





ACC Rescue Update

The American Chesapeake Club Rescue Network has been extremely busy these past two months! We are in the process of updating our contact information on the ACC website and we have added a Facebook page at: <https://www.facebook.com/groups/110893839340673/>

We have been able to assist in the placement of over 35 dogs in just two short months. These dogs all have come into rescue for different reasons which range anywhere from the death of an owner, a breeder closing a kennel, to being pulled from a shelter or off of Craig's List. We have had dogs surrendered to ACC because of changing family dynamics, losing a home or a dog needing veterinarian care, which is not in the family's budget.

One such dog is our sweet Athena. Athena was

tied to a tree with a rope when she first came to our attention. Her family surrendered her to ACC Rescue. After a trip to the veterinarian, which we do with all of our dogs, she tested positive for heartworm. Athena was placed on medication to slowly kill the heartworms but we needed to step up her treatment due to her health beginning to decline. She is now receiving the recommended treatment via three injections, which is more effective, but adds stress on her physically, and of course is more costly. Our hope is that she will respond quickly to this new treatment and be able to join her new family who are already waiting for her as soon as she is physically able to join them.

With the recent devastating flooding in Louisiana, ACC Rescue reached out the community to offer assistance with the relocation or fostering of any Chesapeake in need of help. Cheri Glinker our "Point Person" put together a box of donations from ACC members to send to the area. Their needs were simple

things such as leads and collars. Thank you to everyone who assisted!

All of this would not be possible without our rescue network of volunteers and member support. Thank you to each and every one of you! If you are willing to foster a dog, assist in transportation or evaluation, please contact Heidi Henningson at buroak@mail.com who is the Director of ACC Rescue. You may also go to the ACC website and complete an application on line. If you are interested in adopting a new family member, you may also do this by visiting the American Chesapeake Club home page for adoption forms.

ACC Rescue will have a booth at the National Show Specialty so please look for Cheri Glinker, Rhonda Rose Kemp and Bo who found his forever home with Rhonda.

We are always in need of donations to assist in the fees associated with pulling dogs from shelters, providing needed medical care and daily care, transportation and relocation. To treat a dog for heartworm such as Athena, the cost is \$900.00. To repair an ACL (which we have just done thanks to the Trust) is often close to \$3,000. Without the

generous support of our members and the ACC Charitable Trust, these dogs would not be able to live a full and active life. Health Committee Report

Degenerative Myelopathy

Update from University of Missouri

June 17, 2016

[Edited Aug 1, 2016 for ACC general readership]

Dear ACC Charitable Trust and the ACC Members:

In this update, we write to thank the ACC Charitable Trust and members of the ACC for playing such a supportive role in the study of canine degenerative myelopathy (DM). The Chesapeake Bay Retriever (CBR) breed played an important role in the original gene (SOD1) mutation discovery and remains a key breed in the ongoing DM research. We continue to investigate many aspects of DM as an important veterinary disease as well as DM's role as a model for human amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS).

Update on Genetic Modifier Study in the CBR
We are currently working to identify genetic modifiers that may influence DM's susceptibility and age-of-onset for CBRs with the homozygous *AT RISK* test result and dogs with the heterozygous *CARRIER* test result.

In collaboration with the Broad Institute at MIT/Harvard University, we recently published an article in the *Proceedings of the National Academy of Science, U.S.A.* ¹documenting a genetic modifier gene (*SP110*) that affects age-of-onset of DM in Pembroke Welsh Corgis that have tested *AT RISK* by the *SOD1* mutation test. Pembroke Welsh Corgis that test *AT RISK* by the *SOD1* mutation test and also carry the *SP110* modifier gene are likely to develop DM at an earlier age; whereas, Pembroke Welsh Corgis that test *AT RISK* by the *SOD1* mutation test but do not carry the *SP110* modifier are more likely to die from other causes before they develop DM. We also evaluated the *SP110* modifier in the Boxers; however, almost all Boxers carry the *SP110* gene, so the risk effect could not be assessed. This means we only have reliable data on *SP110* for Pembroke Welsh Corgis. For other breeds, like the Chesapeake Bay Retriever, more information is needed. This research was funded in parts by the AKC Canine Health Foundation and the American Boxer Charitable Foundation.

We are just now utilizing the generous \$10,000 donation from the ACC Charitable

Trust to look for a similar modifier gene (and/or other more specific indicators of DM) in the CBR. We have begun the preparation for submission of whole-genome sequences of the CBR for sequencing. As the technology improves, we have waited for the sequencing price to decrease so that we would have more opportunity to sequence additional dogs if we find a modifier gene in the whole genome sequences. To identify these modifiers, we will generate and evaluate the whole genome sequence of a CBR that developed DM even though it was heterozygous *CARRIER* according to the *SOD1* test for DM. For comparison, we would also like to generate and evaluate the whole genome sequence of an older CBR that tested homozygous *AT RISK* but has **not yet** developed DM (a blood sample from an *AT RISK* dog that is 12-14 or older years of age and not showing signs of DM).

What Is A Modifier Gene?

A modifier gene is a gene that influences or has small effects on the expression of another gene. For example: with eye color, one gene controls whether eye color is blue or brown, but modifier genes can influence the color by affecting the amount or distribution of pigment in the iris. For DM, the *SOD1* gene (the gene we currently test for with DNA testing) is the gene that must be present in order to cause the disease, where the presence of a modifier gene might determine whether a dog actually gets the disease, or how old a dog might be when he gets it.

Updates on DNA Tests and Necropsy Cases Submitted

Currently 2907 CBRs have been tested for the mutant *SOD1* gene with the following results:

- 1323 normal (no *SOD1* gene)
- 1134 carrier (one copy of the *SOD1* gene)
- 450 at risk (two copies of the *SOD1* gene, one from each parent).

So far we have performed necropsies on 19 CBRs with clinical signs of DM and 2 normal CBRs donated for control tissues. We have documented DM in 14 of those dogs: 10 tested homozygous *AT RISK* and 4 tested heterozygous *CARRIER*. The remaining 5 dogs did not have histopathologic confirmation of DM and a different disease process was causing the signs of hind limb weakness.

The dogs chosen for necropsy were not randomly selected, so the high heterozygous to homozygous ratio for DM-affected CBR in the necropsied dogs does not represent the overall ratio for CBR. Nonetheless, we have identified more *CARRIERS* with DM among CBRs than we have found in any other breed. In the long run, the identification of genetic factors that influence the susceptibility to DM could lead to the development of novel therapies that could benefit both dogs with DM and human patients with ALS.

With active investigations of the neuropathology of DM, acquisition of fresh tissues in appropriate fixatives continues to be necessary to perform these studies. The necropsies need to be performed immediately after death because the neural tissues rapidly degenerate after death. Often the primary care veterinarians or veterinary specialist perform the necropsy procedures. Collecting these tissues properly involves a fair amount of time, and we have appreciated the financial support from the ACC Charitable Trust in covering the cost of fees for veterinary necropsy services and the help the ACC offers by helping owners coordinate with veterinarians/veterinary specialists to get the necropsies done.

Clinical Trial for Treatment of DM

We currently have a clinical trial ongoing that is open to all breeds/dogs with early signs of degenerative myelopathy. The purpose of this study is to evaluate a promising new drug as a treatment for DM with hopes to slow disease progression. Dogs diagnosed early in the disease process of DM will be administered a drug that will repress ('knock down') the production of the protein, superoxide dismutase 1 (*SOD1*). The drug has been tested in a preclinical setting for safety in dogs. The drug will be injected into the spinal fluid at the low lumbar region of the spinal cord. **The study will be randomized and double blinded; meaning the investigator and the pet owner will not know whether the dog receives the drug or a placebo. Eight dogs will receive the drug and 4 dogs will receive only the placebo. Based on the randomization design, the participant dog has a 67% chance of receiving the therapy.** For more detailed information on this study please email Briedi Gillespie at b.gillespie@usu.edu

Health Committee Report

Funding for DM and Use of Donated Samples

At the University of Missouri College of Veterinary Medicine, we have an account dedicated to DM research. Donations like that from the ACC Charitable Trust help support some of these biomarker and additional genetic studies for which it is difficult to accrue grant funding until initial pilot study data has been generated. This fund also assists with procurement of tissues for further study and payment of technical personnel who assist with these various studies. Through the collection of tissues and DNA, we have developed an archive of tissues, which are shared with other researchers of DM and ALS.

Your Help Is Still Needed For These Studies!

If you have not tested your CBR for the DM SOD1 gene please do so! Instructions for testing can be found by going to the website: <http://www.offa.org/dnatesting/dmotherbreeds.html> Click on "Order OFA DNA test kits" and choose Degenerative Myelopathy. Samples can be submitted as cheek swabs through the OFA or as blood samples (recommended) sent directly to the laboratory at University of Missouri. All proceeds either through the OFA or directly to the lab at Missouri directly benefit research of DM genetics.

If your CBR has or develops signs that your veterinarian thinks are consistent with DM: The University of Missouri still needs post-mortem samples from dogs who have DM, especially if your dog has already been tested as AT RISK or CARRIER. Please consider having him/her contribute to the study. Contact the ACC DM liaison Briedi Gillespie (see below) to receive the most updated protocols. *Please note: as much notice as possible is needed to coordinate collecting the samples. We cannot coordinate with only a few days notice, due to collection and shipping constraints.*

Help is available for the cost of contributing to these DM studies: The ACC Charitable Trust continues to provide monetary support for the cost of the sample collection (necropsy) for CBR's to be a part of the DM study. If you have a CBR that shows signs of DM and you wish to contribute to the study, please contact the ACC DM liaison Briedi Gillespie with as much advance notice as possible at b.gillespie@usu.edu or (208) 301-1592 for the most current protocols and for help coordinating the procedures.

of nine consecutive successful tests. Diesel is now in training for his Senior Hunter and Hunting Retriever titles, and is looking forward to duck hunting with Pat.


New Junior Hunter

AKC Spaniel Hunts Tests



Being an avid upland hunter and hunt test enthusiast, I was excited to see that as of July 1, 2015, Chesapeake Bay Retrievers were added to the list of approved

breeds to participate in AKC Spaniel Hunt Tests.

Coming off the heels of previous success in both HRC and NAHRA Upland Hunt Tests and another successful hunting season behind us, I decided to hit the Spaniel Hunt Test circuit in the early spring of 2016 with my four year old Chessie named Link.

Our journey began in March by leaving a cold and dreary Illinois for the fresh air and warmth of Cedar Creek, Texas where the Heart of Texas Spaniel Club teamed up with The Boykin Spaniel Club and Breeders Association of America to host four tests over three consecutive days.

The tests are formatted in a similar fashion to AKC Retriever Hunt Tests with Junior, Senior and Master Stakes being offered. The junior level is the introductory stake where a dog is expected to show basic quartering skills in the field while working within a reasonable distance to the handler. The junior dog is not required to be steady to wing or shot or deliver completely to hand. Junior dogs are also expected to make a short water retrieve and the handler is allowed to gently restrain the dog at the line. The senior level requires all that the junior level requires plus more of an emphasis on boldness when attacking cover, a higher level of working different wind patterns and a stronger desire to hunt. The senior hunting dog should demonstrate more of an independent attitude than junior while keeping within hunting distance and deliver the bird to hand but is still not required to be steady to wing and shot. Senior dogs are required to be line steady for the water retrieve and also participate in the Hunt Dead Test which requires the dog to find a downed bird in a general area that the dog did not see fall. The Hunt Dead Test is similar to a blind retrieve but the exact whereabouts of the fallen bird are unknown. The handler and dog will use voice or whistle cues to hone in on the exact location and make the retrieve. The Master dog is expected to possess all the abilities of the previous levels while emphasizing a finished performance for all attributes of the test. Master dogs must remain under control at all times while working for the handler with minimal commands or coaxing. Style, enthusiasm, intelligence, game finding ability and steadiness to wing and shot are judged to the highest level. The master level adds a blind water retrieve that is similar to a retriever water blind.

We arrived at the test site just in time to see the junior dogs begin to run the Upland Test. The test was situated on a large field with a big oval area sectioned off with flags. Judges, gunners, bird planters, bird shaggers, the working handler, waiting handlers and the gallery were all in tow as the teams worked around the oval to find and flush their two birds. Once finished, the working dog dropped back in the gallery as the next working dog and handler continued the course. Dogs and handlers dropped in and out of the procession as needed until all dogs were run.

The birds used are typically Chukar or Pheasant for the higher levels and pigeons for the lower levels. The gunners are instructed to move with the handler and the handler needs to keep the gunners in position to make the shot, especially if the dog starts chasing a runner. With the high level of training and professionalism the gunners exhibited, fly aways were not that common but did happen mostly for the sake of safety. All levels besides Junior require a dog that can be called off from chasing a fly away bird. I could go on and on about how in tune the gunners were with the dog and test but let's just suffice it to say the gunners kept a lot of dogs in the game.

Link was entered in the Master test, so there was plenty of time to view the test and make introductions before we had to run. I had contacted the judges prior to the test to make sure the requirements were understood and to insure there were no surprises for a new dog breed, as I was pretty sure Link was the first Chessie to participate. The judges had reviewed the Chesapeake Hunting Style Description with the newly added upland portion prior to the test. They were well prepared and eager to watch a Chessie work.

Our Upland Test started with Link and I walking to the head of the line and situating ourselves amongst the two judges and gunners in the field. I did ask for a little more distance away from the flag line as I knew Link's quartering pattern was wider than what I observed the spaniels using. The judge handed me an unloaded gun to carry. He gave a briefing of the rules and expectations. I confirmed both gunners were ready and kicked link off from my side with a "hunt'em up" command. Link took off in an explosive manner and began hunting into a head wind with the classic windshield wiper pattern, quickly producing a pheasant to shoot. After delivery to hand, I released link again. Fairly quickly Link began trailing a runner just as we were about to round the corner of the course and head down wind. I had to make a decision if we were going to chase the bird and once I saw the edge of the property was surrounded by barbed wire, I called Link off the runner. We continued the hunt on the course with the wind now to our backs. Link showed mastery of fading down the wind and working a pattern back up to the hunt party until his second flush was produced and retrieved.

The Hunt Dead Test consisted of a lower bowl type area with minimal wind, heavier cover and a downed bird somewhere about forty five yards away from the line between two large trees about 15 yards apart. After watching several dogs you could tell the wind was not helping dogs find the bird. We realized the same conditions during our run. After handling Link through the area a few times he finally indicated scent and picked up the bird. I did note that the Spaniel's were allowed to hunt much more extensively while being handled and basically zeroed

in on the bird by themselves versus "completing the blind" as we like to say in the retriever world.

The Water Mark was next. It was thrown from about thirty yards away and splashed in the water well off the edge. A typical Chessie water entry was exhibited by Link.

The Water Blind was run a little more like a typical retriever water blind and was placed about ten yards up the opposing bank of a thirty yard pond. The only real difference I noticed is that the spaniels typically were directed on a straight line across the pond and then allowed a little more free range in hunting versus the precise handling I strived for with Link.

I was happy to be presented with a ribbon for Link passing the first test and we went on to earn three more passes over the weekend.

After Texas, Link and I headed to Missouri to participate in the Missouri Hunting Spaniel Club Spring Hunt Test. Quality tests, experienced judges, exceptional gunners and great people were in abundance at this test as well. I must say that just being some guy from Illinois with a Chessie I would of never have expected to be invited into a strangers home for breakfast, lunch, dinner and provided a room to sleep in. I was so overwhelmed by the hospitality in Missouri that it will be an experience I will not soon forget.



Driving home from Missouri in the glow of two more successful hunt test passes and a newly crowned AKC Master Hunter Upland Chesapeake Bay Retriever, I had plenty of time to reflect on the experience, the friendships made and the lessons learned.

There were many people behind the scenes that worked with the American Chesapeake Club and the AKC to al-

low Chessies into Spaniel Hunt Tests. These tests could not happen without the support of the AKC, ACC, all the club members, judges, gunners, workers and families committed to supporting such events. I am hoping these words can translate my appreciation of what it really meant for Link and I to have participated.

Some people chase titles to prove breeding stock, some for the confirmation of their efforts or training expertise and some simply for their own egos. At one time or another, it may have been any one of those for me. After it all sank in I was a little taken aback by all the new friendships, hospitality, comradery, knowledge and time spent with people who have a common interest in this sport. Nothing I can say here would properly show the gratitude I have for all involved and the value of the experience. I do feel honored to have been able to show others who are so passionate about upland hunting and upland dogs, the drive, determination and unique hunting style of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever. A positive impression was made. At each test we went to there was at least one person that sought me out to say, "I have never seen a Chessie like that before!"

As for Link, I am fairly confident to say that for him, the experience was nothing more than another Chessie field day.







 - **ALL** submissions **MUST** be typed.
 - When typing your submission – keep it simple. **DO NOT** add extra spaces between sentences, or use the “Tab” key to create columns, or add special formatting or characters to your text.
- When sending Express Mail, Federal Express, UPS, DHL, etc., make certain that you check the waive the signature required box.
- Please make all check or money orders payable to the American Chesapeake Club. Do not send cash. All payments must be made in U.S. funds.

Copyright

- The American Chesapeake Club, Inc. (ACC) retains full rights to **ALL** material submitted for publication.
- If you are submitting material from another published source, it is **YOUR** responsibility to make certain that your submission is in full compliance with all U.S. and International copyright laws.
- The following notices shall appear in every issue of the *Bulletin*.
 - Opinions expressed in the Bulletin are not necessarily those of the ACC or the Bulletin staff and the accuracy of all material is the sole responsibility of the authors.

Calendar of Events Submission Deadlines

- Please think ahead when submitting an event to appear in the *Bulletin* Calendar of Events. While your event can be added to the ACC website almost immediately, the print schedule for the *Bulletin* is quite different and requires a minimum 2-month lead time, ideally 4-months is preferred. Please see page 3 of the *Bulletin* for recommended submission dates.

Material Submission Deadlines

- Submissions must be received by the corresponding CE no later than the last day of the even month (December, February, April, June, August, and October) in order to be included in the next *Bulletin*. If it arrives after the last day of the even month, it will be included in the following issue of the *Bulletin* (e.g. if it arrives on the 1st of January, it will appear in the Mar/Apr issue, not the Jan/Feb issue). Please see page 3 of the *Bulletin* for submission date deadlines.

Commercial Advertisements

- The ACC *Bulletin* does not accept commercial advertising from any member or non-member source or commercial vendor.
- Current ACC members in good standing may place classified advertising according to the Classified Ad guidelines printed in the *Bulletin*.

Obituary Submissions

- For Dogs: Members are entitled to submit one photo and write-up, not to exceed 250 words. Obituaries are printed on a “space available” basis.
- For Members: Members are entitled to submit one photo and write-up. Obituaries are printed on a “space available” basis.

New Title Submissions

- Members are entitled to submit one photo and short write-up, limited to 250 words, per dog, per issue. Multiple new titles may be included under a single heading. The only exception will be if the multiple new titles are earned across at least two or more disciplines. For example a new title is earned in conformation, hunting, and agility. In this case, two photos may be accepted and word limit is increased to 350.
- Submissions should include: a Photo, Full name of dog, Sire X Dam, Breeder/Owner /Handler, Name of the Event / Date / Location the Title was finished, add a little tidbit about the accomplishment too.
- Claims of national rankings **MUST** include the name of the publication in which the ranking appeared and the date it was published (e.g. Dog News, June 5, 2007).
- All reports or brags claiming titles where those titles are not AKC titles and the title replicates an AKC title (e.g. CH – Champion; CD – Companion Dog; MH – Master Hunter, etc.) – **MUST** list the registries under which they were won. For example: CKC CH; UKC CH; Int. CH; ASCA CD; CKC MH; CKC FC, etc. If the same title is won under multiple registries it should appear as: AKC/CKC/Int. CH.
- All reports or brags claiming BIS, MBIS, MBISS, Group wins, Multiple Group wins, etc. where those wins are not AKC wins – **MUST** list the registries under which they were won. Examples: Multiple Canadian (or CKC) BIS Winner; Multiple UKC BIS Winner; Int. BIS Winner; etc. If that same dog has also won AKC BIS, Group Placements, etc., then the listing should appear as: multiple AKC/CKC BIS Winner; et al.
- If you have a question how to report a title or win, please contact the appropriate CE for guidance.
- Submission must be made by the owner, co-owner, or breeder who must be a current ACC member in good standing. Submissions by breeders who are not owners of record must include the owner’s written permission.

Supported Entry and Event Result Submissions

- Supported Entry or Event results should include:
 - Name of Show/Event, Date(s), City and State (and/or Country), Judge(s), and Actual Entry numbers.
 - For Supported Entry Show News, results should include major wins: BOB, BOW, BOS, Select Dog, Select Bitch, WD, WB, RWD, RWB, and if offered, Best Veteran and Best Opposite Veteran.
 - For any other ACC sponsored events (agility, tracking, WDXQ, hunt tests, field trials, CAT, etc.) include only passing or qualifying results for Chesapeake Bay Retrievers.
 - All major wins, passes, or qualifiers should include dog’s full registered name, call name, owner names, and breeder or handler names if available.
 - Event chair write up/summaries should be limited to 500 words.

Show News Photos

- Due to limited space, only New Titles, BIS, Group placements or Supported Entry major wins (as listed above) will be published. If the dog has had several wins that you would like reported in the same Bulletin, please send in only one photo with text (250 word limit) that includes all accomplishments.

Puppy / Stud / Older Dog Submissions

Current ACC members in good standing may place classified advertising according to the Classified Ad guidelines printed in the *Bulletin*.

 - Ads **MUST** be typed and are **ONLY** accepted from ACC Members in good standing.
 - Payment for Puppy, Stud Dog, Older Dog ads **MUST** be received with the ad submittal. Please limit ads to necessary information as space is limited.

Photo Submissions

Only photos submitted by the owner(s), co-owner(s), or breeder(s) who are current ACC members in good standing shall be published. Submissions by breeders who are not owners of record must include permission from the owner or co-owner of record prior to the submission deadline for the current issue.

- **For ALL Photo Submissions** - If a photographer requires that you provide their name in order to publish their work, be certain to include a photo credit with your submission copy.

For Electronic (Digital) Photo Submissions by E-Mail

- Send the photos as an ATTACHMENT, not in the body of the e-mail or other document.
- Good quality photo images a minimum of 300dpi or higher AND image size of 8" x 10" are needed in order to print well in the *Bulletin*.
- Proper resolution and size will create a JPEG image file size of greater than 1 MB. If your file size is significantly smaller than 900 KB or 1 MB, then it probably is not 300 dpi or the correct image size and will not be usable.
- Check the settings on your camera / mobile device before taking pictures. There should be a settings feature allowing you to adjust the resolution/pixels; choose the highest setting for best print pro-

duction. For example: 2400 x 3000 pixels/inch (converts to 300dpi for an 8" x 10" photo).

- Some digital cameras/devices create photos that are 24" to 30" in size but are shown as being only 72 or 96 dpi. **This is OK.** Just send the unedited file as is. The larger physical photo size provides lots of pixels and most of these photos can be edited to the required physical size and dpi needed for printing.
- Please **DO NOT** crop or edit your images – that will be done for you. Whenever possible, cropping will be done to show the dog as fully as possible.
- If you are scanning a hard copy of a photo, please check your scanner settings for proper resolution and image size, and make certain that you clean your scanner's glass surface prior to scanning.
 - If your scanning software does not automatically crop your scan to the size of the photo, please do so manually prior to saving the scan.
 - Scans of digital photos printed onto inkjet photo paper on your home printer will generally not reproduce well.

For "Hard Copy" Photo Submissions

AKC Delegate's Report

Communication Received from the AKC: AKC Agility Suspends Use of the Collapsed Tunnel

This past week, The American Kennel Club Agility department held their annual field representative meeting. During the meeting, the staff reviewed concerns raised by the Agility community involving the collapsed tunnel. This obstacle has been shown to cause issues as performances have become faster and higher level classes have become more complex.

After their review, the Agility Field Representatives agreed unanimously to suspend the use of the collapsed tunnel effective immediately. Based upon the Agility department's recommendation, Sports and Events Senior Management contacted the AKC Board of Directors to request immediate action. The Board concurred that the concern regarding the safety of the dogs was the first priority.

As of August 30, 2016, the AKC will suspend the use of the collapsed tunnel in all courses

until the concerns can be resolved. Judges will be contacted by their Field Representative to review how to adopt this immediate change.

Thank you to the Agility community for working in partnership with the AKC to bring positive changes to our sport.

American Chesapeake Club Bylaws Amendments - Need Your Vote This Fall

The American Chesapeake Club's multi-year plan to update its tax exemption and legal status has reached the final step – 10 basic amendments to the bylaws. These have been approved by the American Kennel Club and just need members' approval to complete the entire project so that all the legal documents will be in conformity. Of these amendments, 4 are legal items, 2 are new AKC requirements for parent clubs and the others are minor adjustments to the 1999 bylaws with some legal and AKC overlap. Following are the specific provisions, reasons for amending, and exact language. New wording is underscored and the deletions are ~~stricken through~~:

Article 3(A) (Purposes) The Restated Articles of Incorporation include the correct current wording for an AKC parent club that is incorporated in California and tax exempt as a social welfare organization, Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(4.) All the original, outdated wording from the 1962 Articles is deleted and not shown here, as it was previously deleted from the Restated Articles of Incorporation.

As amended, it reads, "The purpose of the corporation is to ensure ongoing public benefit from purebred Chesapeake Bay Retriever dogs through programs and activities. It is organized under the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation law for public purposes. This corporation is a nonprofit public benefit corporation and is not organized for the private gain of any person."

Article 3(B) (Specific Purposes) An additional specific purpose (f) is an AKC approved provision that was included in the Restated Articles and is now added to the bylaws. The other provisions were previously added in the 1999 bylaws amendments and remain the same.

As amended, it reads, "and (f) to disseminate accurate information about the Chesapeake Bay Retriever specifically and dog care in general and to educate the general public."

Article 3(C) (Limitations) Outdated language is entirely deleted and not shown here. The new provision is the exact language that the California Franchise Tax board required for the Restated Articles. This conforms the bylaws to the Restated Articles on file with the California Secretary of State.

As amended, it reads, "The property of this corporation is irrevocably dedicated to social welfare purposes and no part of the net income or assets of this corporation shall ever inure to the benefit of any director, officer or member thereof or to the benefit of any private person. Upon the dissolution or winding up of the corporation, all assets remaining after payment, or provision for payment, of all debts and liabilities of this corporation shall be distributed to a nonprofit fund, foundation or corporation which is organized and operated exclusively for either charitable or Social Welfare purposes, having established its tax exempt status under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code for the benefit of dogs."

Article 4(A)(1)(e) (Classes and Qualifications) The is a new provision and adds a foreign, non-voting membership class for future Club applicants residing outside the United States. Current non-resident members will remain legal members of the corporation with rights to vote and hold office. This provision is now required by AKC for legal reasons relating to its Political Action Committee, because only members of AKC affiliated clubs residing in the United States, its territories or possessions may contribute to the PAC.

As amended, it reads: "(e) Foreign Membership. Open to all persons eighteen years (18) and older residing outside of the United States, or its territories and possessions, who are interested in the breed and subscribe to the purposes of corporation. This type of membership pays full dues and offers all corporation benefits and participation. Notwithstanding the foregoing, however, Foreign Members may not vote (with the exception of those Foreign Members who were members in good standing as of the date that these Bylaws were adopted by the membership in accordance with Article 13 hereof), and no Foreign Member may hold office."

Article 4(A)(7)(a) (Grounds for Discipline)

In August 2011, AKC's Board of Directors voted to define a member in good standing to be a member who has not been suspended from "any" AKC privileges. AKC now requires this language in the bylaws of member clubs.

As amended, it reads: "Any member who is suspended from ~~the~~ any privileges of The American Kennel Club automatically shall be suspended from the privileges of this corporation for a like period.

Article 5(E)(8) (Meetings of Directors – Board Action) California law only permits board action without a meeting when there is unanimous written consent of the board for any action to be taken. By stating this in the Bylaws, we avoid confusion and remind the board and membership of this important law. When there is not unanimous written consent for an important matter, the board can later consider and adopt it at a legal meeting with a quorum and majority vote of directors present.

As amended, it reads: "(8) Board Action: Every act or decision done or made by a majority of the Directors present at a meeting duly held at which quorum is present is the act of the Board, and hence of the Corporation, unless the Articles or these Bylaws require a greater number or otherwise provide. An action required or permitted to be taken by the Board may be taken without a meeting, if all members of the Board shall individually or collectively consent in writing to that action. The written consent or consents shall be filed with the minutes of the proceedings of the Board. The action by written consent shall have the same force and effect as the unanimous vote of the directors.

Article 7(B)(4) (Nominations) This amendment clarifies and further explains the basic principles of the dual envelope voting process that is required by AKC and the requirement to use the specific envelopes provided. The process is mandatory. Ballots received that are not in strict compliance with the 2-envelope procedure/ instructions will be considered invalid and not counted. There is a clear statement that individuals comprising household memberships must each receive and submit separate ballots in the specified separate envelopes. The amendment requires the word "BALLOT" to be printed on return envelopes so it can be visually recognized and not mishandled or lost. An additional word "separate" emphasizes the dual envelope process. Retaining the word "blank"

is correct word usage and also consistent with AKC terminology.

As amended, it reads: "(4) If one or more valid additional nominations are received by the Secretary on or before August 1st, he shall, on or before August 31st, mail to each member in good standing, a ballot listing all the nominees for each position in alphabetical order, with the names of the states in which they reside, together with a blank envelope, marked only with the word "BALLOT" and a separate return envelope addressed to the Secretary or independent profession firm, as designated by the Board, marked "ballot" "BALLOT" and bearing the name of the member to whom it was sent. Household Members shall each receive separate ballot materials with return envelopes bearing their respective names so that each must return his individual ballot in his respective, separate envelope. So that ballots may remain secret, each voter, after marking his ballot, shall seal it in the blank envelope marked "BALLOT" which in turn shall be placed in the second provided return envelope addressed to the Secretary or independent professional firm. Ballots received that are not in strict compliance with these requirements shall be considered invalid and not counted. Ballots must be received no later than September 25th to be valid and counted. The returns shall be checked against the list of members whose dues are paid for the current year prior to opening the outer envelopes and removing the blank "BALLOT" envelopes, and shall certify the eligibility of the voters as well as the results of the voting which shall be announced to the members within 45 days. The Secretary shall immediately notify the nominees of the election results. The tally of the election results shall be published in the next issue of the American Chesapeake Club Bulletin."

Article 10 (Parliamentary Authority) This amendment deletes the reference to a specific edition of Robert's Rules and substitutes the standard AKC language referring to the "current edition." This eliminates the need for the Board to adopt resolutions when new editions are published and any confusion or risk of using outdated versions for which fewer professional parliamentarians may be experts.

As amended, it reads: "The rules contained in the ~~Scott, Foresman~~ current edition of Robert's Rules Of Order, ~~the~~ Newly ~~Revised~~ 1990 ~~edition~~, shall govern the corporation in all cases to which they are applicable

and in which they are not inconsistent with these bylaws and any other special rules of order the corporation may adopt; ~~provided however, the Board may adopt by resolution a subsequent edition of Robert's Rules of Order to supersede the foregoing.~~

Article 14(B) (Delegate to the American Kennel Club) Regarding the AKC Delegate, additional wording is added to specify general duties and provide additional reference to material published by AKC, the ACC's approved job description and any specific board action about the Delegate position. Since the duties may change from time to time, it is a better drafting practice to simply refer to other sources than list additional duties in the bylaws.

As amended, it will read: "Subject to Board approval as otherwise provided herein, the President may appoint from the members the delegate to the American Kennel Club. If elected and accepted by The American Kennel Club, the appointee shall hold such office for not more than two (2) years unless reappointed as above. Among other duties, the Delegate shall report to the Club all actions and matters discussed at the AKC's Quarterly Meetings. The Delegate position is expressly subject to policy documents from time to time published by AKC, the respective job description as approved the Board of this corporation and any other action adopted by the board."

Article 15 (Dissolution) This amendment provides current provisions for dissolution of the corporation and distribution of assets that are consistent with legal and tax requirements.

As amended, it reads: "The Corporation may be dissolved at any time by the written consent of not less than two thirds (2/3) of the members in good standing. In the event of the dissolution of the Corporation, other than for purposes of reorganization, whether voluntary or involuntary or by operation of law, none of the property of the Corporation nor any proceeds thereof nor any assets of the Corporation shall be distributed to any members of the Corporation. Upon the dissolution or winding up of the Corporation, its assets remaining after payment or provision for payment, of all debts and liabilities of this Corporation shall be distributed to a nonprofit fund, foundation or Corporation which is organized and operated exclusively for either charitable or social welfare purposes.

having established its tax exempt status under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(4) as applicable, for the benefit of dogs.”

Dual Champion Sodak's Gypsy Prince - Breeder: Rev. Schuster; Owner: Chesacroft Kennel (A. Bliss); Trainer: Charles Morgan. "Prince" was the first dual champion retriever of any retrieving breed. He was the second Chesapeake to make a field title. Prince was a medium sized deadgrass dog with an intense desire to work especially in icy water. He had a lifetime total of 14 pts. Today all field trial Chesapeakes trace back to Prince through his son Chesacroft Baron ***.

FC Shagwong Gypsy - Breeder: C A Smith; Owner & Trainer: E. Monroe Osborne. "Gypsy" was the first Chesapeake bitch to earn a field trial championship (1939). She was the runt of her litter - a royally bred litter. Her sire was FC Skipper Bob and her maternal grandsire was Dual Ch Sodak's Gypsy Prince. Run by her owner Ed Osborne, Gypsy had 31 Open pts. and ran/completed the first National Open in 1941.


