New AFC ~ Meet McQueen



Spring of 2016 was a tough one for me. Comet won an Amateur and qualified for that years National Amateur and was diagnosed with cancer the next day. I wouldn't be running her again . . . the next 5 weeks were tough with a single bright spot. Comet's sister, Ivy, had puppies at the end of April. There was a single boy amongst all the girls and he was spoiled! He

became my saving grace through that summer as his potential became clearer everyday. It was a tough job for little puppy to give me hope after Comet passed on but he managed to make me smile and get out to train.

He had the coolest bright blue eyes and could escape from any pen I put him in, jump, climb, plow through, nothing held him but a tough crate. I thought of naming him something like the great escape with the call name of McQueen but I wanted to stop his escapes not enhance them! So, a friend reminded me of the "King of Cool" phrase used to describe Steve McQueen and there we had hit.



His abilities were clear and he debuted at the ACC FTS in Montana winning the baby and the junior puppy stakes and placing in the senior (second to his sister.) But the best moment was

the opening of the trial with a flyer shot in memory of Comet which he retrieved, ribbons and all.

McQueen went to boot camp that fall and immediately took to the training with a furor, rapidly going through the basics and showing his intelligence, drive, and tractability.

His true debut was the specialty in Virginia where he won the Derby and got 3rd in the Qualifying at 17 months. He ended his Derby career with 13 points and was QAA before he turned two. He began to gather All Age points as a two year old that

fall and has continued well from there. After time off from the COVID quarantine, he came back strong last fall and this spring to complete his AFC at the Idaho Retriever Club trial in May and qualified for his first National Amateur Retriever Club championship.

McQueen is a big, burly, goofy dog with a huge heart, great personality and the intelligence to pull off some pretty tough feats. He's my Malinois, Army's, best friend, the kittens climb all over him, he won't leave my side in the house, has to know what I'm doing at all times and has the posture of strength standing at my door looking at whoever is on the other side. (If they only knew what a marshmallow he is! And Army is his protector.)



Tom Ivey and I have been blessed, again, with another wonderful animal to build more great memories and help represent the breed on a National level. We want to thank everyone for their continued support and good wishes as we travel down this road but especially Jerry and Jane Patopea for their expert training and care, Julie Cole, Carol Knapp and Maurine Coleman (to name a few) for the miles and miles of travel and experiences on the road with our dogs, Much thanks to Brett Crow and wife, Sharon, for doing this breeding and all the travels and training we have done! 



Sniff, sniff, sniff . . .

A Dog's Incredible Nose & the Sport of Scent Work

The sport of Scent Work (called Nosework in some organizations) is one of the fastest growing events in AKC companion/performance sports. Emulating the work of professional detection dogs (such as those who search for drugs or explosives), the sport of Scent Work requires the dog to find "target odors" and neither the dog nor the handler knows where the odors are hidden. The dog must use its keen sense of smell to locate the odors and then communicate the "finds" to the handler.

In AKC, four essential oils are used as the target odors (Birch, Anise, Clove, and Cypress). Dogs begin in the Novice classes, where only Birch is used. The Advanced classes may use Birch and/or Anise; the Excellent classes use Birch and/or Anise and/or Clove, and the most complex classes, Master and Detective, use all four odors, Birch and/or Anise and/or Clove and/or Cypress. The dog must be proficient at finding all four odors to succeed at the highest levels. There is also a Handler Discrimination class, where the dog must search for the scent of its handler.

The searches are conducted in a variety of environments, called "elements" and there are four elements in AKC Scent Work trials (Container, Interior, Exterior, and Buried). In the Container element, the odor is concealed within a container (such as a box, backpack, luggage, etc.). The dog must locate the containers that contain odors and indicate those finds to the handler. For each Find the dog locates, the handler must call "Alert" to the judge.

In the Interior element, the odors are hidden in an indoor search area, such as on an object like a table or chair. At most scent trials, rooms are used in a real-life state, so the dog could search within a classroom or office, for example. For the Exterior element, the odors are hidden in an outdoor area, and the dog must work through changing air patterns, weather conditions, and natural distractions. Lastly, the Buried element is performed with the odors buried in containers of sand and/or water.

As the dog and handler progress through the levels from Novice to Master, the searches become more complex and contain various distractions such as food, toys, auditory or visual distractions, etc. At the Novice level, the dog must locate a single hide in each class. Advanced classes contain two hides, and Excellent classes contain three hides. At the Master level, the number of hides is unknown to the handler, which adds the difficulty of knowing when the dog has found all the hides and has "cleared" the area. At each of these levels, three qualifying scores are required to earn the title in that element.

