

ACC Rescue has been working with several dogs these last few weeks. Our sweet Grace, who was taken from her home and her owner charged with neglect, has gained 23 pounds in her wonderful foster home in Missouri. She is now ready to find her forever home, and we are currently screening applicants. We placed a wonderful dog named Copper from Colorado. Copper was a bit out of control and his family surrendered him to an amazing trainer who worked to help Copper become socialized and acquire the manners needed for placement. Copper was adopted by a wonderful family in Virginia who made the long drive to Colorado to pick him up. He is thriving in his new home.

We assisted an owner in placing a young female who needed a family who could give her more attention and structure. She needed an only dog home as she was not aggressive, but would bully the older male dog in the home. The owner felt it wasn't fair to either dog, so a new home was found. Often, we will receive calls from owners who have a dog that they can't control or lack the time to the work with the dog so that it becomes socialized properly. Dogs, as a general guideline, need a minimum of two or more hours of dedicated social time with "their people" daily. This, of course, can be broken up into chunks of time over the course of the day, but people often forget the time commitment when adding a new member to their family. Getting a dog is a life-changing decision, and the amount of time and commitment can be overwhelming. In exchange for your time, love and attention, your dog will give you a lifetime of love and friendship.


We had a male and a female whose families were unable to keep them due to housing issues. This has been more of an issue over the past two years, as moves based upon a job change or a loss of job have not been uncommon. We work with the current owner to screen and find the right new home for their dog. The nice part about this type of placement is that the current owner can meet the new owners and often they will stay in contact with each other.

We just pulled a female named Sunshine out of a kill shelter in San Antonio, Texas. What is a "kill shelter?" A kill shelter is an animal shelter that accepts all animals regardless of age, health or behavior. While this might sound like a good practice, these shelters are often forced to euthanize

animals based on their duration of stay so they will have enough space available to accept all animals. Just because a dog is in good health and has a good temperament does not mean that they will not be euthanized to make room for the next animal.

Sunshine was surrendered by her owner. She was in poor physical condition and young, only around a year. An alert volunteer spotted her, and she was tagged (placed on hold) by ACC Rescue until we could plan for her to move into a foster home. This is exactly what happened to Sunshine. She has been placed in an amazing foster home and taken to the veterinarian for a complete physical. After a good bath, she received her vaccinations and has settled in with an amazing foster.

Sunshine loves to snuggle, run, and sleep on the couch. She has stolen everyone's heart. I am happy to report that she has an adoption pending and will be moving to Idaho to join an amazing young woman as she finishes school.



None of this would be possible without the support that we have from the ACC membership, volunteers and the ACC Charitable Trust. We have "Rescue Angels" who go above and beyond all the time whether it is supporting us financially or make the drive from Texas to California. You know who you are!



# Ask the Judge

## “I say potato and you say po-tah-to”

You are probably asking yourself what that old song has to do with Chesapeake Bay Retrievers, and especially how it relates to judging the breed. The answer is, “nuances”. Judging dogs is not just putting together puzzle pieces and awarding the best fitting finished picture. How often have you shown a dog and had the judge ask about color, or eye shape, or tail curl, or (glory be) topline! Judges who are not breeders learn the parts and pieces, but the nuances of the breed are difficult to understand and difficult to explain and teach.

I’ve watched and participated in judging for over 30 years. I know that observers do not see the same thing when viewing a dog. One person may be shown a picture or a live example of a CBR and rave about the beautiful shoulder angle and the outstanding reach on the side gait. Yet another person may see the same example having a shorter upper arm and the reach being an illusion of lifting from that. So...potato/po-tah-to.

Breeders have a much better grasp on the full picture of the breed. They know how differences in size and weight can skew the look but be equally correct. Breeders know the differences among a level topline, a slight rise to the rear or an exaggerated sway. A breeder knows the difference between a high tail set or low tail set and how the tail carriage is affected. As breeders, we know if a tail is carried too high above the back or curled too drastically to spoil the outline. Breeders know what a curly coat or long coat looks like and when it becomes a disqualification. We know when hair on the tail has longer strands due to shedding coat and we do not unwrap the tail hair and measure it. Doing so would show a misunderstanding of the intention of the standard.

