





## First published Jan / Feb 1978 American Chesapeake Club Bulletin

### From the Desk of the Editor

Being the bulletin editor for ACC brings with it many new adventures and happenings. In this issue I would like to share one with you

Shortly after accepting the job as editor, the phone rang. It was Mr. Joe Wright of Gray Stone Press, Nashville, Tennessee. He asked if I would be interested in an artist drawing of a Chesapeake Bay Retriever for one of the Bulletin covers. Being new at this job, I said, "Sure, we can always use material for the Bulletin, send it up. If it looks OK, I'll use it on next month's cover.

I must have sounded just a little skeptical because Joe said, "I'll send it up and I'll call you back in a couple of days." It arrived in a cardboard container about 3 feet by 4 feet by 1 inch. I opened it and there was a beautiful sketch of the Chess you see on the front cover at its original size – 17" x 22".

A couple days later Joe Wright called and asked, "what do you think of T. Phillip Crowe's drawing?"

In one sentence I said, "It is very beautiful. It will be on the cover of the Jan.-Feb., 1978 ACC Bulletin. I hope you don't want it returned because I'm sure I'm not going to return it!"

Joe of course laughed and informed me that I could have it. I talked with Joe about half an hour on his dime, and when I finished, he said he would send more material that could be used for covers (even though they are not Chesapeake Bay Retrievers).

In about a week a catalog from Joe Wright and Gray Stone Press arrived. On page 2 was T. Phillip Crowe and some of his other paintings. I have reproduced the pictures that were in the catalog along with the picture Phillip Crowe.

Joe Wright of Gray Stone Press, who has made a business out of producing limited edition art reproductions, has graciously given the ACC Bulletin another first, by allowing us to use a print from the collection of the distinguished artist T. Phillip Crowe.

Phillip Crowe makes his home in Nashville, Tennessee where he owns an advertising design studio. Being an avid sportsman, he has always expressed an interest in wildlife and a desire to share this with others. As a result, he has created several wildlife paintings that capture his feelings of the grand outdoors. It was this interest that brought his attention to the Chesapeake Bay Retriever. While attending the Spring All-Breed show in Nashville this year, he was exposed for the first time to this hardy breed of sporting dog. One-month later he was the proud owner of Blustrywood's Lady pintail, now a one year old bitch, who's sire is Champion Crispin Roderick, CD. A new world of dog was opened to Phillip. After learning about the many aspects of the Chessie and being influenced tremendously by his "little girl", Phillip wished to share his feelings on the hardiness and certainly unique character of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever you all know so well. It was with this in mind, that he created the portrait in honor of Champion Crispin Roderick, CD and all Chesapeakes, whether in the sporting home or show ring.

# A Step Back in Time

## History of the Working Dog Certification Program

As submitted in the November 1974 ACC Bulletin

In October 1971 the Board of Directors appointed Ed Gesner, Eloise Heller, Kent Lowman, Dr. G. M. Miller, Ben Robertson, and Dave Conrad, Chairman, to a committee to study and make recommendations on the subject of a Working Dog Certificate for the A.C.C.

Dave Conrad took on the difficult task of researching other clubs' Working Dog Programs and communication ideas back and forth between his committee members. His goal was to compile everyone's ideas, not just one individual's views, into a consensus of the majority of opinions for a workable and satisfactory program for the A.C.C.

The W.D. proposal was presented at the annual meeting in August 1972. The Board of Directors accepted the proposal in December 1972 with only a few minor modifications- a real compliment to Dave's research and organization. At this time the Board voted to set the fee for entering a W.D. Stake at \$10.00 for members and \$20.00 for non-members.

Regional Directors were made responsible for handling the W.D. stakes, and Kent Lowman was appointed the Vice President in charge of the working Dog Certification Program. The first W.D. Stake was run at Marshy Point, Maryland on the Chesapeake Bay in Conjunction with the Bench Specialty on April 6, 1973.

## The First WD

As submitted in the June 1973 ACC Bulletin

The first WD stake to be run under the auspices of the A.C.C. was held at Marshy Pointe, Maryland on April 6, 1973. Charley Morris, Field Trial Chairman, began promptly, kept it moving smoothly, and by one-thirty the stake was completed. 33 dogs ran with 18 passing and 2 others certified through field trial performance.

Because the WD Application was done in haste, it needed to be changed. For instance, when it was time to mail certificates to those who passed the WD Stake, there was no mailing addresses and no way to find them if the owner was not an A.C.C. member. The application has been redone, and I urge Regional Directors to write me for the revise Application when planning to put on a WD stake.

Our Bulletin Editor, Don Russel, offered to put the dog's name on the certificate in a calligraphic style letter. As he said, this makes the certificates issued "to the qualified dogs a little nicer for the owners to receive," and I am grateful for his contribution to the new program. Have patience if you do not receive your certificate immediately for this part of the program takes time too.

# AKC Tracking

## AKC Tracking – what’s it all about?

By Doreen Palmer

AKC Tracking is a sport that is held outdoors in either a large open field, or an area that is a mix of open space and wooded areas, or more urban settings such as business parks or campuses. In tracking the dog is in charge. A dog’s sense of smell is so much more developed than ours that only they know where the track goes. Chesapeakes are well suited to tracking, with exceptional noses, stamina and a love of the game. Added to that is that they get to be in charge, making it a perfect sport for our dogs. Watching a Chesapeake work a track in a big open field is truly a thing of beauty!

AKC competitions in nose work first started with tracking in the 1930’s. In recent years several other types of events that make use of a dog’s nose have been added to AKC titling programs or title recognition programs. These include Scentwork, Barn hunt and Earthdog. But tracking is the granddaddy of all the nose work games that the AKC offers.

The first AKC tracking test was held in 1936. Until 1947, a tracking title was required in order to earn a UD (Utility Dog) in obedience. When it became a standalone event it was designated Tracking Dog or TD. It wasn’t until 1980 that a more advanced tracking title was added to the tracking lineup. This is the Tracking Dog Excellent or TDX. In 1995, what many consider to be the most difficult of the tracking titles was added. This is VST or variable surface tracking. In 2014 an additional entry level test was added, the TDU or tracking dog urban title. When a dog earns a TD (or TDU), a TDX and a VST title they earn the title of Champion Tracker (CT).

At all tracking test, 2 judges and a tracklayer plot the tracks the day before the test is run. While no 2 tracks will be identical they should be as close as possible in complexity as required by the regulations for that level of test. Each track is run by only one dog. The morning of the test the tracklayer goes out and lays the track. Then, depending on the level of the test, the dog and handler start their track anywhere from 30 mins to 5 hours later. The tracks range in length, depending on the level, from 440 yds. to 1,000 yds. in length. Each track will



have a specified number of turns, none of which may be acute. When working the dog is on a long lead of between 20 and 40’. Small wallet sized articles made up of leather, cloth, plastic or metal are dropped by the tracklayer along the track, and again the number and type is determined by the level of the test, which the dog must indicate. The start of each track is indicated with a flag on a post. A handler may talk and praise the dog, pet it, give water or untangle the dog, but no harsh corrections, food or toys are allowed on the track at a test. The handler has no knowledge of the track itself other than the parameters set out in the rules. The dog must be at least 6 months old to be entered.

Since the inception of the Tracking title program in 1937 Chesapeakes have done quite well earning 173 TDs, 24 TDX titles, 7 VST and 7 Champion Tracker titles through 2019.

Tracking isn’t a sport for everyone; it’s done in all types of weather conditions, depending on where you track bugs, wild animals and overgrown brush can present their own problems. However for those of us who love the sport, the obstacles are nothing compared to the thrill of tracking behind a dog that is doing something we have no ability to do. Every time a dog nails a corner or finds a dropped article, one that most likely the human would have missed it is mind blowing – Every. Single. Time.

Tracking Titles:

**TD – Tracking Dog title.** The track shall be between 440 and 500 yards in length. The track should be laid in an area that has similar cover for the entire track. Age of the track from the time it is laid and the time it is run will be between 30 mins. and 2 hours old. There will be a start article and an end article on each track. Each leg of the track must be at least 50 yards long, and there will be 3 to 5 turns on each track. The dog must be worked a minimum of 20’ from the handler on a long line and harness.

**TDU – Tracking Dog Urban title.** The track shall be 400 and 500 yards in length. The TDU requires that there are a minimum of 2 different surfaces – vegetated and non-vegetated. At least 10%, but not more than 30% of the track will be on the non-vegetated surfaces. Age of the track from the time it is laid and the time it is run will be between 30 minutes and 2 hours old. There will be a start article, an intermediate article and an end article on each track. Each leg of the track must be at least 50 yards long, and there will be 3 to 5 turns on each track. The dog must be worked a minimum of 10’ from the handler on a long

line and harness. This is an optional title which is considered equivalent to the TD

**TDX – Tracking Dog Excellent title.** The track shall be 800 to 1000 yards in length. A TDX track will include at least 2 obstacles and 2 sets of cross tracks. An obstacle includes gullies, plowed fields, woods, streams, roads, bridges and fences. Cross tracks are put in by 2 people walking abreast 4’ apart that cross the track on 2 separate legs and are put in between an hour and 15 mins. to an hour and 45 mins. after the track was laid. Age of the track from the time it is laid and the time it is run will be between 3 and 5 hours old. There will be a start article, 2 intermediate articles and an end article on each track. Each leg of the track must be at least 50 yards long, and there will be 5 to 7 turns on each track. The dog must be worked a minimum of 20’ from the handler on a long line and harness. A dog must have earned a TD or TDU to compete for its TDX.

**VST – Variable Surface Tracking title.** The track shall be 600 to 800 yards in length. A VST track will include at least 3 surface changes which includes vegetation and non-vegetation. The non-vegetation areas with comprise at least 1/3 and up to 2/3 of the total track. There are no physical obstacles on a VST track. Age of the track from the time it is laid until the time it is run will be between 3 and 5 hours old. There will be a start article, 2 intermediate articles and an end article on each track. Each leg of the track must be at least 30 yards long, and there will be 4 to 8 turns on each track. At least one of the turns must be a “moment of truth” 90 degree turn on a non-vegetative surface. Tracks may be laid between buildings in archways, breezeways and any type of partially enclosed area as long as there are 2 or more openings. The dog must be worked a minimum of 10’ from the handler on a long line and harness. A dog must have a TD or TDU or TDX to compete for a VST title.

**CT – Champion Tracker title.** A dog that has earned a TD or TDU, a TDX and a VST earns the title of Champion Tracker.

MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

A regular meeting of the board of directors of the AMERICAN CHESAPEAKE CLUB, a California Nonprofit public benefit corporation was called to order 6:04 PM ET, Tuesday, April 21, 2020. The meeting was held by telephone conference call through which all persons participating in the meeting could hear and speak to one another.

The following officers and directors were present: President Lynda Barber-Wiltse, Vice President Pat Baughman, Treasurer Margi Palmer, Secretary Carolyn Johnson, Director Tina Cox, Director Gina Downin, Director Gale Frana, Director GiGi Grant and Director Marlene Drag.

President Lynda Barber-Wiltse served as Chair and Secretary Carolyn Johnson served as Secretary of the meeting.

1. Approval of Minutes – To approve the February 12, 2020 Board Teleconference Minutes. **20:19** (Margi Palmer, Gale Frana) approved 4/21/20
2. Report of the President: President (Lynda Barber-Wiltse) is keeping current with information regarding AKC cancellations due to COVID-19.
3. Report of the Secretary: Secretary (Carolyn Johnson) reported the following motions have been approved by unanimous written consent of the directors, effective on the dates noted, and the consents will be filed with the minutes of this meeting.
  - A. To accept the February 2020 New Members **20:15** (Carolyn Johnson, Tina Cox) Approved 03/11/2020
  - B. To appoint Gina Downin (MD) to the Electronics Communication Group. **20:16** (Lynda Barber-Wiltse, Tina Cox) Approved 03/11 /2020
  - C. To create a CBR Data Group, Gina Downin (MD) Chair, George Makatura (NC), Amy Wernecke (MD). **20:17** (Lynda Barber-Wiltse, Tina Cox) Approved 03/17/2020
  - D. To provide \$2,500 to the cancelled ACC All Breed Field Trial (CA) for losses incurred related to the COVID-19 pandemic. **20:18** (Margi Palmer, Gina Downin) Approved 03/18/2020
4. Report of the Treasurer: As of March 31, 2020, the club has a total of \$244,780 spread amongst 12 accounts. \$102,293 is in a one-year CD at SmartBank and \$92,895 is in a Money Market savings account at BBVA. We have \$17,454 in operating funds at BBVA and \$14,144 at PayPal. The rest of the funds are spread among the Regional Directors and other accounts.

The 2019 National Field Specialty trial has closed out its account returning the initial \$5,000 and a profit of \$341.

Through March our total receipts were \$13,481 and our expenditures were \$28,920 for a net excess expenditures of \$15,439. Besides the normal Bulletin expenditures other expenditures of note was the initial NSS disbursement \$5000 and \$200 per supported entry for 2020. Some of the Supported entries funds have been returned due to the cancellation of the shows. Also included was the mass mailing of the new illustrated guide to the judges \$1134 and the transfer of funds to the ACCCT of \$5,268 based on contributions received in 2019. We just received the annual bill from AKC for them to include the club's flyer with new registrations. Based on the invoice they sent out 2,054 flyers.
5. Reports of Committees
  - A. Standing Committees

- i. Companion Events Committee – Lynda Barber-Wiltse (AK) Nothing to report.
- ii. Field Trial Committee – Marlene Drag (MO) Due to COVID-19, discussed options concerning winners should 2020 NFTS be cancelled and held in 2021. Will reach out to NFTS 2020 Committee to discuss.
- iii. Health Committee – GiGi Grant (ID) - Jim Stewart reports that the final reviews of the bloat grant are taking place, and while we do not have results yet, Jim is cautiously optimistic that the study will bring us useful information for the health of our dogs.
- iv. Hunt Test Committee – Pat Baughman (NE) Regarding hunt tests: significant changes to qualifying for Master National 2020 (see below), cancellation of Master Amateur National 2020, cancellations of almost all hunt tests at this time, forwarding of AKC letter to Aug Ohio hunt test chair and secretary. AKC comments on Hunt Test cancellations (see attached).

The Master National Board of Directors is committed to providing updates regarding the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on the 2020 event. The Board has completed an initial assessment and analysis of available 2020 qualification information, AKC hunt test cancellations, and the potential impact of these on the AKC hunt test community and the 2020 Master National.

The MNRC Board has decided the 2020 MNRC Qualifications will be determined as follows:

1. MNH dogs (3 MNRC qualifications) remain qualified for life.
2. MNR dogs (2 MNRC qualifications) are automatically qualified for the 2020 event.
3. MH dogs that qualified for the 2019 event are automatically qualified for the 2020 event.
4. MH dogs with at least 4 MH passes during the current qualifying year 08/01/2019 - 07/31/2020) will be qualified for the 2020 event.

There will be no adjustments to the MNRC standard of judging or test requirements for the 2020 MNRC Event.

There will also be changes to other elements of the event such the conduct of the various meetings, parties, and other ceremonies. These will develop as we determine what life after the COVID-19 pandemic may hold for us.

- v. Judge and Breeder Education Committee (JBEC) Committee – Gina Downin (MD) Betsy Humer reported ACC Website

Betsy canvassed our 26 Mentors in March and asked about recent mentoring sessions and what areas judges had questions about or parts of the Standard they need

more information about.

The JBEC members will each do a write up on those areas to be added to the ACC website for additional education for members, breeders and judges. Will also review past write-ups.

#### NSS Judges Seminar/Workshop and Hands-On

Betsy has been in contact with Joanne Silver, 2020 NSS Chair, concerning timing and date. It is re-confirmed that the Seminar portion will be held at 7:30 a.m. Friday Oct. 16<sup>th</sup> in the building where judging takes place. It will be finished before judging starts. Ringside mentoring will be available for the judges after the Seminar during Sweepstakes and Dog Judging on Friday. Hands-On will begin ½ hour after conclusion of judging on Friday afternoon.

#### NSS Ringside Mentoring

Of the 26 Mentors contacted, all have responded but six. I will follow up in May/June and verify how many are still planning on attending the NSS in October so that a tentative schedule can be put together.

#### IG Mailing

An additional dozen IG's were mailed to approved judges who requested a copy after it was publicized on several Internet and Facebook page lists.

- vi. Lifetime Achievement Award Committee – Gale Frana (TN) The Lifetime Achievement committee has voted to recommend the recipients for the 2020 Lifetime Achievement Award.
- vii. Show Committee – Tina Cox, (MI) Michelle Keehn reported we have had a few supported shows that have had to be canceled because of Covid-19. Still have several supported entries planned for this year.

The show committee has put out requests for 2021 supported entry applications and the NSS for 2022.

Several new supported entry applications received and approved. Kennel club of Philadelphia, (Oaks, PA), South Windsor KC, (Springfield, MA) and Delaware KC, (York, PA).

Committee is in discussion on how to best handle NSS challenge trophies.

Two positions on the show committee expire in 2020.

The Show Committee is here to support the 2020 NSS Committee in the coming weeks as the Committee may need to cancel/reschedule the Specialty.

- i. ACC National Specialty Show Manual Update Committee- Tina Cox (MI)-. Angie Cox reported The Show Manual Committee is reviewing the updated and re-formatted content for approval. Additional information, appendices and /or updates, and appropriate hyper-links are now being researched to include.

- ii. Breed Rescue Service – Gale Frana (TN) We have had a couple of quiet months most likely attributed to what is currently facing our country. In early January, two dogs were placed in their forever homes. Heidi is currently working with three dogs in need of homes. We have many people looking for a dog. More than you can imagine which is very positive. What makes a placement difficult at times is that people often want a puppy, or a 3-5-year-old, not an older dog. Rescue looks for several dogs that may find their way into rescue with the current financial situation facing many families. Should this happen, we will be ready.
  - iii. CBR Data Group – Gina Downin (MD) The CBR Data Group is developing a training program to train volunteers to input historic data (integrate old stud book data from the 1880's) into our CBR Database. As soon as we have worked out the kinks, we will use various communication tools to send out a request for volunteers. Attended/helped at multiple NFTS.


