

East Coast Supported Agility Trials

The East Coast contingent of the ACC put on an ACC supported agility trial in August 2013 with the proceeds going towards the tracking test to be held at the 2014 NSS. It was such a success that another was held in January of 2014, with the proceeds from that trial adding to the obedience/rally budget at the 2014 NSS. Both trials were held in Hamden CT at Paws N' Effect. In August we had Chessies come from Maryland (Jim & Brenda Stewart), New York (Rob Conroy) and Connecticut (Doreen Palmer) for a total of six Chessies running at the all-breed trial. At the January trial Rob and Jill Conroy came in from NY with three Chessies and the Palmers two Chessies from CT also ran and helped with the trial. Additional members



of the ACC that came to help were Joanne Silver, Mike Moscovitz, Barbara Healy, Fred Feins and Gary Palmer. The club and its members received many, many compliments on the trial. We hope to do more trials in the future including one in November 2014, again in Hamden. We hope that anyone in the area can join us either as spectators, helpers or especially to run their Chessies! Health Committee Report

Exercise Induced Collapse

Exercise Induced Collapse (EIC) is most commonly seen in Labrador Retrievers but also seen in eight other breeds including the Chesapeake Bay Retriever. It can be inherited as an autosomal recessive trait. There are some disagreements on the types of collapse and age ranges and grouping of the Labradors with this disease syndrome. There has been no published age ranges and groupings for the Chesapeakes.

DNA testing for the genetic mutation causing EIC susceptibility can now be performed. If the dog has one recessive gene, it is called a "carrier". If the dog has two recessive genes it is called "affected." If there are no signs of the recessive genes for EIC, then the dog is called "clear." Dogs with two recessive genes are 80% more likely to have at least one incident of collapse in the Labrador studies. The numbers are not documented yet for the Chesapeake Bay Retrievers.

All researchers agree that the recessive gene blocks the formation of an enzyme (dynamain-1) which handles neuro-transport to the brain. With high amounts of exercise in the dog, the need for this blocked enzyme is elevated hence the collapse of the dog during maximum training and exercise. The collapse of the dog can be confused with epilepsy (seizure), heart problems, low blood sugar, myasthenia gravis and other neuromuscular diseases. The DNA test that is now available can take away this confusion with other diseases and can be diagnostic.

EIC testing is available on the web site of the University of Minnesota's Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory¹. In affected dogs that have a severe attack of muscular collapse, death could result. Reduced exercise in an affected dog with the gene mutation will result in a perfectly normal pet generally without a collapse incident. But continuing to increase exercise can be fatal. There is no long term "cure" or medication available to treat this disease, except that when it occurs, sometimes sedation is required to bring the dog out

of the seizing state. This can be tricky and requires veterinary care.

Samples of the dog's blood, cheek swabs, cut dew claws, and frozen semen can all be tested for this disease. The disease in Chesapeake Bay Retrievers with the mutated gene does not guarantee collapse will occur, but it does show the possibility of passing on the gene mutation to its offspring. Chesapeakes may give different signs and severity of the disease than Labradors.

The information on this disease syndrome changes frequently even from the best and most recent sources. My information is a short compilation of research from the University of Minnesota over the last year. The peculiarities of this disease are still being defined.

(The Open points must be earned by an amateur handler.) The trophy was donated to the ACC by Eloise Cherry in 1979 in memory of her dog Tiger's Cub. **Winner: Tim Carrion.**

FC Tiger of Clipper City Trophy: Awarded annually to the Chesapeake owned by an ACC member that earns the most points in AKC licensed and member Qualifying competition. The trophy was first awarded in 1961. **Winner: Westwind's Good As Gold** owned by Wendy Shepard Chisholm.

FC/AFC Meg's Pattie O'Rourke Trophy: Awarded annually to the Chesapeake owned by an ACC member that earns the most points in AKC licensed and member Derby competition. The trophy was first awarded in 1961. **Winner: Blucollars Full Metal Jacket** owned by Michelle Dunn.


The Louis Traung Trophy: Awarded annually to the Chesapeake owned by an ACC member that earns the most points in AKC licensed and member Derby competition in the West Coast states and Idaho. The trophy was donated to the ACC by Mrs. Louis Traung in 1962 and was originally a West coast trophy. Idaho was later added when several dogs were sold to Idaho residents who were supposed to trial them. (This addition was noted in a letter for Eloise Cherry that was received by the ACC many years later.) **Winner: Alutian Spur** owned by Mary Ellen Mazzola and Kassey Rowland.

FC AFC CFC CAFC Chesdel Chippewa Chief Trophy: Awarded annually to the Chesapeake owned by an ACC member that earns the most points in AKC licensed and member field trial Derby competition in the Central and Eastern Time zones. The trophy was donated by Alex Spear in memory of his dog Chip. **Winner: Blucollars Full Metal Jacket** owned by Michelle Dunn.

