THE DOGS

THE BREED IN THE 1930'S

The popularity of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever continued to grow through the 30's and up to WWII. They were popular for hunting, field trials and shows. The 1930's and the ACC were hugely influenced by Tony Bliss, Jr. He took over the club (age 19) when it was nearly out of members and in a short time turned around its fortunes. The new sport of field trialing begun in 1931 provided a new proving ground for hunting abilities. Tony Bliss was one of the driving forces in the development of field trials. The American Chesapeake Club made considerable contributions to the development of the field trials (and later the AKC Hunt Test program). Then much more than now, the stakes more closely approximated hunting situations. There were a number of significant kennels in this time span: Chesacraft, Dilwyne, Shagwong, Grizzly Island, and Lake Como to name but a few.

Retriever trials using water as a component are an American idea generally credited to Eltinge Warner, publisher of Field & Stream. He organized the first "water" trial held in 1914 in East Hampton, NY on Georgica Pond. These informal water events continued until the advent of AKC retriever trials in 1932. The early informal trials were open to all breeds as the photo below shows.

The ACC held its first AKC field trial in 1932 at Islip, NY and continued the emphasis on water tests. This emphasis is what ended up distinguishing the American trial scene from the British. In England, water work was incidental in the trials and land work accounted for bulk of the testing. This was the era of Skipper Bob, Dilwyne Montauk Pilot & Sodak's Gypsy Prince. The sport of field trials was popular among the society crowd. Reports appeared in the NY newspapers and various magazines of the time.

In the conformation area, the national specialty show resumed after 7 yrs. (first one held in 1926). They were hosted at the prestigious Morris & Essex Show from 1933 to 1939. Many of the dogs run in the field were also consistently competing in the conformation shows.

FC Skipper Bob - He was the unquestioned star of the early field trial scene. He was owned and run by Harry Conklin of Amagansett, NY. Skipper Bob was the first Chesapeake to make a FC title. He was known for his intelligence and his ability to mark (remember the fall of the bird) no matter how difficult. At his first trial at 14 mos., he was first in the Puppy stake and second in the all-age (CBRS only) and second in the all-age, all-breed.

Many of the early competitors were sired by him- his daughter FC Shagwong Gypsy was the first female Chesapeake to make a FC title.

FC Dilwyne Montauk Pilot - Pilot was a full brother to Skipper Bob. In 1936, he won the Field & Stream trophy as the best retriever of the year- the first and only CBR thus honored. He was purchased by Dilwyne Kennels and it is under their ownership that he came into his own at the trials. **See cover picture.**

Dual Ch Sodak's Gypsy Prince - He won first in the Open at the 1936 & 1937 ACC FT and was officially awarded his FC 12/10/1936. In 1937, he completed his bench title and became the **FIRST Dual Champion** of any of the retrievers (the first dual Labrador didn't title until 1941). What was he like? His trainer, Charles Morgan, offers this description of Prince- "Tony Bliss had me get Sodak's Gypsy Prince out to show off to some aristocratic friends how Prince broke ice. We did not realize how thick the ice had frozen that night. Prince with his flying leap off the



high bank hit the ice with a terrific impact and skidded on top of it to the duck. After this experience I was afraid Prince wouldn't hit the water or break ice, but he did just as hard as before."

FC Shagwong Gypsy - She was the first Chesapeake bitch to make a FC title. Of course with her pedigree, what could one expect? Her sire was Skipper Bob and her dam was a daughter of Sodak's Gypsy Prince! She was a good looking dog too. Gypsy was run and trained by E. "Ed" Monroe Osborne and competed in the first Open National. Ed described her as a consistent dog and always an excellent marker. She was also a pleasure to handle too.

FC Shagwong Gypsy – The First Female FC

Ch Shinnecock Belle*** - Belle was a 1/2 sister to Skipper Bob (same dam) and was owned by Walter Roesler, Jr. In 1938 she was BOB at the ACC National Show Specialty. She was especially admired for her thick coarse coat and lovely correct head. In the field she amassed 6.5 Open pts.

