Did you have a great hunt with your best pal or a great hike in the woods? Have you been getting into perhaps conformation, field work, therapy dog work, agility, obedience, rally, tracking, farm dog, trick dog, barn hunting, coursing, dock diving flyball, herding, search and rescue, scentwork/nosework, shed, etc.? Tell us how you got involved and explain what is necessary to train for that activity. Sharing your experiences and explaining what it takes may spark someone else and their best pal to want to try something new and fun also. It is truly all about the dogs, time spent and fun activities. Each of our dogs is "the best dog" no matter whether they are working with us on a specific sport or just curled up on the couch giving love and companionship.

Some of our members are especially well versed and educated in various health aspects, dog training and dog rescue. We'd love to hear from you and have you share your experiences about particular aspects that could be of value to all our Chesapeake owners.

It is easy to submit your writeup. Email to the Bulletin Editor by deadlines – Feb 28; Apr 30; June 30; Aug 31; Oct. 31 and Dec 31.

Photo Submissions: Only photos submitted by the owner(s), co-owner(s), or breeder(s) who are current ACC members in good standing shall be published. Submissions by breeders who are not owners of record must include permission from the owner or co-owner of record prior to the submission deadline for the current issue. • For ALL Photo Submissions - If a photographer requires that you provide their name in order to publish their work, be certain to include a photo credit with your submission copy. For Electronic (Digital) Photo Submissions by E-Mail • Send the photos as an ATTACHMENT, not in the body of the e-mail or other document. • Good quality photo images a minimum of 300dpi or higher AND image size of 8" x 10" are needed in order to print well in the Bulletin. • Proper resolution and size will create a JPEG image file size of greater than 1 MB. If your file size is significantly smaller than 900 KB or 1 MB, then it probably is not 300 dpi or the correct image size and will not be usable. • Check the settings on your camera / mobile device before taking pictures. There should be a settings feature allowing you to adjust the resolution/pixels; choose the highest setting for best print production. For example: 2400 x 3000 pixels/ inch (converts to 300dpi for an 8" x 10" photo). • Some digital cameras/devices create photos that are 24" to 30" in size but are shown as being only 72 or 96 dpi. This is OK. Just send the unedited file as is. The larger physical photo size provides lots of pixels and most of these photos can be edited to the required physical size and dpi needed for printing. • Please DO NOT crop or edit your images – that will be done for you. Whenever possible, cropping will be done to show the dog as fully as possible. • If you are scanning a hard copy of a photo, please check your scanner settings for proper resolution and image size, and make certain that you clean your scanner's glass surface prior to scanning.

# ACC Rescue

People often ask how do dogs end up in rescue? Lifestyle changes, job loss, divorce, moving, straying from their yard, and theft. It can be hard for dedicated pet lovers to understand how someone could just surrender or dump his or her companion, but it happens daily.



ACC recently pulled a sweet young female from a shelter in Maryland who was brought in with a broken leg because of being hit by a car. She had no collar nor was she microchipped. Molly was treated by a private veterinarian and her leg was placed in a cast. She was scared and not comfortable where she was. The Director of the shelter worked to gain her trust and give her personal attention. Molly was held six days and then released to ACC Rescue. We were fortunate to find an amazing foster home for Molly in Ohio. Yes, Ohio. They drove all the way to Maryland to pick up Molly. Yes, we even work to find the right foster home case by case. Once settled in, Molly was reevaluated by an orthopedic specialist to ensure that she was on the mend. It was determined that this little girl would need additional surgery and that a plate would need to be placed in her leg for proper healing. Of course, this all comes at a cost, which ACC Rescue covered.

I always worry about naming names but none of this would be possible without our "Rescue Angels." You know who you are. We have individuals who immediately send a donation for a specific dog. There are individuals

who send items for our ACC Rescue Auction House on Facebook. We have amazing people who donation beautiful "birds" to be auctioned off at the NSS and generous individuals who purchase them, let alone one heck of an auction team. Of course, there is the ACC Charitable Trust who always is there for our brown dogs in need.

I am happy to report that sweet Molly is on the mend and has an adoption pending. As it often will happen, we have what we call a "failed foster," which means Molly will be staying with her foster family. Their love and commitment to her is amazing and just the home we would like all dogs to have.

If you would like to assist with ACC Rescue, we are always looking for volunteers for a variety of position. Please do not hesitate to volunteer!





