On the Cover

UNBELIEVABLE! After a drought of about 6 years, we now have a male Chessie Field Champion! — the only one now living! On October 16, 2011, Colonial Outer Banks WinChester won the Open at the Maryland Retriever Club's Fall Trial. Since this was his second Open win, he surpassed the points necessary for the FC title.

Chester was whelped on June 24, 2006, out of CH Westwind's Colonial Starfire*** QAA WDQ MH, and by Westwind's Colonial Rimfire QAA ***. Star had 5 All Age points and was the winner of the 2004 Open at the ACC National. (Star's full sister Lopy earned FC/AFC.) LB had 29 All Age Points. He had his Amateur win and needed 2 points to complete his Amateur title and needed an Open win to complete his FC; unfortunately he passed 4 days prior to his 8th birthday. This cross has proven to be very successful since it has produced 5 All Age Qualified dogs, with Chester as their first FC, and I believe that this line will continue to produce more excellent puppies.

From the start WinChester has been one surprise after another. I was looking for a female puppy from some bloodlines I had worked with more than 20 years ago from Eloise Heller Cherry and Les & Nancy Lowenthal (Ironwood Stone E. Cubs x Berteleda's Ready or Not), but I could not find one without a long wait. I finally found Mike Coutu and his bloodlines that came close to what I was looking for. Unfortunately, he only had one male puppy left, and Mike was reluctant to sell him due to an injury that mom had accidentally inflicted to his elbow. But my wife persisted, and WinChester came home.

Chester showed promise right from the start. He loved his early training, but it didn't take long before it became apparent he needed to be force fetched. A local friend of mine, Johnny Melton, had been training retrievers and wanted to work with Chester. Johnny said he "knew he had it even from such a young age when he came to the line and looked way out to see where things were." WinChester excelled, so we continued to train him with another local friend, Chris Locklear, who professionally trains retrievers in Laurinburg, NC (Locked and Loaded Retrievers). At the time, Chris focused only on hunt tests, so we entered Chester in Junior, Senior and Master Hunt tests, which he passed without any difficulty. All these tests were done locally as Chris did not want to travel at the time.

Since Chester was not yet two years old when he earned MH, I asked Chris to try him in Derby stakes. Chris agreed to take WinChester to the closer trials. Once again, Chester showed promise, and placed in one of the two Derbys with Chris.

By now, Mike Coutu was wishing he had this dog back! He even came to train with Chris so he could keep an eye on Chester, and ended up leaving a few dogs with Chris for training. We did everything short of begging Chris to take Chester on the field trial circuits, but he did not want to travel and leave his wife and new son at home. Mike continued

So Mike recommended that Dave & Mark Mosher take WinChester to Maine to see what they thought of him. (Not to mention the fact that he would be closer to Mike!) Mark and Dave, of course, were impressed as well, and have done an extremely good job taking Chester to the top. In the fall of 2008 at a little over 2 years old, Chester had earned 1 Qualifying point and 3 JAM's. He was now ready to run with the "big dogs."

Mark and Dave kept telling me that WinChester was "doing the work" and it was just a matter of time. Three months after his 3rd birthday, Chester earned Reserve Jam at the 2009 Specialty in September, and an Open Jam at Long Island in October, 2009, while Mike got a JAM and a 4th place with him in other

amateur stakes. Then Mark & Dave let Chester come home for 2 months "vacation" to hunt with me in the winter!

I was thrilled when Mark called telling me that WinChester had earned the best thing that we could get on the way to an FC — the Open Win at South Jersey on April 17, 2010! He now had 5 points toward FC and ½ point toward AFC at age 3 years 10 months.

But during Chester's "winter vacation" in 2010-2011, we noticed that he was limping after heavy work, and the NC Vet School confirmed that he had a broken ankle due to his hard-charging and exciting water entries. A steel plate would be required, which would have to be removed before Chester could return to his work. So we reluctantly decided that he should not go back to Maine, but only run a limited schedule in 2011. Mike Coutu as the breeder, desperately wanted Chester to continue, and offered to run him in a few trials, where he continued to do well and place in spite of the injury.

At the end of the fall season for Mike, he called to recommend that Chester go back to the Mosher's for just one month as Chester was doing well, and he felt that Chester would benefit from an extra month's trials. Wow, was Mike ever right about that! At the second trial with Mark Mosher, Chester won to finish his Field Champion title at 5 years, 4 months with 11 points!

