







Each year the American Kennel Club recognises breeding programs from the Sporting, Hound, Working, Terrier, Toy, Non-Sporting and Herding groups, with the winner of each going forward to challenge for the AKC Breeder of the Year. The AKC President and CEO says, "It is our pleasure to honor this group of esteemed breeders. These individuals have made important contributions to the sport and to the betterment of their breeds. They are committed to ensuring the healthy future of their breed as well."

The 2021 AKC Breeder of the Year award winner will be announced during the livestream of the AKC National Championship presented by Royal Canin on Sunday evening, December 19, 2021. This year recipient for the Sporting group is Chesapeake Bay Retriever breeder, Dyane Baldwin of Pond Hollow Chesapeakes.

Thank-you to AKC for this award, I thought they called the wrong person! In 1977, my late husband Bill and I got our first pure bred Chesapeake. He became a Ch* UD WD. I bred my first Chesapeake Bay retriever litter with co-owner and mentor Barbara Mullen in 1979. In 2019, I became the first AKC Platinum Breeder of Merit for Chesapeake Bay retrievers. Right now I am 2 dogs away from 200 conformation champions. I have bred over 365 AKC titled dogs in all types of venues-198 champions (31 with group placements); 7 FT award winners; 24 Master Hunters; 45 Senior Hunters; 94 Junior hunters and titles in Obedience, Tracking, Agility (A MACH), Rally and Dock Diving.

A thank-you also to all the owners (many of which have become good friends) for developing the dogs so they could achieve these titles.

Why would Jess be in a Zoom with Chrissie's American Chesapeake friends? Because, we wanted her to be present when the American Chesapeake Club awarded her mother our Lifetime Achievement Award. The surprise went off without a hitch. It was a brief zoom call, but one that Chrissie will long remember as she is the first foreign ACC member to receive this award.

It was a very emotional moment when I was informed, from the other side of the Atlantic, that I had been awarded the ACC Lifetime Achievement Award.

Never, in a million years, would I have expected this honour and I am truly humbled and honoured to have been nominated and to have been presented with the award.

Chesapeakes have been my life and love for nearly fifty years now and have remained a constant whilst other things (and people!) have come and gone. HOPE SPRINGS DOUBLE PUFF ** MH WDQ
Jan. 6, 2008 - Oct. 28, 2021

She was the puppy nobody wanted from an accidental litter of half siblings. Originally sold to a duck hunter, she was stepped on by a horse two days before he was to pick her up, breaking two bones and severing a tendon. The vet patched her up with a toe to elbow soft cast while we hoped for the best, but the sale was off and we were warned she could end up with a permanent limp. She

tried to swim with her big cast on and nearly drowned, but she did heal with no lameness, just a fear of water. Once it warmed up, she got over the fear, but couldn't seem to learn how to swim properly. She'd pull her front feet out of the water making a lot of wake but no forward progress. No trick we tried seemed to work and we thought she'd be the only Chesapeake in the world that could not swim. We tried to give her away as a nice house pet but found no takers.

We'd called her Pander, which became Panda and then Der. She was a cute puppy with a sweet disposition and big intelligent eyes, but we did not need another dog, particularly one that could not swim. I found no takers when I tried to give her away as a nice house pet. Surely someone would want the only non swimming Chesapeake in the world. When she finally did learn to level out and swim. she was 8 or 9 months old--and still here. She loved retrieving and was crazy about real birds, but refused to bring them back.



When Der was 14 months, it was decision time. After force fetch and collar conditioning, I would sell her as a started dog. But she sailed through that and showed uncanny marking and memory, and I lost her dam in a freak accident so I finally realized she was here to stay. In less than 3 months, she made it to the last bird of her first derby. Screaming drama queen during training, she never refused a retrieve in her entire life although she did stick on a few last-birds for a time, and she was test wise, but she was such a fun partner I forgave her for that.

