## First Chesapeake VCD4

Chesapeake First! On April 7, 2012 **UCDX CT Eastern Waters' Sea Zephyr, VCD4, RE, NF, WD, CGC** finished his UDX to become the first Chesapeake to earn the VCD4 designation from the AKC.

A Versatile Companion Dog title (VCD) is a derived title that requires a dog to title in Obedience, Standard and Jumpers Agility and in Tracking. The number designation indicates the level that the dog has titled at. The lowest level is a VCD1. Only a VCCH (Versatile Companion Champion) is a higher level than a VCD4. To earn a VCD1 a dog must have earned a CD in Obedience, its NA & NAJ (or NAP & NJP) in Agility and a TD in Tracking. For a VCD2 the dog must earn a CDX in obedience, in agility an OA & OAJ (OAP and OJP) and a TD. To earn the VCD3 a dog needs a UD in obedience, in agility an AX and AXJ (AXP and AJP) and a TDX in tracking. For the VCD4 the dog must earn a UDX in obedience, MX & MXJ (MXP & MJP) in agility and a VST. A VCCH dog has earned its OTCH in obedience, MACH in agility and a CT in tracking.

For a dog to earn a VCD title at any level is an accomplishment. But the higher the level, the more amazing it is. It takes a remarkable dog to reach the highest levels of the VCD program. According to the AKC, as of March of 2012 only 18 dogs of any breed have ever earned the VCD4 title. Zephyr is the 19<sup>th</sup> dog to do so. To earn his VCD4, Zephyr had to earn 16 titles (4 in each of the venues that the VCD is derived from). He truly is a remarkable dog!

The VCD4 title requires a dog to work consistently at the highest levels of competition. While the VST title requires only one pass to earn it, it generally takes several attempts to pass a test. The pass rate at each test is very low, quite often with no passes. As of mid-April of 2012 there have been fewer than 325 dogs of any breed to earn a VST. Of those, FOUR are Chesapeakes! The other titles – UDX, MX and MXJ require 10 passes (or legs) to title. The UDX Obedience title is earned



by qualifying on the same day in both the Open and Utility classes at 10 different trials. To earn a MX or MXJ leg, the dog must run the course perfectly. No mistakes or time faults are allowed.

Zephyr earned the first title needed for a VCD title with his TD in September 2006 at 15 months old. The rest of the titles needed for the VCD1 title took a bit longer as our dogs don't jump at full height in training until they are 2 years old. He ran in his first agility trial in late 2008. His VCD1 was earned in March of 2009 when he finished his Novice Agility Jumpers title, his VCD2 was earned in October of 2009 when he finished his Open Agility title, and his VCD3 was awarded in June of 2010 when he earned his Agility Excellent title.

We've had a great time working on this title. Zephyr and I have traveled all over the Country, from CT to CO to NC and most of the places



in between. We've met, trained and competed with many wonderful people and made a lot of friends. Along the way Zephyr was the first Chesapeake to have ever made it into the AKC National Tracking Invitational. Zephyr not only ran in the test, but also passed! He is one of the very few who have ever done so. He has earned multiple High in Trials and High Combined in Obedience. He's beaten a few Border Collies for placements in the 24" agility classes, which for a dog that outweighs the competition by 30 or 40 lbs. is pretty decent.

I've been asked which I thought was the hardest of the 4 venues to title in. I would have to say that the hardest would be whatever one is the last title that you need to earn your VCD4. For us that was the UDX. Walking into that second class of the day, usually Open, was always nerve wracking because first you had to get through the individual exercises and then the dreaded out of sight stays! Often with hours in-between classes! Luckily for me, if he was going to miss an exercise I usually knew before the stays that we hadn't made it that day. Zephyr would probably tell you that the hardest venue for him to finish in is obedience. His first love (after the field) is tracking. He loves agility and has fun in obedience.

Zephyr isn't done yet. He is half way to his MACH (Master Agility CH) and his JH, which was put on hold until he earned that UDX, as well as part way to his Obedience Master title. He gets to go back out and play in the field again, run in agility and, if this fall we are still having fun, we'll play in the Obedience and Rally rings again.

Z and I could not have done this without the help and support of my wonderful husband, Gary who has laid almost as many tracks as we've run, built and hauled agility equipment and been judge, steward and "as big a distraction" as possible for us while training in obedience. We've had wonderful trainers and mentors in many of our venues and of course we've had our own cadre of angels watching us from above – Joanne K., Janet H., and Millie B. As always our thanks go out to Betsy & Rupe Humer for breeding this incredible boy and letting us have him.