# Inside the Outline

Outline is the basic form of a dog in profile, and any judge, breeder, or fancier should immediately be able to identify the breed from outline alone. For the Chesapeake Bay Retriever, originally developed as a water retriever and bred to hunt under the harshest conditions, the outline or silhouette should convey soundness, power, stamina, and overall balance.

The CBR head is distinctive from other retriever breeds with a broad, round skull, medium stop, and a tapered muzzle that is pointed but not sharp. The tapered muzzle, as opposed to square, lessens the amount of lower jaw submerged in water when performing water retrieves. The muzzle should be approximately the same length as the skull. Lips are thin, not pendulous, and ears are set well up on the head so water does not easily enter the ear canal when swimming. The neck is medium length but muscular to facilitate carrying birds of all sizes and weight on water and land, and should transition smoothly into the shoulders.

Body is of medium length and slightly longer than tall. The forequarters have strong, sloping shoulders with straight, medium-length legs showing good bone and muscle. Pasterns are slightly bent. A strong, short back is well-coupled at the loin. Stifles are well-angulated, with the rear showing as much power as the forequarters with no tendency toward weakness. Powerful hindquarters are necessary for swimming, especially under harsh conditions the Chesapeake is bred for, and working difficult terrain. The tail should be medium length with, as the Standard states, a "medium heavy base." Standing, in outline or silhouette, the tail should appear straight or slightly curved with no tendency to curl.

The Chesapeake topline is unique when compared to the five other

retriever breeds in the Sporting Group, all of which require a level topline. The CBR Standard allows the hindquarters to be as high or a trifle higher than the shoulder. Note the phrase trifle higher as the rise must not be excessive or extreme. For the Chesapeake Bay Retriever, a level topline is also acceptable, and both toplines are equally correct. The topline should not show any weakness such as a dip or swayback; topline should be straight and strong with the allowance of a slight rise toward the top of the hip. Coat can be thicker over the withers and hips which may cause an optical illusion of a dip, but physical exam and movement will determine correct structure.

In underline, the depth of chest should extend at least to the elbow or slightly below. Flank should be tucked up under the loin. Skirting or feathering at the flank may hide the tuck in profile, but that, along with a well-developed barrel ribcage, can be determined upon examination.

Outline reflects the entire dog by bringing together all parts that support a breed's purpose. The outline should clearly convey overall balance and the hallmark characteristics required to perform the work the Chesapeake Bay Retriever was originally bred for and still excels at today.

## Historic Glossary Notes

In the early 1990s, the AKC requested all parent clubs use the same format for their Breed Standards and included a section called Topline. By reviewing the definitions listed below, one can see a lack of consistency in the meaning of Topline. Topline should not be used interchangeably with the word "backline."

By that definition 'level topline' is an obviously incorrect and impossible demand of some standards, e.g. Australian Terrier, Papillon, Weimaraner, etc., in which 'topline' and 'backline' have been confused." p.139.

"Backline - that portion of the entire topline of a dog, beginning at the rear end of the withers and ending at the tail." p. 21.





## American Chesapeake Club Lifetime Achievement Award

### OBJECTIVE

The ACC Lifetime Achievement Award is given to an individual who has made significant contributions to the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed / the people who own them through outstanding leadership / advancement of knowledge / understanding.

### ELIGIBILITY

The ACC Lifetime Achievement Award recognizes personal achievement / its positive impact on the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed. The award may be given to any individual independent of specific institutional affiliation with the American Chesapeake Club or other organizations.

The ACC Lifetime Achievement Award is not an annual award. The awards selection committee may decide not to make any awards selection in a given year or may decide to bestow multiple awards. The number / frequency of award selection is strictly at the discretion of the awards selection committee.

Nominations may be submitted by organizations or individuals, including the nominees themselves.

### AWARDS CRITERIA

Nominees are judged by the originality, vision, breadth, / impact of the entire body of their work. Candidate selection must go beyond mere name recognition / reputation. A nominee's work is evaluated in such areas as:

- A strong / well-documented commitment to the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed.
- Vocal / written advocacy of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed today.
- Advancement of best practices in owning, training, competing, rescuing / breeding Chesapeake Bay Retrievers.
- Service to the community / the public in connection with the Chesapeake Bay Retriever as a breed, in competition, to owners / through rescue efforts.

### JUDGING

Nominations will be evaluated on the criteria provided above. The names of the award winner(s), if any, will be announced prior to the annual American Chesapeake Club Meeting during the National Specialty Show. The formal presentation of any award will take place at the Specialty.