Now that Chester has FC in front of his name, we hope to add CH to it for a Dual Championship because we believe in Chessies with brains and beauty both. (He will begin working on it in 2012.) Since Chester also has 3 points toward an AFC title, he will continue to pursue it on a limited schedule also.

I give all the credit to Mike Coutu, Johnny Melton, Chris Locklear, and Dave & Mark Mosher for bringing out the best in Chester and for keeping Chester excited and eager to please. Thanks to them, WinChester is now the only living male Field Champion — **WAY TO GO, CHESTER!**

It all started in 1988 when Bob and wife Wendy bought their first Chesapeake Bay Retriever: Canvasback's Gun Powder Lady MH CDX WDG QAA. Bob knew from then on that it would only be Chessies for him. Over the past 23 years Bob and his family (especially Wendy and youngest daughter Katie) owned and trained several Chessies including Canvasback Gimme The Flier MH WDG QAA (Open placements, high point Derby Chessie in 1996 and top Open Chessie female in 2001) and Canvasback South Bay Souvenir MH, WDG, **. During his field trial/hunt test career Bob worked with several clubs including The American Chesapeake Club, Talbot Retriever Club, and Maryland Retriever Club. The one thing that Bob loved to do more than run his Chessies was to shoot the fliers. In 2001 he was inducted into the Retriever Field Trial Gunners Guild and that year he had the opportunity to live gun at the National Open Championship held in Cheraw SC. Bob always had a Chessie by his side, that was the way he would want everyone to remember him.

Tales from the Field

The Chukar Challenge

One evening, I was checking email. The secretary of the local retriever club had forwarded me an invitation from the local upland bird dog club, The Arctic Bird Dog Association, inviting people and their dogs, to a Chukar Challenge. The Challenge was open to all breeds. I thought that this sounds interesting, so I call the contact to find out what the deal is and based on the information provided; decide to enter one of my Chessies, Tazlina or Tazzy. Tazzy is an accomplished upland bird hunter, possessing an extremely keen nose.

A little bit of background is pertinent. A number of years ago, my friend and fellow Chessie fancier from Lewiston, ID, James Mauney, invited me to go upland bird hunting. The result of which was that I switched from waterfowl enthusiast to upland bird enthusiast. The Chessies switched also, loving it all, birds was what they care about. This event, the Chukar Challenge, is an upland bird hunting test, complete with, you guessed it, chukars.

So we show up at the appointed date and just prior to lunch time. We kind of stood out. I am underdressed (dirty blue jeans and a t-shirt) and under-gunned for the event. We have entered the world according to Orvis complete with expensive and fancy side by sides (I don't own one), fancy khakis, fancy shooting vests, and Ruffed Grouse Society pins and emblems. There are pointers, setters, and spaniels. There is now a Chessie (who is blonde and beautiful), the only retriever present. We are rather out of place.

Never one to be self-conscious and being hungry, I avail myself of the very nice lunch spread, which was a nice touch. People trickle in from the test, sit down, eat their sandwiches, and make their acquaintance. Conversation ensues. It went something like this

"A Chessie, huh?"

"Yes a Chessie."

One gentleman says. "You must be a waterfowl enthusiast".

"Well, no in fact, I am an upland bird hunter. "

Dead silence suddenly pervades the lunch group.

The question on everybody's mind, having very high opinions of their setters, pointers, and spaniels, which nobody had the audacity to ask, these being gentlemen, was "What are you doing with a Chesapeake if you really like upland bird hunting"?

Well, they were about to find out.

A number of the competitors, in discussing the morning's experience with their dogs, lamented that they had only been able to find one of the three birds. Four gentlemen in fact, had the same experience, and came to the conclusion, that "It must be field", "There was something odd with that field".

Sometime after lunch we were called, as it was now our turn. The rules of the test were explained. Three chukars are planted in a field; you and the dog have 20 minutes to find the birds. Now this is Alaska, the term 'field' is a misnomer. This is an approximately 50 yard swath

of land that has been cleared of forest, and now has had the brush which has grown up mowed. The 'field' is surrounded by thick spruce forest.

The dog is scored a number of ways. The dog gets a certain amount of points for finding the bird, retrieving the bird, delivery of the bird, how many shots it takes to get the birds, and if you finish under the 20 minutes. There may be other criteria, but I have forgotten.



