

Once again, the Chessie Field Trial folk and their dogs came together in July at beautiful Fall City Washington for the 2014 FT Specialty. It is about 30 miles east of Seattle in the lushly green foothills of the Cascade Range. Fall City and Monroe (near to the FT grounds) were quaint little former logging towns that begged to be explored.

Monday found several training groups in the area joining the few people that had come from the trial the weekend before in Junction City OR. I trained with a group (Dina Perugini, Diane Mazy, Breidi Gillespie, Jane Pappler and Tom Cox) at a farm that had been donated to Fall City as an educational/recreational area – less than two miles from town. (Dog training was allowed and it became a popular spot to air dogs. Mornings and evenings found several herds of elk right where we trained. WOW!). Afterward, I headed to beautiful Snoqualmie Falls for some sightseeing – well worth the visit.

Then it was time to head to the Blue Heron Golf Course for the kick-off banquet. It is always so nice to see old friends again and meet new ones (Brian West from Alberta Canada was our lone foreign visitor while Mike Moscovitz wins the award for coming the farthest – coast to coast with three dogs in tow!). We were able to socialize on a big deck

overlooking the course – snacking on appetizers to go with our favorite drinks. We also got our first opportunity to view the merchandise that was being offered. The embroidered logo (Brown dog in front of the green State of Washington) was very striking. It was the Field Trial's turn to have the annual meeting so Vice President Linda Harger called the



meeting to order with Secretary Lynda Barber-Wiltse present to take minutes. (Also present were Board Members Annette Monugian and Mike Moscovitz.) There were a few committee reports – including the announcement that the 2015 Field Trial Specialty would be held in Paducah

Kentucky in early October with Linda and Mitch Patterson chairing the trial. (Exact dates to be determined.) The 2016 FT Spec will be held in the Mountain Time Zone. With the business out of the way, we got onto the "good stuff." It was announced that a lifetime achievement award would be given out at the Show Specialty. Then Dual awards for 2013 (and two from 2012) were presented. (Please see the Secretary's report for the complete list.) But it was wonderful that many of the owners and their dogs were present to accept the awards for their dogs' accomplishments. Finally, it was with great pleasure that Linda presented a Lifetime Achievement Award to Tom Cox. (And I

believe it was the first time I have ever seen Tom speechless.) He has had Chesapeakes for 80 years and has served the American Chesapeake Club in many capacities including being an officer, chairing several FT Specialties, Bulletin FT editor and mentor for the Breed. His





acceptance speech was heartwarming. As they say, couldn't happen to a nicer guy." Congratulations Tom!

The starting numbers for the Open and Amateur were announced and the meeting was adjourned. Then it was time to eat!! A buffet of prime rib and salmon to go along with perfectly prepared vegetables and fresh fruit salad was presented. It was followed up with tasty dessert. And boy, the food was great!! We finally headed back to our hotels to air dogs & prepare for the next day.

Monday morning was beautiful – cool with dew on the grass but bright and sunny. Both the Open and Qualifying stated at Bert Carlson's Canine Country Club so the stakes were close by. The Qualifying got in two series but only one for the Open. After the day's work, we headed directly back to the near-by golf course. This time the buffet included stuffed chicken with heavenly mushroom sauce, perfectly prepared veggies, Caesar salad and dessert paired with our favorite beverages. This proved to be a shorter evening as everyone was anxious to start another day of trialing.

OPEN COMMENTARY

The first series of the Open was a triple with a long middle retired gun, left hand bird short second and live flyer shot to the right. The test proved to be very challenging due to terrain and cover changes. Each bird offered a challenge. Many dogs hunted the flier, others hunted the left hand bird but the long middle retired gun proved to be the most formidable of the marks. The terrain rolled to the right positioning dogs to hunt to the right of the mark with many leaving the area and being out of sight for a significant period of time. Thirteen of the twenty-five dogs that started the stake handled, with two being picked up by their handlers.