Upland Gundog Association's First National Gundog Open Challenge

April 26 and April 27, Grinnell, Iowa

New Upland Venue Brings Tournament Style Bird Dog Competition to Everyday Hunters

The Upland Gundog Association (UGA) might be a new organization, but they are on the move in the hunting dog industry. In just two years, they have hosted several hunt test events with hundreds of entries, operated in over three states and had interest in Canada to bring this family-friendly, hunter-centric upland venue to more bird dog owners. Their first UGA National Gundog Open Challenge will be hosted on Saturday April 26 and Sunday April 27 in Grinnell, Iowa.

The UGA offers hunt test for both pointing and flushing breeds, at the Gundog or Advanced level. They are also unique in that pointing Labradors are allowed to run in the pointer division. The Open Challenge is a more competitive, tournament style competition where a handler and dog are asked to hunt and harvest three birds in the fastest time possible. Time will be added as a penalty for missed shots, partial retrieves, trapping the bird (pointing division), etc. The interest in this venue has been overwhelming, and bird dog owners all over are very excited to enjoy a weekend full of dog training and hunting-like competition.

"The Open Challenge is a lot of fun", said Mike Moncada, UGA Vice President. "We have the event structured in such a way that we avoid common complaints in other venues. For example we run the venue in two very similar fields side by side, to avoid scent saturation for the participants that run towards the end. We also do not plant birds in the same identical spots each run, so handlers cannot "cheat" by memorizing the pattern. All in all, it is a friendly competition that people really enjoy, and we get to see a lot of fantastic dog work".

Now it has been more than thirty years of adventures, some of them smooth and comfortable, some not so much. I've come to realize though that there hasn't been a day since Putnam kicked, chewed, wagged and ate his way into our lives that all our Chesapeake Bay Retrievers, each and every one have been a missing ingredient in my life. I will be forever in debt to the many "Chessie" folks and regular dog people, **friends and relatives who stayed in touch (and those that didn't) who've helped guide me through the training, competing of and just plain enjoying these amazing gifts.** – Kevin Seymour, until my clip runs out.

Our Journey from the Duck Blind to Top Ten Sporting Dog

RBIS GCH Chesastar Hudson Bay RN, CGC was picked from a litter of thirteen bred by Mari Vaccaro and Patsy Barber out of GCH Chesabar Pawprints In The Sand, Ryley, and GCH Silverbar Wind On Cricket Bay, Bayly; it was one of Patsy’s last litters. Hudson was born on the 4th of July, 2010 and he is the number one Chesapeake Bay Retriever and number ten Sporting Dog for 2013. He is the very first Chesapeake to be awarded a Reserve BIS.



Like most puppies Hudson was enrolled in puppy kindergarten at twelve weeks old. He went on to regular obedience classes, rally classes, and we even gave intro to agility a shot. I could not keep up. Where Hudson excelled was in the field. Hudson has been hunting upland game since he was six months old and retrieved his first wood duck shortly after that. Hudson has been used in tower shoots and has worked with me guiding hunters at Clover Hollow, a local commercial shooting ground. All of this helped Hudson be in top condition when we were asked if we would be willing to special Hudson.

So began our journey from the duck blind. If you are thinking of campaigning your dog, you will need a great dog in top condition who loves to show, a handler who clicks with your dog and lots of luck. To increase your chances of success, it helps to have a unique ad campaign, we built Hudson’s ads around his duck hunting and upland

game hunting. We wanted to focus on the Chesapeake’s ability to be a true dual purpose dog. You and your dog must have a willingness to compete in as many shows as possible to accumulate the points needed to place in the breed and all-breed rankings. Hudson was in 173 dog shows in 2013. This means you will not see your dog for weeks at a time unless you travel to see him at shows.



When he does come home it will be up to you to keep him in top physical condition with lots of exercise and engaging him in activities that make him happy, for us it was hunting and swimming. Judges look at teeth, so a daily brushing was a must and keeping his coat clean but retaining the natural oil can be a challenge in the winter months, also keeping him at his optimum weight can be difficult when he is on the road.

Most of us who show our own dogs cannot be on the road five to six days a week going to dog shows so the only option is to hire

a professional handler. It should be a great handler who knows the breed and one you trust with your dog. We were fortunate to have Michelle and Michael Scott who also showed Hudson’s father Ryley to the number one ranked breed Chessie in 2009. Hudson loved them and that special bond was evident when you saw them in the ring together.

And then there is the luck factor, you need to be at the right show at the right time with judges that will acknowledge a Chesapeake in the group ring; if you are looking for a top ten sporting dog you need those important all breed group points.



The more people you have supporting your dog the greater your chances of placing in the top ten. We had great support from Mari Vaccaro and Debbie Smith, going to dog shows, clapping, and cheering for Hudson in the group ring, all these things help.

To all of you who choose to campaign your dog, team Hudson wishes you the best of luck and success in your endeavor. To all of our friends who supported us and the new friends we made along the way, we thank you, Karen and Jan Sosik.