Thanks for owning us Zephyr, you are the best!

# 2012 Tennessee Chessie Fun Day

# The Healthy Chesapeake

## DIABETIC ALERT DOG

Bravo was born in McCammom, ID on December 2, 2005; I received him as a gift from Steve and Sharon Parker of Sunshine Kennels early in 2006. I didn't plan for him to remain with me; I had another home already lined up for him when he turned two. I had trained and competed with Labs and simply wanted to see if my training practices had advanced enough to train a Chesapeake Bay Retriever. I had no clue that when this brown bundle of fur came into my home that my life was about to become forever changed.

As a pup Bravo was a funny little joker, full of joy and happily bringing laughter to whatever situation we were in. Before he was a year old I exposed him to as many new experiences as I could. Bravo had \*heart\* and he always tried. He occasionally made wrong choices, but as long as he put forth effort and tried I was happy. Working with him, I realized that Chessies are not for everyone and that they are definitely not for a novice trainer!

At 12 months of age Bravo passed the tests and became a registered Delta Therapy Dog. We volunteered at Aspen Ridge Rehabilitation Hospital working one on one with a therapist and patient. Bravo took people for walks, pulled wheelchairs and played all sorts of retriever

games. We would help stroke victims practice speech by having them give him commands, other times he would lay quietly as patients re-learned to move their limbs to pet or brush him. People will often do things with and for therapy animals that they won't do for their Doctors or nurses.

His registered name is Fetch Express Bravo Zula SH, CDX, RN, NAJ. He also jammed a Qualifying stake at the only AKC Field Trial I entered him in. He is an accomplished dock jumper with a personal best of 23' 7" in Big Air (broad jump) and 6' 10" in super vertical (high jump). Bravo has twice been nominated for the AKC ACE award (Award for Canine Excellence) in 2010 and 2011.

In 2011 Bravo won the K9 Hero of the Year Award at the Soldier Hollow Sheepdog Classic in Utah. He was also in a Cabela's commercial and he is the Cover Dog of the 2012 Cabela's Lab calendar. (Yes, a Chessie is the cover dog - I am not sure if Cabela's knows that or not, LOL!)

Bravo is also my hunting partner; he is a fantastic waterfowl and upland hunting dog. He has more ribbons, medals and plaques than

I have wall space for. While all of this is amazing and shows what an incredible dog he is, there is one more skill that I would gladly trade every ribbon, medal, and plaque for. You see, Bravo is also my Diabetic Alert Dog (DAD).

I am a Type 1 Diabetic with hypoglycemic unawareness. My pancreas does not produce enough insulin and I do not realize it when my blood glucose drops too low. Bravo alerts me to my low levels as well as my highs. He first alerts me that there is a change happening; I then I ask "What is it?" and he either waves a paw at me for high blood glucose or he bows for low blood glucose. Bravo has allowed me to remain active doing the things that I love.

While Bravo has brought hope and comfort to me, he has also brought hope to others with diabetes. People see him in action and become driven to improve their own lives with a trained DAD dog. He helps teach both the diabetic and their family how to properly handle dogs. He also alerts the

family if \*their\* blood glucose is too high or too low. Bravo has alerted countless people with diabetes in elevators, in airplanes, at sporting venues and in Doctors' offices. Basically anywhere there are people; Bravos' nose is at work.

At a recent Diabetic Alert Dog Conference, Bravo was working with a teenage diabetic while I was instructing a class. This young man is anxiously awaiting his own Diabetic Alert Dog but is currently on a waiting list. Suddenly, Bravo began alerting him that his blood glucose was getting low. He quickly got his meter and checked his blood; it confirmed the beginning stages of a low blood sugar. A dangerous low was avoided for this young man.

This is HUGE in the life of a diabetic! With tears in their eyes his parents came up and said "That is the most incredible thing we have ever seen! We know that when we get our own dog that will be common, but this moment with Bravo will always be special for our son and for us - he gave us our first real time alert to a low blood sugar."



Bravo also helps me train other dogs to perform this much needed service through playful competition and the goal of being first to inform the diabetic of a low sugar. He misses very few low or high blood sugars on me and he is a wonderful example for other dogs to learn from.

Bravo's alerting has caused us to be disqualified in a few competitions, but I truly don't care. He has proven that his number one job is to tell me when my blood sugars are off no matter what he is doing or where he is. The "nose" knows, and he tends to be about 15 to 30 minutes ahead of the blood glucose meter, 30 to 45 minutes ahead of a continuous blood glucose monitor.

