2020 Field Trial Specialty

Open Report

In spite of all the uncertainties—will there be a 2020 field trial specialty, should I travel with Covid-19 in our midst, do I really want to drive that far, etc., etc.—the 2020 Field Trial Specialty began as scheduled on September 15. Actually, more or less on schedule. Open began a bit after 9:00 a.m., which is about as close to the listed 8 o'clock start as field trials ever get.

The setting was hardly what the trial's organizers had hoped for. The air was full of smoke from forest fires burning in Oregon and California and the ground was tinder dry from prolonged drought—one could barely make out the nearby mountains and dust billowed behind (and into) vehicles no matter how slowly one drove. By the second morning the sun was a red ball shining wanly through smoke billowing from a new forest fire to the east that cut off one of the access roads to the trial. Meanwhile, construction delays on Highway 55, the main route to the trial, sometimes ran 20 minutes or more. In spite of it all, contestants gathered in good spirits.

Andy Kahn and Tom Vaughan, two experienced and very popular judges, started the open with a fairly wide-open land triple on rolling terrain that gave way to a slope to the right much of which was covered with Idaho's inevitable sagebrush. The middle gun station, about 250 yards out, threw a duck slightly downhill to the left and then retired. Although also in the sagebrush, the bird fell not far from where the brush ended and a huge down-slope pasture began. The right

hand station, about 225 yards out, threw a duck square to the right from a point of sagebrush in which the gunners stood across a grassy opening and into a second body of sagebrush. This station also retired. Dogs then had to turn back well to the left to mark the flier which was shot angling back at some 175 yards in a well-grazed natural meadow, boggy in spots.

The flier created few problems, unlike the other two marks. On the middle bird many dogs pulled uphill behind the gun station and away from the bird. Even when they tried to recover, a shallow irrigation ditch between the gunners and the bird created a psychological barrier that some hesitated to cross on their first attempt. On the right hand bird, dog after dog drove through the grassy opening, past the sagebrush hiding the bird, to hunt well up the hill before finding their way back down to the bird. The judges were generous in their callbacks—24 dogs—but a number of the survivors were limping badly.

The land blind followed in the same field and from nearly the same line as the marks. When the dogs reached the mat a gunner in white, located some 75 yards out to the right, stood up, fired a dry pop, and sat down. Handlers were then free to attempt the blind, which was located some 350 yards out not far left of the middle bird of the land marks. The test was trickier than it looked. Halfway out the line to the blind went over a point protruding into the meadow, it then went across a boggy stretch, and up and across the toe of a hill-ock toward the bird which was another 40

yards out. Handlers who let their dogs get too far upslope on the hillock, the natural place for dogs to go, found that their animals were out of sight for a considerable time after topping the mound and by the time they reappeared had almost invariably pulled upslope to the right behind the blind planter. Handling from there to the blind was a chore made all the more traumatic because handlers knew they were probably already out for getting so far off line. In the end, only 15 dogs remained in the competition.

The water blind followed on the Beaver Creek Reservoir, a huge impoundment that supplies much of the irrigation water for the Davis Ranch, our hosts. Water in the reservoir was well below capacity, leaving an untimbered, fairly straight shoreline that sloped steeply to the water. Occasional downed logs and patches of willow or aspen marked the terrain. The judges set up a shoreline blind with a long entry that tested whether the dogs were willing to parallel the shoreline for a considerable distance before getting into the water, stay in, cross a point, and then reenter. They then crossed a bay to another large point, reentered once more proceed to the bird. Work varied, but only four dogs were eliminated from further competition.

The judges then moved to a confined arm of the reservoir for their third and fourth series. A steep slope to the water's edge necessitated contestants taking a circuitous route to the line on the shoreline (and, unfortunately, limited the gallery's view of the test). Across the arm two large points

extended out into the water from the upslope timber. The water blind required dogs to do a long swim, pass some snags sticking out of the water, cross the first point, reenter the water, and then exit on the second point to climb away from the water to the blind. Four more dogs were eliminated from the competition.

The final test was a water triple with dead birds on each of the points and, after a sharp turn to the right, a close-in flier shot not 30 yards out. The flier was a breaking bird if there ever was one! The two dead birds were both thrown from near the timber toward the water. Although the banks were fairly bare, the birds on the farther point were hidden by a clump of willows and those on the nearer point behind a stump. The close-in flier excited the dogs to the point where a couple grew noisy, while the nearness of the water blind to the marks played mind games with others.