### NOMINATION REQUIREMENTS

There is no entry fee for the Lifetime Achievement Award. Nominations should be mailed directly to: ACC Lifetime Achievement Awards; Linda Harger, 3020 Killebrew Dr; Payette, ID 83661; fireweedid@me.com.

### INFORMATION TO BE INCLUDED IN NOMINATION:

Please furnish the following information in the order asked, using 8.5" x 11" sheets of paper.

1. Name of the nominee, nominee's address, phone number, / e-mail address
2. Name of the person submitting the nomination, along with that person's address, phone number, / e-mail address
3. A detailed description of how the nominee meets the awards criteria  
Visual aids supportive of the nomination should not exceed four. If they are smaller than 8.5" x 11", they must be mounted on sheets that size.

The following signed statement must be included within the nomination: "I understand that the contents of this entry become the property of the American Chesapeake Club / will not be returned. 

## CKC Tracking Dog (TD)

On 9/18/21 at the Wascana Dog Obedience Club tracking test, Toscane (Nordais Unique Toscane MH WCI CD RN) ran and completed the required track to earn her CKC Tracking Dog Title (TD).

There were 8 entered in the test and we drew Track #6. The track was aged about 45 minutes and the first leg of the track started with the wind at our backs.

We had a good start.

The first leg went by very quickly and soon we made the first turn. The second leg seemed long and had sparser vegetation and some vehicle ruts that paralleled the track for a good 20m. I wondered if the scent was pooled in the ruts and thought we may have missed our turn and were now off track. Trust your dog ran through my head and then Toscane showed signs of losing the track, circled once then headed into the wind for another 100 m, she was moving fast now. Without circling, she made a sharp left and started pulling hard. This 3rd turn took us toward a gravel pit about 120 m away we were moving fast and getting closer and closer to the pit and the vegetation was getting sparser. Now I started to think we were several meters off track and had over run the glove. I was trying to figure out what the wind was doing. Then Toscane stopped, I could see she had the glove in her mouth, I walked my way down my line to her, took the glove and held it up to show the judge. Toscane and I had a celebration and made a big deal about finding the glove while the judge and tracklayer caught up to us. Both were out of breath, as I now realized, I was too.



This test was held near Regina, Saskatchewan and judged by Shirley Klatt. The track was laid on a dry prairie grass field by Ian Kutarna and was 405 m long. We completed the track in just under 5 minutes.

## REGISTER OF MERIT PROGRAM (2021 Update)

The ROM Program Update Ad hoc Committee (Chair Lynda Barber-Wiltse, Laurea Griggs, Linda Harger, Betsy Horn Humer, Annette Monugian, Doreen Palmer and Toni Raden) is proud to rollout the 2021 updated Register of Merit Program. The original program was approved in 2003 and printed in the July/August 2003 ACC Bulletin. The Board approved the 2021 Update on 9/29/21 and appointed Lynda Barber-Wiltse as the ROM Program Coordinator. Email questions about the program to: [romprogram@amchessieclub.org](mailto:romprogram@amchessieclub.org).

The Register of Merit (ROM) program rewards those individual sires and dams (owned by members in good standing with the American Chesapeake Club) who have made outstanding contributions to the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed through their offspring's' achievements rather than on their own achievements. The ROM designations for dogs from the 2003 timeframe are currently listed in the ACC "CBR Breed Database". New designations will be added to the database and published in future Bulletins.

The Ad hoc Committee was charged with updating the original 2003 program to include new titling options (e.g., Rally, entry level Obedience and Agility, Grand Champion, other sports our dogs participate in, etc.). The Committee kept the "relationships" between categories and spread out the 2003 points to insert the new titling options then updated the cumulative points – thus preserving the original intent of the program.

More information about the program, including how to apply, is available at our ACC Website. From the ACC homepage navigate to "About the Club" then click "Register of Merit (ROM) Program" from the pull-down options (here is the direct link) (<https://amchessieclub.org/rom/>). The ROM Worksheet is a tool to help members gather and present the required information. The three ROM, ROMX and ROMQ Dogs buttons link to queries from the CBR Breed Database. The FAQ's button links to a growing list of questions and answers about the program and application process. BIG HINT – the "CBR Breed Database" is a wealth of information needed for the application process.