Ch Bud Parker's Ripple - Ripple was purchased from Canadian breeder George Fairbairn by Tony Bliss. Ripple won the 1933 National Specialty show.



Bliss considered her one of the finest he ever owned. Her size, proportions, water resistant coat and her head were qualities that earned her this praise.

THE KENNELS

Chesacroft - In December 1932, Anthony Bliss of Oyster Bay, NY purchased the rights to the Chesacroft name and the remaining Hurst stock. Bliss was from a wealthy family and was determined to popularize America's own sporting dog. He was 8 yrs. old when he was given his first CBR. From that dog, he grew to know the breed from this first dog's nature and retrieving instinct. Among his dogs: Dual Ch Sodak's Gypsy Prince, Ch Busy B- his favorite dog, Ch Bud Parkers Ripple, Ch Airline Theresa- BOB 1935 & 36 Westminster.

Grizzly Island - The kennel was located in Solano County, CA. and was owned by Louis Traung. Mr. Traung advertised his breeding program combined the best of the FT and bench lines- Chesacroft and Dilwyne. From his brochure- "They both (Ch Nippy Bob & Ch Dotty) love to hunt and retrieve and are very courageous. There is a complete out-cross of bloodlines in their pedigree, which also contains 21 champions of record."

Dilwyne - One of the most famous kennel names in the breed, "Dilwyne" was the prefix of R.R.M. Carpenter, Jr. Similar to Bliss, Bob Carpenter was given his first CBR by his father as a young boy. Just as similar Bob Carpenter came from a wealthy background- he was one of the heirs to the Du Pont fortune. His first Chesapeake "Tim" lived to the ripe old age of 17 and was the impetus for his interest in the breed. In 1931, the kennel started to acquire some of the finest bloodlines available with the main interest field trials. In 1935, a magnificent and modern kennel was built in Montchanin, Delaware- the location of Dilwyne Farm.

In 1935, Carpenter purchased, against the advice of nearly everyone, Montauk Pilot. Pilot supposedly washed out of the trials and was sent to Harry Conklin who had owned his brother FC Skipper Bob. Under Conklin's training and with Dilwyne added to his name, Pilot returned to top form. In 1936, he won the Field & Stream trophy as the best retriever of the year- the only CBR thus honored. 1936 was a sensational year for the kennel!

Thru the 1940's and 50's, while dogs were kept at the kennel, Bob Carpenter's interests shifted to business ventures. In 1959, in partnership with Jesse Mitchell, the Dilwyne name reappeared on the field trial scene. In 1971, Dilwyne Jez O' Meg qualified for the National Amateur. Bob Carpenter died in 1990.

Shagwong - Prefix of E. "Ed" Monroe Osborne located in Three Mile Harbor, NY. The first FC female Chesapeake was owned, bred and trained by Mr. Osborne. His other well known dog was FC Guess of Shagwong named for his unusual color. Guess' story will appear in the 1940's article. I had the pleasure of visiting the Osbornes at their home in 1990 thru 1993. Like many others, WWII interrupted the breeding of CBRs at Shagwong. Ethel described giving away dogs because of rationing. After the war, their interests started turning to sailing and custom yacht building. Although they stopped breeding, Ed did judge the National in 1945 and continued to judge field trials through the 1960's. He was in attendance at the first National Amateur in 1957 and at the first Master National in 1991.

Lake Como - The name of Charles Berg's kennel outside Philadelphia, Pa. Mr. Berg had a keen interest in the breed from the early 30's. He focused mainly on conformation with a goal of producing dogs that combined the best of the western and eastern types. Berg was an avid duck hunter and considered the Chesapeake a superior water dog. He served as a regional director for the ACC 1936-1937 and also was an approved judge of the breed. Some of his dogs were: Ch Bud Parkers Prince 1931 & imported from Canada; Ch Floating Power (BW/WD 1933 ACC Specialty Show); and Ch Old Delaware Princess.