Again work varied. All eleven dogs finished, although two had to handle. Richard Chavez's Gracie took first (and made Richard's long drive from Wisconsin more than worthwhile). Lorraine Sarek (another long-distance traveler) took second with Ginger; Linda Harger finished third with McQueen; and Mark Patton took fourth with Edgar Johnson's Wally. The Reserve JAM went to Tom Lind and Sandy.

Thanks, Linda, I'm glad not all of us Idahoans got shut out—but then, I am delighted so many folk who bit the bullet and made the long trip into the smoky wilds of our state were rewarded for their efforts.

Amateur Report

The setting for the first series of the Amateur stake at the 2020 American Chesapeake Club Field Trial Specialty was situated along a hillside of the sprawling Davis Ranch in Cascade, ID. The temperatures at the start of the day dipped into the fifties and gradually rose into the eighties as the day progressed. The morning wind was calm and variable while a smoky haze filled the air. The prevailing winds established their normal patterns by midday, blowing left to right and away from the line. Ducks were used in all the series. The long middle stand out bird was thrown first, left to right and slightly angled back in a clearing in the sagebrush at the end of a large pasture at approximately 280 yards. The long bird landed behind a patch of sagebrush with a few other small patches of sagebrush in route to the bird. The right retired bird was thrown second at 110 yards. Located up a brushy hillside in heavy sagebrush, thrown down the hill right to left and slightly angled out behind a patch of sagebrush at the pasture's edge. The flyer go bird was shot from right to left, angling back and out of the test at 150 yards. The work was generally good, although some dogs came in behind the long gun and hunted deep or missed the short bird and ran up the hillside with an expanded hunt. There were thirty dogs to start the test and six dogs were dropped after the conclusion of the first series.

The afternoon brought a combined land and water blind in a new location at the water's edge of a massive reservoir. The mat was sit-

uated on a steep, sandy beach, facing north with beach on the left and the reservoir on the right. The wind was mostly blowing out from right to left. The land bird was the left leg of the test located down the beach and up to the top of a hill at 100 yards with dead fall and brush along the way. The forested hillside further to the left created a tight corridor that paralleled the water's edge. The right water leg required the dog to angle down the steep beach and slice into the water, cross a point that was the toe of the hillside of the land blind and then swim out to open water and across to the far shore of the bay, continue up out of the water to the opposing hillside, over a large deadfall to the bird planted just below a mountain road at 250 yards. Overall, the work was favorable with some dogs needing multiple whistles and concentrated handling to convince them to run the bank without jumping into the water while trying not to lose them in the forest to the left. The water blind showcased the dogs desire to get in the water, cast off a point and make a big water swim. Most of the trouble came at the end where extra whistles were needed to get the deadfall or put the dog on the bird. Fifteen dogs were called back to the final series to be held the following morning.

The fourth series found itself at a different but equally impressive reservoir on the other side of the ranch. The morning weather started out in the fifties with a mild wind blowing from right to left. The test was a triple with two retired guns and a flyer. The short retired was thrown first, out across a channel, left to right, slightly angled back and towards the shoreline at 150 yards. The long retired was thrown second, left to right from one side of a distant bay to the other at 250 yards. The flyer go bird was on the right, situated on a peninsula with land in front and water in the background, shot right to left and into the test. Most dogs made short work of the flyer and left short retired. The long retired bird required the dogs to take a big and disciplined swim to get to the bird without running the peninsula up front or beaching early. Most dogs courageously started the big swim but found themselves beaching before the retired gun and hunting the hillside left and deep before working their way down to the bird. A few others decided to take too much water or swim out to sea. The top dog did the test clean.




Qualifying Report

The first dog went to the line at 10:03 am and it was 57 degrees out with a smoky haze in the background.

First series was a double. The long bird was approximately 200 yards, being thrown from right to left. After throwing the gunner would sit in a chair angled giving the gun a semi-retired look. The second mark was approximately 35 degrees to the right and was a shot flyer going from left to right. The cover was of medium thickness with a heavily covered ditch with water in it half way to the mark. Dogs ran down the hill, through the ditch, then up a short distance to pick up the mark.

Second series. Upon returning to the line, dogs would retire into a holding blind, then they would come out and run a blind through medium cover approximately 175 yards. The blind was approximately a 55 degree angle from the memory bird from the line. Cover was medium and dense. Dogs would run down a hill through heavier cover then up to where the blind was placed.

Third series was a water blind. Dogs would run down a hill approximately 90 yards into a small pond, approximately 15 yards to the right of the dam of the pond, go across a small channel, then come up on the middle of a peninsula of land, go approximately 10 yards then enter water again. They would then make a 15 yard swim, then come out on land, travel another 15-20 yards to pick up the blind.

The fourth series was a water double. The go bird was thrown right to left onto the end of a peninsula. Dogs would travel down the hill, enter the water, swim across and pick it up. It was around 130 yard in distance and the cover was medium to light. The long bird was thrown left to right, then the gunner would retire behind a blind. The dog would run down the hill, enter the water for a 25 yard swim, come out on land, run up the hill and pick it up at about the crest of the hill. Then return. Cover in this area was very light and it was approximately 130 yard distance.



Derby Report

The Derby got underway shortly after mid-day Wednesday, The temps were in the upper 80's under blue skies and a smoky haze from distant and not so distant fires burning in the western U.S.

There was a field of 11 dogs after one scratch. (Four of the entries were pups under one year that were also entered in the senior and junior puppy stakes). Judges Andy Khan and Tom Vaughn set up the first two series to run consecutively. The first was a single, with a dead duck thrown right to left at 102 yards. «Just to knock the rust off» according to the judges. Most all dogs had no problem with this mark. After running the first, the dog and handler were instructed to move to the left 20 yards to run the second series.

The second series was a double, with a long dead bird straight ahead thrown back and from left to right at 190 yards and a live flyer shot to the left at 79 yards. This set up was a bit tough for the young dogs. With the flyer station and all the activity surrounding it. This setup made it difficult to get the young ones to focus on the long memory bird. One young dog, Jig, (Fireweed's Irish Dancer) owned and handled by Dale Langhorne was presented with a live duck that landed untouched through a volley of shotgun fire. The gallery

collectively held their breath then gave a rousing round of applause when the young dog sorted out the still live duck and delivered it to hand! There were 7 dogs called back for the third and final series (due to time constraints)

The 3rd series was a water double with #1 bird to the handlers left at 178 yards thrown right to left and #2 bird straight ahead at 98 yards left to right. Both marks required a 20 yard water entry, and a 60 yard swim. The long memory bird required an angled water entry and exit, then the dogs had to drive up a hill 100 yards for their mark. At the end of the day, the dogs that completed this series all placed.

Puppy Report

The Specialty Puppy stakes are always an interesting combination of raw talent, newly acquired skills and utter chaos. With the pups ranging from 5-12 months anything is possible.

The Senior Puppy Stake (9-12 months old) saw all seven puppies competing, with Bill Burk's "Miles" being the youngest at 5 months and Adam Levy's "Star" the oldest at 10.5 months. Both of Adam's pups were handled by professional Marc Patton in an apparent attempt to intimidate the other handlers, but long-time veterans Marston Jones and Bill Burks about 100 years of experience between them) were ready for the challenge.

Two land singles were set at approximately 60 & 70 yards throwing dead ducks into medium height prairie grass. Most of the dogs went straight to the area of the fall, with only a couple of the dogs having moderate area hunts to find the bird. Marston's Deuce provided the most entertainment by running straight to the first bird, which he clearly found, but then taking a grand tour of the set up. Clearly, after a 3 day trip to the Specialty and a long day waiting in the car, he decided to stretch his legs a bit before

picking up the bird and delivering it to Marston. It was nice to see that most of the pups, regardless of their age, had good line manners and delivery skills. One of the pups was so pleased with himself that he strolled past the gallery with his prize before reluctantly returning to his handler.

The Senior Puppy stake ended with two water marks, both thrown in the water about 50 and 40 yards out. The first bird was thrown in open water and all dogs swam straight to it with no problems. The second bird was thrown next to an island to increase the difficulty but all dogs swam straight to that as well. Not sure how the judges separated all the similar performances.

The Junior Puppy Stake (6-9 months old) saw four puppies competing, with Bill Burk's "Miles" the youngest at 5 months and Marston Jones' "Deuce" the oldest at 2 days shy of 9 months. The Junior stake used a similar set up to the Senior stake, with the marks moved slightly closer. Given that the same dogs ran both Senior and Junior, performances in the Junior stake were even tighter as all of the dogs ran straight to the marks. There were minor differences depending on whether the dog had a quick turn to find the bird or front-footed the bird.

One of the pups even stumbled over the bird before quickly snatching it up.

The most interesting situation arose when Bill Burks turned to "work the judges" as soon as his pup Miles picked up the bird. Of course, while Bill chatted, Miles decided to run towards the only person paying attention to him, the gunner on the other side of the field. After some gentle ribbing from the gallery, Bill whistled Miles to the right location and received the bird.

The water marks for the Junior Puppy stake were quite simple for the caliber of the pups running. The first bird was thrown about 15 yards straight out in front of the pups and the second was thrown about 25 yards down the shore on the right. Handlers ran from a little outcropping in the pond to reduce the possibility of cheating. All of the pups swam straight to both marks and had no problems delivering them to their handlers.

Last, but not least, the Baby Puppy Stake (less than 6 months) included two puppies, Tim Bonnema's "Willie" and Jim Price's "Riley". Unfortunately, the stake was delayed until both handlers were finished at the Amateur, after most people left for dinner, so no details are available.



Updates to Chesapeake Bay Retriever Health Screening Requirements for OFA CHIC Program



The ACC Board of Directors recently voted to update our health screening recommendations to the Orthopedic Foundation for Animals (OFA) CHIC program. The OFA's Canine Health Information Center (CHIC) works with breed parent clubs to define the standard health tests done to screen for issues that are prevalent in or important to each breed. The CHIC program current

recommendations do not account for developments in genetic testing that have become essential tools for Chesapeake Bay Retriever breeders. And, our CHIC recommendations are not in alignment with our ACC Breed Health Statement also posted on the American Kennel Club website.

Here is our ACC Breed Health Statement: The American Chesapeake Club (ACC) Board of Directors and the ACC Health Committee approved the following Health Statement for Chesapeake Bay Retrievers: The ACC Board of Directors strongly recommends that all breeding stock be free of Hip/Elbow Dysplasia, Progressive Retinal Atrophy (PRA) in addition to all hereditary eye diseases, Exercise Induced Collapse (EIC), and Degenerative Myelopathy (DM) – tested Normal or otherwise. The above health statement was proposed by our ACC Health Committee then approved by the ACC Board of Directors on September 11, 2016, (ACC Board Motion 16:39).

The Board felt that the American Chesapeake Club has a responsibility for consistent messaging to the public about standard health screenings for our breed. Prior to this revision, CHIC certification only required screening for hip dysplasia, elbow dysplasia, and an annual eye examination. Additional recommendations (though not required) were a cardiac exam and tests for Progressive Retinal Atrophy and Autoimmune Thyroiditis.

The updated CHIC requirements (effective January 2021) will be:

- Hip Dysplasia
- Elbow Dysplasia
- Annual Eye Examination
- Progressive Retinal Atrophy
- Degenerative Myelopathy
- Exercise-Induced Collapse

Additional recommendations:

- Autoimmune thyroiditis
- Cardiac Exam

Any dog that has the required health screening results on record with OFA is "CHIC Certified." The program does make allowances for dogs that are Clear By Parentage on genetic tests provided that both the sire and dam of those dogs have "Clear" results on record with OFA. In addition to allowing us to collect data on health issues that matter most to our breed, CHIC serves as a way for the public to educate themselves about what health clearances are considered "best practice" for specific breeds. Educated puppy buyers are more likely to support conscientious breeders who are doing everything in their power to preserve and protect our breed.

The Board recognizes we have some breeders who do all the recommended health tests but may not choose to submit the genetic test results to OFA. Going that extra step for CHIC certification is not a priority for all breeders. What matters most is that breeders use the health screening tools we have at our disposal to guide breeding decisions. We also recognize breeders may breed to a dog with genetic test results that are not within the OFA database. This might prevent offspring from gaining official Clear By Parentage status from OFA, thereby, preventing them from gaining CHIC certification.

"A CHIC number is issued when test results are entered into the database satisfying each breed specific requirement, and when the owner of the dog has opted to release the results into the public domain. The CHIC number itself does not imply normal test results, only that all the required breed specific tests were performed and the results made publicly available." Tracking Dog (TD)

"Barge" (Sugar Tree's Sea Jetty TD MH WDQ x GCHB CH Chesabar's Veruca Salt JH) earned his TD/Tracking Dog title on September 27, 2020. Tracking tests have high numbers of entries but very small numbers (4-6) are chosen at random to run. There were five competitors. The Hudson Valley Tracking Club's fields allowed the TD test to provide each dog its own track with the required overall length of track (440-500yards) and 3-5 turns. The tracks are decided by the judge and then "laid" by a person who walks the predetermined track. Tracks for TD are aged 1/2 to 2 hours. Barge is fast, 80 lbs and at 21 months he is powerful. He has a great nose. Once he is sent on the track, he does not stop until he has the final scent article, a leather glove! At one point the judges were running full tilt downhill through knee high grass to keep up. Their comments. "We don't see very many Chessies. He did really well." The next weekend in training he did his first 800-yard TDX track in deep woods and ravines. The track was 5 hours old. Fred ran him. Or was that Barge running Fred? Barge is owned by Connie and Fred Glore (MA) Awesome job Team Barge!

Billy owned many many Chessies through the years but the special one that he so proudly owned was Dual CH AFC Distagon MH (Tiger). Billy was heartbroken when Tiger showed the early signs of DM (degenerative myelopathy) and Billy, being BILLY, chose bring

out the sad facts of DM to the entire Chesapeake world to see...

Billy's outgoing (and somewhat controversial) DM crusade helped to push the development of a DNA test to identify the gene that causes DM so the disease may be eradicated in the future.

In the end, Billy was a loyal friend to many, a Chesapeake Bay Retriever lover, breeder and owner, and a close friend that will be sorely missed.

ACC Rescue



We have been assisting several owners in finding new homes for their dogs with the use of Facebook and our applicants. Often we can match based upon location and application information a number of possible new homes. Individuals will be vetted and then

let the current owner have a conversation with them. We have even had “meet and greet” dates where perspective adopters have met the family and dog. This is especially helpful where there are other dogs in the home. We had one situation where a family was in between homes and a volunteer “fostered” their dog until they were able to find new housing. Yea!

We recently worked on assisting a family who’s mother passed away and her dear friend said that she would care for the dog, should she succumb to cancer. Unfortunately she did and so her son is driving the dog from Maryland to Louisville, Kentucky where we had a temporary foster home until arrangements could be made for the dog to move from Kentucky to Washington State. ACC Rescue will assist in situations like this because it is the right thing to do. In this situation, the son realized that he could not part with his mother’s dog, and so there was a very happy ending. It is a good reminder to members to think what would happen to their dogs or who would step up to care for them should the unexpected happen. Often family members will take a dog to the Human Society, as they have no other idea of what to do. Please make your thoughts and plans known for your fur family. Talk to the breeder, neighbors and family members about your wishes.

ACC Rescue does not take “bite” dogs into our rescue program. We will work with a family trying to find a solution. A big part of this job

is offering suggestions, advice, counseling to individuals who find that they have an issue with a dog. Puppies are great but they grow up and need structure, routines and boundaries as we all know. We will work to provide alternatives and answers as much as we can. We have several volunteers with “dog smarts” who will try and assist when possible. Research tells us that a dog needs to meet/experience 500 new people, places and things by 17 weeks to have a solid foundation from which to develop their lifetime of socialization skills. Dogs that do not meet these criteria will often have a handicap in this area and will constantly be at a disadvantage to one who truly received that investment. This means that puppies need constant exposure to new, novel experiences during this period leading up to 17 weeks. If a dog isn’t properly socialized- whether this be because you didn’t know or because you adopted a dog that was already older and you had no say in their socialization- it’s never too late... they can still be happy and comfortable with your help. You may need to adapt some of your plans and strategies; you may need to work hard with a trainer or behaviorist and enlist the help of friends and family. The key is to think like a rescuer and never give up trying! We help dogs come out of their shells and overcome challenges daily in rescue- you can too . . . you just have to recognize the need and start today!
