

On the night of March 15, 2018 the sports world was absolutely abuzz. The current NCAA basketball tournament format came into being in 1985. Never before had a No. 16 seed beat a No. 1 seed. No. 1 seeds were 135-0 against 16 seeds. All that changed as the University of Maryland Baltimore County (UMBC) Chesapeake Bay Retrievers beat not only the No. 1 seed Virginia Cavaliers, but the overall No. 1 seed. The magnitude of this upset was on par with the 1980 Miracle on Ice hockey upset and the sports world went nuts.

In these days and times when things go nuts, social media goes nuts and the regular media jumps on it. This time was no different. Sportscasters and commentators, who knew nothing of the school, kept referring to them as the Retrievers. People were jumping on social media sharing pictures of their Golden Retrievers, Goldendoodles, Poodles, and others of their ilk, claiming a share of this momentous upset.

The sportscasters, in their ignorance, perpetuated this.

The coach, Mr. Ryan Odom, had to come out the next day and emphatically tell the sports world, that “We are not the Retrievers, we are the Chesapeake Bay Retrievers”. Amen. No riff raff so-so retrievers for UMBC. Pictures started to turn up showing a statue of a Chessie that was

UMBC came into being as classes were first held in the fall of 1966. It was decided that the school needed a name and mascot as schools do. Students were encouraged to send in suggestions. Mr. Tom Berlin, a student and non hunter, initially submitted the name The Canvasback Duck. He had 2nd thoughts about that, and 2 days before the deadline, submitted another suggestion, The Chesapeake Bay Retriever. The administration liked Mr. Berlin's second idea the best of all the entries, and UMBC became the UMBC Chesapeake Bay Retrievers. The first mascot, a pup named Campus Sam, or known to most as Sammy, was donated in 1967 by Claude Callegary and made his 1st appearance at a lacrosse match in May of 1967. Mr. Richard Chisolm, a student, cared for and trained the dog.

Sometime in 1986 someone got the idea, that a more permanent representation of the mascot was necessary. While the

administration, led by Chancellor Michael Hooker, was very skeptical of this endeavor, nevertheless, student enthusiasm won out and \$1,000 was appropriated to start the project. A philosophy professor knew

the administration that his student, Paulette Raye, a Samoyed fancier, be commissioned to do the work. That came to pass in 1986.

Now, Paulette needed to find an appropriate model for the sculpture and she really didn't know anyone with a Chessie, so she asked her vet if the vet knew anyone. Well, her vet was none other than Dr. Brenda Stewart, who, of course, had a number of Chessies. Paulette came over to the Stewarts' house and observed their group and fell in love with CH BIS Oak 'N' Thistles Nitty Gritty WD. Otherwise, known as Nitty. Thus began Nitty's career as an artistic model.

The first step in the process is to make a representation of the subject out of clay. For this, Nitty, had to pose and remain stationary. The modeling sessions lasted about 5 hours. Imagine asking a Chessie to stand and remain still for a long time. Nitty had to be taken out at regular intervals for brisk walks to keep him focused on his responsibilities. Unfortunately, UMBC did not have a proper studio for this and it needed to be done at Towson State University. This greatly increased Nitty's commute time and the Stewarts' time. Nitty made 6



trips to Towson. Some 350 pounds of clay later, Paulette was able to make the clay model of Nitty. The next step was to make a wax representation. All told, Paulette had 87 hours of work into this at the time. The wax representation was done and sent to the foundry, The New Art Foundry of Baltimore, for casting. Paulette received no compensation for her work.

Unfortunately, it was at this point that Chancellor Hooker eliminated all discretionary spending. Nitty's wax form would languish for approximately a year at the foundry while an effort was made

to seek funds to finish the project. \$10,000 was needed. Mr. Steve Cassard of UMBC sent out a letter in November of 1987 requesting contributions. There were significant donors. The Giant Food Foundation contributed \$2500. Jesse Mitchell, a former president of the ACC, contributed. The family of Bobby Carpenter also made a significant contribution.

Once the necessary funds were procured, Nitty became bronze. The official unveiling ceremony was held on Dec. 7th 1987. Nitty, the statue, was hidden under a black velvet tarp, while



the crowds gathered. A full house was on hand. A jazz band played, speeches were made, excitement filled the air; TV cameras whirled as the real Nitty, who, of course, was most distinguished guest, made his way towards his likeness. Things were abuzz, as Nitty, showing no signs of stage fright and thoroughly enjoying all the attention and adulation, moved towards his hidden statue. When the timing was perfect, Dr. Stewart handled him to the velvet shroud and instructed Nitty to grasp and pull. This, to a chorus of ooohs, ahhhhs and applause, he did, perfectly unveiling his likeness to the world.



Chancellor Hooker named the statue True Grit, but the statue is of Nitty. True Grit was actually the name of Nitty's father.

Naturally, with all the hoopla, folks had worked up an appetite, which was anticipated, and there was an honorary lunch held. An incident, the details of which remain quite murky, occurred near the salad bar in which Nitty wound up covered in broccoli salad. Nonplussed about the additional attention and the mess, he did what any Chessie would do, he dealt with the mess, eating the broccoli salad. His coat now being more oily due to the mayonnaise, but the scent of which gave Nitty a fond memory for days.

Not only was Nitty the statue mascot but he was a live one as well, attending UMBC sports functions. In one notable basketball game in which UMBC was playing their rivals, Kent State, the UMBC cheerleaders had their buddy Nitty with them. They were set up just off of one of the corners. Well, as it so happened, that was the corner that Kent State liked to run a set play. They'd run a few players in, screen out the defenders, and open a shot for the man that broke

into the open. Nitty, being a typical very smart Chessie, knew the difference in uniforms. When the guy broke free and ran towards his cheerleaders, he'd raise a fuss by barking and growling. The Kent State player was scared to death that this Chessie was going to come get him that he repeatedly missed the shot. When the teams switched ends, the UMBC coach was asked if he wanted Nitty and the cheerleaders to go down to the other corner. The coach said "Hell yes, he is the best defense we got".

Quite a dog. Nitty passed on in 1993. It is not known if he has descendants. There is one straw of sperm left on him so we are hopeful that his genes will be part of the gene pool.

The Stewarts still have 4 Chesapeakes and live in the same place. Paulette Raye lives in CA. Due to circumstances, she was not able to pursue her passion in art. However, she will be retiring in June and is looking forward to pursuing her first love once again.

Changes to **AKC Agility** to be implemented May 1, 2018: There are several changes in the running of a trial and also in the actual performance and judging of a dog and handler team. Below are those changes that will impact the judging of the performance in the ring. - A dog leaving the table and going to another obstacle before the table count is done will no longer be scored as a Failure but rather a Wrong Course. This would allow dogs in the Novice and Open classes to qualify if they meet all other requirements for a pass.
- If a handler touches ANY obstacle prior to the dog crossing the finish line it will result in a non-qualifying score for the run.

- The Four Paw rule will no longer apply and dogs will be allowed to reattempt the obstacle as long as they had not started the descent of that obstacle.

Changes to **AKC Tracking** titles to be implemented August 1, 2018: Lifetime Achievement title will be implemented to recognize consistency and longevity in the sport. The new title will allow the AKC and owner to reflect the number of times a dog has passed at the various test levels. As an example if a dog were to pass a TD twice it would now be recorded as TD2 and show in all official AKC records.

- The designation needs to be applied for and payment received by the AKC before it being included in the dogs official records. Recognition will be backdated to 1/1/00.
- As stated in the rules, untitled dogs have priority in the draw; previously titled dogs will be entered into the draw after all untitled dogs have been offered a spot in the test.

