Five Chesapeakes Compete in the 2011 AKC Agility Invitational

On December 17 & 18, 2011, five Chesapeake Bay Retrievers and their human partners met in Orlando FL to represent CBRs at the sixth annual AKC Agility Invitational. The Conformation Invitational and the Obedience Invitational were right next door along with AKCs "Meet the Breeds" and the Eukanuba Dock Diving. Two competition rings with sod were setup for Agility at one end of the enormous Orange County Convention Center with bleacher seating on all four sides. The Agility Invitational competition consists of four preliminary rounds with the highest cumulative scoring dogs competing in a final round for the

Championship. Total all-breed competitors in the 20" and 24" jump height groups were 101 and 107, respectively. Only one dog of each breed can pass into the final round in each height group, and for the first time two Chesapeakes won spots into the final round in the 20" height group (Inde and Lynda Barber-Wiltse) and the 24" height group (Yogi and Karen Shaffer). Yogi also earned the Highest in Breed award and finished 9th in the 24" final round, while Inde finished 6th in the 20" final round. Congratulations to our two finalists and all participants for representing Chesapeake Bay Retrievers so well.

Although I received an invitation to this event every year with at least one of my Chesapeakes, this was our first opportunity to attend. Yogi and I had an amazing experience our first time participating in a competition at this level. Saturday we arrived without no expectations, never anticipating what was about to unfold. I was nervous prior to the first round, but amazingly we finished with a clean run. Later that afternoon I was very pleased when we had a second clean round. While checking the results, it was then that I noticed our cumulative score, and that somehow Yogi and I were ranked 20th in a field of 107. Considering that Yogi and I are a fairly green team, I hadn't expected to break the top half. Sunday was even more surprising when we had a third clean round, and a subsequent ranking of 12th. It was then that I realized that we might qualify for the final round, and I started getting excited and very nervous. The fourth round found us with another clean run and a final ranking of 7th! It was so much more than I could have imagined accomplishing, and I was so very proud of Yogi. In the final round we incurred our first fault of the weekend, but it was overall a nice run and Yogi did everything I asked of him. He is an amazing teammate and thinks this game is a lot of fun. The overall experience was very positive. The weather was wonderfully sunny and warm. There were some problems with the ring footing, but the event staff did the best they could to resolve the problem and fortunately Yogi had very little difficulty. I would like to express my thanks for all the support and

encouragement Yogi and I received from other Chesapeake fanciers, even though agility may not be their chosen venue of competition. The phone calls, e-mails and messages were much appreciated. vacation by visiting Larry's family in LA along the way. Larry's adult daughters, Tina and Alice, joined us for the trip to FL and

we rented a two bedroom condominium less than five miles from the Invitational event. We went to SeaWorld and other nearby attractions. Inde and Lynda had a blast! Inde remembered her dock diving lessons from last year and got to swim in the Atlantic Ocean at New Smyrna. We returned home four days later for a good roll in the fresh Alaskan snow.

The Invitational competition weekend started with crate setup and a non-scored, optional FAST "warm up" on Friday afternoon. The four-round competition began Saturday morning at 5:45 a.m. with course walkthroughs and general briefing. For the East Coast Boys, this was early morning. For Alaskans Inde and me, this was 1:45 a.m.! We don't run agility at that time! Get up and get ready to hunt ducks – yes, but not think and run Excellent level agility courses! Thankfully, we had almost a week to acclimate to the East Coast Time Zone! Inde gave me a funny look each morning when I fed her breakfast! It was a GREAT showing for Chesapeakes! At the end of the two-day four-round competition, Inde finished 12th out of 101 dogs competing in the 20-inch jump height, earning a spot into the final round, where we finished 6th. The Second Independent American Chesapeake Club Tracking Test

On Wednesday, February 22, 2012, the ACC held its second tracking dog, tracking dog excellent test at Otay Mesa, San Diego, CA. The sky was brilliant blue, the grass was tall, lush and green, the moon, stars, and planets were all aligned, and the breeze was light. The traditional "good luck" chocolate cake was set on the table and brought all its good luck to the competitors. The perfect day for a perfect test. We held three TD test with two passes and



four TDX tests with an unheard of four passes! You can't get much better than this. This is far above the national averages of passes. If you want to pass a tracking test, come to Southern California in the winter. This was our last tracking test for the season. We let the rattlesnakes own the fields in the spring and summer.

Our own Chesapeake person, Sally Diess, and our local Sally Nesbitt judged for us a second year. They laid beautiful tracks in lush field and were kind and supportive of all us nervous handlers. The smelly tracklayers, nice clean cross tracklayers, the pole carriers, and drivers gave up two days of their busy lives to work. A tracking test cannot happen without a crew of dedicated tracking loving folks. Our secretary, the Magnificent Marla Cook, was there with all her paperwork and organization. This couldn't happen without her either. Mark Walsh kindly chaired the event so I could enter and run my dog. Mary Ellen Mazzola, Maureen Coleman, and Jan Toby rounded up the ACC committee to cheer us on.

