American Chesapeake Club LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

OBJECTIVE

The ACC Lifetime Achievement Award is given to an individual who has made significant contributions to the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed / the people who own them through outstanding leadership / advancement of knowledge / understanding.

ELIGIBILITY

The ACC Lifetime Achievement Award recognizes personal achievement / its positive impact on the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed. The award may be given to any individual independent of specific institutional affiliation with the American Chesapeake Club or other organizations.

The ACC Lifetime Achievement Award is not an annual award. The awards selection committee may decide not to make any awards selection in a given year or may decide to bestow multiple awards. The number / frequency of award selection is strictly at the discretion of the awards selection committee.

Nominations may be submitted by organizations or individuals, including the nominees themselves.

AWARDS CRITERIA

Nominees are judged by the originality, vision, breadth, / impact of the entire body of their work. Candidate selection must go beyond mere name recognition / reputation. A nominee's work is evaluated in such areas as:

- A strong / well-documented commitment to the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed.
- Vocal / written advocacy of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed today.
- Advancement of best practices in owning, training, competing, rescuing / breeding Chesapeake Bay Retrievers.

- Service to the community / the public in connection with the Chesapeake Bay Retriever as a breed, in competition, to owners / through rescue efforts.

JUDGING

Nominations will be evaluated on the criteria provided above. The names of the award winner(s), if any, will be announced prior to the annual American Chesapeake Club Meeting during the National Specialty Show. The formal presentation of any award will take place at the Specialty.

NOMINATION REQUIREMENTS

INFORMATION TO BE INCLUDED IN NOMINATION:

Please furnish the following information in the order asked, using 8.5" x 11" sheets of paper.

1. Name of the nominee, nominee's address, phone number, / e-mail address
2. Name of the person submitting the nomination, along with that person's address, phone number, / e-mail address
3. A detailed description of how the nominee meets the awards criteria. Visual aids supportive of the nomination should not exceed four. If they are smaller than 8.5" x 11", they must be mounted on sheets that size.

The following signed statement must be included within the nomination: "I understand that the contents of this entry become the property of the American Chesapeake Club / will not be returned. Open Report

The open started with "just a double". It was set in a valley with sage brush and other cover. The flyer was thrown left to right down a hill into the valley by a big out cropping of large sage brush. The memory bird was thrown left to right. It was next to a mountain that was covered in pine and trees and other brush. The bird was on the top of a small hill and was thrown into very tall sage brush. Some of the dogs wanted to see what was up the mountain and took a short trip into the pines. They either hunted or were handled out to the bird. Other dogs let the terrain push then into the valley and they would hunt between the two birds, in the classic "no man's land". Some of the dogs took the perfect line up through the sage brush and still had small hunts.

The land blind was run from the top of hill into the valley quite a way behind the flyer. The field was full of stumps from pine trees. The blind planters were hidden deep of the blind. The wind picked up quite a bit adding more difficulty to the terrain, sage brush, and stumps to keep the handlers sharp.

The water blind was held at the very beautiful mountain lake. It was a shore line blind with an angle entry. There was a small point and there was a lot of discussion about the point being on line or not. Some of the handlers brushed the point others put the dogs up on it. It was such a small point either way appeared

Amateur Results



Amateur Report

The Amateur started with a double in a pasture with low to moderate cover. The judges made good use of limited terrain features by throwing a short retired bird in a small dip with the gunner retiring behind a small hill on the left. This bird was thrown left to right with the gun retiring as soon as the bird was thrown. The go bird was a long flyer to the right and quite deep of the memory bird. It was shot left to right in knee high dead grass cover. Most dogs did well on both birds, some had a hunt on the flyer, and some were drawn up the little hill where the memory bird gunner had retired, then worked their way back to the right to the bird. Thirty dogs were called back.

The land blind was run in the same field but from the opposite direction. There were two sets of gunners in the field, near the gun stations used in the first series. The line to the blind was down a draw to the right of flyer crates and just left of the fall from the first series memory bird. A very strong cross wind from right to left caused some problems for the early dogs to run and several dogs didn't

hear the whistles when they were in the lowest part of the draw and near the end of the blind. The wind eased up some and dogs had a bit more success later in the day.

