Range Retriever Club (MIRRC) the two weekends preceding the Specialty. For those who arrive early, therefore, it will be possible to run three trials in 10 days without having to move. Given rising gasoline prices, it doesn't get much better than this. An all-breed trial following the Specialty will be held in Sauk Rapids, Minnesota (Central Minnesota Retriever Club), which is approximately three hours from Virginia/Hibbing.

In addition to "National-caliber" grounds, we have an excellent panel of judges, all of whom know and appreciate the breed. Information pertaining to entries, accommodations, meals, etc. is provided on the following pages. Virginia and Hibbing are located in the center of Northern Minnesota's Iron Range. This is a region rich in history, natural resources, and scenic beauty. For information pertaining to museums, historical sites, hiking/fishing, natural areas, etc., please see: ironrange.org. The weather in Minnesota at this time of year is generally warm-to-hot, although temperatures can drop into the 50s at night. Rain is a distinct possibility and there is a 100% chance of encountering Minnesota's state "bird", the mosquito, so bring plenty of bug spray.

The festivities will kick off Monday, August 1st, with an official meeting of the American Chesapeake Club. This meeting will be held at the Headquarters hotel and will be followed by a catered dinner. **PLEASE SIGN UP IN ADVANCE FOR THE MONDAY AND WEDNESDAY DINNERS** using the form below. Limited merchandise will be available for sale at the event. Your best bet is to order merchandise in advance using the form below and pick it up on Monday evening.

Running Order

The Dow Jones method will be used to establish starting numbers in all stakes. Judges will be authorized to impose a system of rotation in the Open and Amateur stakes.



Refunds

Scratches requested before the closing date should be made through Retriever Entry. After the close contact the Field Trial Secretary. Full refunds will be made for bitches in season or dogs that have been injured, provided that a veterinarian's certificate is provided. There will be a \$25.00 penalty for all other scratches, except that no-shows will not receive a refund. AKC Announces New Grand Championship Achievement Levels

Beginning May 11, 2011, concurrent with the implementation of the 2011-2012 AKC Point Schedule, AKC Grand Champions will now have the opportunity to become Bronze, Silver, Gold and Platinum Grand Champions. To obtain the Bronze level Grand Championship, a dog must achieve 100 Grand Championship points. Silver will be 200 and Gold 400 points earned while our ultimate Platinum level will require 800 Grand Championship points.

Upon reaching each level, AKC will mail special recognition medallions and certificates to the owner of record. To keep up-to-date with the competition, a new Top 100 All-Breed Grand Champions list will be featured at www.akc.org/grandchampionship. In addition, the online GCH Breed Lists will be expanded from the top 25 to 100 dogs including Bronze, Silver, Gold and Platinum level designations. We hope exhibitors will enjoy and embrace the newest enhancements to the Grand Championship program.

Grand Championship judging will not change with the introduction of the Achievement Levels. All Champions of Record entered in the Best of Breed/Variety competition will be eligible to compete for "GCh" points at all-breed, group and specialty shows at no additional entry fee. Points are awarded, at the judge's discretion, to the following placements: Best of Breed/Variety, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch.

After dogs have completed the initial Grand Championship title, points will continue to accumulate and the dog will be recognized upon reaching 100, 200, 400 and 800 points.

An American Retriever in Germany

A Dual-Purpose Chessie as a multi-purpose hunting and tracking dog in Germany.

We fell in love with Chesapeake Bay Retrievers the first time we saw them during our search for a hunting and family dog. In February 2006 Chili, Port West Chocolate Chili (sir: Galeforce Amazing Moses, dam: Ches-Shores Samy Delux) became part of our family.



As a real Chessie, Chili learns easily and loves to work. So she passed the companion dog test at 11 months and the "fall breed test" of the

Versatile Hunting Dog Movement, JGHV (Jagdgebrauchshundverband, a registered association) at 21 months. Part of this test is 'search with duck' and Chili got 11 of 12 points for this work in heavy reeds. The Chesapeake is unknown in Germany and the first question a judge asked me was: "Will the dog go into the reed?" After Chili's work there were no further questions about her hunting abilities.