The second and third series was a double blind with an honor on a single mark. Dogs picked up the single thrown to the left of the land blind, and then returned to run the land and water blinds. The land blind involved an entry into the water, up across a point, a reentry back into the water to the far shore where the bird was planted. Dogs returned to run the water blind which was down a channel with dogs having to catch the grassy area of a point, and then continue back into the channel to the end where they left the water to the bird up on the shore.

The fourth series was a demanding water triple. Shot first was a long middle bird retired bird on the far right shore involving several in and outs across fingers of land, close to the flier. A shorter right hand bird was shot second and thrown across a channel into lilies at the waters edge. The last bird down was a flier which was shot to the left and back with a line that included two in and outs. Each bird offered its own challenges but it was evident which dogs marked the long retired bird.

(FT editor note: As Tom Cox mentioned in the last sentence of his Amateur report, our multi-talented Chessies had three CH finish the Open too. CK)

QUALIFYING COMMENTARY

The Qualifying began at 9:00 AM Tuesday. Judges were Bob Dahlheim and Jon Otto. Test dog was Alabama Moon Bear, run by Clayton Evans. This series was a triple, with a long flyer up the middle. The right hand memory bird was retired, but the short left hand mark proved even more problematic for some teams. There were some interesting terrain changes for the dogs to deal with in this series, as they ran in wonderfully overcast, cool weather. Many of these dogs had come from much warmer climates, so the change was a welcome one for those teams.

The second series was a land blind, again with terrain changes. The line ran close by the flyer from the first series, past duck crates. Four dogs were dropped from this series, including my own (I had dropped my mega whistle in the grass, and had a little orange back up whistle which I now know that Ruckus doesn't recognize...)

Twelve dogs moved on to the challenging water blind 125-130 yards out. Dogs ran downhill, had an angle entry, then LOTS of lily pads on the left to contend with. Many attempted to exit to the land and run the bank, instead of persevering through the lily pad obstacle. Those that stuck with the line then had a slight uphill run to the bird.

Wednesday began with eight dogs back in an absolute downpour, changing to just a hard drizzle later in the day. Judges, handlers and gunners contended with what Western Washington is known for much of the day; the dogs didn't appear to notice. One long water mark, with an in-your-face flyer faced the remaining dogs, with seven successfully completing the Qualifying.

Congratulations to Qualifying winner Crossfire Empire Builder (O/H Paul Gilmore), all the finishers, and a big thank you to our judges for their hard work in the elements, as well as our gunners and blind planter.

AMATEUR COMMENTARY

By Tom Cox (ID)

The Amateur started Wednesday after completion of the Open. Judges John Otto and Bob Dahlheim set up an interesting combination double and blind on a large, grassy field at Bert Carlson's Canine Country Club. Dogs ran from a high bank that gave a good view of the test, but made holding the initial line difficult. Some distance out on the right was a small hill with a tree, a gunner stood up the slope of the hill near the tree and threw a dead bird downhill to the left so it landed at the toe of the hill. While the second bird was being thrown, this gunner retired.



A second station well out in the field and slightly to the left shot a flier mallard to the left and slightly back. The ducks were healthy, mature birds that flew well. Contestants were instructed

to pick up one bird (which inevitably was the flier) and then pick up a blind which had been planted well deep and slightly to the right of the flier station. After that they were free to get the retired memory bird.

The line to the blind was close behind the flier boxes, across a swale, and then well out in the field. The line to the blind was through a crescent of plowed ground close to the flier station. The judges commented that those who missed the plowed area en route to the blind need not expect to be called back.

Work on this double test varied considerably. The grass hid the flier unless the dogs were close, and a variety of hunts resulted. Some dogs, not wanting to go so close to the flier boxes, tended to flare off the line to the blind and missed the crescent of plowed ground. There was a good deal of similarity to the field both in front of and behind the blind, so handlers had difficulty judging the depth of blind. Once past the bird, they had difficulty getting their dogs to come in toward it. A light breeze from left to right was no help on this.