There is also a Detective class, which tests the most seasoned and well-trained teams. Detective classes consist of multiple interior/exterior sections over a large search area, an unknown

number of hides, and various distractions. Any of the target odors may be used in Detective searches. Ten qualifying scores are required to earn the Detective title.

AKC Scent Work is open to all dogs, including mixed breeds and rescues. Chesapeake Bay Retrievers that compete in Scent Work typically do very well; they enjoy the opportunity to work independently, and their hunting skills serve them well in this sport. AKC Scent Work is a positive, fun activity that allows the dog to use its strong sense of smell, while building a trusting relationship between the dog and its handler.

training in various disciplines, but also because of Molly’s intense desire to perform any task asked of her with enthusiasm and perseverance. Molly is a confident, tough and eager worker who enjoys training and competing. Like most Chessies, she sometimes prefers to do things her way, but she takes corrections in stride and accepts being held to a high-standard when working. Her biddable nature has been passed down to many of her pups who have done well at early age in

the only time such a feat has been accomplished in the 40 years since the MH title was first awarded. Molly is also the first female Chessie to earn the CH & UD titles, and be QAA in field trials. Molly is also the 5th Chessie to be Qualified All-Age and earn both the AKC MH and HRC HRCH titles, joining Bill Ferguson’s “Happy” (MHR HRCH Fergies Happy Time MH QAA QFTR WDQ) , Alan Sandifer’s “Sterling” (HRCH UH Hope Springs Dowry HRC500 MH QAA), Ed Bahr’s “Fatz” (HRCH Rudy’s Chasing Minnesota Fatz MH QAA) and Cathy Scroggin’s “Tink” (HRCH TC’s What Was Mama Thinkin’ MH QAA).

both retriever and search/rescue training. Molly works in duck/goose blinds during the hunting season and occasionally flushes pheasants in the field. She is always willing to do whatever is asked of her.

Candidate Bios for the 2021-2022 Board of Directors

Message from the Secretary:

Greetings from Ocracoke Island, NC where Thomas and I are camping with our dogs. In the May/June Bulletin, I provided the names and bios of the nominated slate for the 2021 Board of Directors. Since that time, I have received valid petition packets from three members who wish to run for positions on our Board of Directors. In accordance with our Bylaws, the receipt of these petitions initiates an election in which members will cast paper ballots for their candidates of choice. Please refer to Section 7 (Elections) of the American Chesapeake Club Bylaws for more information about the election process.

7. ELECTIONS

A. CORPORATE YEAR

The corporation's fiscal year, beginning on the 1st day of January and ending on the 31st day of December. The corporation's official club year shall begin at the conclusion of the election and shall continue through the next election. The elected officers and directors shall take office on the first day of the month following the election and each retiring officer shall turn over to his successor in office all properties and records relating to that office within 30 days after the election.

B. NOMINATIONS

No person may be a candidate in a corporation election who has not been nominated in accordance with these bylaws. A Nominating Committee shall be chosen by the President and approved by the Board of Directors before January 1st. The Committee shall consist of five (5) members from different areas of the United States, and three (3) alternates, all members in good-standing. No more than one member of the Nominating Committee shall be a member of the current Board, but a member of the current Board must be a member of the Nominating Committee submitting the slate. The President shall name a chairman for the committee. The Nominating Committee may conduct its business by mail. The Nominating Committee should be published in the January/February Bulletin and include the addresses of Nominating Committee members. The Nominating Committee announcement shall contain the following language:

"Members interested in being considered for nomination to an officer or Board position may submit to the Nominating Committee a resume of their experience with the breed, previous service to the Club and any other pertinent information regarding their qualifications. Submitted information becomes the property of the Club and may be subject to verification. Interested parties should consider that all positions may not be open for new parties each year as officers and directors generally serve in their positions for three years. Additionally, geographic representation is a consideration when selecting nominees, as required by the ACC Bylaws. Resumes should be submitted to the Nominating Committee by April 1st.

(1) The Nominating Committee shall nominate from among the eligible members of the corporation, one candidate for each office and for each other position of the Board and shall procure the acceptance of each nominee so chosen. The Committee should consider geographical representation of the membership on the Board to the extent that it is practical to do so. The Committee shall then submit its slate of candidates to the Secretary by May 1. The Secretary shall contact each nominee and request a biography for publication, not to exceed (400) words. The Secretary shall mail the list, to include the full name of each candidate, state in which they reside, and their biography (as provided by the candidate) to each member of the Club by June 1st, so that additional nominations may be made by the membership if they so desire. The slate shall also be submitted for publication in the July/August Bulletin, and should further include any petition nominations that are received by July 1st.

(2) Additional nominations of eligible members may be made by written petition addressed to the Secretary and postmarked on or before August 1st, signed by five (5) percent of the current membership or 50 signatures, of members in good standing, whichever number is lower, and accompanied by the written acceptance of such additional nominee signifying his willingness to be a candidate. No person shall be a candidate for more than one position, and the additional nominations which are provided for herein may be made only from among those members who have not accepted a nomination of the Nominating Committee.

(3) If no valid additional nominations are received by the Secretary on or before August 1st, the Nominating Committee's slate shall be declared elected, and no balloting will be required. The new officers and directors will take office on October 1st.

(4) If one or more valid additional nominations are received by the Secretary on or before August 1st, he shall, on or before August 31st, mail to each member in good standing, a ballot listing all the nominees for each position in alphabetical order, with the names of the states in which they reside, together with a blank envelope, marked only with the word "BALLOT" and a separate return envelope addressed to the Secretary or independent profession firm, as designated by the Board, marked "BALLOT" and bearing the name of the member to whom it was sent. Household Members shall each receive separate ballot materials with return envelopes bearing their respective names so that each must return his individual ballot in his respective, separate envelope. So that ballots may remain secret, each voter, after marking his ballot, shall seal it in the blank envelope marked "BALLOT" which in turn shall be placed in the second provided return envelope addressed to the Secretary or independent professional firm. Ballots received that are not in strict compliance with these requirements shall be considered invalid and not counted. Ballots must be received no later than September 25th to be valid and counted. The returns shall be checked against the list of members whose dues are paid for the

current year prior to opening the outer envelopes and removing the blank "BALLOT" envelopes, and shall certify the eligibility of the voters as well as the results of the voting which shall be announced to the members within 45 days. The Secretary shall immediately notify the nominees of the election results. The tally of the election results shall be published in the next issue of the American Chesapeake Club Bulletin.

C. VOTING

Voting in the Annual Election of Officers and Directors shall be conducted by mail ballot using a dual envelope procedure in accordance with these bylaws. Ballots shall be counted by three inspectors of election, appointed by the Board from members in good standing and who are neither members of the current Board, nor candidates on the ballot nor members of their household; or ballots may be counted by an independent professional firm designated by the Board. The person receiving the largest number of votes for each position shall be declared elected and shall take office on October 1st. If any nominee, at the time of completion of election, is unable to serve for any reason, such nominee shall not be elected and the vacancy so created shall be filled by the new Board of Directors in the manner provided by these bylaws.

Note: Ballots will be counted by an independent professional firm designated by the Board.

In accordance with Bylaws 7.B.(1) I now submit to you the bios for the nominated candidates and the petition candidates who's petitions were received by July 1.

President – Tim Carrion (Maryland)

I was essentially born into the world of Chesapeakes. My late father starting running Chesapeakes in field trials in the early 1940's. Growing up throwing birds and going to trials I wanted to run a dog myself but my father said I first had to train one. In 1964 he bought me a puppy from Eloise Heller and in 1965 we placed 4th in our first Derby, and the rest is history.

Throughout the last 50+ years I have trained, competed and hunted my own dogs. I have served as a judge, chairperson, committee member, board member, officer and president for various retriever clubs. I have also acted as a consultant for ESPN during their formation of the Great Outdoor Games and its spinoff the Super Retriever Series (SRS) designing the rules and numerical scoring system. As president of the Maryland Retriever Club we proposed, received approval and held the first Qualifying stake to be held in conjunction with a Hunt Test.

In all these areas I enjoy the collaboration with my fellow club members. These roles allowed me to use many skills and develop some new ones. Vice-President – Marlene Drag, DVM (Missouri) *

My husband and I bought our first Chesapeake in 1985. We had been introduced to the breed during our time as veterinary students. Our primary intent for our first dog was for waterfowl hunting but we did not want a Labrador or Golden. We brought Ian home at 9 weeks. My husband's assistant at the clinic volunteered her husband to help us train because he trained Golden Retrievers for field trials. We trained with George and at his urging, entered a puppy stake when Ian was 4.5 months old. When Ian got fourth place, this was the start of a time consuming and fun hobby. At just 6 months of age, Ian passed his WD. Then at the urging of others, we also began to compete in conformation. Ian finished his Championship quickly, became Qualified All Age, and had all age points. With our first dog we made a lot of mistakes but also learned a lot about the breed.

My primary interest is still retriever field trials. Bruce and I have had numerous all-age qualified dogs, and currently are running all-age stakes with one dog and recently received a second in the Qualifying with our young female. Finding time away from the field is hard but over the years we have had a Champion Master Hunter, and another Champion all-age qualified dog.

- local events to educate the community about the breed and show our pride in our native Maryland dog
- Judged a WD/X/Q
- Judged Sweepstakes: Kennel Club of Philadelphia Supported Show and 2019 NSS

I have served for three years as a Director of the club and I am currently in my first year as Secretary. I focus on projects that document and preserve the history of our dogs and our club and that make that information available in a useful format for the Board, our members, and the public. Major projects include the club database and the new website. I'm excited about the potential for these projects to "tell the story" of our breed and our club. Treasurer – Margi Palmer (New Mexico) *

I have been the treasurer for the last two terms. It has been good to give back to the club that only has what's best for our breed on its agenda. I have been involved with Chesapeakes my entire life. My parents got their first Chesapeake in 1946, before I was born. I showed in Juniors, qualifying and exhibiting my Chesapeake at Westminster. In my teens, I titled Ch. Eastern Waters' Chobee Belle CD. I bred her and had a litter of puppies, one of which was a multi group placing dog and NSS winner; AM BDA Ch. Eastern Waters Brown Charger, AM BDA CD.

After college, I left the East Coast and moved to New Mexico. I brought with me Ch. Chesachobee's Papoose whom I continued to show in conformation and also trained and earned her CD and CDX. I got a male puppy, Ch. Eastern Water's Chieftain CD. I spent most of the 70's showing Chief in breed and obedience.

Chief had nine Sporting Group placements, which at that time was very unusual for a Chesapeake. During these years I was an active member of the local obedience club and served as their treasurer.

I spent the next twenty years raising my children and running my CPA practice. I was never without a Chesapeake. After my kids were grown, I got a puppy and began showing again. Since then I have also involved my daughter and "soon to be a Junior" granddaughter. In regards to my experience and qualifications for being treasurer, I have been a CPA since 1977. I have my own firm and I am very familiar with all financial and reporting requirements. I have been treasurer of the Rio Grande Kennel Club since 2009. Director - Todd Adams (Alaska) *

I made the move to Alaska in 1995 and my journey with Chesapeakes started shortly after. I grew up in West Tennessee and hunted and guided from Illinois to Arkansas where waterfowl hunting was my favorite past time. Dogs, of course, came along with those pursuits and yes, I started with Labs. I bought my first Chesapeake in 1999 and my education began. I got involved with Hunt Tests (HT) and entered a few Field Trials (FT) with her. I was able to get her Senior title and passed a Master test before her time was cut short with Degenerative Myelopathy (DM). I am thankful she was able to contribute to the genetic testing we now have for that disease.

I was impressed enough with Ginger that I knew I wanted to continue with Chesapeakes. I also had become actively involved in our local retriever club. I have served on the Fairbanks Retriever Club board and in various officer roles over the years. I am an AKC FT and HT judge and have judged both in and outside Alaska on many occasions, as well as serving on HT and FT committees including the ACC - FTC. I compete in multiple disciplines- Conformation, Hunt Tests, Obedience, Rally and Agility. 4. Report of the Treasurer

The 2020 financial report has been submitted to the Bulletin for publication and the tax returns are filed. As of March 31, 2021 there was \$282,589 in the various banks including the one year CD valued at \$103,805. Total receipts for the three months was \$9,917. Most of the income was dues (\$6,044) and the profit transferred from the Ohio All breed Hunt test (\$3118.) The total expenditures for the three months were \$11,478. The primary expenditures included the transfer of the 2021 dues renewal campaign to the ACCCT Trust (\$5635) and bi-monthly bulletin costs (\$3419.) There are currently 1149 members. Laurea Griggs has opened an account for the NFTS. We have transferred the contributed funds from the dues renewal process to both the NSS and the NFTS.

5. Reports of Committees

1. Standing Committees

- i. AKC Delegate (Heidi Henningson) - The AKC has a pilot program that allows Juniors to show Canine Partners. Clubs can opt not to allow Canine Partners in Juniors competition at their events. There is a recommendation clubs have a "Junior Coordinator" and work with the club's Public Education Coordinator" to educate youth organizations about AKC events and purebred dogs.
- ii. Companion/Performance Events Committee (Laurea Griggs) -AKC has extended the Virtual Rally program until year end 2021, and has also added the Advanced and Excellent levels. As a change, these virtual title recipients will no longer be eligible for Rally National Championship invites. As of March 1, there is a new pilot Virtual Obedience program. This will be for the first 2 levels, Beginner Novice and Novice only. AKC now has a Disabilities Accommodation Waiver. Participants needing any kind of waiver to compete in AKC events can submit a waiver for their sport, explaining the accommodation needed and the policy with it affects. Waiver requests are reviewed by a newly formed department.
- iii. Field Trial Committee (Marlene Drag) - The 2021 NFTS has just published information about the Host Hotel (Quality Inn, Americus, GA). They are working on fundraising. They already have had some incredible donations (Impact Crate, Boom Gun, Ainley Bird Crate, etc). Fundraising discussion appears under New Business.
- iv. Health Committee (Gale Frana) - The committee is exploring new research projects to support with our AKC Canine Health Foundation Donor Advised Funds.
- v. Hunt Test Committee (Pat Baughman) - The Hunt Test Committee recently held a teleconference to brainstorm ideas to increase support for and participation in hunt tests.
- vi. Judge and Breeder Education (Gale Frana) - The committee is reviewing the draft website to give the web team feedback and working on new articles.

vii. Lifetime Achievement Award Committee (Margi Palmer) - The committee has received several nominations.

viii. Show Committee (Tina Cox) - The committee is transitioning to a new Chairperson (Michelle Voss). Several members have inquired about donating new trophies. Board discussion followed regarding the history of motions surrounding NSS trophies.

2. Ad-Hoc Committees and Groups

- i. ACC National Specialty Show Manual Update (Tina Cox) - Nothing to report.
 - ii. Breed Rescue Service (Carolyn Johnson) - Rescue is working with our treasurer to prepare a financial report to present to the ACC Charitable Trust.
 - iii. CBR Data Group (Gina Downin) -Dyane Baldwin shared her copies of Eve Keeler's records from old AKC and Field Dog Stud Books so that we could make copies for the ACC. These records date back to 1878. We will be running them through optical character recognition software to convert these paper files to digital format. The ultimate goal is to upload all of this old data into the database. We hope to complete this project by September. We've added more volunteers for short term-projects and this is allowing us to accelerate the work.
 - iv. Editorial Committee (Lynda Barber-Wiltse) - Nothing to report.
 - v. Electronic Communications Group (ECG) (Laurea Griggs) - The committee has reviewed Google web stats to gain insight into which pages on our website are getting the most traffic.
 - vi. Health Survey (Gale Frana) - Programming is almost complete. Testing will soon begin on the survey and we are hoping for a June launch. The initial proposal for this project was a one-time survey. There was some discussion of a perpetual survey, but a formal proposal for that idea has not yet been submitted to the Board for consideration.
 - vii. Nominating Committee 2021 (Margi Palmer) - The nominated slate was submitted to the Secretary prior to May 1. All biographies of the candidates have been submitted for publication in the Bulletin as required by the Bylaws.
 - viii. ROM Program (Lynda Barber-Wiltse) - Nothing to report.
- ##### 6. Unfinished Business
1. Updates on Ongoing Projects
 - i. Bylaws Revision Project - We continue to find areas of our Bylaws that could benefit from revision. We are making note of those areas in preparation for launching this project.
 - ii. Website Update - The web team just completed focus groups with members in Zoom video conferences to get feedback about the website. That feedback was very helpful and led to some improvements of the website and ideas for future projects.

1. Raffle fundraising alternatives - In preparation for upcoming fundraisers to support our national specialties, the Board discussed legal alternatives to raffles. Pat Baughman, who has considerable experience with fundraising in his professional work, has agreed to be a resource to both national specialty committees.
2. Update Membership List Distribution Policy Motions 98-12 and 98-12a to account for advances in technology - Tina Cox agreed to take the lead on this project.
3. Cloud Storage for Club Documents - Gina Downin is researching cloud storage options for important Board documents that must be preserved and available to future Boards.
4. Petition Candidates/Election - The Board plans to hire a third party to handle an election if there are petition candidates.
5. Annual Meeting - Notice submitted to be published in the May/June Bulletin: "The American Chesapeake Club will hold its Annual Meeting in conjunction with its National Show Specialty in York, PA at 6:30 pm on Thursday, August 26, 2021. Please note that given the ever-shifting landscape of COVID-19 restrictions that affect group gatherings in the state of Pennsylvania, there may be additional updates regarding the location of this meeting.