Anyhow, the judge explains all this and I said fine, let's go. The stopwatch starts. We start out, Tazzy quartering the field, working like she does for pheasants. She is not quite sure what the gig is, these surroundings being new for upland birds, but there is a gun involved so something must be up. It isn't very long before she starts getting chukar scent from previous contestants. OK, she says there are birds here. Ooh boy, and it is only July. We work are way back and forth with the wind at our back, and all of sudden she reverses course and heads back to a thick patch of lupine. I know a bird is going to come up, and the flush is beautiful. Bam! The chukar lands in a thicket in the forest. She quickly retrieves. Now she is really amped up, this is a hunt, she has had a flush and a retrieve, there are birds, and we are out to kill them. The tail is wagging nonstop, the enthusiasm is intense, she is hunting and hunting hard. The next one comes up out of pile of brush, he did not like that brown nose being stuck on himself, bam!, another retrieve out of the forest. Eight minutes used up and one chukar to go. Chukar number 3 again flushes beautifully, bam! and falls in the thick forest. Our hunt is over in 12 minutes, more points. Tazzy has achieved the maximum possible score. The judge exclaims, "This is a really nice dog". Yes, she is and she has one helluva of a nose. On our way back, Tazzy flushes chukar #4, one that a previous participant's nose obviously missed, I ask if she is entitled to more points, no.

Over the years, James and I have hunted our Chessies together. The dogs have always found birds if there were birds to find. James lives where he gets a 4 month season and has been extremely successful with his Chessies. So, I never had a frame of reference as to how our Chessies compared to other dogs when it came to upland birds. My suspicions were that they were very good. Now, that has been confirmed. Our Chessies can hold their own against any breed when it comes to bird hunting.

The Chessie, my blonde Tazzy, won the Chukar Challenge. I was called the next day by one of the officers of the club to inform me of this, and the gentleman suggested that I should get a springer spaniel. A frigging springer! Yeah, right, I was very polite and did not say, that he ought to get a Chessie and then he could really get some birds, I just said that I really like the nose on my Chessie girl and that she amply demonstrated that now didn't she?

Tazzy represented her breed very well and I am very proud of her.

- Vocal / written advocacy of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed today.
- Advancement of best practices in owning, training, competing, rescuing / breeding Chesapeake Bay Retrievers.
- Service to the community / the public in connection with the Chesapeake Bay Retriever as a breed, in competition, to owners / through rescue efforts.

JUDGING

Nominations will be evaluated on the criteria provided above. The names of the award winner(s), if any, will be announced prior to the annual American Chesapeake Club Meeting during the National Specialty Show. The formal presentation of any award will take place at the Specialty.

Discussion items:

The current duties of the Electronics Committee were discussed. The board requested John Martin take back a request to the ECC for the committee to discuss and provide a list of what they feel their duties include. John was also asked to emphasize to the committee members that the list moderators are the only ones who can publish reprimands if they feel there have been list violations.

Membership in the Master National Retriever Club - 2011-12 Dues \$50.00. Motion 11:21 was passed below. This year delegate is George Marthinuss

AKC announces a change for the upcoming 2011 AKC National Obedience Invitational Awards/Prizes. To celebrate the 75th Anniversary of Obedience, for the first time ever AKC is offering clubs and members of the Fancy the opportunity to sponsor some of the awards and prizes for the 2011 National Obedience Invitational (NOI). All sponsorships will be published on the AKC website and in the commemorative 75th Anniversary NOI catalog. Ann Jeffcoat will check to see if there are any breed specific awards being offered and report back to the board.

Upcoming ACC Dues renewals - Motion 11:22 below was passed for approval of the hard copy of the dues renewal form. The Board agreed the Secretary and DC would be responsible for sending out all dues renewal and for providing the online dues renewal form.

Discussion on the new updated Bulletin Submission Guideline was deferred giving all board members an opportunity to review the guidelines. An online vote will be taken the week of August 25th. Once the guidelines are approved they will be published in the Bulletin and will also be available on the ACC website.

Discussion on Audrey Austin, Southern CA RD to hold an ACC TD, TDX, Agility Test for Southern CA in 2012 --Approx TD/TDX expenses: judge's airfare --around \$450. No grounds fees, no judges' fees, secretary fee -\$125, port a potty, I think \$150, hospitality around \$50, ribbons \$30, workers gifts, \$50. Income: \$550. Motion 10:23 below.

Also possibility of a Southern CA RD VST expenses: judge's airfare -\$450, ribbons \$30, judge's fee \$65. Income \$300.

Discussion on AKC registration information, new titles of record, stud book info, etc. - Deferred

The duties of the DC's job description was discussed. The president reminded the board of the past motion (number 10:62) assigning the duties for all ACC mailings to the DC. He reminded the board of this motion since the upcoming election and the question being raised as to who would do the mailing of the ballots.