Together Der and I made many new friends and she was equally eager to tackle a big crippled Canada goose as she was to take on a tough set of marks. She could read me like a book. It was a sad day when the light went out in those big gold eyes

Chessie Tales

Miss Chandalar

Before we get the story, the moral of the story is, be nice to your flight attendant

In late June, I gave Cathy Scroggins of Rock Hill Retrievers in Texas a call. I routinely give her a call every 3 months or so. She is good Chessie folk and we visit about what is going on in the Chessie world



In this case, what was going on is that she had bred one of her bitches, Decks, to AFC Red Dogs Anything Goes, Porter. Porter had 44 all age points which is very rare in the breed. It takes an exceptional dog to accrue 44 AA points. I have always liked Porter and had tried to breed to him once, which was unsuccessful. In addition to his field talent, he has a wonderful temperament. I was surprised that Cathy had done a breeding, for I thought all the sperm was gone. I immediately said I want a pup, preferably a female. I was excited at the potential of being able to get a Porter pup but my enthusiasm was tempered by the fact that this was a frozen AI breeding, which I have come to the conclusion is about the same as gambling with luck being a major component. Spinning the roulette wheel, doing a frozen AI breeding, just about the same.

As things turned out, it was one of those rare frozen AI success stories. Decks had 10 pups, 8 girls, 2 boys. I was going to get options.

Airplane reservations for flying from Alaska to Texas and back in mid August were made. This is a long journey and my plans were to do it within 24 hours, picking the pup at the airport and getting right back on the plane.

Arrangements were made for a neighbor to come in and take care of the dogs left in my house in Anchorage.

The day arrived, and off I went. The plane left at 1:30AM. Anchorage to Seattle went fine and was on time. Caught the connection to Dallas (DFW). Things went bad about 3/4 of the way to Dallas. I noticed that the plane went into a holding pattern, flying in circles. The intercom came on and the pilot said, "Trouble in Dallas, thunderstorms." This was still fairly early in the day, and thun-

derstorms only worsen as the day goes on. I knew at this point that my plans were going to go up in smoke. An hour later, the pilot gets on and says DFW is closed, we are diverting to Kansas City. Great, just frigging great

Meanwhile, Cathy had left her home as she lives 3 hours away from DFW, and was waiting.

I have no way to communicate, but I noticed on my computer that there was a private network. I suspected that the airline staff had access to a network, so I trundled back to the back of the plane. Whereupon I introduce myself to the 2 flight attendants present. Their names were Tracia and Kitsie. I say "I have a problem. I have a new puppy that is waiting on the ground. Do you have a way to communicate?" Well, yes they did, they do have their own network. So Tracia starts texting Cathy apprising her of the situation. Kitsie texts my neighbor apprising her of the problem and that I would not be returning as planned,

please take care of the dogs. The response was not to worry, they'd be taken care of.

We land in Kansas City. My cell phone will not work. I borrow a cell phone, to try and call Alaska Airlines, hah, as everybody else is trying to call Alaska Airlines to deal with the ramifications of being diverted. Tracia continues to update Cathy who is still waiting in Dallas. She has gone and picked up her grandson Isaac. Her husband, Wade, has had to leave work early to come home and take care of their dogs.

We stay in Kansas City for about 5.5 hours. Eventually, we take off and arrive in Dallas at around 10PM, some 8 hours later than expected. My connection is shot.



My connection is through Portland, The plane that I am on, will be flying back to Seattle. It is clear that I will be spending the night in DFW. Portland, or Seattle. Tracia suggests that I stay on the Seattle plane and she makes

those arrangements for me, I can't reach Alaska Airlines, but she can. The kicker here is that I have to get off the plane, go connect with Cathy, get the pup, go through security, and get back on the plane in 45 minutes.

This sounds straightforward, and in many airports it would be, but not DFW. DFW is the absolute worst as far as signage and clear indications of where to go are. This includes getting in and out of the airport. Tracia tells Cathy that I will meet her at Alaska Airlines ticketing, terminal E. I get off the plane, they had me exit first, the pilots know all about the puppy, heck, most of the plane knows about the puppy by this point, and immediately head the wrong direction. It took me about 7 minutes to realize I was in error. I then have to retrace my steps, I have wasted 15 of the 45 minutes that I have. Meanwhile, Cathy is having trouble navigating the airport and is going around in circles, unable to find parking for Terminal E. The GPS is sending her to the wrong place. Eventually, Isaac, who is 9, has the wisdom to say "Grandma, why don't you turn the GPS off". That helped and she eventually finds a parking spot near the Alaska Airlines departure and somehow, we stumble into one another. The puppy who has had a very long day, is transferred. Keep in mind, we have an 8 week old puppy who has been taken out of the surroundings she knows, has been taken away from her siblings, and is in an airport with a bunch of people she doesn't know, there are lots of unfamiliar sounds and smells, and has been handed over to someone she doesn't know. Not to mention everybody involved has had a very long day and are stressed. We clear security, everybody oohs and aahs at the cute baby.