## INTRODUCTION

Prepared by the ROM Program Update Ad hoc Committee (Chair Lynda Barber-Wiltse, Laurea Griggs, Linda Harger, Betsy Horn Humer, Annette Monugian, Doreen Palmer and Toni Raden)

The Ad hoc Committee was charged with updating the original 2003 program. What appears below is essentially what was approved by the Board (Motion 03:21) and presented to the membership back in 2003. Some minor editing has been done to bring it up to date for 2021 but the document holds to the original intent of the program.

The Register of Merit (ROM) is a program that rewards those sires and dams who have made outstanding contributions to the Chesapeake Bay Retriever breed through their offspring. The ROM program, unlike other programs, does not reward the individual dog based on its achievements, but rather on the achievements of its offspring.

Three dogs are used here to illustrate how the original program was developed in 2003:

The first dog to be awarded an ACC Register of Merit certificate is Dual Champion and Amateur Field Champion Koolwaters Colt of Tricrown. Although Colt was only bred a handful of times, he sired quality animals in each litter. This is the hallmark of the consistent sire. To calculate his points based on the ROM system, first he must have belonged to an ACC member. Then the merits of his offspring are looked at. His offspring include 1 FC/AFC/CFC/CAFC, 4 with Ch (one group placing in Canada), 3 CD dogs, 1 CDX, a WD and a WDX out of a total of six titled offspring. He meets the first criteria of having six titled offspring, in 3 different areas, at least 1 show Champion, at least 1 field title, and one advanced title. Colt's ROM level point total is 41.

The first ROMX title is to Colt's sire, Amateur Field Champion and Champion Bomarc of SouthBay, Companion Dog. Bomarc was owned by August Belmont, IV and Louise Belmont, both members of ACC for many years. August was also the ACC President at one time. Bomarc was not only successful in field, show and obedience, he produced offspring that were successful as well. In addition to Colt, he produced 10 Ch (including 1 with group placements, and one National Specialty Show Best of Breed winner), 5CDs, 1 CDX, 1 TD, 3 WDs, and 4 offspring with field trial awards. Bomarc's ROMX level point total is 88.

Bomarc's grandson, and Colt's son, Field Champion, Amateur Field Champion, Field Trial Champion (Canadian) and Amateur Field Trial Champion (Canadian) Chesdel Chippewa Chief, is the first ROMQ. Chip is the only Chesapeake Bay Retriever to have earned all four field trial titles available in North America. But it is his production record that gives him this latest award. Chip belonged to the late Alex Spear, a member of ACC and participant in field trials since the 1930s. Chip sired 85 titled offspring. Included in that total are 1 Dual Champion, 1 FC/AFC, 1CFC/CAFC, 12 Champions (including several who were also awarded field trial placements or were Qualified All-Age trial dogs), 11 CDs,

1 CDX, several hunt test titles (including 3 MH dogs), numerous WDs, WDXs, WDQs, and 36 field trial placing offspring. Chip's ROMQ level point total is 358.

These three generations of ROM winners are an illustration of how the categories, qualifications, and point schedule are used to calculate a dog's qualification for these awards. Not only that but having several generations of ROM winners illustrates that quality progresses from generation to generation in our breed and deserves to be rewarded! A list of dogs and bitches eligible for ROM/X/Q was developed and published in the July/August 2003 ACC Bulletin. The ROM, ROMX and ROMQ designations for these dogs has been added to their profiles in the ACC CBR Breed database.

This list is not comprehensive, as new dogs will be added when their qualifications are verified. If you have a dog/dogs that meet(s) the qualifications, please fill out the ROM application, provide the required documentation or references and submit to the ROM Program Coordinator. Once verified, your dog will be added to the ROM and ACC CBR Breed database and a printable certificate will be emailed to you.

### **ROM GUIDELINES**

The Register of Merit (ROM) program was established to bring recognition to Chesapeake Bay Retrievers who are outstanding producers. This acknowledgement is based entirely on the achievements of the produce/get of a particular dog. The ROM program will be administered and maintained by the ROM Program Coordinator. This is a volunteer position of indefinite term approved by the ACC Board of Directors. The ROM Program Coordinator will be responsible for verifying titles and points as submitted by applying owners, emailing printable certificates, submitting list of achievers to the ACC CBR Breed Database and ACC Bulletin as necessary and maintaining files and records.