Hunts on the retired bird to the right were often extensive. Dogs tended to pull up the hill to where the gunner had stood and to establish their hunts there. After hunting there for a good bit, several worked their way out into the field well away from the bird. The judges clearly preferred a quick handle to a hunt over a large area; some who had extensive hunts were not called back, while some good handles were. This was in line with the recommendations of AKC's Field Trial Advisory Committee, a recommendation which is often ignored. Sixteen of the twenty-five starters were called back for the water tests.

Water work commenced early Thursday morning with a single water blind. A gunner in white, sitting on the slope to the left of a pond threw a poison bird to the edge of the pond and then sat in plain sight. The starting mat was back a good distance from the edge of the water. The line to the blind ran downhill through some cattails, across a sizeable bay, across a high, fat point, and then across another bay. The bird was some sixty yards back

DERBY COMMENTARY

The 2014 Derby started off Wednesday afternoon with a steady rain and cool temperatures that the dogs enjoyed. The judges, Mary Ahlgren and Gary Ahlgren, set-up the first three series as singles from the same line and the dogs ran outside, outside, inside.

The first mark was an 83-yard exciting live flyer thrown down a tree line. The second mark was approximately 150 degrees from the first mark at 138 yards. The line to the bird was down a hill, through cover, requiring the dogs to then push back up a hill. The third single was down the center of the first two marks at 163 yards with the bird thrown out from the tree line. The performance varied from front-footing the marks to small and large hunts.

The fourth series was a land/water double with the water mark as the go-bird, landing about 20 yards up on the opposite shore. The water mark was 124 yards including heavy vegetation that the dogs had to push through on the opposite bank. The memory bird was 166 yards, and the line to the bird was angling across a road, and then pushing down through grass to the mark.

Julie Cole had the privilege of running her daughter Jennifer Matteoli's Chesapeake, Crackshot's Rice Rocket who proved to be the strongest performer of the event with solid marks through all four series, taking 1st place. Rudy's Chasing Minnesota Fatz, owned and handled by Ed Bahr, captured 2nd place. Cathy Scroggins, handling in her first Field Trial event, took third place with Platte River's Decoy Dancer. Fourth place was captured by Westwind Whispering Cove Jay, owned and handled by Michael Moscovitz.

from the edge of this second bay. Dogs were out of sight after passing through the cattails and again after going over the point. When the dogs reappeared several were pulling hard for the poison bird. Not all handlers were able to persuade their dogs that this was a bad idea. Even some handlers who got their dogs to the far side of the second bay found their dogs still wanting to curl back to the poison bird. Eight dogs were called back after the water blind.

The fourth series was a water-land triple on the same pond as the water blind, but running across it in a different direction. Two guns on the right side of the pond, up the shore, threw birds on a tight angle back away from the edge of the water. Dogs then had to

turn a good 140 degrees to the left for the third bird, a flier. The flier gunners were on a small hill, shooting out to the left so that the birds landed in the green field. After getting the flier and making



the big turn back to the right, a lot of dogs had trouble with the down-the-shore double. Only three dogs did the test correctly (they took the first three places), while three handled and two picked up. Julie Cole's AFC Crackshot Ruddy Duck was declared the winner; Jane Pappler's CH Redlion's Notorious Wren was second; Diane Mazy's CH Risky River Bodacious was third; and Brett Crow's Fireweed's Poison Ivy fourth. The Reserve JAM went to Rudd McClory's Freezer's Bold Contention. A Judges' Awards of Merit went to Edgar Johnson's Coventry Hills Go Go Jasmine MH. With these results, Edgar and Diane's dogs became Qualified All-Age. Again demonstrating our breed's versatility, two of the placing dogs were also conformation champions.