I get back on the plane and all the flight attendants gather round to see Chandalar whom they are all calling Chandy, which is pronounced Shandy. Chandalar is an Arctic River, emanating from the Brooks Range. While probably stressed, she is dealing with it.

The flight to Seattle is fine, Chandy does just fine, and we arrive near midnight. So there I am, with an 8 week old baby, and having to spend the night. There is no place to sleep in the Seattle airport and I didn't. Chandy did however, and at 6:30AM we board a flight to Anchorage. The flight was long but uneventful. We finally arrived home, I went 32 hours without sleep, and it was a total of 4 hours in the previous 50 hours. I was totally and completely exhausted for I am not a young man any more. Chandy did well and took it all in stride and was excited to meet my dogs at home. Let's play was her idea, mine was sleep.

I will never fly to Texas in August again,

Tracia was able to take a bad situation and make it work

as well as it could. It would have been a real mess if she had not helped. Many thanks to Tracia and to Cathy for her perseverance.

What has happened to young Miss Chandalar since?

Well, it certainly has not been an average life for a young pup.

Before she was 3 months, she went on the annual caribou hunt. This involved camping out in the woods and living in a tent in the wilderness.



Quite an experience for a very young pup. She did fine and actually had fun running through the tundra and jumping into the ponds. She was quite intrigued with the flopping grayling that we caught.

Shortly after this, she was flown in the cargo hold of a jet to Seattle, and driven 1200 miles to North Dakota in a dog truck to start the annual fall bird hunting trip. This is an upland bird hunting trip, mainly focused on wild pheasants.

There was some limited training going on, and she was delivering to hand by 3.5 months. From an early age, it was clear that gun fire was not going to be a problem.

I, typically, get my pups in the winter, so by the time their first hunting season comes around, they are around 10 months old which is an ideal time. This was not the case with young Miss Chandy, and she was out hunting pheasants with the rest of the pack at 4 months old. She got very excited at the sight of the flushing pheasants. She wanted the birds very badly and was trying to take the retrieved birds away from the older dogs as they were bringing them back. However, her curiosity regarding the porcupine did not go well and she got quilled. I got to pull quills out of her out in the field, joy, joy, joy.

I had bought a winger and on days that the wind did not blow excessively, which were few, she was getting marks which she was very enthusiastic about.

We then headed west to hunt quail, where she retrieved her first birds in a real hunting scenario. The flushing



quail caused much excitement.

Her temperament, as expected, is wonderful. She has not met anybody she doesn't like, and loves children. The feeling has been quite mutual as everybody has really liked her.

So, in summary, before she was 6 months old, She flew from Dallas to Anchorage, went on a wilderness caribou hunt, flew from Anchorage to Seattle, went on a 6,000 mile trip in a dog truck, went pheasant hunting, got quilled by a porcupine, went quail hunting, was retrieving birds and delivering them. She is not a shrinking violet, that is for sure, and I like her very much. It was worth the ordeal but I still am not going to fly to Texas in August ever again.

She has now started her field trial training with Conrad Retrievers.

Thoughts On Versatility In The Chesapeake Bay Retriever

Chesapeake Bay Retrievers (CBR) have often been described as the most versatile of the hunting dogs. Sometimes described as the 4x4 of the retriever group: a die-hard hunter bred to retrieve 100+ waterfowl every day in wet, icy conditions, a fierce protector of family and property, a well-mannered companion in the home, and the ultimate “Velcro” dog.

What makes the Chesapeake so versatile and why should we encourage this beyond field work? How much work and commitment does it take to train a versatile dog? How will an individual CBR’s utilitarianism improve the breed?



“Versatility” in the Breed Standard

It’s most interesting that the word “versatile” is not found anywhere in the CBR Breed Standard. Instead, the authors of the standard chose to describe the natural and trained abilities of the CBR in many different ways so that the breed was not limited only to its original purpose – “to hunt waterfowl under the most adverse weather and water conditions.¹” Rather, the breed is encouraged to better itself through growth and development within the existing standard.

For the most part, the Breed Standard describes the size, proportion, and substance of the dog. These are all traits that conformation judges evaluate in the breed ring: head, bite, topline, body, gait, and coat. These qualities are what most reputable breeders are proving when taking their breeding stock into the conformation ring. Does the dog align with the breed standard?