### **GENERAL RULES**

1. Awarded to Chesapeake Bay Retrievers whose owners are members in good standing of the American Chesapeake Club.

2. ROM titles are awarded only upon application by the owner. The ROM Program Coordinator will work with the ACC CBR Breed Database Team to maintain a database of eligible Chesapeakes. It is the owner's responsibility to supply the ROM Program Coordinator with proof of parentage and/or titles of offspring at the Coordinator's request. Proof may consist of photocopies of registration, award certificates, links to valid online databases, or

other official documentation from the American Kennel Club, ACC, or other recognized source. Much of the required information is available from the official ACC Breed Database.

3. Titles earned under the following registries will apply: AKC, ACC, CKC, UKC, NAHRA, FCI, other Kennel Club registry that is the ruling body for any country not covered by FCI. The ROM Program Coordinator shall determine equivalency for any non-AKC title not specifically listed in the official Point Scale. Owners are responsible for supplying the ROM Program Coordinator with rules and regulations for non-AKC titles to determine equivalency. Only hunt test titles where testing uses real birds shall earn equivalent points as compared to AKC tests.

4. Points may only be awarded once for equivalent titles. Equivalent titles are those with the same basic skills required for work within a category, as such, a JH would be considered equivalent to an SR and WD, an American CH or CD is equivalent to a Canadian CH or CD, etc. Obedience and Rally are considered one category and points will be awarded for the highest title earned (for instance, if a dog earned both a UD and RAE, the dog would get credit for the higher UD points and not the RAE points). For the ROM program, Hunt Tests and Field Trials are considered different categories, and dogs are eligible for points in both disciplines.

5. Points are not cumulative for subsequent titles. For example, a dog earning a CD gets 4 points, and if the same dog earns a CDX it will get two additional points, bringing the total points for the CDX to 6. Points are only awarded for the original title and not alpha/numeric additional titles (for instance, points awarded for Grand Champion (GCh) but not for Bronze/Gold/etc. or Preferred Agility Excellent (PAX) but not PAX2.

6. To qualify for any ROM award, the Chesapeake must meet ALL the following requirements:

- a. Have at least one offspring with a conformation Championship, and one offspring with a field title; and
- b. Have a minimum of six (6) AKC (or equivalent) titled offspring for dogs, three (3) for bitches; and
- c. Have offspring titled in three (3) different AKC (or equivalent) event areas (i.e., one CH, one CD, one JH); and
- d. Have at least one offspring with an advanced title (i.e., All-Breed BIS, CDX, TDX, FC/AFC, WDQ, SH, AX, or better); and
- e. Meet all point requirements.

7. A ROM award will be based on an approved and established point scale, as attached. (Since the program was updated in 2021, we will allow a grace period where members may submit information on dogs/bitches born

before 2010 based on the original 2003 point scale.)

8. There are three levels to the ROM award based on cumulative points and will be designated as follows:

- a. ROM — Dogs 60 points, Bitches 30 points
- b. ROMX — Dogs 120 points, Bitches 60 points
- c. ROMQ — Dogs 200 points, Bitches 90 points

## Annual Meeting Minutes

#### MINUTES OF ANNUAL MEETING OF MEMBERS

The Annual Meeting of Members of the American Chesapeake Club, a California nonprofit public benefit corporation was called to order on August 26, 2021 at 6:30 p.m. Eastern in York, PA at the American Chesapeake Club National Show Specialty pursuant to provisions and notice requirements set forth in the bylaws.

President Lynda Barber-Wiltse served as chairperson of the meeting, and Gina Downin served as secretary. Also present were Treasurer Margi Palmer, Director Tina Cox, Director Gale Frana, and Director Carolyn Johnson.

Based on the number of attending members with voting rights, the chairperson determined that a quorum was not present, and no member action could be taken other than to adjourn. However, the chairperson stated that informational reports and special presentations would be made followed by informal discussion with attending members, summarized as follows:

President Lynda Barber-Wiltse invited club volunteers in many different capacities to stand to be recognized and all were thanked for their contributions to the club. Groups recognized were committee members, Regional Directors, event Chairs, event volunteers, and candidates in our upcoming election.

Secretary Gina Downin informed the membership that ballots for the election have been mailed. A professional accounting firm was contracted to receive and count ballots. All ballots must be received by the account no later than September 25th. All members were encouraged to participate in the process and cast their vote. The new elected Board will be seated on October 1.

The Board of Directors requested “Year in Summary” reports from our committees, so the membership is informed of all the hard work that our committees and project leaders do on behalf of the club. These reports were sent to the entire membership via Blast Email but are included below to be entered into the formal record of the club.