The first dog to pass the TD was a black Standard Poodle, CH Alamode Zipp'n to Runwuick CD, RE, OA, OAJ, NF, PR1 with her co-owner handling and her owner trailing behind with the judges. After one quick look back at the start to check that everyone was coming, Zippy lived up to her name and zipped through her track. The second pass was a Rhodesian Ridgeback, Orangewoods Mtn Spirit at Old Ranch, pulling her 82 year old owner at a good pace. She had no trouble finding her glove. It was beautiful.

After waiting the allotted time to age the tracks, the TDX test began with a bang. A Rottweiler, Arwen Von Brink CD, GN, RE, HSAS, AX, OAJ, TD kept her handler moving, making turns, picking up articles, all the way to the glove. Track two was

run by a Basset Hound, CH Bugle Bay's Sin City Cuppa Joe TD. His owner drove from Las Vegas, NV. to have the thrill of passing with flying colors. We had one alternate track and a lovely white Boxer, Snow Angel Monique, VCD1, RE ran a perfect track with her owner/handler. There are not many Boxers that can add those TDX letters behind their names.

I drew track three. At 11:17 in the morning, the sun came out to heat us up. The judges said to take my time, drink water, give Zazzy water on the track if I needed. "We don't want you passing out from the heat." Zazzy was ready to rock and roll coming out of the car. She never noticed the temperature. I had to calm her down to put her harness on. At the start flag, she took off like a



shot dragging me behind. She made her six turns without a hitch. At the second of the three roads she had to cross, she stopped long enough to take a drink and let me take a much needed one. Tracking is

thirsty work. When she found her first article, she picked it up and spit it out for me to retrieve. She couldn't take the time to come back. At her second article, she glanced back at me, "here it is, pick it up." And off she went. I didn't see the cross tracks and neither did Zazzy. She was going too fast to notice them. I thought the 845 yards we ran would never end. But they did as Zazzy dashed up to the glove, and brought it proudly back to me just fifteen minutes after the start. I was so thrilled, happy, and relieved! We did it and we did it at the ACC trial, the only Chesapeake representing the breed. I am still flying high.

Back at home base, we celebrated with sandwiches and the now traditional "Good Luck" chocolate cake. It was truly good luck with all these wonderful dogs and handlers passing so well.

The trophies are awarded annually to members of the American Chesapeake Club. (Historical notes are from the May/June, 1996 ACC Bulletin.) The winners of the ACC perpetual trophies for field trial accomplishments in 2011 are as follows:

FC/AFC/CFC Nelgard's Baron CD Trophy. Awarded annually to the Chesapeake of an ACC member that earns the most points in AKC licensed and member Open competition. The trophy was donated by Mrs. Walter S. Heller and was first awarded in 1963. Winner: **FC Colonial Outer Banks Winchester MH** owned by Michael Nelson

DC/AFC Tigers' Cub CD Memorial Trophy. Awarded annually to the amateur handler whose Chesapeake earned the most points in AKC licensed and member Open and Amateur competition. (The Open points must be earned by an amateur handler.) The trophy was donated to the ACC by Eloise Cherry in 1979 in memory of her dog Tiger's Cub. Winner: **Linda Harger**

DC/AFC Mount Joy's Mallard Trophy. Awarded annually to the Chesapeake owned by an ACC member that earns the most points in AKC licensed and member Amateur competition. The trophy was donated by Mrs. E. C. Fleishmann and was first awarded in 1962. Winner: **Yakity's Shake Rattle 'N' Roll** owned by Linda Harger and Tom Ivey

CH Storm Cloud CD Trophy. Awarded annually to the Chesapeake owned by an ACC member that earns the most points in AKC licensed and member field trial Amateur competition in the West Coast states and Idaho. The trophy was donated by Eloise Heller in 1966. Winner: **Yakity's Shake Rattle 'N' Roll** owned by Linda Harger and Tom Ivey

FC Tiger of Clipper City Trophy. Awarded to the Chesapeake owned by an ACC member that earns the most points during the year in AKC licensed and member Qualifying competition. The trophy was first awarded in 1961. Winner: **Colonial Spring Fever** owned by John Gullickson

FC/AFC Meg's Pattie O'Rourke Trophy. Awarded annually to the Chesapeake owned by an ACC member that earns the most points in AKC licensed and member Derby competition. The trophy was first awarded in 1961. Winner: **Sundog's Venus Rising Ablase** owned by Todd Adams

The Louis Traung Trophy. Awarded annually to the Chesapeake owned by an ACC member that earns the most points in AKC licensed and member field trial Derby competition in the West Coast states and Idaho. The trophy was donated to the ACC in 1962 by Mrs. Louis Traung and was originally a West Coast only trophy. Idaho was later added when several dogs were sold to Idaho residents who were supposed to trial them. This note is in a letter from Eloise Cherry that was received by the ACC many years later. 