What judges cannot easily evaluate in the breed ring is temperament and the dog’s willingness to work. The section on temperament in the breed standard is short, only 47 words, but it is this passage that describes the most critical aspects of the CBR’s versatility, outside of the breed’s field abilities:

“The Chesapeake Bay Retriever should show a bright and happy disposition with an intelligent expression. Courage, willingness to work, alertness, nose, intelligence, love of water, general quality and, most of all, disposition should be given primary consideration in the selection and breeding of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever.¹”

There are eight facets of the CBR’s temperament listed in this brief paragraph that can be used to further define the versatility of the breed:

1. Bright and happy disposition
2. Intelligence
3. Courage
4. Willingness to work
5. Alertness
6. Nose
7. Love of water
8. General quality



All of these attributes are necessary components of a hunting dog, but what about those dogs that meet the breed standard, and aren’t hunted over with regularity? How can we prove the CBR’s inherent breed qualities for either breeding stock or a companion dog when we have limited access to field training? How can our dogs demonstrate courage, willingness to work, alertness, nose, intelligence, love of water, general quality and disposition in an urban setting or one that is less “hunter friendly?”

In Chapter 4 of “The New Complete Chesapeake Bay Retriever,” Mrs. Janet Horn provides an excellent answer to these questions in her commentary on the breed standard: “... not all work is retrieving game; work can be anything the owner asks the dog to do.² ”

“Versatility” in Companion Dog Sports

There are many canine sports that can demonstrate the eight facets of the CBR’s disposition and demeanor. The dog’s abilities are proven through their ability to learn, think, and act both in relation to and independently of the handler. These facets are all part of the important foundation work used in field sports and functional hunting application. From something as simple as the

AKC Canine Good Citizen to dock diving to competitive obedience, each sport can support and provide the basic evidence of the elements for the CBRs original purpose and encourages both the dog and handler to work together to achieve a goal.

Through training and dedication, various companion dog sports offer unique opportunities to build upon the natural abilities of the CBR. For example, sports like agility require intelligence, willingness to work, and courage under the pressure of time, which requires accuracy and responsiveness to complete a course. The dog needs to be mindful of the handler's position and direction, while simultaneously navigating



unstable and irregular terrain or obstacles in sometimes blind conditions. The dog must be willing to work and intelligent enough to take direction and make independent, split-second decisions at a distance. Although agility, on its face, may look nothing like hunting, the base requirements on the dog and handler are similar, in order to be successful.

Incredibly fun and inherently rewarding, dock diving is consistent with the CBR's breeding as a cold waterfowler. For waterfowl dogs like CBRs, diving into the water (which is usually freezing cold, even in the summer) after a flying bumper is one of the most exciting things ever, aside from diving into the water to fetch a bird. What better way to have fun and proof a dog's training than to set them up to do water retrieves, inclusive of obedience, marking, swimming, and retrieving? Despite what it looks like, dock diving takes a considerable amount of athletic ability, drive, courage, love of water, and basic obedience to be successful. The dog needs to be obedient and have solid sit- or down-stays, recall, retrieve, and drop commands. It takes courage to launch off the dock into clear water, at an upward angle to get distance. For dogs exhibiting in air retrieve, not only are these physical aspects of the dog important, but their "mouth-eye" coordination and marking abilities, are imperative. All of these aspects are consistent with training a dog for hunting.



Scent detection and tracking, which also include search and rescue, sentry, and law enforcement detection

dogs, are largely natural skills that that are built upon and specialized by the trainer. When trained for scent detection and tracking, the dog is rewarded for finding a certain scent that they are trained to find on command in a variety of adverse conditions. Air movement can create pockets and wells of false scent, water can dampen a scent track, and time ages scent, making tracking an exceptionally difficult task for even the most accomplished detection dogs. The keys to scent detection and tracking are consistent training and teamwork, closely followed by trust. The dog is responsible for finding the scent and tracking it back to its source, similar to the way a hunting CBR finds its way back to a lost bird in the field. The handler is responsible for teaching and reading the cues from the dog and trusting that the dog knows what it needs to do. Finding a lost bird in a hunting situation is scent detection and tracking.