Twenty dogs were called back to the water blind and only seven of them made it through to the fourth series, so that should tell you it wasn't an easy water blind! There was a long square entry to a wide channel of water the dogs had to swim across. This was a very cold morning and the water was obviously COLD for the dogs after most had been used to summer training. It took some work for the early dogs to get across the open water and not fade to the closest shoreline. Then they reached a shoreline point and handlers had to put the dogs out of the water briefly and right back in for another long swim tight to the shoreline. This proved to be very difficult and many of the early dogs to run were picked up when they couldn't be convinced to get back in or stay in. The work improved some as the test progressed and there were a couple very nice jobs on the water blind.

A water triple with two retired guns and an honor faced the seven dogs back to the fourth series. The judges used the same piece of water as the water blind, but ran across it rather than the length of it. The middle bird was the first bird down, thrown left to right on the side of a ridge with the gunners retiring behind the ridge. The longer right hand bird was thrown left to right and retired behind cover. The flyer was to the left with the gunners standing on the shoreline close to the mat and throwing out into the water. This was an extremely short, very exciting flyer – a real test of steadiness for both the working dog and honor dog. Some handlers got the middle bird next and many dogs had to hunt around and over the ridge to come up with the bird. The right hand bird required an angle swim across the water, with some dogs getting out early, some staying in a bit long which produced some hunts on this bird. All the dogs got all the birds, but the short flyer proved too much for one young dog on honor.

Qualifying Report

Tuesday morning dawned clear and cold (at least by California standards). The car thermometer read 25 as we scrapped the ice off the windshields. However, the sun was bright and the temperatures soon began to climb. The directions to the trial grounds sounded simple enough; take the main highway north to the first right turn outside of town, go to the first left turn and then drive to the trial site. However the dirt road seemed endless and then it turned into cattle path leading into the rolling pasture land. (Ranches are BIG in Idaho!) Finally we see the cars parked signaling that we had arrived at the test.

The first series was to be a land triple. The line was at the crest line of a bowl. Off to the left across a couple swales and gullies was the memory mark. To its right and down one of the gullies was the partially retired middle bird station, and on the right out in the flat was the flyer station. The test worked as designed with the combination of the dog having to run along a slope and then the suction of the middle mark pulling many of the dogs wide right of the memory bird. Several dogs had to handle to complete the test.

The second series was the land blind. For this we stepped just back of the line for the marks (across a small ditch) and sent the dog just to the back side of the flyer crated from the first series, along a marshy piece of land to this lone little bush about 250 yards away.

Derby Report

There were thirteen dogs entered in the Derby, but we had five scratches leaving only eight to run. (Kennel cough has been to blame for many Clubs not having Derbies this fall). With ACC members coming from afar, Field Trial Chairperson Linda Harger announced the ACC would certainly have a contest!

The Judges made excellent use of the terrain in setting up the tests. The first and second series were combined, with a long shot flyer as the first series on the left side of a ridge. After the dog returned with that bird, both dog and handler moved over to the right to run the second series. This series consisted of double, with the marks converging and aligned on the next ridge. Five of the eight dogs were back for the third series. In the third series, the dogs ran from the top of a ridge down the hill through cover and into the water. Four dogs successfully completed this series. Due to concerns over losing another dog, the Judges decided to end the Derby at this point. The tests were well thought out, and the use of the terrain was excellent. Jane Pappler marshaled and everyone pitched in to make it a very enjoyable and successful test.

Qualifying Report Cont'd

The third series was run at a nearby pond. It was the water blind. Again the dogs were running down hill for a distance until they reached the water's edge. There was a slight barrier of cattails along the shoreline the dogs had to push through and then a short piece of mostly splash water and a bit of swimming water, until the dogs reached a point of land. The dogs needed to push across this point and re-enter the water and swim to the far shoreline to get the bird. Several dogs flared at the cattail barrier and several more would not handle off the point.

The last series was a water triple on this same pond. The line was moved several yards to the right. The memory mark was on the far side of the pond and was a slight in-throw to the water's edge. The second bird was on the left hand bank and was also a slight in-throw to the water's edge. And the go bird was a shot flyer on the right bank. Several of the dogs went way deep on one of the memory marks requiring handling to complete the test.

to be on line. After the point was a small bay of water then the bird was up on another point. The bird boys were hidden. Some dogs got in a little early, or stayed up on the point too long, or landed too early at the end of the blind.