Copies of the 2011 Election Ballots and Ballot Instruction sheet were provided to the Board. Whether or not the Ballot should list all names (even those names for positions not being contested) was discussed and it was determined all names should be listed as this is what was done in the past. The ballot and instruction sheet were approved by the Board.

There was a discussion on who should do the mailings of the ballots for the upcoming election - Motion 11:24 was passed determining that the mailing must be done by an outside party.

As mentioned above the Secretary again let the Board know that she would most likely go with Bear Associates since they could handle the entire process.

Illustrated Standard - Discussion and comments - Discussion of the Illustrated Standard was deferred due to it being unfinished at this time, however motion 10:25 below was made and passed establishing a deadline for the finished product to be presented to the board.

Lack of response from ACC mentors to breed survey for an article for Dogs In Review - Board member and chairperson of the JBEC, Ann

Jeffcoat will send a note to all mentors reminding them that these request fall under their mentoring responsibilities and encouraging them to respond in the future.

National Parent Club Canine Health Conference being held on Aug. 12-14 - Several attempts had been made to find a representative to attend the Conference without any success.

The request for donations by the SAR 2011 Tribute for Dog Heroes of September 11th: A Tribute to America's Search and Rescue Dogs was discussed and deferred until more information on the agency could be acquired.

There was a discussion about the ACC Data Coordinator and/or Secretary providing the ACC Treasurer and others with a current copy of the ACC roster in Excel format including phone numbers and e-mail addresses. It was brought up that the ACC Treasurer already has this information from last year's renewals and all new members list. Also brought up that all members currently have a hard copy of this information in the form of the ACC Directory and all new members are published in the ACC Bulletin. One Board member shared a concern that by providing any member with a soft copy of all member information it would make that information very easy to share and puts the members at risk for receiving unwanted e-mails and other correspondence. A motion was made about providing this information but had to be deferred due to the person making the motion being unavailable for further discussion.

REGISTRATION FEE INCREASE

A price increase of \$10.00 from \$20.00 to \$30.00 was approved for dog registration and transfer fees. The fee for the silver and gold packages will be maintained at the current price. The price printed on existing forms will be honored until April 30, 2012 for dog registrations only. The grandfathering will not apply to transfers.

FEES FOR CO-OWNERSHIPS

The Board also approved a \$10 fee for each additional owner added to the dog during the original registration of the dog and any subsequent transfers, effective January 1, 2012. A dog may be registered with one Primary Owner at no additional cost. Co-owned dam owners registering members of the litter to the litter owners will be exempt from this additional fee. Each additional owner will receive an e-mail copy of the AKC registration certificate. The copy will be clearly marked COPY, will not display the certificate issue date, and will not have the transfer form on the back. Old applications will be grandfathered until April 30, 2012.

4-to-6 MONTH BEGINNER PUPPY COMPETITION

Regulations for the 4 to 6 Month Beginner Puppy Class Competition with an effective date of July 1, 2012. were approved.

OPEN SHOW

Regulations were approved for the Open Show with an effective date of July 1, 2012.

AKC Owner/Handler Series

The Board approved the AKC Owner/Handler Series, effective January 1, 2012.

BEST OWNER/HANDLER COMPETITION PROCEDURE GUIDE

The Owner/Handler competition is conducted following Best of Breed judging in each breed ring. Dogs handled by professional handlers are not eligible to compete. Eligible dogs that are entered in BOB competition are identified by an asterisks (*) in the stewards book and the catalog.

JUDGE AND RING STEWARD PROCEDURAL GUIDE (FOLLOW PUBLISHED ORDER)

1. All dogs in the BOB competition (including WD & WB) are to stay in the ring after the judge makes their placements in BOB competition.
2. The ring steward asks all professional handlers to leave the ring.
3. The ring steward confirms the dogs remaining in the ring are eligible using the steward's book or catalog markings.
4. The judge is to then select the Best Owner Handler (BOH).
 - a. *If the BOB is eligible they are automatically BOH.*
 - b. *If BOB is ineligible and BOS is eligible excuse all dogs of the same sex as BOS and choose BOH from the remaining dogs.*
 - c. *If both BOB & BOS are ineligible and Select Dog & Select Bitch are both eligible, the judge is to choose BOH from the Selects and eligible WD or WB.*
 - d. *If one of the Selects is eligible excuse all dogs of the same sex and the judge chooses BOH from the remaining dogs of the opposite sex including the eligible WD or WB.*
 - e. *If BOB, BOS, SD and SB are not eligible the judge may choose any eligible dog remaining in the ring.*

- e) Never knowingly sell or place a Chesapeake Bay Retriever with unethical persons or those who would not provide proper / humane care in the dog. Refuse to sell any Chesapeake Bay Retriever to any pet shop or to any wholesale dealer in dogs.
- f) Should you become aware of the mistreatment, abuse, or need for relocation of any Chesapeake Retrievers, make every effort in line of assistance by notifying the breeder of the dog involved, the appropriate local authorities / helping in any other way in which you are able.

