



2016 Field Trial Specialty Report

Exceptional judges, super workers, and wonderful competitors all came together for a few short days in the magical Mission Valley area of Western Montana for the 2016 Field Trial Specialty. Although clouds kept the snowy peaks hidden for most of the week, the cooler temps were ideal for the dogs.

The Mission Valley retriever community generously shared great training and trial grounds (sites of two National Amateur Retriever Championships) and helped in many ways to ensure our Specialty was a success. The biggest contribution from the Valley was the judges – all from the local area. Sincere thanks go out to Open Judges - Judy Rasmuson and Linda Johnson; Amateur Judges - Anna Calvert and Judy Bly; Qualifying Judges – Duncan Christie and Lynn Nelson; Derby Judges - Tom Hartl and Jean Grammer; and Puppy Stake Judges – Art Rourke and Robin Rourke.

Chesapeakes and their people began to arrive in the area up to a month before the specialty and enjoyed the varied training opportunities, and Brown Dogs were here en masse for the few days preceding the event. Open Commentary

Competition in the American Chesapeake Club's 2016 Field Trial Specialty began with the Open competition on Tuesday, September 20, a gray, drizzly, overcast day. Judges Judy Rasmuson and Linda Johnson, both experienced and much respected judges, set up a wide open triple for a first series land test that featured rolling terrain with scattered pond, cattails, and meadowland in the lower portions and lighter grass cover on the uplands. Thirty-six dogs started the competition.

The middle bird of the triple was thrown first, left to right. It landed near the far shore of the right-hand of two small ponds behind a barrier of bulrushes and cattails. The gunner then retired into a holding blind near the left end of the pond. The correct line to the bird was through a corner of the right-hand pond and some did it well, but more skirted the pond, taking the narrow berm between the two pieces of water. Some corrected quickly; others turned left and hunted the hillside behind the left-most pond before finally correcting and going to the bird.

The left hand bird, the shortest of the three, was thrown second, left to right across a narrow channel and into some shoreline cover. The line to the bird was down a steep hill, which presented special challenges. Dogs tended to want to look across to the opposite hill for the mark rather than down to the gunner. Although the gunner stayed up, dogs running down the hill had to watch their feet to avoid stumbling and thus had some difficulty maintaining a true line to the bird. A number of dogs wound up going behind the gun before correcting and going across the channel to the bird. A few blew through and hunted the far hillside.

The third bird was a flier shot right to left up a hillside to the right. The birds landed in a variety of spots, but most dogs had relatively good marks on it. Primarily, the flier set up the other two marks.

Thirty dogs were called back for the land blind. The line to which ran to the left of the middle bird of the triple, across the left-hand pond and behind the holding blind from the first series. The bird itself was near the edge of a larger pond that lay farther out. Work varied. Some dogs wanted to hunt short of the bird or up the hill to the right of the line to the blind. Some few wanted to go back to the mark, and a number began to slip whistles after they got out a fair distance. In the end, nineteen dogs were called back for the third series.

For the water blind, contested the next day in somewhat better weather, the judges moved the line further west so the dogs had to run across the slope that they had run down to get to the left-hand bird of the triple. After traversing the hillside, the line ran through the corner of one pond, over two narrow points, past some decoys and into more water each time, then across a fat point and into the water again, and finally on to the bird on the far bank. A poison bird shot up the hill above the two peninsulas and the blind-planter's holding blind, in plain sight above the fat point, worked to pull dogs to the left. As a result, some were lost behind the last point and got to the bird by running the bank. Others missed water after reaching one or the other of the initial two points. Only nine dogs survived this difficult test.

For the final test, the judges moved to the hillside on the far side of the ponds used in the water blind. The test was a demanding triple on big water. The first bird was thrown left to right onto an island. The gunner retired. The second mark was a converging bird thrown right to left onto the tip of a peninsula opposite and just long of the island bird. The marks were fairly tight to one other. This gunner also retired. The third bird was a flier shot uphill across yet another pond. As in the first series, the flier primarily set up the other two marks. There was an honor, but no one broke on it.

Work varied widely. Various dogs skirted much of the water on their way to the left-hand bird. Some huge hunts resulted. Handlers who tried for the middle bird second saw their dogs on the right line only to wind the island bird while en route, do a sharp left turn to pick it up, and then, rather than take the proper line again, take one well to the right of the bird on the point, a line that took them up the hill behind the retired gun before recovering to come down and get the bird. In the end, seven dogs completed the test.

PS: One more item, while giving out ribbons for the Open at the dinner Wednesday night, there was some confusion about one illegible number on the list I was provided. Belated congratulations to Larry and LaJean Ford whose dog, Sunshine On The Rockies QA2 earned a JAM ribbon. So sorry you had to wait so long to hear that good news.

Qualifying Commentary

The morning was gray and cool which was a welcome surprise. The Judges, Duncan Christie and Lynn Nelson provided us with a very challenging setup!! There were 42 entries and five scratches so there were 37 running dogs. We had two test dogs so that we handlers could get a good idea of what we were facing.

The setup: The lay of the land was a continuing vista mottled with rolling terrain laden with hundreds of square hay bales. The order was: Triple with right hand bird thrown angled back left to right over a culvert of grasses at about 2 o'clock and the thrower then retired, 2nd middle bird thrown left to right over the rise of a hill. The thrower was sitting in front of the hay bale facing the running dog. The flyer was last bird down at about 11 o'clock. Not much wind.

After the dog ran the marks they then turned left to face the also very challenging almost 300 yard blind. The blind looked to be not as hard as it turned out to be. Dogs wanted to square the hillsides (3 of them) and it took most a good deal of whistles.

After everyone completed the marks and blind there were 22 dogs called back to the water blind.

The water blind included a rather small and tight waterway with a couple of points. One to get on and off, the other to go by and exit to an approximately 150 yards of land to the bird.

There were 13 called back to the water marks.

That test was a triple where the long bird was thrown right to left and the gunner stayed out. The dogs had to cross a large pond on the way to that bird. The middle bird, 2nd bird was to the right across a small pond with accompanying channels -- gunners retired and the third bird down was a flyer. The flyer's station posed a big factor as a detractor for some of the running dogs. Ten dogs successfully completed the test.

Amateur Commentary

1st series was an indented triple with the long right gun retired with 39 starters. The flyer was to the left and was longer than the middle gun. Middle gun was positioned near a line of hay bales directly in front of the line, with the long gun to the right. The long gun retired behind a wood pile and the terrain to that bird had high cover and was ruff to get to.

Most dogs picked birds up around the horn while some went outside, outside then middle. Many dogs had to be handled on the right long bird that was retired. But there were some outstanding Chessies that had no problem picking up all three without a handle. 31 dogs were called back, even the dogs that were handled to the long gun.

2nd series was a land blind. The blind was a straight forward blind that went through two marks of the first series, that being the middle mark and the long retired mark on the right. There was a wide corridor through two hay bales. 23 dogs did the blind.

3rd series was water blind. This blind separated most of the dogs. Straight forwarded blind – by a point, up on land and get the bird. However, you started on the side of a mound that threw the dogs off and then the real problem began. Problem was that many dogs refused to get in the water. But then there were dogs like Porter (owned and handled by Bill Burk) who made it look easy. There was Sue Dorsey who also made it look easy. I know my dogs refused to get in and when I called them in I told them they should be ashamed – a Chessie not getting in the water. 10 dogs were called back for the final series.

Derby Commentary

By Todd and Barbara Adams

The first two land series were held on Wednesday, September 21, 2016 at Retriever Land, a picturesque well maintained farm owned by Judy Rasmuson.

The first series began in a hay field on a sunny 55°F morning with a very light south wind. The line was facing north. The memory bird was thrown from left to right in very light cover. The go bird, a live flyer, was shot right to left in sparse to medium cover. The birds were approximately 90-degrees in relation to each other with the go bird on the right, equating to both birds being thrown into the test but with a good separation. The throws and bird placements were very consistent for all 13 of the dogs (there were 5 scratches) that came to the line.

The second series brought overcast skies and a 61°F temperature. The winds had changed to a variable northeast wind at 15mph. The test moved to a nearby field after the first series and faced west. The guns were positioned tighter for this series, at approximately a 45-degree angle from the line, thrown outside the guns, with the memory bird being significantly longer than the go bird. The long memory bird was thrown from left to right into medium cover. The go bird, located to the left of the memory, was thrown from right to left into sparse medium cover. The test was well designed for the light and wind conditions and held consistent throughout the series for the 12 dogs that were still competing.

The following day the Derby moved to Libertyville owned by Bill McKnight, another well maintained property with rolling hills. The well-designed features of this area, including various technical ponds, lended itself as excellent habitat to the migratory waterfowl that travel through the Mission Valley of Montana.

The third series began with overcast skies at 45°F temperature. The line was facing west with a 6mph wind from the north. The gunner stations were at a 90-degree angle from the line, see picture. The memory bird, on the right, is thrown first, left to right and lands in light cover on a side hill across a wider section of water. The go bird is also thrown

Three Puppy Stakes

Senior Puppy Commentary

The first two series of the senior puppy stakes started with back-to-back singles. The first, at 100 yds, was thrown to a mowed hayfield. The second, 90 degrees from the first mark and 84 yds from the line, was thrown to a patch of grass cover in the same field. Both birds were thrown right-to-left. Handlers were asked to bring the pups back behind the holding blind after the first retrieve to wait for the second thrower to come out to throw the second mark. A few dogs had to navigate past the bird rack to do this which made for a few good laughs from the gallery.

All the dogs picked up their birds fairly easily and we traveled to another location for some water work. It was clear that all competitors needed more of a challenge!

The third series started on a hill with a downslope about 30 yards long. At the bottom of the slope they had to cross a 15ft wide channel and forge another 100 yards beyond to the mark. The bird boy had a great arm and threw the bird a good 20-30 feet from left-to-right nicely for each dog. Most of the dogs navigated this mark well and it could have been anyone's game. A highlight for me was watching the water entries. A few dogs even made it close to $\frac{3}{4}$ of the way across the channel just on the entry "leap" alone!

The judges were committed to really seeing these dogs' budding abilities. Six eager pups were asked to return for a 4th series; a big open-water swim of about 30 yards (well, "big" for puppies anyway). The line was placed about 5 feet from the bank. In the water there were some tempting points on each side that the dogs were asked to swim past. An added challenge of a fairly sharp upward bank on the far end meant that the dogs needed to climb a bit in order to make it directly to the (right-to-left) mark which landed about 20 yards beyond the far bank in tall grass.

At the end of the day 5 ribbons were awarded. Many thanks to our judges Art and Robin Rourke who made it a fun experience for all, and to our marshal Florence Sloan who kept things flowing nicely throughout the day. It was great to see so many friendly faces and meet the new batch of future Derby competitors. Hope to see you all again next year!

The judges were Art and Robin Rourke who put on a really nice fair test -- they had a nice set up, told us about the test, asked if we had any questions and answered them completely. The Junior Puppy Stake started with Dee Dee running test dog, after that the test started with two retrieves on land, the first one was about 40 yards in distance and the second one about 70 yards. The duck was thrown into a small amount of cover. These two retrieves were considered the first and second series of stake. All dogs were called back to run water which was a land water combo about 70 yards in length, the judges were very helpful with the puppies and handlers during the test. Three dogs were able to finish.

I asked Art if there was anything he would like to comment on for the write-up in the ACC Bulletin and after a couple moments of thought he said «I never commented for the press while working so I'm not going to comment now.» They were such down to earth judges that you could feel at ease with while running your puppy. You couldn't ask for better scenery and weather to run the brown dogs. Thanks for a great ending to the NFTS.

4th series was a water triple. Right hand bird live flyer shot up on land. Left hand bird thrown on land to the right. Middle bird retired and angle back to the right. All three birds required dogs to get in the water and get out on land to make the retrieve. All dogs called back to the 4th series were successful.

As a footnote the Amateur stake, in difficulty, is no different from the Open stake. In the Amateur stake though, all handlers must be amateurs where as in the Open stake an amateur would be competing against professional handlers who may, in some cases, be extremely proficient in handling dogs in a field trial and are sometimes hard to beat.

left to right and landed with a splash in front of a peninsula. The gunners were visible to the dog in route to both birds the whole time. There were 7 dogs who competed in this series and all were called back to the fourth.

The weather for the fourth series was still overcast and the temperature had increased to 56°F. The wind continued blowing from the north but increased slightly. This test, located on a different piece of water, consisted of a close go bird on the left with a long memory bird to the right on a side hill at 60-degrees from each other. The long memory bird was thrown left to right downhill in light cover. This mark was challenging as dogs had a long entry, with a 40-yard swim and a long exit to get to the bird. The gun may not have been visible to the dog for the entire route and truly tested the dog's marking abilities. The go bird was also thrown left to right and landed with a splash behind a small island of cattails, which resulted in dogs having to mark first and then use their nose to hunt the bird out of the cover.

Thanks to Jean Grammer and Tom Hartl for setting up fair Derby tests that truly tested dogs natural marking abilities.

Nuka Bay Chesapeake's venture into the ACC NFTS Baby Puppy Stake:

Since I was already planning to attend the 2016 ACC NFTS in Ronan, MT, for the ACC Annual Meeting, Linda Harger suggested that I enter my young puppies in the Baby Puppy Stake. Hmm, sounded like fun – why not! I watched the Baby Puppies at prior NFTS events and my Sister-in-Law (Gwen Haynes - Golden Retrievers) and I were already working with my two 5 month old puppies Deshka and Nelchina on puppy retrieves and basic field training. So I agreed to enter. Challenge One – Entry Express won't accept entries for dogs less than 6 months old. You have to "fudge" their birthday in their profile to make them older than 6 months, enter them in the stake you want, then "edit" their birthdays! This was a hard concept for me to wrap my head around! ;-). Challenge Two - we had "vehicle issues" leaving Alaska, so our trip start date was moved back and our mode of transportation changed! As a result, we missed opportunities to train in MT before the event and I did not have exercise pens for the puppies to romp around in! Challenge Three – will 5.5 month old puppies that have been cooped up in a kennel for a 2500+ mile, 5 day drive return to me if I take them off leash? I would soon find out. As I walked Deshka (the first entry) to the line for her land birds, I was hoping and praying that she would come back to me! Hopefully with a duck in her mouth. Boy was I relieved when she was racing back towards me with her bird. Then it was Nelchina's turn – unbeknownst to me, she got distracted by drag back scent from Tim Bonnemas' "Bonnemas Wild Card" puppy's energetic tour of the field after retrieving his duck!! Nelchina was tracking his path almost footstep by footstep (not surprising since she has some phenomenal tracking dogs in her pedigree)! She finally got downwind of her bird and found it ... and also returned to me with it!!! Both girls were called back to water – which turned out to be more technical and advanced than they had been trained for. The day still ended on a positive note – both girls picked up their birds and came back to me with them and they both got some excellent field experience! Would I do it again? ABSOLUTELY!!! (aside – Deshka and Nelchina turned 6 months old days before the NSS in Portland, OR, and provided an entertaining view on how to do Brace! They did a lot of growing up on our one month long road trip from Alaska to Montana and Oregon and back!)

Companion Events

Featuring Lure Coursing!

Lure Coursing is a system of mechanized lures and pulleys that stimulate the unpredictability of chasing live prey. Lure Coursing was developed for sighthounds that are bred to hunt by sight. In July of 1991 the AKC instituted the Lure Coursing tests and trials for sighthounds. The AKC now also offers a Coursing Ability Test (CAT), an introductory event fashioned after the sport of lure coursing, so that dogs other than sighthounds can participate. It tests a dog's basic coursing instinct or hunting-by-site ability. The CAT has become quite popular with Chesapeakes and is open to all breeds.



In the CAT, dogs pursue an artificial lure (white plastic bag) that zigzags across an open field in a course of 300 to 600 yards. The course length that a dog runs depends on its height and breed. Chesapeakes generally run a 600 yard course as they are over 12" at the withers and are not brachycephalic. Dogs must be registered with the AKC and at least one year old to run at an AKC approved event. Dogs that have a PAL number or are enrolled in the AKC Canine Partners program are also eligible. The test is a non-competitive pass/fail event and all dogs entered will run one at a time. They must pursue a lure and complete the course with enthusiasm and without interruption within a stated maximum amount of time. Max time: 600 yards - 2 minutes; 300 yards - 1 1/2 minutes. Females in season cannot enter. You can only enter once per event. Safety is the primary consideration when setting up a course. In a CAT there aren't any turns more acute than 90 degrees. Dogs can wear any type of collar except chokers, pinch (prong) or electronic training collars. Before each event an inspection committee inspects the dogs for lameness, fitness to compete and females in season. In order to earn an AKC title your dog must complete a course at least 3 times. Depending on the title you will need more qualifying runs to title

Titles and the number of qualifying runs required are:

- Three passes = Coursing Ability (CA) title
- Ten passes = Coursing Ability Advanced (CAA) title
- Twenty Five passes = Coursing Ability Excellent (CAX) title
- Fifty passes = Coursing Ability Excellent 2 (CAX2)
- Every additional 25 passes will give you a higher numbered title

AKC introduced the Fast CAT test earlier in 2016. It is a timed 100 yard straight dash for dogs where they earn points based on their speed. Titles are awarded when a designated number of points are earned.

If you would like to give CAT or Fast CAT a try, check out the tips below:

- Make sure your dog isn't lame, is healthy and in good shape. If unsure consult your Veterinarian.
- Go to a CAT practice day to see how your dog will do. The operator will adjust the speed of the lure according to the level at which the dog is capable of working. This is a great way to find out if it is a sport you and your dog will enjoy.
- You can make a practice lure by attaching a string and a bag to a pole. Then encourage your dog to chase it trying to bring out their prey drive.
- Your dog should have a good recall.
- The nature of lure coursing is such that only the dog running the course should be near or in sight of the lure and course.
- Keep in mind that you will need to be physically able to hold and release your dog as well as catch it when done.
- Have fun. That is what running events with your dog is about.

CAT gives owners another venue to explore when looking to do performance events. It really doesn't take much time or training and the dogs get exercise while the owners enjoy watching their dogs perform and could possibly bring home a title that is the icing on the cake.



It was a great honor to be invited to judge the WD and the show.

The group included seasoned handlers with their accomplished working dogs, as well as some beginners with their first Chesapeake puppies. The atmosphere was friendly and welcoming. I was impressed with everyone's good humor and the shared investment in the success of all participants. What a fine example of good sportsmanship!

Our weekend began with a training day so that everyone could become more familiar with the rules of our ACC Working Dog Stakes. Handlers train differently in Germany as their tests differ from ours. So, there were many questions about things such as when it's appropriate to talk to your dog and when you can handle. Some of the young dogs had only worked with dummies prior to this so we spent time introducing birds. The only thing more exciting than watching the natural instincts of a Chesapeake come alive is the look of absolute joy on the face of their handler. On the day of the WD, my fellow judge, Ulrike Schlögell, and I saw some excellent dog work from all entries whether they went home with a ribbon or not.

The show was great fun. Due to rainy weather, we took shelter in a barn on a property where Scottish games are held. We ran a "test dog" of sorts to demonstrate ring procedures and I explained what a judge is looking for. I saw a really lovely group of bitches; their outlines were classic Chesapeake and they could really move. But, my Best of Breed dog (SedgeGrass Hop, Skip, and Jump) was a very fit, well-balanced dog that had traveled from the Czech Republic. And, Best of Opposite (SedgeGrass Gunnin' for Glory) was a stunning bitch from the Netherlands. I'd take either of these dogs home without a moment's hesitation.

I've traveled to Chesapeake events in a number of countries and one common thing that I've observed is that the owners of these dogs express so much pride in owning one of our rugged, American dogs. The Chesapeake Bay Retriever has many friends in Germany and now, thanks to this breed, I do as well. - Gina Downin

Our dogs come to us in need of a new home for a variety of reasons; some simply arrive at a shelter as a stray. One very special little girl arrived at a shelter in Texas desperately in need of care. Blaire arrived starved, with puncture wounds to her face, no coat, abrasions and a mangled back leg. It was determined that she had been shot which broke her hind leg in two places. Blaire had bone fragments removed from her leg and her puncture wounds attended to. She was young, sweet, house broken and obviously in need of special love and attention. Lynise Marshal offered Blaire a temporary home where she could begin to heal and trust again. Lynise is a retired Sheriff Officer and has seen abuse before. AKC Delegate's Report

The highlights of the September 2016 AKC meeting were that AKC has recently established an online learning and test site "Canine College", <https://caninecollege.akc.org> and health projects.

The "college" is designed for breeders, judges, groomers and trainers. At present this site provides examinations for both conformation and hunt test judges seeking initial and renewal certification. As this site matures a catalog of courses will be available.

There has been significant activity in various health projects: The AKC and The Canine Health Foundation has awarded Auburn, North Carolina State, Ohio State, and

Univ. of Pennsylvania veterinary schools each a \$100,000 to fund Theriogenology Residencies. The mission of these programs will be the breeding of healthy litters focusing veterinary obstetrics, gynecology and andrology.

The "Tic-Bourne Disease" project continues to build its funding with the AKC now matching over \$250,000 in private contributions. This study involves multiple centers and looks at: prevalence, prevention and treatment strategies, the transmission of Bartonellosis and Ehrlichiosis and other associated diseases from tick bites.

Other studies involving the treatment and the genetic risk of kidney, epilepsy and autoimmune diseases continue.

Elections to Delegate Standing Committees are held at the September Meeting. This year I was elected to serve a 3 year term on the Hunt Test and Field Trial Committee. The Chesapeake Bay Retriever (CBR) breed played an important role in the original superoxide dismutase 1 gene (*SOD1*) mutation discovery and remains a key breed in the ongoing DM research. They continue to investigate many aspects of DM as an important veterinary disease and as a model for human amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS). Dr. James Stewart will provide an update in the Bulletin. The Health Committee also wants to focus on the 3 sarcomas: Osteosarcoma, Hemangiosarcoma and Lymphoma since they are also deadly to our breed. The present research using immunotherapy as opposed to chemotherapy are cutting edge in dealing with finding a cure for these diseases. Dr. Nicky Mason has been a leader in this research and very successful in her treatments at this point (U. of Penn). It is time for another health survey (the last one was conducted in 2003)

- iv. Judge and Breeder Education Committee (JBEC) (Betsy) – List of mentors that will be available for ringside mentoring at the National Specialty Show in Portland, OR in October was sent to Michelle Keehn – the presenter. No other seminars are scheduled for the balance of the year. The committee just received an application for a new mentor and it is being distributed to the committee members for discussion.
- v. Show Committee (Jill) – Premium list for the 2016 NSS almost done. Getting ready to send out approval letters for 2017 supported entries and expecting more will come in now that chairs will be allowed to show (with stipulations). Haven't received any response for 2018 NSS applications. The Board discussed status/availability of updated Show Manual.
- b. Ad-Hoc Committees
 - i. Breed Rescue Service (Heidi) – ACC Rescue has a new FaceBook page (349 members so far). They placed 12 dogs in the last 6 weeks and helping members place dogs. ACC charges \$100 (minimum) to adopt and is setting up a checking account. Some are working as service dogs and with the wounded warriors. ACC is working with the other CBR rescue groups. Craigs List and Petco have CBR's to place (for

\$500!). Cheri Glankler (ID) joined the group. Heidi plans to submit a Rescue article for each Bulletin.

American Chesapeake Club LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

OBJECTIVE

The ACC Lifetime Achievement Award is given to an individual who has made significant contributions to the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed / the people who own them through outstanding leadership / advancement of knowledge / understanding.

ELIGIBILITY

The ACC Lifetime Achievement Award recognizes personal achievement / its positive impact on the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed. The award may be given to any individual independent of specific institutional affiliation with the American Chesapeake Club or other organizations.

The ACC Lifetime Achievement Award is not an annual award. The awards selection committee may decide not to make any awards selection in a given year or may decide to bestow multiple awards. The number / frequency of award selection is strictly at the discretion of the awards selection committee.

Nominations may be submitted by organizations or individuals, including the nominees themselves.

AWARDS CRITERIA

Nominees are judged by the originality, vision, breadth, / impact of the entire body of their work. Candidate selection must go beyond mere name recognition / reputation. A nominee’s work is evaluated in such areas as:

- A strong / well-documented commitment to the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed.
- Vocal / written advocacy of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed today.
- Advancement of best practices in owning, training, competing, rescuing / breeding Chesapeake Bay Retrievers.
- Service to the community / the public in connection with the Chesapeake Bay Retriever as a breed, in competition, to owners / through rescue efforts.

JUDGING

Nominations will be evaluated on the criteria provided above. The names of the award winner(s), if any, will be announced prior to the annual American Chesapeake Club Meeting during the National Specialty Show. The formal presentation of any award will take place at the Specialty.



Dual Champion Sodak's Gypsy Prince - Breeder: Rev. Schuster; Owner: Chesacroft Kennel (A. Bliss); Trainer: Charles Morgan. "Prince" was the first dual champion retriever of any retrieving breed. He was the second Chesapeake to make a field title. Prince was a medium sized deadgrass dog with an intense desire to work especially in icy water. He had a lifetime total of 14 pts. Today all field trial Chesaapeakes trace back to Prince through his son Chesacroft Baron ***.

FC Shagwong Gypsy - Breeder: C A Smith; Owner & Trainer: E. Monroe Osborne. "Gypsy" was the first Chesapeake bitch to earn a field trial championship (1939). She was the runt of her litter – a royally bred litter. Her sire was FC Skipper Bob and her maternal grandsire was Dual Ch Sodak's Gypsy Prince. Run by her owner Ed Osborne, Gypsy had 31 Open pts. and ran/completed the first National Open in 1941.