We also showed Chili and she got both German Youth Champion titles (one from the VDH, the German Kennel Club, and one from the DRC, the German Retriever Club) and was the Youth Club Winner in 2006. In April 2008 Chili had 11 puppies fathered by Redlion's Hit Doctor.

In the following autumn Chili passed several hunting and tracking tests. The "Test after shooting (VPS)" with the following parts:

- Forest work with overnight blood tracking, rabbit drag and dense cover search.
- Water work with a search without duck and a blind retrieve (searching).
- Field work with a feathered game drag and a free search and retrieve of a planted dead game bird. During the whole test the retrieve of rabbit and feathered game is graded.
- Obedience: the dog's general behavior and obedience during the whole test, the obedience during drive hunt, heeling on and off leash and down stay with shooting. Chili got all possible points in this test and won the test. We had a great day.

Two weeks later Chili passed the 1000 meter (0.62m) overnight " Blood Tracking" (VSwP) with a first prize.

In December 2008 Chili was also successful in the "Retrieving Reliability Test" (BTR) with a fox.

In May 2009 Chili passed the blood tracking test on the 40 hours old track with a second prize. There were several thunderstorms with heavy rain during the two nights while the track was laying.

In July 2009 we participated in the "Geisenfelder Blood Tracking without accompaniment of a judge". This is a respected test in Germany like the special tracking test in Austria on which Julia Enz reported. This year the eight 'signs' were leaves of a beech with artificial holes. The only chance to find the green leaves on the forest ground



is a good tracking dog which refers to the leaves. With five referring-leaves Chili and I reached the dead deer in 23 minutes. Chili won the blood tracking and got the "Bronzene Siegel". She is now the only female Chesapeake in Germany with VSwP I/II and the 'Bronzene Siegel'.

In addition to her hunting career, Chili was shown in the adult classes. German Champion (VDH), German Champion with working title (DRC) and Club Champion with working title 2008 are the titles which Chili owns.

Chili is our first Chesapeake, always trained, handled and shown by Claudia Breitgoff. She is our hunting and tracking companion, beloved



member of our family and a great spokesman for this unknown breed in Germany. Since February 2009 she has been living with Ches-Shores Tala for Sea'nLand. (Chili_Tala.tif)

While UKC Novice and Open are very similar to the AKC classes; UKC Utility has some big differences. Here's a brief description of UKC Utility, and note the jumps are not in the ring until Directed Jumping at the end, when they are brought in by the stewards.

Signal exercise: – Basically identical to the AKC signal exercise.

Scent discrimination: Only 5 metal articles are used and the dog does not see the articles put out.

Directed marked retrieve: (Easiest to describe with a baseball analogy.) Handler stands at home plate. Steward puts gloves at first, second, and third. Judge tells handler which glove to retrieve.

Directed signal retrieve: Handler and dog see the steward replace the glove just retrieved. On order from the judge, the handler sends the dog away towards glove #2 at second base, and then stops the dog with a command to stop and sit in the middle of the ring at the pitcher's mound. The judge then tells handler which of the three gloves to retrieve. Think retriever baseball, very scaled down.

Consecutive recalls: The first recall is the same as the AKC drop on recall, but after the dog finishes the handler immediately tells the dog to wait, leaves the dog, goes to the other end of the ring, and does a straight recall.

Directed jumping – identical to AKC.

The United Utility Dog title requires the dog to qualify in Utility A or B at three different trials, but you may earn all three legs under the same judge. The dog must have earned a UCD and UCX before competing in Utility.

The United Obedience Champion Dog (UOCH) is earned by qualifying in both Open B and Utility B at five separate trials, with a combined score of 370 or higher. Additionally, the dog must earn 100 obedience championship points, with at least 30 from Open B and 20 from Utility B. The points are awarded on a scale from 1 point for a score of 170-174.5 up to 8 points for a score of 199-200. Points increase as the score increases.

In general, UKC jump heights are a bit lower than AKC, with lower jumps for Veterans (7 and older) and for certain breeds.

Rules and lots more information is available on the UKC website.

At least in my area, UKC shows are more laid-back than AKC, and I've found the scoring to be more generous. The only really new exercise was the directed signal retrieve. I first taught the signals to the three gloves from a stationary position, with Hannah sitting on the "pitcher's mound"

with me gradually moving back to "home plate." When she understood that, I just used my normal go out command to send her, and a very firm "SIT" to stop her half-way. I found that stopping her in the middle of that go-out didn't cause short go-outs in AKC trials. It was fun to teach a new exercise, and we are looking forward to some more UKC trials.



- Service to the community / the public in connection with the Chesapeake Bay Retriever as a breed, in competition, to owners / through rescue efforts.

JUDGING

Nominations will be evaluated on the criteria provided above. The names of the award winner(s), if any, will be announced prior to the annual American Chesapeake Club Meeting during the National Specialty Show. The formal presentation of any award will take place at the Specialty.

CODE OF ETHICS - AMERICAN CHESAPEAKE CLUB

Love / respect of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever is implicit in membership in the American Chesapeake Club. Therefore, all members agree to follow the guidelines in the Code of Ethics.

I. RESPONSIBILITIES OF MEMBERS

- a) Read / familiarize yourself with the American Chesapeake Club Breed Standard for the Chesapeake Bay Retriever that is approved by the American Kennel Club. Support / abide by the rules of the American Chesapeake Club / The American Kennel Club.
- b) Appreciate the unique value of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever / try to develop the characteristics that they have inherited through selective breeding (intelligence, desire to work / retrieve with style, love of water / keen swimming ability).
- c) Assume the responsibility of proper feeding, maintenance, health care, and training of all times.
- d) Always contact yourself in a manner which will reflect credit on yourself / the breed. Refrain from public criticism or malicious disparaging of others or their dogs.
- e) Never knowingly sell or place a Chesapeake Bay Retriever with unethical persons or those who would not provide proper / humane care in the dog. Refuse to sell any Chesapeake Bay Retriever to any pet shop or to any wholesale dealer in dogs.
- f) Should you become aware of the mistreatment, abuse, or need for relocation of any Chesapeake Retrievers, make every effort to be of assistance by notifying the breeder of the dog involved, the appropriate local authorities / helping in any other way in which you see able.

II. RESPONSIBILITIES OF BREEDERS / BROOD BIRCH / STUDIOS (The American Chesapeake Club Board of Directors strongly recommends that only animals with current DFA / CERF / PRA clearances be used for breeding.)

- a) Do not breed Chesapeake Bay Retrievers that are not registered by the American Kennel Club or by breed clubs recognized by the American Kennel Club.
- b) Strive in each breeding to improve the breed according to the ACC Breed Standard. Carefully plan each breeding, breed on grounds of appropriate temperament, appearance / other desirable qualities.
- c) Be aware of genetic defects which can be harmful to the breed. When breeding endeavor to select animals that will reduce the incidence of genetic problems while enhancing the positive attributes / abilities of the breed. Be open with all persons interested in the welfare of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever / discuss possible physical or temperamental defects in your own stock.
- d) Do not breed any bitch who is not mature (never before the second heat) / in good health. Do not allow puppies to go to their new homes until at least 7 weeks of age.
- e) Act responsibly toward all puppies produced by your kennel bitch or stud dog for the lifetime of the puppies. (Recommend that the breeder encourage the owner to contact him if he can no longer keep a dog at any time in the dog's life.)
- f) Understand that written contracts are strongly recommended for all transactions, such as sales, purchases, co-ownerships, breeding rights agreements, lease leases, club services, etc. Keep accurate records / pedigrees / give your owners registration papers as toward as soon as available.
- g) Use / promote the use of the American Kennel Club non-breeding registration to get quality puppies which are sold or placed by you.