Obedience is crucial to any dog-human relationship and should not be overlooked. Obedience, including both competitive obedience and rally, show the dog's willingness to work together with the handler. The primary skill demonstrated in obedience and rally classes of all skill levels are based in heelwork. Heeling, both on and off lead, is reflected in daily life, as well as the hunt/field environment. The alertness, precision, critical thinking, problem-solving, and willingness to work and follow the handlers command, both in close

range and at a distance, are skills not just necessary in an obedience ring, but also for any successful hunting dog, military/law enforcement dog, a service/therapy dog, or even a well-mannered pet in the home. Although both rally and competitive obedience may be on the more serious side of companion dog sports, the teams that are most successful are the ones that exhibit a strong relationship and communication between the dog and handler. CBRs are not generally known for their speed or precision in the obedience ring, but the typical "brown clown" tends to draw an adoring audience of fans because of their tail wagging, prancing, silly movements, and a happy disposition in the ring.

"Versatility" in teamwork

Companion dog sports are an alternative way to demonstrate the whole of the CBR breed standard. As a hunting dog, the CBR is one of, if not the best, out there. An ideal example of a CBR, as described in the breed standard (the perfect breed specimen), is a versatile, rugged, driven, all-around hunting dog. In a world where hunting opportunities can be geographically limited, the next best way to prove that our dogs have the attributes

that a good CBR should have is to do companion sports, have fun, and build deep working relationships with our dogs.

Sports are not a replacement for hunting, though they do offer similar training avenues for dogs and/or owners that are unable to hunt for any reason. We need to normalize that dog sports are a way to further enjoy these highly versatile dogs. CBR owners love to brag on their dogs. We talk about the innate qualities a correct CBR should possess and why this breed is one of the strongest, smartest, and most versatile breeds out there. It does a disservice to the breed to not recognize the value of dog sports and the potential for good that they can do for our individual dogs and the future of the breed as a whole.

Dog sports are more than just “fun games” or a collection of letters appended to the dog’s name. They are a means of communication – a language between a dog and its handler. If the relationship between the dog and handler is improved through the ability to take instruction and obey commands, it’s hard to imagine how it is possible to have a functional working relationship between a sporting dog and its handler in the absence of those characteristics. Whether using sports and titling accomplishments to prove breeding stock or just to improve and enjoy a personal relationship between the dog and handler, the reward of a well-trained dog, capable of doing more than the “average” pet dog, is absolutely priceless.



In 2021 the American Chesapeake Breed Rescue worked to rescue and find new homes for 26 dogs. All of these dogs have different but similar stories. They ended up in rescue for a variety of reasons that ranged from being pulled from a shelter as a stray, owner surrender, or the need of a new placement for a wide range of reasons. Dogs and especially puppies as a lot of work as we all know. Some families



are not able to provide the structure or time for a dog. We have assisted individuals in finding new homes as owner placements for their dog and ACC Rescue screens individuals from our applicants. We seemed to have a higher number of dogs pulled from shelters this year. A couple of dogs have tested positive for heartworm and the financial burden of treatment will cause a owner to surrender their dog. We have been very successful in treating these dogs and finding a new forever home during or after successful treatment. We have a couple of dogs who may be in ACC's possession for an extended period. Finding the right home is not easy and has not happened yet. These dogs are in Northern California with Camille Druge, or ACC Rescue West. As always, our goal is for a permanent home for all dogs, and we continue to work to find the right home, but the right situation has not presented itself yet.

We recently have a dog come into rescue that was removed from the home and the owner charged with neglect. Grace weighed only 35 pounds when she came to ACC Rescue. She is almost 30 pounds under weight. her coat is minimal with only a few waves on her back. We quickly found an amazing foster for her where she would be loved, spoiled and her health needs met. It is a long road, but we are very confident that she will be able to handle it. She currently is eating several small meals until her stomach can adjust to normal amounts of food twice a day. Grace has a new bed, toys and is learning to trust and accept love, something she had been missing in her life. She has been to the veterinarian and is current on her shots, has had a complete physical and fortunately is heartworm negative. She will be stopping by weekly to weigh in but her main task is to gain weight and heal physically and emotionally. Thank you to everyone who has donated to Grace's recovery. You have made her life so wonderful and full of surprises and quality food.

I would like to thank everyone for the ongoing support for ACC Rescue. We could not assist all our dogs in need without your support. This ranges anywhere from fostering a dog, transportation, donations, adopting and support in all forms. Here's to "No Brown dog left behind!"

JUDGING