Changes to **AKC Rally Intermediate** rules to be implemented August 1, 2018 regarding Entry Eligibility and change of entry regulations:

- After titling in the "A" class, a dog may continue showing in the "A" class for 60 days. After 60 days it can then compete at that same level from the "B" class.
- A dog may compete in Nov. B until receiving a qualifying score in Rally Advanced.
- A dog may compete in both the Nov. B class and the Intermediate class at the same trial.
- After a dog earns the Rally Advanced title it may no longer be shown in the Rally Intermediate class.
- Rally Intermediate Class: To show in Rally Intermediate a dog must have earned the Rally Novice title but may not have earned the Rally Advanced title prior to closing of entries.

UKC Shed Dog Events

In January of 2017, United Kennel Club announced the development of a new series of events that test and recognize the efforts of dogs who excel in the retrieval of shed deer antlers. The first Elite Shed Dog Series events were held in the spring of 2017. There are 3 titles: Working Shed Dog (WSD) 5 passes needed, Champion Shed Dog (CHSD) accumulate 100 points and Elite Shed Dog (ESD) 3 first place wins after achieving the champion title. There is also a Dog of the Year honor for the most points earned in the year. There is a youth handler class and Youth handler of the year award also.

For a pass in the working dog series, a dog must find and retrieve 4 antlers in 15 minutes. The dog is to deliver the antler within 1 step of the handler. The handler is not allowed to move once the judge has announced a "find". In the champion series, the dog must find and retrieve 5 antlers in 15 minutes. The antler is to be delivered to hand. The course is 50 x 100 yards in various terrain and ground cover. Please see their website for all the details and rules.

The goal is for the improvement of the dogs used for recovering shed antlers by recognizing individual dogs of outstanding merit. It also provides shed dog owners with a family friendly environment in which to enjoy participating in an activity that promotes an active, outdoor lifestyle for individuals and their dogs. The youngest competitor is 7 years old from SE Wisconsin.

Searching for shed deer antlers is a growing pastime for whitetail deer hunters. The use of the family dog can greatly increase the odds of recovering the antlers.

A wide variety of dog breeds have been successfully used for this purpose. The

space required to train and test the skills of a shed dog are minimal when compared to other types of hunting which makes this sport very accessible to a wide range of individuals and their dogs. It is a great crossover sport for the hunting retriever and companion dogs to both enjoy. <https://www.ukcdogs.com/about-elite-shed-dogs>

Alli is a great versatile dog that will hunt anything we ask her to and have fun doing it. She has a wonderful loving disposition that makes her a quick favorite at events. She is working toward her champion shed dog title. Allie and Guage (below) are the first Chesapeakes to earn the Working Shed Dog titles by acquiring the 5 passes at UKC events on the same weekend.

“Guage” WSD Bear Kreek Grand Oaks 12 Guage MH12 CGC (Ch Sugar Trees Charger RN MH x Grand Oaks Caroway Kodiak MHWDQ**) bred by Tom and Dawn Lind owned and handled by Kim and Brian Schlomann. Guage is a fantastic working dog that loves hunting for antlers. He has been a great ambassador to the sport because he is often used for shed dog seminars, especially at the Wisconsin State Fair and ACC chesie fun days. At 9 years old, is currently working toward his champion title.

“Sadie” WSD Stateline Sadie (WSD Bear Kreek Grand Oaks 12 Guage MH12 CGC x WSD Bear Kreek Sheez Mi Alibi SH CGC). Bred, owned and handled by Brian and Kim Schlomann. Sadie is a quick learning dog that enthusiastically took to shed hunting immediately. She was previously used only for hunting and had very little training in sheds. She went 5 for 5 in the shed tests easily showing that older dogs can be trained to hunt antlers also and love doing it.

Rescue Update

Often people will ask, why adopt? Each situation is different and many are very difficult, but each has a reward. When you adopt, you save a loving animal by making them part of your family. Often rescue groups are brimming with happy, healthy pets just waiting for someone to take them home. Most of our rescue dogs have wound up with us because of a human problem like a move or a divorce, not because the animals did anything wrong. Many are already housetrained and used to living with families. Usually when you adopt a rescue dog, the cost of spay/neuter, first vaccinations and even micro chipping is included in the adoption fee or donation. This is often much more reasonable than the up front cost of adding a new member to your family. Many of our rescue dogs are already housetrained, which means you're not only saving a pet's life, you may be saving your rug. Adopting a mature dog not only gives older animals a second chance, it often means introducing them to your family will be much easier.








My old dog startles easily as I reach out to pet him, his eyes cloudy and reflecting back at me, his world smaller and slipping away.

“Find that duck!”, and he did. Once, being young and excited to have found the cripple hiding among the weeds, he showed it to me only to have it slip from his mouth. Gone again.

“Find that duck!” He stood still in the chest-deep Alaska marsh water, his amber eyes calmly staring at me. “Find that duck!”, I ordered, my voice etched in irritation.

His big, brown head disappeared under the water and gripped the still-alive duck from where he had it pinned with a foot as big as a paperweight. His head popped back up, duck in mouth. Have more faith in me human.

Now he is years past his last duck hunt. His world is small. Crate to yard to kennel. Laryngeal paralysis is choking off his air supply. I tried to give him a fun outing this spring. So quick, he slipped off the ice shelf and into the swollen river. I felt panic grip my chest as he calmly drifted away.

I scan the shoreline and see there is nowhere to haul him out. If he gets to the curve, he’s a goner. But then he stands on atrophied legs, calmly waiting for me, nails gripping the ice shelf. Haul me out human, and I did, my grief bubbling up again.

I watched him descend the front steps on tottering legs. He lurches left to a rotten snow pile and sticks his nose in deep, taking in the smells of spring. That big, brown head disappears again. I breathe in and out with him, anticipating our separation. My grief descends like a thin veil.

He looks up, satisfied, and trots off to his kennel. I’m here now human. Have more faith.

ACC Unveils New Health Tests Database



The American Chesapeake Club is very excited to announce the release of a new project that is now published on the club's website. The club's new Health Test Database allows the public to access results for ALL health clearances in one place, making it easier for all of us to make informed decisions whether we are shopping for a puppy or choosing a stud dog for our next litter. Access to accurate information is power. All data in this new Health Test Database is verified by our team of volunteers so that you can trust the info you find there.

Breeders and owners of dogs can submit results from the many laboratories that now offer health tests. You can simply snap a picture of your official results with your cell phone and upload them to our site so that our volunteers can verify the information. Or send our team a hyperlink to laboratory websites that officially publish test results. You also have the ability to upload photos and add notes to your dogs' records. Notes can include breeder and owner names and contact information for owners.

What makes this project different than current or past resources for health information?

The Orthopedic Foundation for Animals currently publishes many health clearances on their website, but charges a fee to publish results for each test from outside sources and the reality is that many are no longer paying fees to list their results there. In addition, OFA does not accept results for all tests. This forces us to have to dig around to locate all available information. Our ACC Health Test Database brings an end to the health test treasure hunt. In the past, our breed has had several privately owned pedigree databases that included results from health tests. Some of those databases folded and went away when the individuals who developed them found that it was impossible to keep up with the work. Other databases lost the confidence of their users because unverified information submitted by the public led to databases so riddled with errors that one could not truly trust the information found there. The ACC Health Test Database will improve accuracy by verifying documentation of each health test added to the database. And, no one person will bear responsibility for sustaining the project; a team of volunteers will share the workload. As the parent club for our breed, the ACC feels a responsibility to build and protect this resource for our breed community.

To make this project a success, we ask everyone to take a little time to submit any missing data for your dogs. We already upload all OFA information, so we are looking for health data that you have not submitted to OFA. If you have results from Paw Print Genetics, Optigen, GenSol, etc., send those results in and we will publish them alongside your OFA data.

ED BAHR (AL) – VICE PRESIDENT

I have always had dogs in my life and experienced a variety of breeds. A high school friend had a litter of Chesapeake puppies in the fall of 1990, and that was the beginning of my relationship between Chesapeakes and myself.

My first Chesapeake, Chico, was mainly a duck-hunting dog with little training, yet I enjoyed watching him use his natural ability of picking up ducks.

In the spring of 1991, I got my second Chesapeake, Beamer. I had both dogs for about a year. We mainly hunted ducks and partridge at my northern Minnesota cabin. Soon after having Chico for two years, I lost him in an unfortunate accident. This left Beamer and me spending endless hours duck hunting in Canada and northern Minnesota. Beamer was an excellent family dog, seeming to watch over my son as they grew up together. The bond he created within my family was indescribable. Beamer possessed amazing retrieval skills without being formally trained. He lived for fourteen and a half years. Losing him was an extremely sad time, yet I knew that I would always own a Chesapeake.

About a year after Beamer's death, I purchased my third Chesapeake, Deuce. I became interested in learning how to train Deuce using a more formal training program. I purchased numerous books and DVDs, and spent a lot of time learning how to train him. When Deuce was about two years old, I was introduced to hunt tests and started running him at entry level. He progressed through the different levels of these tests, yet when he reached Master level work, he was diagnosed with a neck issue that led to retiring him from competition.

Running hunt tests had allowed me to meet a large number of people who were involved in training and were members of different hunt clubs. One of these contacts informed me of a breeding that was of high interest to me, and in January of 2013 I purchased Rudy's Chasing Minnesota Fatz. Using my previous training, Fatz progressed through Finished and Master Level Hunt Tests. I had attended my first Chesapeake Field Trial Specialty in the fall of 2012, as a spectator. In 2013, I entered Fatz in his first Field Trial. He won Senior Puppy and Jammed the Derby at nine months old. This was the start of my interest in Field Trials. In 2014, Fatz earned a second in the Derby and Jammed the Qualifying. He has since jammed 3 Q's and placed 4th 2 times in the Q.

Fatz also was entered in a Conformation Event at eight months of age and won the Puppy Class.

My goal for the Chesapeake is to continue to produce healthy dual purpose dogs, both field and show.

Who am I? 1985 - Fell in love with Chesapeake's and became an ACC member. Own five Chesapeakes with eleven at Rainbow Bridge. I have trained, handled and titled many dogs in both AKC and UKC hunt tests and shows, as well as WD/WDX/WDQ and Canine Good Citizen events, and have participated in field trials. I have competed in conformation, CGC and Working events at several ACC National Specialties, and assisted in publishing the ACC Bulletin. I have also been active in dog clubs, including as an ACC Regional Director in both Missouri and Nebraska, treasurer and board member of the Columbia (Missouri) Kennel Club, where I organized a supported Chesapeake entry, member of the Nebraska Dog and Hunt Club and Great Plains Hunting Retriever Club, and member of the Grand Island Kennel Club, where I ring steward at the annual show and help with educational events, teach retriever classes and provide individual consultations with retriever owners.

In addition, I strive to be an ambassador for the breed. I organized and conducted Chesapeake Day events in Missouri, taught obedience for 4-H, worked with various clubs to organize and implement working tests and hunt tests, assisted with the Chesapeake booth at a Pheasant Fest, ran the Chesapeake exhibit at the Missouri Department of Conservation "Day With Wildlife", helped organize the Waterfowl Festival Event and ran the Chesapeake exhibit in Illinois, and have conducted many Chesapeake field demonstrations for various organizations.

I am a hardcore waterfowler who would not think of going without a trained dog. And my grandfather was right.

TINA COX (MI) - SECRETARY

My history spans over 25 years of owning this wonderful breed. I received my first Chesapeake in 1993 as a birthday gift from my long-time friend who owned the first Chesapeake I ever met. I fell in love with her dog immediately and knew I wanted one. Currently I have five dogs, one is almost 13, two six-year old's, and two nine-month old's. I co-own most of the dogs with my friend and my niece. I have competed in different venues with my dogs that include Conformation, Hunt Tests, CGC, Trick Dog and Working Dog Certification program, earning titles on several dogs in those venues.

I have been a member of the ACC since 2009; the current Secretary and one of two Regional Director's for Michigan. Together we have organized Fun Days, WD stakes, Annual Fun Hunt and last fall added a Dock Diving Fun Day to our events. Since 2009 I have volunteered at the Judges Education Seminar in Michigan, assisting with organizing the educational material as well as bringing my dogs to assist the judges in the hands-on portion. This is a fantastic venue for continued education for breed enthusiasts and judges.

These past two years as Secretary have been very educational and challenging for me. The Board works hard and has the best interest of the club, it's members and most of all the welfare of our breed at heart. One does not realize all that goes into making our club successful until you are on the other side of the fence. I would encourage others to volunteer where you think your talents may be utilized.

I welcome the opportunity to continue serving the club, it's members, and the dogs that we all cherish.

GINA DOWNIN (MD) - DIRECTOR

We brought home our first Chesapeake in 2002. Eddy was a large boy who proved to be a rather challenging first Chesapeake. We now say that he was sent to us to teach us how to be better dog people. And, he was a very good teacher! After adding Eddy to our family, I found myself joining a retriever club, attending weekly obedience classes, and eventually entering our first show (the 2003 NSS in Michigan). Our second CBR, Scupper, came from Jane Pappler who had been particularly accommodating about my incessant questions about the breed and had invited me to her house to learn how to evaluate a litter of puppies. That day led to a long, fulfilling mentorship and friendship in which we co-owned several dogs and co-bred a number of litters. I now breed on a very limited basis under the kennel name, Weatherdeck.

I'm particularly enamored with the versatility of our breed and I try (as much as my demanding day job will allow) to train and partake in a variety of activities that stimulate my dogs and give them a job. I'm active in my retriever club and my obedience club. I am always training for a few different disciplines at one time and competing on a limited basis throughout the year.

I've been an active ACC volunteer since joining the club in 2003. I've served on the rescue and show committees and chaired the Show Committee and the 2014 Nominating Committee. I co-chaired a supported entry at the Maryland Sporting Dog Show for 3 years. In 2011, I co-chaired the National Specialty Show. And, I co-chaired the WD/X/Q at the 2014 NSS. I'm currently a Regional Director in Maryland. I've also been very active in rescuing Chesapeakes through Chesapeake Bay Retriever Relief & Rescue having fostered and placed over 40 rescues.

I'm currently a number of months into my first year on the ACC Board of Directors. In that time, I have worked with a small group of people to launch a new ACC Health Tests Database so that it is easier for everyone to find information about all health clearances on individual dogs. That project is proving to be a success and Chesapeake owners all over the world are submitting health test data to us. I am also serving as Board Liaison on both the Show and JBEC Committees.

MARLENE DRAG, DVM (MO) - DIRECTOR

My husband and I bought our first Chesapeake in 1985. We had been introduced to the breed during our time as veterinary students. Our primary intent for our first dog was for waterfowl hunting but we did not want a Labrador or Golden. We brought Ian home at 9 weeks. My husband's assistant at the clinic volunteered her husband to help us train because he

trained Golden Retrievers for field trials. We trained with George and at his urging, entered a puppy stake when Ian was 4.5 months old. When Ian got fourth place, this was the start of a time consuming and fun hobby. At just 6 months of age, Ian passed his WD. Then at the urging of others, we also began to compete in conformation. Ian was a CH, because all-age qualified, and had all age points. With our first dog we made a lot of mistakes but also learned a lot about the breed.

Our primary interest is still retriever field trials. We have had numerous all-age qualified dogs, and currently are running all-age stakes with one dog and the minor stakes with another. Hopefully the youngest dog we have will be running Derbies this fall. Finding the time to do other activities is hard but over the years we have had a Champion Master Hunter, and another Champion all-age qualified dog.

I currently serve on the ACC Health Committee, I feel that through my association with other members, I have a working knowledge of goals of the ACC. The ACC should be proud that it has dedicated members that are constantly striving to make the club successful and continue to strive to make Chessies an all-purpose breed.

DAN EPPERSON (TX) - TREASURER

My love affair with retrievers began on Thanksgiving in 1966. Little did I know at the time, holding our new retriever puppy on my lap, the impact she would have on my life.

I grew up waterfowl/upland hunting and learned how to train dogs with her. My Dad ran her in the local Michiana FT club, and I found my strong baseball throwing arm in demand as a bird boy. One of her pups went on to become a Field Champion under a local pro. A littermate became mine to train and hunt with through my college years. I graduated with two BS degrees, one in Electronics Engineering and the other Management.

We moved to Southern California in the mid-80s for my new job in the US Defense industry. I soon joined the hunt test retriever movement with a NAHRA club and became an officer. I suggested the club also hold an AKC hunt test. Somehow, I ended up as the HT chairman of the first AKC HT in the state.

In 1990, I transferred to Texas for a job in Quality Management. Here I continued HT club activities/roles and became a HT judge. We purchased our first Chesapeake Bay Retriever for my wife to train for hunt tests. Later, we bred her to a dual champion and kept two pups.

By 2000, my position as a Project Manager and our daughters' school activities pulled me away from hunt tests. But, I continued to hunt with our Chessies well into their later years. One day I found myself "retired", Chessie-less and running a marathon in Chicago. Carla, my wife decided I needed a new little Chessie "Angel" to keep me occupied.

Angel certainly excelled at her role. She qualified and ran her first Master National at 21 months and has continued to do so yearly. At the Inaugural Master Amateur Invitational, she became

the first and only Chessie to pass. Angel has also earned show points with Carla as her handler.

Carla and I are actively training her young male Chessie, Vinny to run in master hunt tests this fall. When time permits we get together to train with my Dad and his Chessie, Maple.

I'm passionate about maintaining the Chesapeake Bay Retriever's performance in the field and in the ring. We must strive to maintain the breed's conformation, intelligence and disposition to ensure they remain America's premier waterfowl dog.

GALE FRANA (TN) - DIRECTOR

I am honored to be considered by the Nominating Committee and the ACC membership for a position on the ACC Board of Directors. The American Chesapeake Club is very important in preserving and promoting a wonderful breed, whose versatility, strength, loyalty, intelligence, work ethic and gentleness makes them one of a kind. It would truly be an honor to represent the people who live with and love Chesapeakes; the members around our country and the world.

Chesapeakes have been a part of my life since 1977. I participate in conformation, obedience, rally, and field work. I have bred multiple champions and dogs with titles in obedience, rally and field.

I have served the last three years as the ACC Treasurer. It has been both challenging and rewarding. I see one of my roles as support for those members who volunteer to work for our breed. I have had the pleasure of getting to know and work with many people across the country and some foreign members as well. I also serve as the ACC Regional Director for Tennessee. We have an annual TN Chessie Fun Day with attendees from five states and last year also hosted a Tracking Seminar.

I am also involved in other local dog organizations. I am a member of the East Tennessee Retriever Club, participate in club training days and work at club tests and trials. I volunteer with the HABIL program at the University of TN College of Veterinary Medicine as a canine evaluator for potential therapy dogs. I also serve as a volunteer with Smoky Mountain Service Dogs which provides mobility assistance service dogs for veterans who have become physically disabled due to their service to our country. There is no charge to the veteran. The service-dog-in-training lives with me for about 18 months while I train the dog in advanced skills and take the dog everywhere I go in my daily life.

I have a Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration from the University of Central Florida. I believe I have the dedication to our breed as well as the experience, organizational skills and personal qualities to continue to serve our wonderful breed, our members and our club as a member of the Board of Directors.

GIGI GRANT (ID) - DIRECTOR

I have owned Chesapeakes since 1999, which is also when I joined the ACC. I grew up with dogs, but we always just "had" them, we didn't train them to do much more than be solid citizens in the home. All that changed with our first CBR!

My husband and I decided when we became empty nesters that we wanted a breed that neither of us had had before, for our next dog. Our previous two family dogs had been a Standard Poodle and a Shih Tzu. So we did quite a bit of research and decided on a Chesapeake. We were pretty outmatched with our first, and soon learned that we would be spending some time going to obedience classes and establishing a pecking order at home. We learned so much with Thud!

Thud became the first dog with whom I earned an obedience title (CD) (possibly out of necessity!), and a hunting title (WD). He was followed by Tomahawk, pheasant dog extraordinaire. Tommy was our first show dog, and the great grandsire of our 5th Chesapeake, VooDoo. In between were Kiowa, Tommy's son, and Ruckus, Tommy's grandson (We presently have Ruckus and VooDoo). Between them, they have earned 2 GCH, 4 CH, 3 SH, 4 CD, 2 CDX, 1 WD, 1 WDX, 2 WDQ, 1 Elite Jumper in Dock Dogs, 1 Master Jumper, and 1 Senior Jumper. In addition, Ruckus has earned his first two MH passes.

Through living with, working with and loving these dogs, I have come to appreciate the various clubs which promote dog sports. I am an active member of 2 All-Breed clubs, 2 obedience clubs, and 3 retriever clubs. I work at all events put on by these clubs, and I am working toward becoming an AKC obedience judge. I am a CGC examiner. In addition, I volunteer for our local All Breed rescue group, serving as Spay & Neuter Coordinator.

Sadly, we lost Thud to DM (before the test was available), and Tomahawk (a carrier) to DM. Both dogs were necropsied in order to participate in the ongoing study. I continue to learn all I can about this disease, in hopes that one day it won't be a factor in our breeding programs.

I am devoted to this breed, and it is an honor to serve on the board of the club which cherishes and protects this breed.

FROM THE ACC BYLAWS PAGE 16-17, SECTION 7. ELECTIONS, B. NOMINATIONS, SUBSECTIONS 2 AND 3

(2) Additional nominations of eligible members may be made by written petition addressed to the Secretary and postmarked on or before August 1st, signed by five (5) percent of the current membership or 50 signatures, of members in good standing, whichever number is lower, and accompanied by the written acceptance of such additional nominee signifying his willingness to be a candidate. No person shall be a candidate for more than one position, and the additional nominations which are provided for herein may be made only from among those members who have not accepted a nomination of the Nominating Committee.

(3) If no valid additional nominations are received by the Secretary on or before August 1st, the Nominating Committee's slate shall be declared elected, and no balloting will be required. The new officers and directors will take office on October 1st.

OBJECTIVE

The ACC Lifetime Achievement Award is given to an individual who has made significant contributions to the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed / the people who own them through outstanding leadership / advancement of knowledge / understanding.

ELIGIBILITY

The ACC Lifetime Achievement Award recognizes personal achievement / its positive impact on the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed. The award may be given to any individual independent of specific institutional affiliation with the American Chesapeake Club or other organizations.

The ACC Lifetime Achievement Award is not an annual award. The awards selection committee may decide not to make any awards selection in a given year or may decide to bestow multiple awards. The number / frequency of award selection is strictly at the discretion of the awards selection committee.

Nominations may be submitted by organizations or individuals, including the nominees themselves.

AWARDS CRITERIA

Nominees are judged by the originality, vision, breadth, / impact of the entire body of their work. Candidate selection must go beyond mere name recognition / reputation. A nominee's work is evaluated in such areas as:

- A strong / well-documented commitment to the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed.
- Vocal / written advocacy of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed today.

- Advancement of best practices in owning, training, competing, rescuing / breeding Chesapeake Bay Retrievers.
- Service to the community / the public in connection with the Chesapeake Bay Retriever as a breed, in competition, to owners / through rescue efforts.

JUDGING

Nominations will be evaluated on the criteria provided above. The names of the award winner(s), if any, will be announced prior to the annual American Chesapeake Club Meeting during the National Specialty Show. The formal presentation of any award will take place at the Specialty.

NOMINATION REQUIREMENTS
