







OPEN COMMENTARY

First Series Land/Water Triple: The Open first series was a combination land/water triple. The test was shot from the left to right.

The left hand bird was a retired gun with a dead duck thrown on the opposite side of a long finger of a pond from left to right at 250 yards. The line to the bird was a long water entry down a sloping hillside into heavy cover along the shoreline, then a 40 yard swim, then driving up a hill 75 yards to the bird. Dogs had a tendency to square the water which pushed them up the hill to the left. Most dogs recovered to pick up the bird in some fashion. Early dogs had a lot of difficulty picking out the gun station due to fog and lighting conditions which was reflected in the loss of dogs in the callbacks. As the sun rose this gunner became very visible which showed in much better work.

The center bird was a dead duck at 260 yards shot left to right up a hill, thrown over a sandy road and into grass cover. The line to this bird was along a rolling hill in-which the dog lost sight of the gunner several times. Dogs that climbed the hill to the right could get lost to the right causing difficulty recovering to the bird.

Right hand flyer: As the dogs came to the line mat they easily picked out the right hand gunner which was a Mallard duck flyer shot slightly angled back from left to right at approximately 75 yards. The bird landed up a gentle slope of foot-high grass cover with several mowed strips. The closeness of the flyer amped dogs up and several dogs had very long flyer hunts.

Second Series Land blind: The second series was a single land blind (260 yards) run from the same line as the first series. The bird was placed approximately 25 yards to the left of the center gunner. The true line to the blind was along a side of a gentle slope, onto a sandy road for 20-30 yards, then onto a grassy area, then back across the road and a drive to the bird. Overall work was choppy as this configuration was a "get on and off a point" and the need to "get on the point" created numerous whistles for the handlers and dogs.

Third Series Water blind: The water blind (175 yards) was run from the area where the first series retired gunner was placed. The dog came to the line was sent to square into the pond, then swim to a long point, then back into the water for a swim along the shoreline, past a grassy point, then "out to sea" for several yards before a gunner was told to throw a bird for the dog to complete the blind.

Fourth Series Watermarks with an Honor: The fourth series was a water triple with two retired guns and an honor. The birds were shot center, left, then right flyer.

The center bird was a retired duck thrown approximately 360 yards, left to right. The gunner then retired into a natural brush growth. This was a very well placed bird that tested the dog's memory and courage as they had a long swim followed by a long drive up a hill to the fall. Most dogs squared the water exit which pushed them left and up the hill to a long hunt.

The left hand bird was also retired, thrown left to right and into a tall stand of pine trees. This was also a well place bird and the dog's tendency was to hunt to the left of the fall.

The flyer was the last bird and was shot to the right of the pond, approximately 100 yards and up a hillside, into mowed strips. The flyer caused some difficulty with dogs as they hunted the mowed strips. This was a very nice All-Age test and truly tested the dog's abilities.

AMATEUR COMMENTARY

First Series was held on a beautiful, bright day. The Amateur began with a land triple presented around the horn from left to right. First bird thrown to the right at 175 yards from the line, gunner retires into the woods. After the dog is sent on the first retrieve, middle/second bird was thrown right to the left approx. 215 yards from the line. The shot flyer station, 3rd bird down, was presented 58 yards from the line, shot to the right. This was an area with rolling terrain having mowed strips of cover throughout. Several dogs found the close proximity of the flyer very inviting and broke. There were several dogs needing to be handled to two of the marks, some handled on one bird and others did really nice memory marking on all 3 stations. There were a few missed birds by our gunners and one of the running dogs was interrupted by a judge's Lab that got out of the van and retrieved the shot flyer before the working dog could be sent! 44 Dogs were entered, 4 scratches, 25 were called back for the 2nd series on Thursday.

Second and Third Series: Land Blind and Water Blind Combo

This test started late as fog dominated the early hours. The Amateur blinds were well thought out, very nice bird placement, very nice tests, a true All-Age quality water blind.

The judges setup a double blind, a land blind approximately 150 yards with a gunner sitting approximately 25 yards to the left of the land blind. The line to the blind cut thru several mowed strips. In general, dogs did well on the blind.

The dogs came back from the land blind and looked out at a 250 yard water blind to the right of the land blind. The line carried the dog down a gentle slope of mowed strips approximately 150 yards towards the left corner of a pond. The blind was a long angle entry into the left corner of a large pond and down the shoreline. A gravel road circled the pond which several dogs identified as the perfect place to run. Several dogs had difficulty entering the pond, choosing to run the gravel road. Several dogs had

QUALIFYING COMMENTARY

The day started off with the site being fogged in. We finally got started around 10:30am. 33 dogs ran the first series of the Qualifying, a wide open land triple with a breaking bird flyer through a hay field with mown strips creating multiple changes of cover. A long blind ran behind the left gun station and through a slot formed by 2 stands of cover, quickly nick-named 'the goalposts'. The changes in terrain and cover made the test a little trickier than it first appeared.

19 dogs were called back for the 2nd series at the Wood Duck Pond, a water blind with an angled entry through cover, over a point and then an open water swim to the bird placed on a steep bank in heavy shade.

12 dogs came back for the 3rd series, a water triple with an honor. The middle bird was the first down, landing in cover on the far shore with an angled entry over a point. Second bird down on the left was an open water swim across the pond and then up a slope. Last bird thrown was a short breaking bird on land just to the right of the line.

It was a pleasure to see all these wonderful dogs run and doing an amazing job. Thank you all the volunteers that worked during all of the stakes.

DERBY COMMENTARY

Seventeen young, eager Chesapeake Bay Retrievers and their handlers and/or owners were judged in the derby stake of the Field Trial Specialty. The judges, Frank Kearney and Kathy Yates, were experienced field trialers and set fair tests for the field. They set all the tests at the Wood Duck Pond area of H. Cooper Black, Jr. Memorial Field Trial and Recreation Area.

The first test was a single flyer duck shot in the middle of the field adjoining the pond at approx. 80 yards. The dogs stretched their legs and enjoyed running to the area of the fall. There were many pins and some close hunts. All the dogs were called back to the second series which was a reasonable double in the pond. Near the middle of the pond, two spits of land run from either side of the pond with a distance of water in the middle. One gunner was placed on each spit and the dead ducks were thrown on land at the end of each spit in a converging pattern. The right hand bird was roughly 80 yards and the left hand bird was about 120 with a land entry of 20 yards. The dogs produced various jobs. Those who had mastered shore breaking swam straight out to each bird, made the retrieve and came back in the water. The younger and/or less experienced dogs could not resist the temptation and swam to some portion of the spits on either right or left, beaching early and running around the spit to get the bird. Fourteen dogs were called back to the next series the following day on the other side of the Wood Duck Pond.

The third series was another land double on the shore of the pond. The memory bird on the left was around 175 yards landing just on the other side of the road and requiring the dogs to run parallel to the shore of the pond. The short go-bird was about 80 yards -- thrown up a hill and landed in some fairly dense cover. The distance between the go bird and line to the memory bird was somewhat close and a few dogs did have difficulty taking the line to the memory bird after picking up the go bird. The fourth series was a long single across the pond some 175 yards with a land angle entry of around 40 yards through cover. Here again, the experienced dogs took water to the spit, across the spit, back in the water and all the way to the other side of the pond where the bird was thrown on the far shore. The less accomplished dogs yielded to temptation and ran around the spit and the pond to the far shore, usually with some hunting in the area of the fall. In the end, 10 dogs picked up all the birds.

Thank you to all the volunteers that worked and marshaled.

PUPPY STAKES COMMENTARY

By Julie Reardon

The Future Stars: "Your pup will have some big paws to fill; look at the all age dogs that are listed on this," Linda Harger said to Ed Bahr as she handed him the impressive trophy for winning the senior puppy stakes at the ACC 2013 Field Trial Specialty in Cheraw, SC on October 31. Bahr's pup, "Fatz" (Rudy's Chasing Minnesota Fatz), is off to a good start: the 9-month-old brown puppy earned a JAM in the derby in addition to his puppy win. Roux (Rudy Fatty Tryst Sassy Roux), owned by Jim and Cathy Scroggins and run by Cathy, was second. Sandy Dollar's Cur-San's Night Magic placed third, and Yves Paquette's Pond Hollow Rock on Graceland JH was 4th.