### Companion/Performance Events

2021 brought significant changes to our committee. We adopted a new name, better reflecting the inclusion of new sports to our coverage. In previous years, we were responsible for Obedience, Rally, Agility and Tracking. We are now happy to add sports like Barn Hunt, Lure Coursing, Dock Diving and Scenework. These additions help to showcase the extreme versatility of our breed. There were many changes and additions to Virtual Titles offered thru AKC, which helped keep exhibitors involved before trials and shows were fully open.

### Field Trial

The FTC has been actively discussing the upcoming FTS. A few things we have identified as issues with the planning and execution of this and past events. We have decided to take the task of completing a long overdue project that many have started and never completed. This will be the definitive guide to FTS Planning. It will include deadline dates and criteria for

grounds, judges and all else. We are also actively seeking 2022 and 2023 FTS event holders.

Preparations are underway for the upcoming 2021 Field Trial Specialty in Americus, Georgia. Dates for the event are October 18-21, 2021. The website for the event can be found on the "Events" page of the ACC website. Chairs for the event are Laurea Griggs and Adam Levy.

## Health

The Health Committee was very happy to welcome a new committee member, Angie Cox (TN).

The Health Committee participated in multiple teleconferences in support of the Health Survey Ad Hoc Committee in formulating the upcoming ACC Health Survey.

Chair, Jim Stewart, monitors ongoing canine health research projects through the AKC Canine Health Foundation and makes recommendations for any available funding opportunities.

The Health Committee arranged for Dr. Chris Zink to present her "I Spy" seminar at the 2021 National Show Specialty in York, PA on August 26. This seminar covers important subjects such as spotting signs of injury before the dog becomes lame and preventing re-injury after soft-tissue injuries. There will be two handouts available at the seminar.

The Health Committee would like to thank the ACCCT for working effectively with us to fund the "I Spy" seminar with Dr. Zink.

Several Health Committee members attended the AKC Canine Health Foundation annual conference. This conference was conducted as a webinar which gave us the opportunity to attend at very little cost. Members will be preparing short articles with information from this conference to be published in the Bulletin and posted on the ACC website. Some of the subjects covered were DM, Dermatology, Cancer, and Epilepsy. Environmental components were discussed in relation to several topics. Of particular interest was a presentation about Chagas disease, which hits hunting dogs and dogs who spend a lot of time outdoors in certain habitats. This disease has been identified all across the country, north to south, east to west and is being studied at Texas A&M University.

## Hunt Test

The hunt test committee has been very active this year. We have been working on ways to get more people involved in hunt tests. We have had multiple teleconferences and lots of communication. We are developing ways to make it easier to offer ACC Sponsored hunt test and support those Chairs as best as possible.

## Judge and Breeder Education

- Articles reviewed and new articles provided by the JBEC.
- "Size Matters"
- "The Dewclaw Dilemma: Rear Dews & Dont's" Rear Dewclaws was also published in the ACC Bulletin and

ShowSight Magazine. Research was done, contacting European and UK members re: laws and restrictions in foreign countries.

No Judges Seminars have been held since Sept. 2019 at the last National Specialty in Washington. Current Judges Seminar scheduled for August 27, 2021 to date has 9 judges signed up. Presentation will be done by Dyane Baldwin and JoAnn Colvin with assistance from four mentors.

NSS Seminar for exhibitors, members and breeders will be presented by Betsy Horn Humer, JEC and Angie Cox, JBEC on Friday, Aug 27 at 8:00 pm at the Wyndham Garden Hotel in York, PA.

2018 Illustrated Guide Flash drives have been mailed to all new permit judges to date.

## Lifetime Achievement Award

The committee is working to insure we honor those who have done outstanding service to our club and breed and welcome member input.

## Show

This year the Show Committee transitioned from Michelle Keehn as Chair to Michelle Voss as Chair as well as three new appointments, Andrew Hanley, JoAnn Colvin and Raneé Navels.

We would like to thank Brenda Stewart and Robyn Haskin for their time and service on the Committee and to the Club.

The Committee has approved and supported more than a dozen Supported Entries this past year. We have also supported the 2021 and 2022 National Show Specialty (NSS).

We are currently looking for volunteers for the 2023 NSS in the West. We have recommended to the Board the approval of Specialty Shows.

Other things we have been working on include a guideline for the Challenge Trophies and repairing or replacing broken trophies, we hope to have this completed within the coming year. We have also been working with the Board to update Standing Rules that pertain to the Show Committee.