Here are just a few of his more memorable alerts from the last year - I was judging an AKC test in OR and Bravo alerted to me from over 400 yards away. While out hunting, he refused to retrieve downed birds until I fixed my blood glucose. Bravo alerted while we were receiving an award at the Soldier Hollow Sheep Dog Classic. While running an agility course, he suddenly stopped, came across in front of me, and would not let me move because my blood glucose had dropped dangerously low. Another time Bravo was inside the house while I was out doing yard work when my blood glucose dropped rapidly. He could not get to me, so using his nose he raised the window a bit farther and pushed out the screen. He then ran to me and alerted. There has not

been a day in the last few years that he has not had to alert, and he averages five alerts a day.

His story is a testament to what an amazing breed the Chesapeake Bay Retriever truly is. Bravo is a very talented dog, my own personal guardian angel and my hero! This dog's dedication and service to me is above and beyond anything that I have ever experienced in my life. I am so humbled, honored and truly blessed to have him in my life. My heartfelt thanks to Steve and Sharon Parker for the wonderful gift that has literally saved my life!

## American Chesapeake Club LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

### OBJECTIVE

The ACC Lifetime Achievement Award is given to an individual who has made significant contributions to the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed / the people who own them through outstanding leadership / advancement of knowledge / understanding.

### ELIGIBILITY

The ACC Lifetime Achievement Award is not an annual award. The awards selection committee may decide not to make any awards selection in a given year or may decide to bestow multiple awards. The number / frequency of award selection is strictly at the discretion of the awards selection committee.

Nominations may be submitted by organizations or individuals, including the nominees themselves.

### AWARDS CRITERIA

Nominees are judged by the originality, vision, breadth, / impact of the entire body of their work. Candidate selection must go beyond mere name recognition / reputation. A nominee's work is evaluated in such areas as:

- A strong / well-documented commitment to the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed.
- Vocal / written advocacy of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed today.
- Advancement of best practices in owning, training, competing, rescuing / breeding Chesapeake Bay Retrievers.

- Service to the community / the public in connection with the Chesapeake Bay Retriever as a breed, in competition, to owners / through rescue efforts.

### JUDGING

Nominations will be evaluated on the criteria provided above. The names of the award winner(s), if any, will be announced prior to the annual American Chesapeake Club Meeting during the National Specialty Show. The formal presentation of any award will take place at the Specialty.



## New Sport - Nosework

For those unfamiliar with the competitive sport of Nosework, it was created by K9 Nose Works and sanctioned by the National Association of Canine Scent Work (NACSW). This sport was inspired by detection style training for working K9s and has elements that are founded in that type of training



and work. One of the many challenges faced by working K9s and their handlers is encountering new environments and scenarios daily. This challenge is reflected in the sport through differing search environments and requirements of each trial location and in the structure of the trial through the four search 'elements'. There are three levels reflecting ability of the dog to find three different odors with increasing levels of difficulty; NW1 - Birch; NW2 - Anise and NW3 - Clove.



To compete in a trial, dog and handler must be enrolled in NACSW and must pass an Odor Recognition Test (ORT) for each odor. For more information about nosework, see [www.funnosework.com](http://www.funnosework.com).

## New Nosework 1 (NW1) Title

The sweetest words uttered by a judge in a Nosework (NW) trial are, "YES! Reward your dog!" On March 11th at the NW1 trial put on by the Emerald Dog Obedience Club in Elmira, OR we heard those words four times! **Desert Smoke's Alibi NW1, CGC** received her NW1 title with a perfect score of 100 points with 0 faults. In order for Ali to compete for her NW1 title, she first had to prove that she could recognize the NW1 odor, birch, by previously passing an Odor Recognition Test (ORT). A NW1 trial consists of



one hide with specific time elements in each of four search elements - Exterior, Container, Interior and Vehicle. Our first search, exterior, had a time limit of 3 minutes; I called alert at 2:25:78; but should have called it sooner - too afraid of a false alert! Our second search was the container search consisting of 25 cardboard boxes laid out in a maze with a 2-1/2 minute time limit. Ali clearly alerted to the proper hide in 25 seconds. We were halfway through!

Our Interior search in an elementary school classroom full of student desks and lots of stuff had a 3-1/2 minute time limit. Ali alerted at 1:04:03 minutes - amazing, considering all the things in that room! The vehicle search consisted of 3 vehicles under a metal shelter with no sides. In the wind and the rain, Ali took 1:20:17 of the 3 minute time limit to alert to the hide. The final result - a new NW1 title for my Chessie! Proudly submitted by Jackie Patterson (OR).

## New AKC Novice and Open Titles




## New AKC and USDAA Titles

My Working Background:


