

2018 Field Trial Specialty Report


The Chesapeake FT Nation met in the Eugene Oregon area for a full week of testing/trialing and fellowship. It is always wonderful to renew old acquaintances and make new friends!!

We were hoping for nice summer weather for our stay but we found less than ideal conditions. We experienced unusually hot weather - up to 95 degrees. Wildfires in Redding, California and Medford, Oregon (up to 300 miles away) filled the Willamette Valley with smoke. Then to add insult to injury, the ground-nesting yellow jackets were everywhere. That resulted in many people and dogs being stung – even called for one trip to urgent care. But we are Chesapeake owners and we are just as tough as our dogs. Despite the distractions, we had fun!!! First off, it there was the first Chesapeake only Hunt test held



under the ACC Field Trial specialty umbrella – held in Scio Oregon, north of Eugene. We had a nice entry of 16 Master dogs (with three dogs completing the test) and 10 Junior dogs (with 8 completing the test.) Please read Dale Langhorne's HT chair's report for complete details.

Monday found some folks doing a last bit of training until it was time to meet for the kick-off dinner. We met on the grounds headquarters (Bente Kongsore's property near Creswell Oregon) for a great social hour and had an opportunity to check out all the silent auction items before we got down to business. President Linda Harger held her last official ACC meeting. (Also present were Vice President Lynda Barber-Wiltse, Treasurer Gale Frana and Board Members Gina Downin and Gigi Grant.) She welcomed everyone and introduced our judges. She also thanked our landowners for the generous use of their properties. She introduced all the key workers at the trial. Linda then had the pleasure to announce the winners of two very important awards. First she gave the ACC Lifetime Achievement Award to Julie Cole. She then announced the winner of the AKC Outstanding Sportsmanship Award to Pat Puwal. Linda said that both of these awards were truly deserved. We then had a door prize drawing for various treats. Finally, it was time to eat and out came the yellow jackets. (Bummer!) Then we all left to turn in and get rested for the first day of the trial.



On Tuesday, we headed to Dan and Keely Morin's property for the Open and the Derby. The Derby was quickly finished since they had a small entry. The Open got off to a late start but the contestants remained in the same parking area so it eliminated the necessity of moving. They started with a land triple and then moved onto marks to finish for the day. We then moved back to the tent at the Kongsore property for dinner and a chance to sign up for the silent auction items. There was FT Spec merchandise for sale too. Also the Derby placements were given out.

On Wednesday, the Open continued at the Morin property and after its completion, the Qualifying started in the same place. The Amateur started at Diane and Alex Morley's property that was right next to where dinners were being held. It was a bit of a drive between the two locations but we managed. (I think Bill Burks and I were the only ones to get lost – in an area of no cell reception!) In the afternoon, the puppies gathered and we held



Open Commentary

By Bill Burks (KS)

The first series of the Open was a land triple. (The birds in all series were ducks.) Right retired 180 yard bird was shot first. The gunner stood on an 8 foot berm with a background of trees and shot from right to left and angled the throw to the bottom of the berm. Dogs crossed two channels of water to reach this bird. Left retired mark at 170 yards -- gunner emerged from behind a tree and threw from left to right into cover. The last bird was a 240 yard flyer up the middle shot from right to left.

25 dogs were called back to the 250 yard land blind with a dry pop. Dogs entered the water, crossed a point and then went back into the water. Then back on land and down a tight corridor. The line was tight to the gunner and sixty yards past him to the bird.

The third series water blind crossed three points -- the second point was scented. Blind was 175yds.

Ten dogs were called back for water marks. The line was on a hillside with trees that were strategically situated. Handlers and dogs had to select slots between the trees to reach all birds. It was 95 degrees and smoky -- the tent shade on the line was appreciated. A 150 yard flyer was on the left and shot out of the test. Dogs crossed two channels to reach the duck. Right retired bird was 200 yards and thrown from left to right onto an island. The line to bird crossed two channels and then another 100 yard swim to the island. A 260 yard retired bird up the middle was thrown from right to left and was tight to the island bird. The line to this bird also crossed two channels of water. Two dogs did the test without handling.

