

THE ACC AND RETRIEVER FIELD HISTORY

"Retriever Club Chronicles" is a recurring series (compiled and edited by Mark Koenig) that appears in "Retriever News" (the magazine that lists the calendar, results and of course ads for all things in the field trial and hunt test world.) The inaugural article highlights the first three retriever clubs to become AKC member clubs – The Labrador Club in 1931, the American Chesapeake Club in 1934 and the Midwest Field Trail Club in 1935. Yes, re-read that! The ACC is the second oldest retriever trial club in AKC history! Dyane Baldwin has written an excellent history of the ACC and its importance, not only in the field trial arena but in the world of working retrievers. The American Chesapeake Club

The Chesapeake Bay retriever has been recognized by the American Kennel Club since 1878 when "Sunday" was the first Chesapeake granted AKC registration. In 1918 the American Chesapeake Club was founded in Albert Lea, MN, with 14 members. When this approval was granted, the ACC became the first AKC recognized parent club devoted to a retrieving breed. The first president was Earl Henry of Albert Lea who in his day was known as the "Chesapeake King." The club maintained its own stud book for a while and held its first AKC specialty show exclusively for the breed in 1926; its first AKC specialty FT in 1932.

It has always been of prime importance to the club and Chesapeake fanciers that the dogs remain true to their purpose - a working gun dog with a love of cold water. The American Chesapeake Club was one of the prime promoters of the early AKC field trials from their inception. The club was responsible for making water retrieving part of the field competitions. Tony Bliss, ACC president during the 30's, was one of the driving forces in the development and promotion of these early field trials. He wrote tirelessly about this "new sport" in the sporting magazines and publications of the day. The first field champion was a Chesapeake FC Skipper Bob and the first Dual Ch was also one DC Sodak's Gypsy Prince. The club's leading role in supporting working events continued with the Hunt Test program which started in 1985. The club hosted its first approved AKC Hunt Test in May 1986. In the early years of the program, there were few clubs qualified under AKC's system to hold tests. The ACC ran tests all over the country to foster interest in the hunting test program. The club's tests were often the training ground for many clubs to achieve AKC approval to hold licensed tests on their own.

The club has its own unique regional director program across the US (and in Europe and elsewhere) to put on "Chesapeake Days." These days are geared toward giving Chesapeake owners and their dogs' introduction to retrieving, birds, obedience, conformation and to cultivate a spirit of camaraderie among Chesapeake owners. The club started its WD and WDX programs in 1973. In 1984, the club added the more challenging WDQ title which incorporated triples and land and water blinds.

Today the club membership numbers roughly 900 to 1000 members from across the US, Canada and overseas. It has been active in issues affecting the health of the breed and participates in OFA's CHIC program. It has funded research that has resulted in genetic testing for PRA, EIC and DM. The club is also justifiably proud that the breed is the only retrieving breed to still be able to crown Dual champions. The words of Tony Bliss penned in 1933 still resonant today: "Our primary purpose is to promote field trials to such an extent as to forever prevent bench shows from fashioning and spoiling the Chesapeake Bay retriever."

“Mean Seeds:” A Threat to Your Sporting Dog?

The following article is reprinted with permission from AKC Canine Health Foundation and was published in CHF's “Discoveries” Issue 36, Spring 2011. Though the ACC did not fund this grant due to it being fully funded already, our breed will benefit from this research.

Whether you own a retriever, setter, a pointing or spaniel breed, a beagle or one of the coonhound breeds, they all have one thing in common: they are canine athletes bred to perform specific task in what can be a very harsh environment. Your sporting dog may be one that competes in field performance events or is used for hunting or both. You have invested many dollars in training, feeding and veterinary care for your dog, because he/she is worth it, he/she is your hunting companion. He/she provides countless hours of dedicated service to you as you pursue your hunting passion. And nothing can ruin your day or hunting season like when your dog is injured or becomes sick.

The AKC Canine Health Foundation, the non-profit world leader in funding sound canine health research, has allocated more than \$450,000 over the last several years to investigate prevention, treatment and cures for injuries that occur in the field. More than ten grants have been funded to study anterior and cruciate ligament rupture and nearly twenty grants have been funded to study various infectious diseases that threaten our sporting dogs including ehrlichia, bartonella, brucellosis, leishmaniasis and leptospirosis, among others.

The most recent grant to benefit sporting dogs investigates “mean seeds” and the role they play in grass awn migration disease. In the sporting dog world, there is a perception among owners that there has been a dramatic escalation in the incidence of grass awn migration disease in the last 20 years.