ADCH-Bronze MACH2 Rippling Waters Jill SACH-S GCH-S SCH-S JCH-S TM-B, MXS MJS MXF T2B2 (CH Rippling Waters Purple Haze MH X CH Rippling Waters BB MH), "Jill", finished 2013 with four USDAA Championship all breed national Top Ten awards. Championship Top Ten points are earned from placements in the Championship Master classes and are based on number of dogs defeated. Each of the Master classes offers different challenges that encourage and demonstrate depth of training and the execution of competitive skills and strategy within the sport.





American Chesapeake Club LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

OBJECTIVE

- Service to the community / the public in connection with the Chesapeake Bay Retriever as a breed, in competition, to owners / through rescue efforts.

JUDGING

Nominations will be evaluated on the criteria provided above. The names of the award winner(s), if any, will be announced prior to the annual American Chesapeake Club Meeting during the National Specialty Show. The formal presentation of any award will take place at the Specialty.

CODE OF ETHICS – AMERICAN CHESAPEAKE CLUB

Love / respect of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever is implicit in membership in the American Chesapeake Club. Therefore, all members agree to foster the goals set forth in the code of Ethics.

I. RESPONSIBILITIES OF MEMBERS

- a. Read / familiarize yourself with the American Chesapeake Breed Standard for the Chesapeake Bay Retriever that is approved by the American Kennel Club. Support / abide by the rules of the American Chesapeake Club / The American Kennel Club.
- b. Appreciate the unique nature of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever / try to develop the characteristics this dog has inherited through selective breeding (intelligence, desire to mark / retrieve with style, love of water / keen scenting ability).
- c. Assume the responsibility of proper feeding, maintenance, health care, and training at all times.
- d. Always conduct yourself in a manner which will reflect credit on yourself / the breed. Refrain from public criticism or malicious degrading of other or their dogs.
- e. Never knowingly sell or place a Chesapeake Bay Retriever with unethical persons or those who would not provide proper / humane care to the dog. Refuse to sell any Chesapeake Bay Retriever to any pet shop or to any wholesale dealer in dogs.
- f. Should you become aware of the mistreatment, abuse or need for relocation of any Chesapeake Bay Retriever, make every effort to be of assistance by notifying the breeder of the dog involved, the appropriate local authorities / helping in any other way in which you are able.

- a. Do not breed Chesapeake Bay Retrievers that are not registered by the American Kennel Club or by kennel clubs recognized by the American Kennel Club.
- b. Strive in each breeding to improve the breed according to the ACC Breed Standard. Conscientiously plan each breeding, based on parents of appropriate temperament, appearance / other desirable qualities.
- c. Be aware of genetic defects which can be harmful to the breed. When breeding, endeavor to select animals that will reduce the incidence genetic problems while enhancing the positive attributes / abilities of the breed. Be open with all persons interested in the welfare of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever / discuss possible physical or temperament defects in your own stock.
- d. Do not breed any bitch who is not mature (never before the second heat) or in good health. Do not allow puppies to go to their new homes until at least 7 weeks of age.
- e. Act responsibly toward all puppies produced by your brood bitch or stud dog for the lifetime of the puppies. (Recommend that the breeder encourage the owner to contact him if he can no longer keep a dog at any time in the dog's life).
- f. Understand that written contracts are strongly recommended for all transactions, such as sales, guarantees, co-ownerships, breeding rights agreements, bitch leases, stud services, etc. Keep accurate records / pedigrees / give new owners registration papers or forward as soon as possible.
- g. Use / promote the use of the American Kennel Club non-breeding registration on pet quality puppies which are sold or placed by you.

- II. RESPONSIBILITIES OF BREEDERS / BROOD BITCH / STUD DOG** (The American Chesapeake Club Board of Directors strongly recommends that only animals with current OFA/CERF/PRA clearances be used for breeding).

ACC HISTORICAL PRINT SERIES #2: "PAIR OF ACES"

This is a great opportunity to own a piece of ACC history with the #2 Print in the ACC Historical Print Series. This 11" x 14" Limited Edition print is published from the Original Watercolor by artist Michael Steddum. It features the Chesapeake "greats" Dual CH Sodak's Gypsy Prince and his grand-daughter FC Shagwong Gypsy. All Proceeds are donated to ACC Health and Rescue.

Dual Champion Sodak's Gypsy Prince - Breeder: Rev. Schuster; Owner: Chesacraft Kennel (A. Bliss); Trainer: Charles Morgan. "Prince" was the first dual champion retriever of any retrieving breed. He was the second Chesapeake to make a field title. Prince was a medium sized deadgrass dog with an intense desire to work especially in icy water. He had a lifetime total of 14 pts. Today all field trial Chesaupes trace back to Prince through his son Chesacraft Baron ***.

FC Shagwong Gypsy - Breeder: C A Smith; Owner & Trainer: E. Monroe Osborne. "Gypsy" was the first Chesapeake bitch to earn a field trial championship (1939). She was the runt of her litter - a royally bred litter. Her sire was FC Skipper Bob and her maternal grandsire was Dual Ch Sodak's Gypsy Prince. Run by her owner Ed Osborne, Gypsy had 31 Open pts. and ran/completed the first National Open in 1941.