Chesdel - The prefix used by Alex Spear for his Chesapeake breedings. Alex's interest in field work pre-dated the first formal trials. There were informal retrieving competitions held often in the marsh and fields of Delaware and Alex was a consistent competitor. His first litter was from his bitch Dapper Dell whom he purchased from Harry Conklin. He also owned Skipper's Babe, a full sister to Shagwong Gypsy. In 1937, Alex and Skipper's Babe won the local stake at the ACC Trial in Benton, MD. From his 1936 litter breeding to Ch Dilwyne Jumping Joe, Alex's first home bred FT dog was born- Chesdel Joe***. Of course Alex's most famous competitor was FC/AFC/CFC/CAFC Chesdel Chippewa Chief.

The 1930's were the good times for the breed-registrations and interest were high; membership in the ACC had risen; the breed was competing successfully in field trials; and a new standard was adopted to bring the western and eastern strains together. Then came December 1941 and it all changed.

USDAA 2014 Top Ten awards & Championships

"Jill" ADCH-Gold MACH3 Rippling Waters Jill SCH-P TQX MXG MJG MFB T2B3 (CH Rippling Waters Purple Haze MH X CH Rippling Waters BB MH) finished the 2014-15 agility season with three Championships, AKC MACH3 and USDAA ADCH-Silver/Gold. 


New Companion Dog Excellent (CDX)

Health Committee Report

The Value of Stored DNA for The Future Health of The Chesapeake Bay Retriever

The ACC Board of Directors (BOD), The ACC Charitable Trust (ACCCT), the Orthopedic Foundation for Animals CHIC DNA Repository (OFA) and the ACC Canine Health Foundation (ACCCHF) are partnering to sponsor a blood collection from our dogs at the National Show Specialty (NSS) and our National Field Trial Specialty (NFTS).

The purpose of this blood draw is to collect and store DNA for future investigation of canine diseases of our dogs. This will include diseases which we know and diseases which we find in the future. The clear overall purpose is stated below.

Frequently Asked Questions about the CHIC DNA Repository

Mission Statement:

The CHIC DNA Repository, sponsored by the OFA, collects and stores canine DNA samples along with corresponding genealogic and phenotypic information to facilitate future research and testing aimed at reducing the incidence of inherited disease in dogs.

Objectives:

1. Facilitate more rapid research progress by expediting the sample collection process
2. Provide researchers with optimized family groups needed for research
3. Allow breeders to take advantage of future DNA based disease tests as they become available
4. Foster a team environment between breeders/owners and the research community improving the likelihood of genetic discovery

The fact that our Degenerative Myelopathy (DM) research is taking place where the DNA is stored, makes this a natural starting place for investigation. The fact that DNA is stored with a medical history makes it available to immeasurable numbers of high quality investigators of unlimited topics.

There is no cost to the donors, just the need to fill out the forms shown in the ACC Bulletin. These forms could be cutouts from the Bulletin or obtained on line at:

www.caninehealthinfo.org/chic_dnabankapp_main.pdf

There is only the need to bring your dogs for an onsite collection of blood. The blood will be drawn by veterinarians or licensed veterinary technicians. All transport will be done by ACC staff.

The completed forms need to be returned by mail to Dr. James Stewart, 2752 Daisy Road, Woodbine, MD 21797. The forms may be returned double sealed with the owner's name and the dog's name on the outer envelope along with which Specialty they are attending. This will assure confidentiality and pairing the correct medical history with the correct blood sample. The completed forms must be received at least one month prior to the National Show Specialty or National Field Trial Specialty. This is necessary for the ordering of materials for blood collections and to anticipate the time allotted for technicians to collect blood.

There are no quick rewards on this DNA banking, other than the increased availability for the DM study. Long term will be significant health protection and access to disease prevention for our breed for at least the next decade and probably longer. Help serve and protect our dogs, they do it for us every day!

Canine Influenza – It's Back – It's Different

Much has been reported recently on Canine Influenza. It is my intention to give the ACC Members accurate and up to date information.

1. This canine influenza is a completely new strain. There is presently no documentation that the vaccine used for last year's strain H3N8 will have any protection against the new H3N2 strain.
2. There is no connection between Canine Influenza and "Kennel Cough" (canine infectious tracheobronchitis) other than some of their clinical signs.
3. A dog cannot give Canine Influenza to a human. A human can carry the virus to a dog on their clothes, hands or other areas of previous contact with an infected dog.
4. 80% of the dogs exposed to Canine Influenza will show clinical signs of the disease.

Fortunately, like the human flu virus, it kills very few healthy individuals. Less than 10% of the dogs infected die and are mostly the result of secondary infection (usually bacterial) acquired after the initial infection. Most dogs recover in 2-3 weeks.

5. The virus is present in saliva, urine, feces and blood. Because of this it can be on the animal's hair and could easily go to your clothes or hands.
6. The virus is easily killed by disinfectants such as bleach, phenol and quarternary ammonia compounds.
7. The virus may live in the environment for 48 hours. It may live on clothing for 24 hours, and on hands for 12 hours.
8. The incubation period is two to four days from exposure to clinical signs. Dogs are most infectious during the incubation period while showing no signs. Virus shedding can last for 10-14 days.

These are the most useful, confirmed facts that I could find. The major reporting states of disease are Illinois, Indiana, Ohio, and Wisconsin. No one has yet reported a new vaccine in production.


Hunt Test Headlines

Ken has been hunting with dogs for 50 plus years and watches Alley more than he watches the sky because Alley sees the birds coming before he does. During Alley's first month of hunting, we were in a stand up blind and dropped three Widgeon from a flight. One bird came down behind us in the tullies that none of us saw. Alley ran straight to the patch of tullies and brought back the crippled bird. Alley also retrieved two geese on the last day of the season. Even though she was unfamiliar with such a big bird (it was half the size she was) she retrieved it without hesitation.

Drake and Alley retrieved 34 birds between them in two days of hunting. By seasons end, they were close to 100 birds retrieved between the two of them. Both dogs have gone above and beyond our expectations in the field and at home. We are looking forward to seeing how far these dogs advance in the years to come.

- Vocal / written advocacy of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed today.
- Advancement of best practices in owning, training, competing, rescuing / breeding Chesapeake Bay Retrievers.
- Service to the community / the public in connection with the Chesapeake Bay Retriever as a breed, in competition, to owners / through rescue efforts.

JUDGING

Nominations will be evaluated on the criteria provided above. The names of the award winner(s), if any, will be announced prior to the annual American Chesapeake Club Meeting during the National Specialty Show. The formal presentation of any award will take place at the Specialty.

CODE OF ETHICS – AMERICAN CHESAPEAKE CLUB

Love / respect of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever is implicit in membership in the American Chesapeake Club. Therefore, all members agree to foster the goals set forth in the code of Ethics.

I. RESPONSIBILITIES OF MEMBERS

- a. Read / familiarize yourself with the American Chesapeake Breed Standard for the Chesapeake Bay Retriever that is approved by the American Kennel Club. Support / abide by the rules of the American Chesapeake Club / The American Kennel Club.
- b. Appreciate the unique nature of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever / try to develop the characteristics this dog has inherited through selective breeding (intelligence, desire to mark / retrieve with style, love of water / keen scenting ability).
- c. Assume the responsibility of proper feeding, maintenance, health care, and training at all times.
- d. Always conduct yourself in a manner which will reflect credit on yourself / the breed. Refrain from public criticism or malicious degrading of other or their dogs.
- e. Never knowingly sell or place a Chesapeake Bay Retriever with unethical persons or those who would not provide proper / humane care to the dog. Refuse to sell any Chesapeake Bay Retriever to any pet shop or to any wholesale dealer in dogs.
- f. Should you become aware of the mistreatment, abuse or need for relocation of any Chesapeake Bay Retriever, make every effort to be of assistance by notifying the breeder of the dog involved, the appropriate local authorities / helping in any other way in which you are able.

- a. Do not breed Chesapeake Bay Retrievers that are not registered by the American Kennel Club or by kennel clubs recognized by the American Kennel Club.
- b. Strive in each breeding to improve the breed according to the ACC Breed Standard. Conscientiously plan each breeding, based on parents of appropriate temperament, appearance / other desirable qualities.
- c. Be aware of genetic defects which can be harmful to the breed. When breeding, endeavor to select animals that will reduce the incidence genetic problems while enhancing the positive attributes / abilities of the breed. Be open with all persons interested in the welfare of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever / discuss possible physical or temperament defects in your own stock.
- d. Do not breed any bitch who is not mature (never before the second heat) or in good health. Do not allow puppies to go to their new homes until at least 7 weeks of age.
- e. Act responsibly toward all puppies produced by your brood bitch or stud dog for the lifetime of the puppies. (Recommend that the breeder encourage the owner to contact him if he can no longer keep a dog at any time in the dog's life).
- f. Understand that written contracts are strongly recommended for all transactions, such as sales, guarantees, co-ownerships, breeding rights agreements, bitch leases, stud services, etc. Keep accurate records / pedigrees / give new owners registration papers or forward as soon as possible.
- g. Use / promote the use of the American Kennel Club non-breeding registration on pet quality puppies which are sold or placed by you.

- II. RESPONSIBILITIES OF BREEDERS / BROOD BITCH / STUD DOG** (The American Chesapeake Club Board of Directors strongly recommends that only animals with current OFA/CERF/PRA clearances be used for breeding).

AKC Delegate's Report

The 2014 AKC Breed statistics rank the Chesapeake #41 in popularity based on 2242 new dog registrations. Litter registration ranked 51 with a 620 litters involving a total of 4060 puppies. The average Chesapeake litter was 6.5 puppies. Approximately 55% of eligible puppies are eventually registered with the AKC. This is a better percentage than many other breeds.

The AKC Board of Directors approved the Chesapeake to participate in Spaniel Upland Hunt Test as of July 1, 21015. This regulation change involved nearly a year and I would to thank Joanne Silver and Dyane Baldwin for their help.

ACC member since 1972. I rescued my first Chesapeake from the Anchorage (AK) dog pound, bought my first puppy (foundation bitch "Fireweed") 6 months later and the rest as they say is history.

I have bred, raised, trained, campaigned, lived with and loved the breed since then. My kennel has produced, raised and/or trained multiple Field Champions/amateur field champions, including 5 Duals, many dogs with bench, obedience, hunt/field titles and even more that are just great pets and gun dogs. I have competed in most venues of retriever competition for too many years to count . . . :-).

I have been an officer of several retriever clubs including the national clubs. I have put on several FT Specialties, WD days and fun days.

I have a lot of FT judging experience including a National Open.

I have been a board member for 3 years and VP for 3 years.

I think I have the knowledge and the common sense to make a good officer for this club.

Vice President - George Marthinuss (NC)

My Goals: To promote the breed through responsible training, competing and breeding.

How I Will Accomplish My Goals: In training my chessies for hunt tests and field trials I will expect them to learn and grow with a firm (but never a harsh) training program. Praise for good work and corrections for poor work.

We will compete in as many hunt tests and field trials that I can travel by truck to each year. Last year we competed in many hunt

tests and field trials. We brought home over 30 ribbons, many Master Hunter passes, several placements in field trial qualifications, and three qualifications for the US Master National.

I will be a responsible breeder by breeding only to increase the number of chessies that have the proper health clearances. Exceptions (nothing that would endanger a litter) will only be made to continue a line that has outstanding Field Champions or Master Hunters.

My Chessies: I own or co-own 8 Chesapeake Bay Retrievers (also a Labrador Retriever). I acquired my first chessie in 1993. Bear passed in 2005. Sheba was acquired in 2002; Lebo in 2004; Patti, Dylan, and Jake (litter mates) in 2006; Scout in 2007; and Ossie in 2009 and Malli in 2011.

placements) and obedience (Utility titles, national rankings) competitions. Offered ACC Memorial Obedience trophy (1997 in memory of Shemya) for ACC member/ dog earning highest total score attaining Utility Dog Title. Her progeny achieved multiple High-in-Trials from Novice, Open and Utility, group placements, GCh, field (MH, QAA) and MACH/agility competitions. Pups from eight Nuka Bay litters earned 325 titles (33 conformation; 50 obedience; 47 rally; 18 CGC/CGN; 27 field; 149 agility; and 1 CA). In the late 70's/early 80's, I served the ACC as the Florida RD. Since moving to Tennessee in 2002, I worked with Sally Gervin, the TN RD, in serving our breed through Chessie Days, holding a WD/X/Q test, and being a resource. Unfortunately, we lost Sally in 2012 so I applied to become the new TN RD. We have our annual Chessie Days and held a Supported Entry chaired by Angie and Brian Cox two years ago. Our Chessie Day usually has people from TN, GA, MS, KY, FL and SC attending.

I participate in conformation, obedience, rally, fieldwork and recently started tracking. I currently have three Chessies in my home and co-own four others with family/close friends. A good friend had a litter of Chesapeake puppies in the fall of 1990, and that was the beginning of my relationship with Chesapeakes. Chico was a duck-hunting dog with little training, yet I enjoyed watching him use his natural ability of picking up ducks. I was only blessed with him for a short time.

In the spring of 1991, I got my second Chesapeake, Beamer. Beamer and I spent endless hours duck hunting in Canada and northern Minnesota. Beamer was an excellent family dog, seeming to watch over my son as they grew up together. The bond he created within my family was indescribable. Beamer possessed amazing retrieval skills without being formally trained. He lived for fourteen and a half years. Losing him was an extremely sad experience.

From the ACC Bylaws page 16-17, Section 7. Elections, B. Nominations, subsections 2 and 3

(3) If no valid additional nominations are received by the Secretary on or before August 1st, the Nominating Committee's slate shall be declared elected, and no balloting will be required. The new officers and directors will take office on October 1st.

Minutes of January 20, 2015 Regular Board Meeting

A regular meeting of the board of directors of the AMERICAN CHESAPEAKE CLUB, a California Nonprofit public benefit corporation was called to order 7:04 PM EST, Tuesday, January 20, 2015. The meeting was held by telephone conference call through which all persons participating in the meeting could hear and speak to one another.

The following officers and directors were present: President Joanne Silver, Vice President Linda Harger, Treasurer George Marthinuss, Secretary Lynda Barber-Wiltse, Director Jill Conroy, Director Heidi Henningson, Director Betsy Humer and Director Michael Moscovitz. Director Emelise Baughman was absent.

President Joanne Silver served as Chair and Secretary Lynda Barber-Wiltse served as Secretary of the meeting.

The minutes of the October 28, 2014, Board Meeting Teleconference were approved as previously distributed on 1/1/2015.

Report of President: The President welcomed everyone to the teleconference call meeting and hoped all had a nice holiday and happy new year.

Report of Secretary: The Secretary suggested a protocol change for Board email business: Implement a discussion period that occurs BEFORE votes are taken. When motions are made in face to face meetings, there is an allowed discussion period that occurs before the official vote. Proposed procedure: Motion emailed with stated 48 hour discussion period (ex: discussion January 20 and 21, followed by voting January 22 and 23). Then a second email is sent on January 22 that includes any changed motion language that came up during discussion and asks folks to please vote in next 48 hours (January 22 and 23) for example.

The Secretary updated the Board on the DropBox communication tool.

The Secretary reported the following motions have been approved by unanimous written consent of the directors, effective on the dates noted, and the consents will be filed with the minutes of this meeting.

Report of Treasurer: The Treasurer reported the following banking/savings account balances as of 12/31/2014: BB&T (Certificate of Deposit - \$100,458; Money Market - \$70,029; and Checking - \$18, 949), Huntington Bank (Checking - \$6,892), and PayPal (\$5,732) totaling (excluding RD accounts) \$202,060. The ACC has more money now than we did at this time last year. The 2014 National Show Specialty was financially successful. As of 1/20/15, we have received 820 renewals with 108 unpaid. On 1/5/15, \$5,442 was sent to the ACCCT. The Board discussed the \$100,000 CD and also the timing of when a new Treasurer joins the Board (October 1) and concluded that we need more overlap between the incoming and outgoing Treasurer.

Reports of Committees: The Board reviewed the updated list of committees, confirmed Board Liaisons and finalized memberships (for inclusion in 2015 ACC Membership Directory).

Editorial Committee: Joanne Silver reported the committee is revising the Bulletin Guidelines to be published in Mar/Apr issue and that we have added the Versatility Corner. Betsy Humer will work with Editor Marty Smith to publish AKC titles in the Bulletin.

Field Trial Committee: Linda Harger reported that details are in order.

Health Committee: Chair Jim Stewart, V.M.D. sent the following report: Two contributions to the AKC Canine Health Foundation (CHF) have been made. One is \$3,000 to a grant which is for use in developing a virus treatment against Osteosarcoma in dogs. The second is \$6,000 to a grant for a regenerative medicine study in which stem cells and platelet rich plasma is used for treatment of supraspinatus tendon injury in the dog. (This is the most common injury seen in high performance dogs.) The ACC Charitable Trust also sent money to these two grants. The Committee has been in contact with Dr. Joan Coates since July. We have had very close contact with Dr. Coates since late November. We have arranged direct contact with Dr. Coate's degenerative myelopathy (DM) group with Sue Worrall who is the Breed Health Coordinator for Chesapeake Bay Retrievers in the United Kingdom. We have a complete report from Dr. Coates on the past, present and future of her DM project. I am presently putting

that report in a form easily understood by our membership. The ACC Health Committee has unanimously endorsed the DM project and has recommended to the ACC Charitable Trust that they provide significant and continued financial support for this project. This should take place in the near future.

Hunt Test Committee: George Marthinuss said the ACC Hunt Test is scheduled for the second weekend in March at H. Cooper Black, SC.

JBEC (Judge and Breeder Education Committee): Chair JoAnn Colvin sent the following report: The JBEC has approved presentations for judge's seminars for the following: Betsy Humer- March, ADSJ- in KY; Michelle Keehn- June, Michigan judges group- in MI; JoAnn Colvin- July, CT judges group in CT. I have contacted all mentors about the NSS in WI in October. Of 16 mentors I have received 9 replies. Three have offered ringside mentoring. Betsy Humer has offered to conduct the judge's seminar. We are still waiting to hear from others, and then the committee will decide the final arrangements. I have been in contact with Patty Martin to conduct a hands-on workshop at the NSS- sponsored by the JBEC- about conformation showing. This will include a practice handling class for participants and their dogs. Members would be free- non-members \$10. To be held on Thursday late afternoon. The vote is not complete, so this is still in the planning stages.

Lifetime Achievement Award Committee: Linda Harger discussed sending out a blast email to solicit input and that we should allow adequate time before the specialty for the selection process. We need to start the selection process earlier. Send recommendations to the Committee and see notice in the Bulletin.

Dual Champion Sodak's Gypsy Prince - Breeder: Rev. Schuster; Owner: Chesacroft Kennel (A. Bliss); Trainer: Charles Morgan. "Prince" was the first dual champion retriever of any retrieving breed. He was the second Chesapeake to make a field title. Prince was a medium sized deadgrass dog with an intense desire to work especially in icy water. He had a lifetime total of 14 pts. Today all field trial Chesapecakes trace back to Prince through his son Chesacroft Baron ***.

FC Shagwong Gypsy - Breeder: C A Smith; Owner & Trainer: E. Monroe Osborne. "Gypsy" was the first Chesapeake bitch to earn a field trial championship (1939). She was the runt of her litter – a royally bred litter. Her sire was FC Skipper Bob and her maternal grandsire was Dual Ch Sodak's Gypsy Prince. Run by her owner Ed Osborne, Gypsy had 31 Open pts. and ran/completed the first National Open in 1941.