The last series was wonderful. If your dog did well on it you will always remember it. It was at the same lake, just turned and facing the other direction. The flyer was shot last, off the shore to the right. The left bird was second, across a small inlet and on the edge of the forest. It was thrown left to right and was retired. The first bird down was in the middle, was thrown right to left and then retired. The line to that long bird was up and over a big point, into a large bay and finally up into some trees. The bird was thrown right to left and retired. A few dogs did just a wonderful job, they took a good line all the way to the bird. Several dogs took the "big swim" and swam around the point came out on the shore to find the bird. A few dogs cheated the second piece of water and hunted up in the trees and found the bird.

The judges set up very challenging test and were very generous with the call backs. They also managed to pick out very scenic spots and all the tests were very gallery friendly.

2013 Show Specialty will be in Pueblo, Colorado in October. Show chairperson will be Renee Wolfe.

Club News

2014 Show Specialty will be at Lancaster, Pennsylvania in September. Show chairperson will be Marty Smith and Joanne Silver will be obedience chairperson.

Regional directors – “Twelve regional directors – WDs, meet the breed exhibits and judges’ seminar will be held. Joanne also announced the passing of Sally Gervin (RD in Tennessee) and expressed sympathies to her family.

has done great work already. They have found new causes. They have found progressive problems and they have trained people in making the surgery successful as opposed to very risky. I have both direct contact and indirect contact with them.

Temperament: I was extremely impressed by the dispositions and the work ethic. During obedience and Rally training the dogs showed alertness, intelligence and willingness to learn and work. They were attentive and you could also see how devoted they were to their masters.

Once in the breed ring their eagerness to please, general interest in what was happening and composure during a typical breed exam was still present. Gaiting was done efficiently, but sometimes creatively. Several dogs tried to be "in charge" by jumping and playing as they moved.

Overall Appearance: coat presentation was natural and clean. There were no products, no back brushing or over grooming. The coats fit the dogs. A coat was not an elaborate fur piece sculpted and contoured to make the dog look like something he was not.

Physical condition was excellent: slim and trim, well-muscled. Results were fronts that moved true and strong rears with dogs using everything they had.

There are some areas where the European dogs are more correct than ours:

- body to leg proportions correct – long and low dogs were not easily found
- heads correct – not overdone but with correct proportions and correct eyes
- temperament – willingness to work and alert, a bright and happy disposition.

I am most impressed by the enthusiasm, intelligence and willingness to work. I feel that we are losing that in some of our dogs here in this country. In Europe, the dogs are expected to "work". My entry of dogs was thrilled to be there with their owners. What dog would not enjoy a beautiful fall day in the gently rolling hills on the Bavarian countryside?

Thank you to the entire committee of ICW who worked non-stop for days. Chairs: Anja and Dennis Ballwieser, Gerlinda Boross, Ina and Michael Jarosch, Ursula Moilliet and Cornelia (Connie) Wunder, and all the exhibitors and spectators who were so kind to us.

OCTOBER 2012 AKC BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

New York, NY - Highlights from the October 22-23, 2012 meeting of the AKC Board of Directors are as follows. Full details on these actions, as well as other actions taken, are included in the minutes for the meeting, which are posted on the AKC website, within one week of the meeting.

* The Board authorized the extending of an offer of employment for a new Chief Operating Officer. John Lyons, the current COO is retiring in January, 2013.

* After a thorough discussion, the Board decided that in 2014, the AKC Board will begin investigating the best response to the property leases expiring in 2018 and 2020, and the advisability of office consolidation.

* The Board added the Kennel Club Boliviana (KCB) to the list of registries with pedigrees acceptable for AKC registration.

* The Board established a \$50 processing fee for the handling of club membership lists, which are required to be submitted annually. The fee will be waived for clubs submitting their lists in an acceptable electronic format. This fee will become effective July 1, 2013.

* The fee for the registration of an imported dog was raised to \$100, effective January 1, 2013.

* The discipline guidelines for sexual harassment have been expanded to cover inappropriate comments and/or conduct regarding but not limited to another individual's race, color, religion, disability, national origin, age, sexual orientation, or gender.

* The Board removed the moratorium on Parent Clubs requesting a lowering of jump heights for their breed in obedience. An application form has been developed for any Parent Club wishing to make such a request.