Commentary from Judge Dyane Baldwin

The hospitality of the Swedish Chesapeake Club is legendary. This year was no exception. Although, the temperature was more like the US than Sweden-at least little humidity. The venue is charming and beautiful and dog/exhibitor friendly. The meals were delicious and served in

a pleasant atmosphere. But the best was the sportsmanship and friendliness of the exhibitors. It just made it such an enjoyable event for everyone-win or lose.

I looked forward with anticipation to return to Sweden after 16 yrs. to see how I found the breed since my previous judging in 1998. Thank-you so much for the invitation to return.

The breeders have done an excellent job in improving angulations, proportions and heads. As before, coats were consistently correct with only the occasional soft coat. Most dogs have balance of positive virtues which is not as easy to maintain as one might think. What a pleasure to see so many correct "Chesapeake" heads with length of muzzle, thin lips and the overall correct head proportions- NO Lab impersonators here ! Scissors bites were the rule with one or two level bites. It was especially nice to see very few dogs too long in the loin-freight train backs not ! Bone, rib spring and body depth was the rule rather than the exception. The dogs were presented in good flesh and condition. I have to say that movement in the rear was better than seen on average back in the States. Side movement showed power and drive. A job well done breeders!

The WD/X/Q is well regarded in Europe and the titles are sought after. This year I got to judge along with Bosse Nilsson, who was fun and easy to judge with. Nearly all of the failures in all levels were due more to not enough training or handler inexperience-not lack of natural instinct. The handler inexperience was most evident in the X which cost many a dog to not pass. I know for some entrants finding water to train on is very difficult. None of the dogs were gun shy and bird handling was good.

In Sweden, they ran a Master Class with the tests modeled on European style trials. Bosse put together tests with dogs running in pairs and multiple dogs on line- the steadiness of the dogs was impressive. It was interesting to see how well the dogs marked and hunted with so many birds thrown at once and each dog taking turns to retrieve while the others sat and looked on. There were considerable

intervals between each dog's work. The winner picked up all the birds!

Nature vs. Nurture

THE FEAR FACTOR: MORE COMPLICATED THAN WE THOUGHT

As dog owners, breeders, and rescue volunteers, we have long recognized that fearfulness is one of the least desirable traits in dogs. Fear-based behaviors are often difficult to mitigate effectively, especially in the hands of a novice trainer. Most aggression has a basis in fear and fear biters can be some of the most dangerous and unpredictable dogs. Separation anxiety tries the souls of the most patient dog owners and treatment often remains elusive. Reactive dogs can be managed but they are a nuisance and owners find themselves avoiding some of the simplest things like walking down the street because all the hysterical fear reactions in their dogs are too stressful and embarrassing. If you have ever had a period in your life where you experienced intense and prolonged anxiety (and who hasn't?), you can imagine that being a dog who spends the majority of its life in that state lives in sheer misery. For our dogs' sakes, we want to minimize the development of irrational fears. (By "irrational" I mean that the fear is not based on any actual threat; all behavior has some kind of rationality in context.)



We have long known that the period of critical socialization is between three weeks and sixteen weeks where exposure to new situations, sounds, and all types of people and animals is essential to building confident puppies who can easily fit into the average home. It is still the gold standard of best practices in raising pups. Because there is a range of temperaments in a litter raised identically, we know there is a genetic factor to behavior or all pups raised the same would be the same. Better breeders will not breed a dog who shows signs of abnormal fearfulness and that's just common sense but how fears are passed on genetically is still a bit of a mystery. And things just got a lot weirder.

A study published in the journal *Nature Neuroscience* brings new light on the genetic inheritability of traits we thought were learned. The scientific word for this is called "epigenetic" inheritance. In this study, traumatic experiences were transmitted into the next generation through genetic markers that were incorporated into the genetic code. The remarkable study was done on mice at Emory University. (Yes, I know that mice are not dogs or people but we are all mammals with the same basic anatomy.)