Puppy judges Mary and Sidney Williams set up straightforward land and water singles for the puppies down the hill from where the Open all age stake had been held, utilizing a bit of terrain and cover to test the young

dogs. The Scroggins, who'd driven from TX to SC just to run the puppy stakes with their two young dogs, collected a trophy and win with their younger pup, run by Cathy, in the junior division to go with their senior 2nd. Deke, (Platte River's Decoy Dancer), put in a very polished performance, unfazed by his other owner Jim, who'd stepped up to help throw for the puppieste bird boys which happened to be Cathy's husband Jim. He'd volunteered to help, explaining, "It's OK, I throw marks all the time when she runs them." Second was Potts, (Hope Springs Little Ponzi) who also marked well but did a few victory laps before returning to heel.

There was more than a little confusion, opinions and ideas for the puppies, as junior and senior puppy stakes are all but extinct at field trials today and no one was able to locate any guidelines for them. They fall under the AKC category of "non-regular classes" but while there were plenty of opinions, no one could definitively offer up any official instructions or rules. However, Mary and Sidney handled all the questions and differing opinions with grace and professionalism. The premium stated the puppy stakes was for 4 to 5 month old pups, but the online entry service program rejected baby puppy entries with a bland computer-generated message stating no dogs under 6 months were eligible for AKC field trials, so people weren't able to enter in advance. And some were confused at how the age cut off works. Like puppy classes at AKC conformation shows, a pup that has turned 9 months before the trial starts, even by one day, is ineligible for the 6 to 9 month class, and belongs in the 9 to 12 month class.

Baby puppies created even more confusion. It had been announced at the dinners and during the trial that anyone could enter any puppy under 6 months for \$10. But Harger explained that the newly donated Hoagland Lundy Challenge Trophy was for pups from 3 to 6 months, not 4 to 6 months as was stated in the premium and on the website. When the dust settled, everyone with a puppy got a chance to run it on some age-appropriate marks, even if they weren't in contention. There was no debate about who won, though: Laura Griggs' "Fen", Coolwaters Roane Point, a precocious 4 month old brown female, edged John Ackerman's deadgrass Decks pup, Rufus, who got the second-placed award.



BEST AMATUER HANDLER

Tim Carrion was selected Best Amateur Handler by the FT committee. As an owner/handler, he and Tanner won the Open and came in 2nd in the Amateur. These accomplishments qualified them to run in 2014 National Amateur Retriever Championship trial that will be held in Roseburg OR in June, 2014.



BEST BITCH IN TRIAL

JJ's Rachel was named Best Bitch in the 2013 ACC FT Specialty. Rachel placed 4th in both the Open and Amateur -- handled by Mitch Patterson. (In fact, she was the only bitch to place in either of the major stakes.) Rachel is owned by Linda Patterson and Billy Smith.

excellent work on this blind, casting into the ponds, carrying their line to the far shoreline. Dogs exited the water a drove up a hill 50 yards to the bird.

Fourth Series: Water Triple with an Honor

Shot left, right, middle flyer. The left hand bird was shot left to right, approximately 300 yards. The retrieve required the dogs to run along a slope which pushed them to the right, then enter into a stick pond with a road weaving thru the test. After exiting the stick pond the dogs had to drive up a hillside to the bird. Several dogs "fell" off the hillside, entered the pond to the right, exited on the road which placed the dogs far right of the fall and on the hillside with the flyer gunners.

The right bird was 140 yards, thrown flat and from left to right along the back shoreline. This retrieve required the dogs to angle into the first piece of water, then cross a land point, reenter and swim to the fall. Several dogs overran this bird, ending up on the hillside beyond the fall area.

Center flyer was shot right to left, approximately 150 yards. The dog would run approximately 100 yards to the water, swim approximately 25-30 yards, then drive up a gentle hillside to the bird. The bird landed across a sandy road in light cover strips.

This was a very nice All-Age test which challenged the dogs trained responses to holding straight lines to fall areas and courage in entering and swimming thru a heavy stick pond.

Early work was weak but several dogs had very nice work on this test.

attachment to this breed and respect for these breeders/trainers/owner/handlers.





AWARDS CRITERIA

Nominees are judged by the originality, vision, breadth, / impact of the entire body of their work. Candidate selection must go beyond mere name recognition / reputation. A nominee's work is evaluated in such areas as:

- A strong / well-documented commitment to the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed.
- Vocal / written advocacy of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed today.
- Advancement of best practices in owning, training, competing, rescuing / breeding Chesapeake Bay Retrievers.
- Service to the community / the public in connection with the Chesapeake Bay Retriever as a breed, in competition, to owners / through rescue efforts.

JUDGING

Nominations will be evaluated on the criteria provided above. The names of the award winner(s), if any, will be announced prior to the annual American Chesapeake Club Meeting during the National Specialty Show. The formal presentation of any award will take place at the Specialty.



"Slider" UKC BIS AL-CH* Riverdel's Against the Seams, RN NW1 CGC (CH. Riverdel's Red Sky at Night, RN NW1 CGC x CH. Chesabar's Windswept Otter Run) earned her NW1 title through the NACSW at their nosework trial held in Lake George, NY on October 6, 2013. To be



awarded this title, she needed to successfully find and alert to the birch scent in 4 different search scenarios; each search has a maximum time allowed to pass that element. At this trial, we were allowed 2.5 mins each to complete our interior and container searches, and 3mins each to complete the vehicle and exterior searches. This was our 2nd attempt at the NW1 title; in our first attempt last year, we timed out in two of the elements (you need to pass all four in one day to title). Slider is not the fastest searching dog, but she is methodical and honest; her cues at source are very subtle and a true trust in her ability for me to call that final ALERT. I am so proud of "Little Lamb" (her nickname for obvious reasons) to have aced her searches, with no faults, at this trial where the searches were difficult and the weather conditions challenging (rain all day, heavy downpours at times). Only 9 dogs entered of 28 were able to meet the challenge and title this day. Slider is bred/owned by Marty Smith and Stacy George, and exclusively trained and handled by Marty Smith (NJ). Great teamwork Marty and Slider!

CKC Draft Dog

"Reese" Del Brave Flying Colours, CD JH WCI (Silvercreek's Serena

Del Brave X Chestnut Hills Blizzard) tested and passed the Canadian Kennel Club sanctioned Draft Dog test on 10/5/13 at the Wascana Dog Obedience Club's Draft Test. Next up for Reese is training for Draft Dog Excellent. At this level the dog has to be handled from behind, the weight increases and a back packing element is added. Reese is bred by George Makatura and Kathy Case and owned by Patti Kipper (SK, CAN) and Bonnie Mountenay. Congrats Reese and Patti!



About the CKC Draft Dog Test: Under CKC rules all registered and recognized breeds are eligible to test for the Draft Dog designation. That is, as long as they can safely pull the 40lbs required in the freight haul.

The test consists of ring exercises where the dog is put through a heeling pattern without the cart, completes a 1 minute stand stay and stands co-operatively to be harnessed and hitched to the cart. When the dog is hitched to the cart, they may never sit or lie down. Once harnessed and hitched, the handler negotiates the dog through a pattern consisting of left and right turns, a pace change to slow and a number of halts and restarts. The final 2 exercises in the ring are a figure 8 around 2 obstacles, followed by the dog backing the cart 4 ft. in a straight line. Once the ring exercises are complete the dogs are called back into the ring for a group 3 minute down stay.

The final exercise has the handler bring the dog to a designated start line harnessed and hitched for the freight haul. The freight haul takes place on a trail with natural terrain; it can have sloping land, boulders, high grass and/or trees that provide natural obstacles. Handler / dog teams hit the trail in groups of 3 and are stopped part ways to load and secure the required weight and change lead dogs, enabling each dog to run in each position. The dogs are required to give up the lead and wait while the other dogs pass.