I’m sure by now you are getting my drift. What do most other breeds have that Chesapeakes do not? Breeder Judges! At this point in time we have, I believe, six breeder judges. Are you aware that many breeds have *only* breeder judges officiating their specialties? They trust that whether potato or po-tah-to, the end awards will reflect the standard and the nuances of the breed and the quality being bred by their fellow fanciers.

I understand that some believe certain breeder judges will 1) put up dogs that go back to their breeding 2) put up dogs that look like what they have bred 3) put up their friends. I have exhibited to breeder judges, watched breeder judges, and judged my fellow breeders. I do not find the three prior points to be true, but keep in mind potato/po-tah-to, as to priorities each breeder holds most important in the breed.

The point of this rambling? We *need* Breeder Judges! Our dogs deserve to be judged to all aspects of the breed. You may be thinking, “I could never do this,” but you can. The AKC lists qualifications to be able to apply for the first breed. They are pretty basic and not hard to achieve. And recently, the AKC has proposed some changes to the application process that will benefit those who may be missing one requirement, but have other attributes. You do need to pass the online test on the breed - 25 questions, multiple choice, open book. The same is true for basic tests on anatomy and judging/ring procedure. You will also have an interview with an AKC representative (about 30 minutes) to discuss the breed - and who knows it better than you? After completing the process you will be given permit (also known as provisional) status and must judge the breed three times and be observed by three AKC reps. There are a number of ACC members who chair or select judges for their all breed clubs and would be happy to help with those initial assignments.

All of the specifics of the application process are given on the AKC website. It can’t hurt to read them. Don’t wait too long! You may just like it and want to apply for other breeds.

I am happy to offer my assistance to anyone interested in looking into becoming a breeder judge. I am sure my fellow breeder judges would do the same. Think about it...and get going!

# Ask the Judge

## Ask the Obedience and Rally Judge

Betsy Horn Humer has been active in the American Chesapeake Club for 57 years. She is an AKC conformation judge (sporting and herding groups) and has been judging AKC obedience since 1993 and AKC rally since 2005. We are fortunate to have someone in our club with such depth of knowledge. We asked her to talk about judging Beginner Novice and Novice obedience classes with a focus on identifying and preventing handler errors – those small mistakes that can make the difference between a high score, a qualifying score, or an NQ.



Here's some general advice for handlers at all levels:

Read the rule book and learn the requirements and regulations for your class. Make sure that your rule book is current; the rules change periodically and handlers need to keep up to date. Rules are posted on the AKC website (<https://images.akc.org/pdf/rulebooks/RO2999.pdf>) or you can purchase a copy from the AKC for \$13. Clubs can order copies of the rule book in bulk, which brings the cost down. Besides reading the chapter that pertains to the class you are entering, chapters one and two have a lot of useful information about ring procedure and key principles common to all the classes. Watch the teams in the ring before it's your turn. Since every team will be doing the same thing in the ring, if you watch you can learn the judge's heeling pattern and where each exercise starts and ends. That can be a big stress reliever! If you're first, the judge will always go over the pattern so you will know what to do before you enter the ring. Get your dog used to having someone follow behind them when heeling and on recalls – just like a judge would do in a trial. Some dogs are really bothered by the judge in the ring, so it's best to work this out in practice sessions. Where you show can make a difference! Some venues present more challenges than others. One ring trials, because they are often quieter, can be a game changer for some dogs.

Look at your score breakdowns after your class if finished. Check the math for accuracy! If you have questions about your score, you can ask the judge about them. Just wait until the judge has some extra time (between classes or after a class is over).

Practice in different places – not just the building where you have classes. Just because your dog does well at your training facility doesn't mean your dog will do well at a busy dog show. Dogs don't generalize locations very well, so it's important to take your show on the road! Get together with friends and train in each other's back yards or at a park or an empty tennis court. Some big box stores allow dogs and make great practice areas. Matches, though not as common

as in the past, are helpful, too. Seminars can be beneficial, whether you sign up as a participant or an auditor. You will always take away some useful ideas and find at least a couple of worthwhile drills or skills or different ways of approaching exercises. Additionally, many top trainers offer on line classes.

### Handler Errors in Beginner Novice Obedience

In general, I see fewer handler errors in Beginner Novice than in some of the other classes, so that's encouraging! Here are a few things I have noticed:

Praise

- You get to use a single word of praise or encouragement in the heeling, figure 8, and recall exercises in Beginner Novice, but most exhibitors do not take advantage of this. That word of praise can make a whole lot of difference in the quality of the performance and the dog's attitude in the ring.