Grasses occur in a single large plant family that contains approximately 11,000 species (Chapman 1996). Although the grasses share many important characteristics of their reproductive structures, only a portion of the species have awns and an even smaller group possess barbed awns of the type of concern to dogs. The awn is part of the sheath that encloses the grass “seed.” The awns extend beyond the seed and those with barbs aid in dispersal of the seeds. One of the ways the seeds disperse is by attaching to things that come into contact with them. Animals and their fur are important ways grass seeds get transported to new locations. From an ecological standpoint, the attachment of grass seeds to sporting dogs is an important natural process. From the perspective of dogs and their owners, it is a dangerous threat. (AKC Canine Health Foundation Grant Application)

The barbed grass awns, or “mean seeds,” attach to a dogs coat and pierce the skin or are ingested or inhaled. Once in a dog’s body, these mean seeds tend to migrate, leaving a trail of infection behind. These infections cause illness that is difficult to diagnose, and can even be fatal.

It is suspected that the increase of grass awn migration disease is due to inclusion of problem grasses such as Canadian Wild Rye and Virginia Rye in the approved lists for Conservation Reserve Program

(CRP) lands. The CRP was first described in the 1985 Farm Bill and it has been reauthorized in each subsequent Farm Bill. The first land was enrolled in 1986. The most important feature of CRP is to encourage farmers to convert their marginal cropland acreage to perennial vegetation that will protect the land from wind and water erosion (Farm Service Agency 2010). In addition to the protection against erosion, hunters and sportsman have seen the favorable response from wildlife to the CRP habitat improvements. In a large number of contracts the perennial vegetation planted consists of a mixture of grasses. Country wide there are more than 31 million acres in active CPR contracts in 2010 (Farm Service Agency 2010). (AKC Canine Health Foundation Grant Application)

David Hopkins, AKC Delegate for the English Springer Spaniel Field Trial Club of Illinois and Chair of the Delegate Field Trial and Hunting Test Committee was instrumental in bringing this concern to the attention of the AKC Canine Health Foundation’s grants committee. Mr. Hopkins worked with Dr. William Lauenroth of the University of Wyoming and principal investigator for the study to submit the application to the AKC Canine Health Foundation.

The primary goal of the study is to determine the frequency with which these barbed seeds are planted, so that sporting dog owners and field trialers can begin discussions with the US Department of Agriculture to modify their recommended list of grasses to be planted on CRP lands.

Dr. Lauenroth stated, “If it can be determined that there has been a dramatic increase in both the incidence of the disease and the quantity of barbed seeds planted in CRP lands, such determination would surely factor significantly into improvements in veterinary diagnostic and treatment protocols, overall education for dog owners, and preventative or remedial measures for the U.S. Department of Agriculture’s approach to CRP plantings.”

This important research has been sponsored by the Golden Retriever Foundation, English Springer Spaniel Field Trial Association, English Springer Spaniel Field Trial Association Foundation, National Amateur Retriever Club, Labrador Retriever Club, Spinone Club of America, German Shorthaired Pointer Club of America Boykin Spaniel Society and the AKC Humane Fund.

OBJECTIVE - The ACC Lifetime Achievement Award is given to an individual who has made significant contributions to the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed / the people who own them through outstanding leadership / advancement of knowledge / understanding.

ELIGIBILITY - The ACC Lifetime Achievement Award recognizes personal achievement / its positive impact on the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed. The award may be given to any individual independent of specific institutional affiliation with the American Chesapeake Club or other organizations.

The ACC Lifetime Achievement Award is not an annual award. The awards selection committee may decide not to make any awards selection in a given year or may decide to bestow multiple awards. The number / frequency of award selection is strictly at the discretion of the awards selection committee.

Nominations may be submitted by organizations or individuals, including the nominees themselves.

AWARDS CRITERIA - Nominees are judged by the originality, vision, breadth, / impact of the entire body of their work. Candidate selection must go beyond mere name recognition / reputation. A nominee's work is evaluated in such areas as:

- A strong / well-documented commitment to the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed.
- Vocal / written advocacy of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed today.
- Advancement of best practices in owning, training, competing, rescuing / breeding Chesapeake Bay Retrievers.
- Service to the community / the public in connection with the Chesapeake Bay Retriever as a breed, in competition, to owners / through rescue efforts.

JUDGING - Nominations will be evaluated on the criteria provided above. The names of the award winner(s), if any, will be announced prior to the annual American Chesapeake Club Meeting during the National Specialty Show. The formal presentation of any award will take place at the Specialty.

NOMINATION REQUIREMENTS - There is no entry fee for the Lifetime Achievement Award. Nominations should be mailed directly to:

3. A detailed description of how the nominee meets the awards criteria Visual aids supportive of the nomination should not exceed four. If they are smaller than 8.5" x 11", they must be mounted on sheets that size.

The following signed statement must be included within the nomination: "I understand that the contents of this entry become the property of the American Chesapeake Club / will not be returned. I further understand that American Chesapeake Club shall have the right to make all text / photos, if any, available for publication without compensation, real or implied, / without claim by nominees against the awards selection committee, American Chesapeake Club or its staff, or individual American Chesapeake Club members."

We need volunteers and we will be sending out a Blast E-mail asking for volunteers and providing contact information.