Qualifying Commentary

By Tim Bonnema (MN) and Tom Lind (WI)

The first three series of the Qualifying were combined. The marks were a double -- right bird at 12 o'clock and about 180 yards was a retired gun thrown right to left with a brushed-in holding blind. Next at 10 o'clock was the go bird, a shot flier, left to right at 110 yards. The retired gun was a challenge for the dogs due to the cover -- many clumps of heavy cover made marking a challenge and holding the line even harder. The dogs tended to blow past the retired gunner into the large field behind the gunner. Next the handlers turned to 3 o'clock for the water blind -- a 110 yard channel blind with a long angled water entry, then a 60 yard swim to the bird on a point. After completing this, the handler went on to the land blind -- at 1 o'clock behind the retired gun station. Again the cover made it difficult to keep the dogs on line.

Eight dogs were called back to forth Series. It was a big triple with two retired guns. Center bird thrown first right to left (approximately 200 yards). Two hidden pieces of water early then multiple clumps of brush and grass. Right bird thrown second left to right. Mark was approximately 180 yards and was just beyond hidden water. Right and center marks were both retired. Go bird was a short (70 yard) mark thrown in left to right with a narrow piece of hidden water on the way. Most dogs didn't have any trouble with go bird but struggled with the two long retired guns. A few dogs got sucked back into go bird after coming out of second piece of hidden water. There were many clumps of grass and brush to confuse dogs on way to retired guns. Six dogs completed the series.

Amateur Commentary

The setting for the first series of the Amateur stake at the 2018 American Chesapeake Club Field Trial Specialty was situated in a bowl shaped area surrounded by hills of varying size. The temperatures at the start of the day dipped into the fifties and gradually rose into the eighties as the day progressed. The morning wind was calm and variable with prevailing winds establishing their normal patterns by midday. Ducks were used in all the series. The middle retired bird was thrown first, right to left and angled back up the opposing hillside at approximately 180 yards. The right retired bird was thrown next, right to left and slightly angled back on a smaller hillside with trees in the background at roughly 160 yards. The flyer go bird was shot left to right and angling back at 75 yards. The work was generally good and most dogs did not need more than a small hunt to find the birds. Only three dogs were dropped after the first series.

The land blind was run from the same spot as the first series. Once on the mat, the handler called for a dry pop from a stand out gunner facing away from the line at approximately 90 yards. The dry pop gunner was located just outside and at the mid-point of a very tight corridor of hay bales. At the end of the hay bale corridor was a small steep sided mound that was directly in line to the bird. The bird was located up into a clearing of a wooded hillside. The dog work varied between needing many whistles to work their way through the hay bale corridor to dogs that almost lined the blind, only to be lost at the end in the woods or miss the mound, which proved to be the critical factor when call backs were announced. Sixteen dogs were called back to the water blind.

For the water blind, the test was moved to pond area at the opposite end of the same field where the land series took place. The mat was set on a small mound and faced a channel approximately sixty yards away. A stand out dry pop gunner sat along the edge of the channel and faced the line with a channel across from him. The line to the blind required the dog to run down and get in the water in front of the gunner. The dog than swam

Derby Commentary

By Shawn Ward (NE)

The first and second series of the Derby got started not long after 8am on Tuesday in a beautiful mowed hay-field. There was a flyer off to the left as a single. Then, immediately after, the dog shifted to the right to run a double for the second series. The memory-bird was thrown R-to-L into some taller wet grass. To the left of that, at about 90 degrees, the go-bird was thrown (also R-to-L) from in front of a brush pile. The weather was still cool out and it was a great way to start out the day.

The third and fourth series went to water. The sun was getting hot and the judges were kind enough to place the lines (and gallery) for these last two series under a grove of pine trees to keep us shaded. The third series was a water single thrown across a pond with decoys in it. The mark was thrown R-to-L out on to the bank of a grassy jetty. The dogs then immediately went to the line for the fourth mark which was placed about 20 yards to the right of the third series line. This was a wide double on the far bank of two parallel canals. The dogs had to go in the water, over the jetty and into the second piece of water and both birds landed on the far banks. There was a right side memory bird and a left side go-bird a good 90 degrees apart. Thanks to our judges for participating in this event. It's always fun to watch the young dogs at their best.

past the first channel, alongside a fairly long shoreline, past a hidden channel and out to the bird located on a spit at roughly 130 yards. The dogs that were comfortable getting in the water and staying in the water made easy work of the blind while the ones that preferred land did not fare so well. Eight dogs were called back to the final series.

For the fourth series, the test was rotated ninety degrees from the water blind line with about 100 yards of land between the mat and the water. The first bird was a long retired thrown left to right at approximately 200 yards with a fairly flat angle just past the backside of the channel used for the water blind. This long mark had the biggest piece of water that was bisected by a spit the dogs had to get up and over to continue their swim to the far shore before exiting the water to the bird. The left retired bird was thrown on land at 160 yards, left to right and with a flat angle just inside a channel with another small slice of water in front. A hay bale at the water entry forced dogs to either choose water or land in route to this bird. The flyer go bird was shot at 80 yards on land in front of the water. The flyer angled back left to right. The dog work varied with a couple dogs breaking on the flyer or needing to be handled on one of the retired birds. The top dogs did the test clean.

Second mark was way right thrown left into water close to island. Some chose to go water, island, water, some chose direct water route. No cheaters on this one. Again, no one empty handed on return.

HT Master Commentary

By Dan Epperson

First Series - Land Triple with a Land Blind. Walk up with a short 45 yd mark on the left side, bird thrown flat left to right. Medium ground cover with hay bales scattered throughout the set up. Second mark was roughly a 100 plus yard flyer. Bird thrown right to left. Fall area of first to marks converging at times with a couple bales of hay in-between causing some to have trouble with either the short check down bird or long flyer. The final mark or Go bird was wide to the right side. Land blind was fundamental and run over level ground slightly in front of two bales of hay approximately 100 yards. Moderate wind, hay bales and the prior triple to the right area were the only factors.

Second Series – Triple with a Water & Land Blind. Series began with a diversion shot being fired. Dogs were brought to the line and instructed to complete a short water/land blind across channel and up onto land at a 45 degrees angle from the line/mat. Upon return the dogs faced a down the shoreline mark 75 yds thrown across a channel, right to left. Handlers and

dogs had to swing wide to the right for a 90 yd mark, thrown left to right. The Go bird or last fall was approx. 120 yds out in-between the two falls. The direct line to the fall required the dogs to hit a corner pocket of water, proceed across land and cross over a channel before reaching the bird. The line to the final land blind was located in-between a dirt roadway running parallel to the line and periductular to the fall area of the second mark.

Third Series – Triple & Honor. First mark was out of a tree line on left side of field. Bird thrown left to right, often landing behind a dirt mound. The second mark up the middle and longer was tight to the first mark. The bird was thrown right to left. Making the converging marks tighter. Hay bales were scatter throughout fall area. The Go bird was thrown to the far sided bank out of a holding blind located at the left end of the pond, slightly to the right of the line of the middle mark. Upon completion of the triple the dogs were required to honor the next working dog.

First Series – Two Land Singles. First land mark was over medium cover 90 yards away. The bird was launched left to right at a 45 angle back from behind a hay bale to in front of another. Hay bales were scattered throughout but didn't deter the dogs. A shot flyer served as the second mark at 80 yds.

Second Series – Two Water Singles. This series consisted of the dogs picking up two back to back singles across land and then separate water channels. The first water mark was 60 yds away to the left of the line. A 45-degree water entry was required to hold the line and pick up the bird on the far side of the channel shore. The final mark was 90 yds to the right side of the line with a long land entry before hitting the water.

Lifetime Achievement Award

I wish to thank the ACC and its members for the honor of receiving the Lifetime Achievement Award at the 2018 NSS. It was bittersweet since (my late husband) Bill was not there to share in the award. From the start Bill was as much a part of Pond Hollow as I was although he never participated in conformation or hunt tests. He supported me in all the things that I did with the dogs.



I was always a cat person. I admired their independence and the affection that you earned. Bill was a dog man. While visiting my aunt & uncle he made a comment that set a course that became Pond Hollow Chesapeakes. They had recently acquired a new puppy and a book on dog breeds. Going through the book, Bill came to the Chesapeake Bay Retriever. The breed's description and photos appealed to him and he said "I like this breed". Had we ever seen or heard of one before? No. I was the cat person so who cares about dog breeds. Christmas that year my aunt kept telling us she had a big surprise for our daughter Jennifer. The surprise-a brown male Chesapeake puppy! We named him Tamarack "Tiki".

Tiki was a happy dog-loved to retrieve. He was a good guardian that I often took to work with me. Tiki loved to swim in the pond at our home. I grew to love and admire the breed's traits. When he died, we had to have another Chesapeake-nothing else would do. We called around and came across Barbara & Sam Mullen "Mitsu Kuma" who had a litter due. We brought home a brown male that we named Saxon (Ch* Mitsu Kuma's Saxon Pond UD WD-"Bear"). I applied the most scientific method in selecting him-he had a small white chest spot that matched my beloved cat's and he wooed! His parents were very well bred. Without trying we stumbled into just the type background you would want if you were going to be serious in dogs. For our first solely bred litter, we chose the kennel name "Pond Hollow" for the little valley (called hollows locally) that we lived in and the pond that was in it. It all went on from there.

There have been 181 AKC Pond Hollow champion Chesapeakes as well as 152 performance titles in various venues including MACH, Ch/UD, Tracking Ch Canada, 20 MH & FT award winners including a QA2. Our stud dogs are #2, #4, & #6 all-time top producers of conformation dogs in the breed. All of my own dogs I personally trained & titled- dogs in conformation (group wins and SS wins), obedience (all levels) and hunt tests to SH level. I have judged in 7 different countries- England, Sweden, Denmark, Ireland, Czech Republic, Germany & Switzerland as well all across the US including Westminster KC.

My philosophy is that the dog must look like it can function for its breed's purpose within the confines of its standard. Good looks without good temperament, retrieving instinct and physical soundness is not enough-a Chesapeake deserves to be and have all of those traits. Again thank-you for this award.

Grain Free Diet and Dilated Cardiomyopathy

Dilated Cardiomyopathy (DCM) involves swelling and reduced function of the heart. The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and the Canine Health Foundation (CHF) of AKC have identical concerns about heart damage possibly caused by some aspects of this diet. These concerns were prompted by an inordinate occurrence of this disease in breeds not predisposed to the disease. Both the FDA and CHF have joined with large food producers to find the specific causes if they do exist. Both organizations have been quick to share their information with our ACC Health Committee. Needless to say, if you have signs of the disease and a history of the diet contact your veterinarian. If he or she confirms the disease is present, contact a veterinary cardiologist and get specific directions on diet and treatment. The following was supplied by the FDA (and the link to it was shared in the last *Bulletin* issue). Little has changed from then, information wise, or since it was written. New significant findings when received will be promptly supplied to our whole membership. We speak to the FDA and CHF frequently each month.

FDA Investigating Potential Connection Between Diet and Cases of Canine Heart Disease

July 12, 2018

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration is alerting pet owners and veterinary professionals about reports of canine dilated cardiomyopathy (DCM) in dogs eating certain pet foods containing peas, lentils, other legume seeds, or potatoes as main ingredients. These reports are unusual because DCM is occurring in breeds not typically genetically prone to the disease. The FDA's Center for Veterinary Medicine and the Veterinary Laboratory Investigation and Response Network, a collaboration of government and veterinary diagnostic laboratories, are investigating this potential association.

Canine DCM is a disease of a dog's heart muscle and results in an enlarged heart. As the heart and its chambers become dilated, it becomes harder for the heart to pump, and heart valves may leak, leading to a buildup of fluids in the chest and abdomen. DCM often results in congestive heart failure. Heart function may improve in cases that are not linked to genetics with appropriate veterinary treatment and dietary modification, if caught early.

The underlying cause of DCM is not truly known, but is thought to have a genetic component. Breeds that are typically more frequently affected by DCM include large and giant breed dogs, such as Great Danes, Boxers, Newfoundlands, Irish Wolfhounds, Saint Bernards and Doberman Pinschers. It is less common in small and medium breed dogs, except American and English Cocker Spaniels. However, the cases that have been reported to the FDA have included Golden and Labrador Retrievers, Whippets, a Shih Tzu, a Bulldog and Miniature Schnauzers, as well as mixed breeds.

Diets in cases reported to the FDA frequently list potatoes or multiple legumes such as peas, lentils, other "pulses" (seeds of

legumes), and their protein, starch and fiber derivatives early in the ingredient list, indicating that they are main ingredients. Early reports from the veterinary cardiology community indicate that the dogs consistently ate these foods as their primary source of nutrition for time periods ranging from months to years. High levels of legumes or potatoes appear to be more common in diets labeled as "grain-free," but it is not yet known how these ingredients are linked to cases of DCM. Changes in diet, especially for dogs with DCM, should be made in consultation with a licensed veterinarian.

In the reports the FDA has received, some of the dogs showed signs of heart disease, including decreased energy, cough, difficulty breathing and episodes of collapse. Medical records for four atypical DCM cases, three Golden Retrievers and one Labrador Retriever, show that these dogs had low whole blood levels of the amino acid taurine. Taurine deficiency is well-documented as potentially leading to DCM. The Labrador Retriever with low whole blood taurine levels is recovering with veterinary treatment, including taurine supplementation, and a diet change. Four other cases of DCM in atypical dog breeds, a Miniature Schnauzer, Shih Tzu and two Labrador Retrievers, had normal blood taurine levels. The FDA continues to work with board certified veterinary cardiologists and veterinary nutritionists to better understand the clinical presentation of these dogs. The agency has also been in contact with pet food manufacturers to discuss these reports and to help further the investigation.

Chesapeake Bay Retriever Earns New Versatile Companion Dog 4 Title (VCD4)



CT Pond Hollow Bay of Calais VCD4 BN RN MJB XF Pond Hollow Bay of Calais (Callie) finished the requirements for the Versatile Companion Dog 4 (VCD4) title this September. She is the second Chesapeake to attain the title, following Doreen Palmer's fabulous Zephyr.

The AKC first started awarding versatile companion dog titles in 2001, but they did not add the VCD4 title until 2003. Since that time, only 41 dogs have earned the title—and Callie is #41.

To earn a VCD title, a dog must display proficiency in three disciplines: tracking, agility and obedience. The titling sequence goes as follows:

- VCD1—dog completes a CD, novice agility and novice agility jumpers titles (or their equivalents in the preferred classes), and gets an initial tracking title (TD).
- VCD2—dog completes a CDX, open agility and open agility jumpers titles (or their equivalents in the preferred classes), and gets an initial tracking title (TD).
- VCD3—dog completes a CDX, open agility and open agility jumpers titles (or their equivalents in the preferred classes), and gets a tracking dog excellent title (TDX).
- VCD 4—dog completes a utility dog excellent title (UDX), masters agility and masters agility jumpers titles (or their equivalents in the preferred classes), and passes a variable surface tracking test.

It takes a lot of time and dedication to earn a VCD 4 (10 qualifying scores at the same trial in both open and utility for obedience, and 10 qualifying scores in both standard and jumpers classes for agility, and the very difficult variable surface tracking test), and it takes a really exceptional dog to have the talent to earn them.

AKC Delegate's Report

At the AKC's Quarterly Delegate Meeting on September 25, 2018:

The American Chesapeake Club was honored for its 100 years of membership in the AKC. The ACC was the first breed club of the AKC.



Multiple issues involving Dog Show Rules were discussed and/or voted upon. The following amendments to Dog Show Rules were passed:

- Chapter 1, Sect 4: allows clubs to limit their event by the number of dogs or by the total entry.
- Chapter 5 Sect 9: allows clubs to offer a three time win trophy for Reserve Best in Show.

The following amendments did not pass:

- Chapter 3 Sect 16: which would specify the order in which awards are presented by a judge at an All-Breed Show.
- Chapter 11 New Sect 16: There is currently a Board "policy" regarding appropriate leads and collars at dog shows. The Delegate Dog Show Rules Committee proposed that this be made a "rule". After a long and heated debate this issue was sent back to the Committee for further consideration and/or revision.

The following are proposals which will be voted upon at the December 2018 meeting:

- Chapter 3 Sect 13: clarifies the eligibility of Winners Dog/ Bitch that has been defeated in a non-regular class as well as

when the Best of Winners is awarded.

- Chapter 5 Sect 2: allows club the option of including the date on class placement ribbons.
- Chapter 9 Sect 2, 4, and 12: clarify the duties and eligibility of Show Superintendents and Secretaries.
- Chapter 11 Sect 1: clarifies a foreign dog's eligibility.
- Chapter 11 Sect 8A: this amendment deals with the reinstatement of a disqualified dog. AKC currently provides a list of dogs that have been disqualified but that list does not include the owner's name or contact information as that would be a breach of the Discloser of Information policy. The proposed amendment would require permanent identification and a picture. Given the variety of opinions on reinstatement procedures I doubt this will receive the 2/3 needed for passage.
- Chapter 16 Sect 1: This amendment provides for the Best of Winners the opportunity to earn 1 championship point if the combined number of regular class dogs of both sexes is the minimum required for 1 point (usually 2 total competitors). Most of the discussion on this amendment has centered on the impact of small entry breeds.

American Chesapeake Club Lifetime Achievement Award

OBJECTIVE

The ACC Lifetime Achievement Award is given to an individual who has made significant contributions to the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed / the people who own them through outstanding leadership / advancement of knowledge / understanding.

ELIGIBILITY

The ACC Lifetime Achievement Award recognizes personal achievement / its positive impact on the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed. The award may be given to any individual independent of specific institutional affiliation with the American Chesapeake Club or other organizations.

The ACC Lifetime Achievement Award is not an annual award. The awards selection committee may decide not to make any awards selection in a given year or may decide to bestow multiple awards. The number / frequency of award selection is strictly at the discretion of the awards selection committee.

Nominations may be submitted by organizations or individuals, including the nominees themselves.

AWARDS CRITERIA

Nominees are judged by the originality, vision, breadth, / impact of the entire body of their work. Candidate selection must go beyond mere name recognition / reputation. A nominee's work is evaluated in such areas as:

- A strong / well-documented commitment to the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed.
- Vocal / written advocacy of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed today.
- Advancement of best practices in owning, training, competing, rescuing / breeding Chesapeake Bay Retrievers.
- Service to the community / the public in connection with the Chesapeake Bay Retriever as a breed, in competition, to owners / through rescue efforts.

JUDGING

Nominations will be evaluated on the criteria provided above. The names of the award winner(s), if any, will be announced prior to the annual American Chesapeake Club Meeting during the National Specialty Show. The formal presentation of any award will take place at the Specialty.

Dual Champion Sodak's Gypsy Prince - Breeder: Rev. Schuster; Owner: Chesacroft Kennel (A. Bliss); Trainer: Charles Morgan. "Prince" was the first dual champion retriever of any retrieving breed. He was the second Chesapeake to make a field title. Prince was a medium sized deadgrass dog with an intense desire to work especially in icy water. He had a lifetime total of 14 pts. Today all field trial Chesaapeakes trace back to Prince through his son Chesacroft Baron ***.

FC Shagwong Gypsy - Breeder: C A Smith; Owner & Trainer: E. Monroe Osborne. "Gypsy" was the first Chesapeake bitch to earn a field trial championship (1939). She was the runt of her litter - a royally bred litter. Her sire was FC Skipper Bob and her maternal grandsire was Dual Ch Sodak's Gypsy Prince. Run by her owner Ed Osborne, Gypsy had 31 Open pts. and ran/completed the first National Open in 1941.