## NSS Manual Update

The Show Manual committee has been working on updating the manual intermittently throughout the year. This is the first time the manual has been updated in decades. Updated ACC and AKC requirements are included and/or referenced as well as steps to follow, tools, and examples of forms needed by anyone working on an upcoming show specialty. A section on supported entries will also be added. The main work has been to format the contents so that individual information sections can be quickly found and referenced by an acting NSS Chair, NSS committee chair or member, or an ACC member interested in hosting a National Show Specialty.

Currently the committee is reviewing the final format and gathering form examples for the appendix. The committee expectations are to have the final draft ready for the ACC Show Committee to review by early September 2021, then send to the BOD for approval by mid-September.

## **Breed Rescue Service**

These truly are unusual times, and we are seeing that in rescue as well. The American Chesapeake Club Breed Rescue assisted in the placement and rehoming of several dogs due to families having to relocate due to a loss of jobs and having to change homes. One owner had to move into town and realized that his dog was not thriving in his new living situation. This owner reached out to us to assist him with finding just the right place for his dog. It was a difficult decision but, in the end, Jake ended up in the Catskill Mountains in a wonderful home complete with a stream and land to enjoy. What a gift.

Dogs come into rescue in several ways. We often will receive notice that a Chesapeake is in a shelter, they may be listed on Craigslist, through referral to ACC Rescue or owner surrender. We had two situations where we pulled dogs who found themselves in a shelter only to find their owners once they were in our custody. We had three dogs surrendered when they tested heartworm positive, and their families were unable to afford to treatment for them. In one situation, we assisted with financial support as the family truly didn't want to lose their beloved dog.

We have had what we call "failed foster," where a dog will be placed into a foster home only to find a new forever home without having to look very far.

A special dog Banjo who was a tripod, moved into his forever home after going through heartworm treatment while in the care of ACC Rescue West. He has done very well and is now in a home as the only dog and best friend of a young woman enjoying hiking and trips to the mountain.

This year we worked with CBRR in providing homes for dogs that were removed from a Chesapeake puppy mill in Nebraska. In 2019 it was listed by the Human Society of the US as one of the top one hundred worst puppy mills. This was several years work in making this a reality. ACC helped a beautiful eleven-year-old found herself a new home on a ranch in Oklahoma.

Meeting the medical needs of our dogs vary from spaying and neutering which we do for all our dogs, to heartworm treatment, to simply getting a dog current on their vaccinations does not come without a cost. The continued support of our members, and the ACC Charitable Trust makes this all possible. We had a very successful Lynch Creek Holiday greenery sale thanks to the support of so many of our members and friends. Over \$1,191.00 was raised for Rescue. We will again be having this event this year.

Our rescue network continues to grow, but we always have room for more volunteers. If you would like to be part of our mission of leaving no brown dog behind, please contact our Director, Heidi Henningson to volunteer.

## **CBR Data Group**

This last year has been a very productive year for uploading historical data from a number of very valuable sources. These are bulk uploads done by our team. This helps us to bring in information about past dogs. Our focus over the next year will be increasing owner/breeder input of new dogs and new health/trait information. The "story" of our dogs marches on and we want to make sure that we capture all of it. Any health or trait tests that are NOT submitted to OFA can only be entered by the owners or breeders of dogs. AKC awards reports including placements, JAM's,

qualifying legs, etc., were previously received from the AKC in one annual report which meant that those awards could sometimes be uploaded to the data a year after the achievement. The Board recently approved receiving those reports quarterly which will allow for more timely inclusion in the database. Just a reminder that our database is always evolving and in time, there will be new functions added. ## **Electronic Communications Group**

Many thanks to the members of the Electronics Committee Group for everything, including but not limited to: historical information on the club and the site, brainstorming, building, content creation and editing.

The ECG was very active this year working on the new and improved website through much of the winter and spring. We are proud to say that we did meet our mid-year goal of going live in June. Committee Members, Tina Cox and Gina Downin spent many hours on the design and the transfer of content from one site to the other.

This year we upped the club's Social Media Game. With regularly scheduled posts and features on Facebook. Currently, the ACC Facebook Page has 3820 Followers, with over 630 outside the US. We have more than doubled participation on the FB page since the release of the new web site. With cross platform integrations Engagement numbers are up on all venues. We have direct messages to the page an average of once a week, with 4 admins monitoring the page, and messages. We have started using Business tools on FB and have started a video Channel. Integration of FB to Instagram account is beginning.

We did have a security issue in July. Our domain was directed away from the website. The issue was addressed within a few hours and was completely remedied within a few days. HostMonster suggested that we change our security application to a newer product called CodeGuard which will prevent take-overs and redirects and create backups for the site.

Work continues on the 2021 FTS website, so that it can be launched as soon as the NSS is complete. The FTS website was setup with a template to assist the FTS Committee in producing an organized, and easy to use site for the event. We plan on doing the same for the NSS Committee next year. The ACC owns domains for both events for consistency.

There are several additional improvements in the works, including a member's only area where we can post specific, or licensed content that cannot, or should not be available to the public. An online store is also in the works.

The committee is open to questions and/or suggestions for future improvements.

## **Health Survey**

The Health Survey is in the final stages of programming and testing. Once all the input from members has been

addressed, programming should be completed. Watch for an announcement when we launch the Health Survey. It is important that as many Chesapeake owners as possible complete this survey for us to get a true picture of health concerns in our breed. Owners need not be members of the ACC to complete the survey. Once the survey is launched, please encourage Chesapeake owners to go to the ACC website to complete the survey. Spread the word through your social media pages to optimize the opportunity for people to participate in the survey. We will announce the launch using multiple avenues, so please watch for it.

## **ROM**

The Register of Merit (ROM) program was initiated in 2003 to reward those sires and dams who have made outstanding contributions to our breed thru their offspring. The ROM program rewards the individual dog based on the achievements of its offspring rather than on the individual dogs own achievements. The ROM Program Update Ad Hoc Committee (Committee) recently worked with the CBR Data Group to scan and import the ROM/ROMX/ROMQ designations from the 2003 list of dogs (published in the July/August 2003 Bulletin) and attach the designations to their profile in our ACC CBR Breed Database.

The Committee also updated the original points scale to include new titles and titling categories now available thru the AKC. This effort required adjusting the 2003 points scale across all categories. The Committee is now gathering input on a selection of qualified sires and dams based on the original 2003 points scale and the updated 2021 points scale in order to determine the revised cumulative points required for the three ROM levels.

Future tasks –

- complete ROM program update;
- submit to the Board for approval;
- move forward on an individual dog recognition program.

## **News From Our AKC Delegate – Heidi Henningson**

For the last year all Delegate and Committee meetings have been held via zoom. The AKC will be holding their first in person Delegate Meeting Tuesday, September 14, 2021, in Newark, New Jersey. The Delegate Forum topic will be “Bringing Juniors to the Sport – What can your club do?” This has been developed by members of the Juniors Subcommittee. The AKC is working hard to provide Juniors with opportunities to become involved in any of several venues that are offered in the Sport of Dogs. Juniors are the future of the sport!

On the Agenda will be the introduction of Delegates attending their first meeting, voting for the Standing Delegate Committees, Approval of the minutes, the Chairman’s Report, the Presidents Report as well as a Financial Report.

AKC Juniors News - A common concern across the sports is who will carry on these traditional Performance Events that we love and are so important to maintaining the “purpose” behind purpose-bred dogs. Children and teenagers are the future of the sport of dogs and responsible dog ownership. The more they learn, the more they will grow in dog sports and as a person. The

Treasurer, Margi Palmer, made the following report. As of August 31, 2021, there was \$269,054 in the various banks including the one year CD valued at \$103,805. During August we deposited partial entries for the Working Dog test of \$3,830 along with new member dues of \$1332.

In September we received the accounting for the NSS Hunt test. There were 104 entries. Gross income was \$9,255 including \$415 from the raffle. Expenses totaled \$11,816 for a net loss of \$2,206. Event Chairperson, Mike Moscovitz, stated that with 20/20 hindsight it would have been a breakeven event or a much smaller loss. He indicated that he was passing on his experiences to the Michigan Hunt test chair.

Jane Pappler has remitted all the entry fees and sent her final accounting for the working dog test which shows a profit of \$1,866. She is preparing a complete report for the Bulletin.

Lois Wida, Treasurer for the NSS is close to remitting her report. She did indicate that she has \$7,984.04 for ACC Rescue from the raffle of Jim Stewart's decoys. She is waiting on a couple of deposits to finalize her report. Based on her interim accounting it appears there will be a small profit from the NSS once the outstanding deposits are received.

In September we closed the one-year CD at SmartBank in Tennessee and moved it to the Operating account. Once the new President and Board is installed, we can decide how to invest the extra funds. Interest rates everywhere look bleak.