II. RESPONSIBILITIES OF BREEDERS / BROOD BIRCH / STUD DOGS (The American Chesapeake Club Breed of Standards strongly recommends that only animals with current DNA / CERF / PRA clearance be used for breeding.)

- a) Do not breed Chesapeake Bay Retrievers that are not registered by the American Kennel Club or by breed clubs recognized by the American Kennel Club.
- b) Strive in each breeding to improve the breed according to the ACC Breed Standard. Carefully plan each breeding, breed on grounds of appropriate temperament, appearance / other desirable qualities.
- c) Be aware of genetic defects which can be harmful to the breed. When breeding, endeavor to select animals that will reduce the incidence of genetic problems while enhancing the positive attributes / abilities of the breed. Be open with all persons interested in the welfare of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever / discuss possible physical or temperamental defects in your own stock.
- d) Do not breed any bitch who is not mature (never before the second heat) / in good health. Do not allow puppies to go to their new homes until at least 7 weeks of age.
- e) Act responsibly toward all puppies produced by your breed club or stud dog for the lifetime of the puppies. (It is recommended that the breeder encourage the owner to contact him if he can no longer keep a dog of any time in the dog's life.)
- f) Understand that written contracts are strongly recommended for all transactions, such as sales, guarantees, co-ownerships, breeding rights agreements, bitch leases, stud services, etc. Keep accurate records / pedigrees / give your owners registration papers as toward as soon as possible.
- g) Use / promote the use of the American Kennel Club run-breeding registration as per quality puppies which are sold or placed by you.

Annual Dues Notice

About ACC Dues and the Renewal Process

The Bylaws state, in Article 4, A, (3) Dues, Fees and Assessments:

(a) Each member must pay, within the time and on the conditions set by the Board, the dues, fees, and assessments in amounts to be fixed from time to time by the board, provided however that amounts of any fees or assessments must be approved by the membership. Actual membership dues shall not exceed \$60.00 for individual membership and shall be determined by the Board. In any year when the Board has not acted to change the dues by August 15, the dues for the closing year shall continue in effect for following year. The board is authorized, in its discretion, to set the dues for household membership at an amount less than twice the dues for one individual membership.

(b) During the month of October, a dues notice shall be sent to each member for the ensuing fiscal year. Dues shall be payable on or before January 1.

(c) Applications for membership voted for acceptance after September 30 of a given year, shall be considered paid for the following year.

Therefore, if your renewal is not received by January 1st, your membership expires and you must reapply.

If your renewal is not **RECEIVED** by January 1st, you will not receive the Jan/Feb Bulletin.

If your renewal is not **RECEIVED** by January 31st, your membership will expire; you will not appear in the new Membership Directory; and you will have to go through the application process from scratch.

ACC Dues Notices will be sent out during the month of October; **HOWEVER**, failure of the Post Office to deliver the notice to you does **NOT** absolve you of your obligation to pay your dues on time. This is **YOUR** responsibility to see that your dues payments arrive prior to January 1st! We'll even take this opportunity to remind you that January 1st is a **HOLIDAY** and there is no normal mail delivery that day. If your check arrives on January 2nd, you will not receive the Jan/Feb Bulletin.

Again, this year you may pay your dues by Visa, MasterCard, Discover or American Express credit card.

Just fill in the required information at the bottom of the renewal form. **PLEASE** do not forget to include the three or four digit Card Security Code (CSC) when paying by credit card. You will also be able to pay your dues online with PayPal. Just go to renewal.amchessieclub.org and follow the instructions.

Individual membership is \$35; Household membership (2 persons residing at the same address) is \$50; Canadian members **ADD** \$13 for postage; all other foreign members **ADD** \$25 for postage.

Checks and Money Orders **MUST** be payable in U.S. funds and be drawn on a U.S. bank. **NOTE: CANADIAN POSTAL MONEY ORDERS** are not drawn on a U.S. bank and are **NOT** acceptable. Please include a self-addressed, stamped post card if you wish acknowledgement of your payment and send your renewal (do **NOT** send mail that must be signed for) to:
