The MACH2 requires a total of 40 DoubleQs (qualifying in both Master Standard and Jumpers classes on the same day), and 1500 points which represent the number of seconds under SCT for each qualifying run. In total her 80 qualifications contained 75 placements, with 51 First Place wins and 2537 points. The following week, Jill became the Third Chesapeake to earn the TQX, which requires 10 tripleQs (a qualifying score in the Master Standard, the Master Jumpers With Weaves and the Master FAST Agility Classes on the same day. Jill also completed both Silver level AKC Lifetime achievement awards, the Master Silver Agility (MXS) and Master Silver Jumpers (MJS), requiring 50 qualifications each in their respective Master Standard and Jumpers courses. Front & Finish® 2013 Delaney Rating System

Compiled By Dave Pluth, Ratings Editor

The Delaney Rating System compares performances of dogs in AKC all breed obedience competition. This system was originally devised by Mr. Kent Delaney, a highly respected obedience and breed judge. The philosophy of the Delaney Rating System is that placing dog/handler teams in each class are the best performers and comparisons of teams should only include these participants. Therefore this system only ranks dogs that place first through fourth in Open and Utility classes. Novice class dogs are not included in this system but are ranked separately in the Front & Finish® Novice Ratings.

Among teams that place, one point is earned for each dog defeated in the class. For example in a class of twenty competing teams the first place winner would earn 19 points as it defeated this number of other dogs. The team in second place would receive 18 points, the third place team would earn 17 points, and the fourth place team would earn 16 points. After points in each class are determined they are compiled across a given competition year.





Tracking Titles Decoded

What Does it Take to Earn That Coveted Tracking Champion (CT) Title?

First, Tracking Dog (TD) tests are in fields where the tracks are laid under variable conditions on moderate terrain. Prior to entering a TD test, the dog must be certified by a tracking judge that they completed the equivalent to a TD test. A TD track must be between 440 and 500 yards in length, the scent must be between 30 minutes and two hours old and there must be a total of three to five turns. A flag and a cloth scent article are at the start, a second flag will be 30 yards from the first, indicating the path of the track. The dog must follow the scent; navigate the turns to find glove or a wallet at the end of track to pass.

To enter a TDX test, the dog must have a TD or TDU title. This test is at least 800 to 1,000 yards with the scent between three and five hours old with five to seven turns and two cross tracks and at least two obstacles to challenge the dog and handler. Obstacles could be roads, ditches, stands of trees, fences or low walls, or anything that is different in the terrain. The four TDX articles will be personal, dissimilar articles, about the same size as a glove or wallet. Only the last article will be a wallet or glove. There will be only one flag at the start with a scent article and the track may proceed in a 180 degree arc from the flag. Finding the start could be difficult. My last TDX test was the hardest physically challenging test I've done. My male, Handsome, leaned into his harness and goes. It is go at his speed, or fall down. I couldn't even say, "good dog" when he came

back with the glove. I'm not sure I have another TDX in me.

The Variable Surface Tracking Test (VST) is a test of credibility, verifying the dog's ability to recognize and follow human scent while adapting to changing scenting conditions. A dog may enter a VST test after earning a TD or TDU title. The track will be between 600 to 800 yards, aged three to five hours, with a minimum of three different surfaces, which will include at least 1/3 vegetation and 2 different surfaces devoid of vegetation, such as concrete, asphalt, gravel, sand, hardpan, or mulch. There will be from four to eight turns with one moment of truth 90 degree turn in a non-vegetated surface. All tracks will be laid utilizing buildings and the diverse scenting conditions created by being in close proximity to such buildings. VST test articles will be four dissimilar, common, everyday items, one leather, one plastic, one metal and one fabric. The start will be in an area of vegetation and may go in any direction within a 180 degree arc.

A new Optional Titling Tracking Test, Tracking Dog Urban (TDU) became effective Jan. 1, 2014. The fundamental features of the TDU test are the dog's ability to follow a track laid by a person under a variety of scenting conditions in an urban environment and to find the articles dropped by that person. Dogs are not required to earn a prior tracking title to enter this test, but as in the TD test, the dog must be certified by a tracking judge that

they completed an equivalent to the TDU test. The track must be at least 400 to 500 yards in length, aged 30 minutes to 2 hours, with a minimum of two different surfaces, vegetated and non-vegetated surfaces. There will be 3 to 5 turns with one 90 degree turn in an open area. As in the TD test, there will be a start flag and a second flag indicating the direction of the first leg. There will be 3 personal, dissimilar fabric or leather articles with the third article being a wallet or glove at the end of the track.

A Champion Tracker must have earned three tracking titles, either the TD or TDU, the TDX and VST. I tried to give a summary of AKC rules for these tests from the AKC Tracking Regulations book. If you are interested in tracking and obtaining titles, please read all the regulations.

My personal experience with tracking has been addicting and rewarding. With training and perseverance most dogs can accomplish tracking tests. I think the hardest for me is the TDX because of the physical requirements for the handler. That said, the VST is the hardest for the dog. There are so many ways to go wrong, can't find the start, can't make the first turn, miss an article, miss the moment of truth turn, the list goes on. Then, of course, it can be difficult getting drawn for a track. Locally, there have been many more entries for only a few tracks. So, it is luck to get in, and hard work to earn a title. The stars, the moon, and the sun must all be in alignment.

Health Committee Report

Raw Meat-Based Diets For Dogs--- Updated Controversy

Raw meat-based diets fed to dogs has always been a point of discussion and full of different opinions. A more recent publication from very reputable sources has been published in the Journal of the American Veterinary Association (JAVMA). From this report, I have tried to excerpt some of the highlights.

It is interesting to note that the American Veterinary Medical Association, The American Animal Hospital Association and the Canadian Veterinary Medical Association all adopted statements discouraging feeding dog and cat meals that included raw or undercooked meat based diets which were made up of an animal source of protein. This was an even handed discussion as much as facts would allow.

It was pointed out that proponents of the raw meat diets claim nutritional superiority and important health benefits. Anecdotal benefits of raw meat diets include cleaner teeth from chewing bones, a shinier coat, and an

owner's perception that they are providing a more "natural" diet. Those in favor of raw food diets, claim that the raw meat diet is what the wild, undomesticated dog (wolves) ate prior to their evolution into domesticated dogs as pets. However, the genome of the present day dog shows 36 areas that differentiate the domesticated dog from the wolves. Ten of these areas play a critical role in the way digestion of starch and fat metabolism occurs in the wolf and the dog. The domesticated dog is now more capable of eating and digesting plant products as well as animal products and is now considered an omnivore. In fact it was considered that this ability to digest starch as well as fat was a critical step in the domestication of the dog.

As a human health matter, dogs that eat raw meat diets shed large amounts of the bacteria called salmonella, in their stool and in their saliva. Older people and those with compromised immune systems are warned to be particularly careful around those dogs shedding this bacteria, as they are most vulnerable to getting very sick. As a result, most nursing homes will not allow a service dog to come visit the patients if they are on a raw meat diet.

This latest six page report on raw meat based foods can be read in the Journal of the American Veterinary Medicine Association Volume 243, No. 11, December, 2013. The compilation of data for this report was done with data collected by Tufts University Veterinary School, The Royal Dick School of Veterinary Studies, University of Edinburgh, University of Scotland, the small animal section of University of Tennessee, and the Red Bank Veterinary Hospital. This is a huge cross-section of knowledge seeking only to improve our knowledge on canine health. If you would like to read the full report, it is both interesting and easy to understand.

Presentation on Conformation and Performance Dogs

With regards to canine animal health, here is an early HEADS UP about the presentation by Dr. Chris Zink at our National Show Specialty on Thursday night, September 18, 2014 from 7:00 PM -9:00 PM which is free to all members of the ACC.

This marvelous presentation has been secured through the efforts of the 2014 ACC

National Show Committee, supported and endorsed by the Health Committee and funded by the ACC Charitable Trust.

Well known and popular speaker Dr. Chris Zink,*** will discuss and advise us on the relationships between conformation and the stress of performance training on the dog and as it pertains to the Chesapeake Bay Retriever. All of us want our dogs to do a job. The job can be field work, agility training, search and rescue, obedience, hunting companion, fly ball, dock dog, pet companion, swimming partner, and more.

Dr. Zink is a veterinarian who has dealt with sports medicine problems and rehabilitation of the dog for many years. She has published award winning books on canine sports medicine and rehabilitation. She was co-author and edited the first book on canine sports medicine and rehabilitation. She was voted Outstanding Woman Veterinarian of the year in 2009. She has accumulated over 80 titles on her own dogs in agility, obedience, conformation, tracking, hunt tests, and rally. She has obtained these titles with various breeds of dogs coming from the sporting breeds, hound breeds, working dog breeds, terrier breeds and herding breeds.

This is definitely going to be an enjoyable event and not to be missed. There is no fee for members to attend this seminar, but we ask that they register so that seating and room arrangements can be made to accommodate all members. More details to follow on registration as time gets closer to the event. Non-members will be charged a nominal fee of \$10.00 which will be donated to the ACC Health Trust.

All are encouraged to join us in what is anticipated to be a memorable two hours of the Specialty. We all could leave these two hours with better knowledge of the canine athlete and helps us to improve our management of our dogs for decades to come.

AKC Delegate's Report

The Spring Meeting of the AKC was highlighted by new appointments, rules and initiatives.

Three new Board members were elected:
James Dok, J.Charles Gavin and Ron Menaker.

Field trials have 2 administrative rule changes. Clubs can now reduce the entry fee for handlers under 18. This change was to help clubs encourage new young handler participation. The second change deals with voting within the field trial committee in the event of a protest. In order to avoid any appearance of bias by the FTC, a committee member may NOT vote on the issue of the protest against a dog or handler if that committee member could benefit from the decision.

Starting May 1, 2014 a pilot program will begin allowing low entry clubs to hold 2 shows in one day. This is for clubs with an entry of 500 dogs or less (not counting obedience or rally). If a club puts on 2 shows in 1 day judges will still be held to 175 dogs / day, not per show.

Chesapeake 2013 registrations were 2145, up from 1999 in 2012. Litter registration were 587 slightly down from 2012. The general decline in AKC registration is of great concerns. AKC is investigating how to get a higher per cent of dogs from registered litters to become registered dogs. A pilot study with Brittanyies showed only 40% registration.

The Canine Health Foundation has a dollar for dollar matching fund for new donors (anyone that has not donated in the past 2 years).

The Disaster Trailer Project has now received over \$244,000 in donations. The goal is 1-2 trailers per state.

The upcoming June meeting will most likely see final votes on the new field trial Q2A title and delegate eligibility. Others issues for continued discussion will be: territory vs. facility for shows, identification and reinstatement procedures of DQ'd dogs, FT rules vs. regulations.

Skijoring, actual fall duck/goose hunting, and companionship of living with Chessies completes the experience.

instructor. Am Australian Shepherd Club of America obedience/rally judge and judge AKC sanctioned obedience matches. Belong to the Evergreen CBR Club, Retriever Club of Alaska, Alaska Working Retriever Club, Alaska Kennel Club, Midnight Sun Golden Retriever Club.

Treasurer - George Marthinuss (NC)

My Goals: To promote the breed through responsible training, competing and breeding. How I Will Accomplish My Goals: In training my chessies for hunt tests and field trials I will expect them to learn and grow with a firm (but never a harsh) training program. Praise for good work and corrections for poor work.

We will compete in as many hunt tests and field trials that I can travel by truck to each year. Last year we competed in many hunt tests and field trials. We brought home over 30 ribbons, many Master Hunter passes, several placements in field trial qualifications, and three qualifications for the US Master National.

Report of Treasurer

The Treasurer presented and discussed the ACC Balance Sheet as of December 31, 2013 (the Total Assets and Total Liabilities & Equity = \$194,739.45) and the Profit and Loss for January through December 2013 (Total Income = \$146,018.89; Total Expense = \$126,406.69; Net Ordinary Income = \$19,612.20; and Net Income = \$19,142.37). Copies will be provided to ACC Bulletin Editor Marty Smith and the accountant for ACC. Director Ellie Domek reported that the 2013 NSS event should be close to breaking even.

Report of Committees

The Board reviewed the updated list of committees. The Board agreed that Editorial Committee members should not have term

expiration dates and that the committee should be listed with other ACC Ad Hoc committees. The Secretary was directed to remove expiration dates and move the committee from "Standing Committees" to "Ad-Hoc Committees" in listings.

Electronic Communications Committee

(ECC): President Joanne Silver provided report from committee – some highlights: the ECC has completed many website updates; is reaching out to other ACC committees for input/updates; has started updating health databases; is reviewing PayPal tool for possible use in other areas; has the Facebook page up and running; and is discussing "Members Only" area options.

Field Trial Committee:

Vice President Linda Harger reviewed the schedule for the upcoming 2014 NFTS (July 21-24, 2014, Carnation, WA) and announced that the 2015 NFTS will be held in Kentucky with Mitch and Linda Patterson in charge.

Health Committee: There is an opening coming up and President Joanne Silver has discussed with Committee Chair Dr. James Stewart and they are looking for a volunteer. President Joanne Silver provided report from committee – some highlights: the committee has provided health articles for the ACC Bulletin; worked with the ACCCT to provide funding for canine bloat research, research on a new lymphoma vaccine and research on the treatment of Histoplasmosis in dogs. This was a significant elevation of participation in canine research by the ACC. The committee will be assisting the 2014 NSS with a health program featuring speaker Dr. Chris Zink. Dr Zink is a well-known speaker and expert in the area of exercise induced health problems in the performance dogs and conformation dog. She will deal with injury, treatment regimes and management of rehabilitation of the dog.

Hunt Test Committee: There is an opening coming up and various member names were suggested. Committee Chair Johnny Fogle should be asked for input. Director Mike Moscovitz reported that the ACC Hunt Test will be held at Cooper Black, SC.

Judge and Breeder Education Committee

(JBEC): President Joanne Silver provided report from committee – some highlights: The JBEC contacted all mentors to determine those willing to be ringside mentors/presenters for the Judges Education at the 2014 NSS

(received responses from 11 out of 16 and eight are willing to help as ringside mentors); approved Patty Martin and Dyane Baldwin to be the presenters for the Judges Seminar at the 2014 NSS; approved Michelle Keehn to be the presenter at the Michigan Judges Group in June of this year with a budget not to exceed \$200; approved the seminar of an outside speaker- Dr. Chris Zink - for the 2014 NSS and allocated \$500 of the JBEC budget to help with the cost. Nathaniel Horn presented a Judges Seminar/Workshop on February 25, 2014 at the Mason-Dixon Dog Judges Association.

Show Committee: Director Johanna Coutu reviewed highlights of the report submitted to President Joanne Silver. The 2013 NSS had a goal to return all of the \$5,000 seed money and show a little profit – they may have succeeded with that goal and will send the detailed accounting information to the Treasurer. The 2014 NSS is progressing well. All events (Tracking, Agility, Obedience, Rally, Conformation, Working Dog Stakes) progressing, No issues to report and AKC applications to be submitted in March. NSS Website available and link found on main ACC website and NSS Facebook page available as another source to keep folks engaged and share information. Trophies ordered and donations/ sponsorships being received. Several unique fundraising initiatives progressing. Seminars: Two (2) Seminars Planned - 1 Health and 1 Judges. Testing: CGC/CGCA and Therapy Dog tests will be offered. Triple Crown Versatility Challenge will be offered. Hospitality / Welcome Bags and Merchandising plans advancing. Challenge Trophies: Several in need of repair (Chris working on). Engravings for Winners from 2012 and 2013 NSS have not been done. We are examining best path forward to bring them up to date either before the 2014 NSS or wait until after and update them with all three years to save money and spare resources.

ACC Data Coordinator: The 2014 Directory is complete; approximately 80 members did not renew by the deadline. The Board discussed the non renewing members situation and suggested that Treasurer George Martinuss check with some of the non renewing folks and ask why they did not renew their ACC membership.

By Laws Committee: The updated By Laws were submitted to AKC on January 24, 2014. The Committee is waiting for a response.

Lifetime Achievement Award Committee:

Vice President Linda Harger and the committee are working on a candidate. Toni Raden is now the Committee Chair.

Unfinished Business

Accept the “Color In the Chesapeake Bay Retriever - revised January, 2014” as presented by the JBEC. Historic records show that some of the deadgrass shades can be very light, almost white in appearance, while darker deadgrass colors can include shades of brown called ash, that appear as either gray or taupe. These ash/taupe/gray shades are not commonly seen and are not preferred. As with all coat colors, the eyes must be of yellowish or amber color. The difference between a sedge and a deadgrass is that the deadgrass shades contain no significant amount of red, while sedge shades do have red. Coat and texture also play a factor in the perception of color.

The self color pattern is preferred by the standard (One color with or without lighter and darker shadings of the same color) You will see dogs with varying degrees of other markings such as: masking on topskull, striping effect of light and dark through body and on the legs, distinct and indistinct saddle markings, and tan points. While acceptable, they are not preferred and should not be disqualified. Considering that color counts for only 4 points in the Chesapeake standard, dogs with such markings should not be arbitrarily excluded from consideration. The other qualities of the dog that are more important to function, such as coat, angulation, head, balance and size, should be given the most consideration when judging. A good quality dog with minor pattern variations is preferable to a mediocre self colored specimen. It is true that these coloration patterns, at times, can be very pronounced. There have been judges who have disqualified dogs because of these patterns under the “specimens lacking breed characteristics” disqualification. Please note that characteristics is plural and color alone is not sufficient to warrant the use of this disqualification. **14:12** (Joanne Silver, Johanna Coutu) Unanimous.

Coursing Ability Test (CAT) President Joanne Silver would like to put in for one for all breeds and mixed breeds and so would Audrey Austin. Motion: ACC to host Coursing Ability Test (CAT) September 6 & 7, 2014 at Colt's Neck, NJ **14:15** (Linda Harger, Johanna Coutu) Unanimous.

The Board discussed the Pedigree Database, acknowledged Lisa Van Loo's efforts and concluded that the ACC should create and own an ACC database. The ACC database should be set up so members can update their own data and possibly be hosted in a “Members Only” area of the website. Canada has a database that allows members to enter updated information that is checked prior to approval and posting. President Joanne Silver will work with the ECC and talk to George Makatura about this initiative.

AKC Good Sportsmanship Award - President Joanne Silver received the medallion from the AKC and recommended that the Board vote on a candidate and that the candidates name be kept secret until we present it out at either the NFTS or NSS. Various names were suggested and the Board will discuss via email. The Board needs a list of prior recipients and also needs a list of Lifetime Achievement Award recipients.

New Membership Drive – President Joanne Silver discussed ideas on how to increase the ACC membership. Members get a Member with incentives (e.g.; current member signs up one new member and current member receives an ACC window decal). Discussion to be continued.

The following items will be discussed at the AKC March 11, 2014, Delegates Meeting. The Board agreed to provide the following input to ACC Delegate Tim Carrion:

- (ACC Board says to vote YES) - Vote on proposed amendment to **Chapter 8, Section 9**, of the *Field Trial Rules and Standard Procedures for Pointing Breeds*, which would allow a club at its discretion to provide lower entry fees for Junior Handlers. This same wording would be added to the applicable

section in the Field Trial Rules Applying to Spaniels, Retrievers, Beagles, Dachshunds and Basset Hounds.

- (ACC Board says to vote NO) Vote on proposed amendment to **Chapter 10, Sections 2 and 3**, of the *Field Trial Rules and Standard Procedures for Pointing Breeds - Protests Against Dogs*, which would add specifications regarding the individuals that may serve on an event committee when hearing a protest regarding a dog's eligibility to enter a stake/class, to help ensure the event committee is impartial.
- (ACC Board says to vote YES) - Vote on proposed amendment to **Delegate Standing Rule on Committees – Item III C. Obedience, Tracking and Agility** of the *Charter and Bylaws of The American Kennel Club*, which would change the name of the Delegate Obedience, Tracking and Agility Committee to the Delegate Companion Events Committee and to incorporate Rally into its charge.
- (Each ACC Board member to email/ provide concerns to Tim) - Read on proposed amendment to **ARTICLE VI, Section 5**, of the *Charter and Bylaws of The American Kennel Club*, which would remove restrictions on Delegate membership for certain classes of persons previously excluded from membership. It opens membership to judges who charge in excess of fees; professional handlers; persons who engage in the retail sale of dog food or dog supplies; or who publish or promote show dogs/ kennels through solicitation or acceptance of advertisements in commercial dog publications; and dog show superintendents. It also adds convictions for animal cruelty as a reason for not approving or for removing a Delegate.
- (ACC Board agrees) - Read on proposed amendment to **Chapter 14 New Section - Rules for Retriever Trials** of the *Field Trial and Standard Procedures for Retrievers*, which would create a new title that can be earned in Retriever Field Trials. The QA2 title (Qualified All-Age 2) is meant to acknowledge an intermediate level of achievement in order to encourage participants to remain active in the sport and their club.