Adult male mice were conditioned to fear the scent of almond cherry blossom by blowing the odor into their cages right before shocking them through the feet. It didn't take long before the delivered scent caused the mice to completely panic in anticipation of the shock. After the fear was consistently conditioned, sperm was collected from these mice, females were artificially inseminated with it, and the offspring were allowed to mature. They had no contact with their sires. When the adult offspring were exposed to the scent of almond cherry blossom, they went into the same panic although they had never been exposed to it before. When their brains were later examined, these second generation mice had developed a greater number of olfactory neurons sensitive to the scent of almond cherry blossom than neurons sensitive to other odors. This physical effect was seen into the third generation of these mice. As a control, the offspring of the "cherry blossom" mice were exposed to other scents and there was no reaction. The fear was specific only to the scent that had traumatized the fathers and grandfathers.

Studies in people have shown that populations experiencing trauma- Holocaust survivors, survivors of wars or famines- also show traumatic psychological effects into the third generation, even when the second and third generation have not experienced the same conditions. We have always assumed that severely traumatized people just make lousy parents and it is a question of nurture rather than nature but now we can't be so sure. The study of epigenetic inheritance is a rapidly growing field with our new-found technologies of peering into the genomes of different species. It is still in its infancy and treated with skepticism by some parts of the scientific community. We can't leap to conclusions from the experiences of a few unfortunate mice but this is real food for thought and another reminder that what we do know can always be challenged by exploring what we don't know.

Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the American Chesapeake Club

The annual meeting of the AMERICAN CHESAPEAKE CLUB, a California Nonprofit public benefit corporation, was called to order at 6:35 PM PDT, Monday, July 21, 2014. The meeting was held in Carnation, WA at the 2014 NFTS.

American Chesapeake Club LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

The ACC Lifetime Achievement Award recognizes personal achievement / its positive impact on the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed. The award may be given to any individual independent of specific institutional affiliation with the American Chesapeake Club or other organizations.

The ACC Lifetime Achievement Award is not an annual award. The awards selection committee may decide not to make any awards selection in a given year or may decide to bestow multiple awards. The number / frequency of award selection is strictly at the discretion of the awards selection committee.

Nominations may be submitted by organizations or individuals, including the nominees themselves.

AWARDS CRITERIA

Nominees are judged by the originality, vision, breadth, / impact of the entire body of their work. Candidate selection must go beyond mere name recognition / reputation. A nominee's work is evaluated in such areas as:

- A strong / well-documented commitment to the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed.
- Vocal / written advocacy of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed today.
- Advancement of best practices in owning, training, competing, rescuing / breeding Chesapeake Bay Retrievers.
- Service to the community / the public in connection with the Chesapeake Bay Retriever as a breed, in competition, to owners / through rescue efforts.

JUDGING

Nominations will be evaluated on the criteria provided above. The names of the award winner(s), if any, will be announced prior to the annual American Chesapeake Club Meeting during the National Specialty Show. The formal presentation of any award will take place at the Specialty.

Dual Champion Sodak's Gypsy Prince - Breeder: Rev. Schuster; Owner: Chesacroft Kennel (A. Bliss); Trainer: Charles Morgan. "Prince" was the first dual champion retriever of any retrieving breed. He was the second Chesapeake to make a field title. Prince was a medium sized deadgrass dog with an intense desire to work especially in icy water. He had a lifetime total of 14 pts. Today all field trial Chesaapeakes trace back to Prince through his son Chesacroft Baron ***.

FC Shagwong Gypsy - Breeder: C A Smith; Owner & Trainer: E. Monroe Osborne. "Gypsy" was the first Chesapeake bitch to earn a field trial championship (1939). She was the runt of her litter – a royally bred litter. Her sire was FC Skipper Bob and her maternal grandsire was Dual Ch Sodak's Gypsy Prince. Run by her owner Ed Osborne, Gypsy had 31 Open pts. and ran/completed the first National Open in 1941.