Heeling

- There has to be a noticeable change of pace in heeling when you go from normal to fast or slow and then back to normal. I see a fair number of handlers who do not accentuate that change of pace – and that's scorable. It's a common error, and I see it across the board, in all obedience classes.

Sit for Exam and Sit Stay

- Both of these exercises usually do not carry a lot of handler errors. The most common error I see on the Sit Stay is that the handler doesn't make a complete circuit around the ring and instead cuts the walk short. I remind handlers to use the whole ring when I give the briefing before the class begins.

Recall

- Most exhibitors have been well-schooled in this exercise. The main errors that I see involve handlers not keeping their arms and hands at their side when calling the dog and using excessive body language to aid the dog (like bending at the waist when calling the dog to come).

### Handler Errors in Novice Obedience

Heeling

- Common handler errors in this exercise are tight leads and handlers adapting their pace to the dog. Additionally, I'm seeing quite a bit of hand movement on the Figure 8 portion of the heeling in this class. I'm talking about hand movement up and down the lead to assist the dog as the team heels around the cones. That's scorable, and I will take one to two points off for this error, depending on how much motion is occurring.

Stand for Exam

- Almost every time I judge this exercise, I see a handler who forgets that hands have to be off the dog before giving the stay command – their hands are still on the dog's collar or withers when telling the dog to stay. Sometimes the handler is not in heel position when they leave the dog. That also

counts against your score. Scoring has changed over the years on this exercise. It used to be, some 30 years ago, that any movement on the part of the dog was not permitted and would result in a non-qualifying score. Now some movement is permitted with just a minor penalty – one or two point deduction.



#### Heel Free

- In this exercise, most errors are caused by the dog, not the handler. That being said, most exhibitors do not take advantage of being able to use an extra command if the dog's heeling goes awry, or if they do take advantage of it, they do so too late in the heeling pattern. That extra command carries a penalty (three to five points), but using it right away rather than late in the heeling exercise can save the class and make the difference between a qualifying score and an NQ.

#### Recall

- Just like in Beginner Novice, it's common to see that the exhibitor's arms and hands are not at their sides when they call the dog. Additionally, some handlers will give a double command on the finish (giving a verbal command along with a hand signal) and that's a three point error. I have also seen handlers moving their shoulders or turning their heads on the finish – and that's scorable.

#### Sit/Stay Get Your Leash

- It is common to see handlers forgetting to wait for the judge's

command to return to the dog after they have collected their leash – and that's true in both the A and B classes.

#### Group Exercises

- I have seen handlers failing to go the required full six foot distance from their dogs on the group exercises (sit and down stay). Additionally, there is supposed to be a bit of slack in the lead, and it is not supposed to touch the ground. Both those errors are minor faults.

#### Leaving the Ring

- Dogs are required to leave the ring properly at the end of their run and should not be pulling on the leash or out of control. Lack of control, even between or after exercises, should be scored.

### Which class to enter . . . A or B?

There's some confusion about A and B classes and which class to enter. Following is a guide:

- In all Rally and Obedience classes, the rules state that that for A classes, the handler must be the dog's owner or a member of the owner's household or immediate family.
- In all B classes, the handler can be the dog's owner or anyone else, and there are no restrictions on the handler's prior AKC obedience experience.

### ELIGIBILITY SPECIFIC TO OBEDIENCE CLASSES

#### Beginner Novice A

- Dog does not have any AKC obedience titles.
- Handler has never put an AKC obedience title on any dog.
- Once an AKC BN title is earned, the dog can continue to be entered in this class for 60 days. Afterwards,

the dog may continue in AKC

#### Beginner Novice B

- Dog can have an AKC Beginner Novice, Companion Dog or Preferred Companion Dog title – other AKC obedience titles are not permitted in this class.

#### Novice A

- Dog does not have an AKC CD title.
- Handler has never put an AKC Regular or Preferred Novice, Open, or Utility title on any dog.

#### Novice B

- Dog does not have any legs towards an AKC Open or Utility title.

#### Open A

- Dog has an AKC CD but does not have an AKC CDX title.
- Not open to handlers who have trained or exhibited a dog that has earned an AKC OTCH title.

#### Open B

- Dog has an AKC CD and may have an AKC CDX title.

#### Utility A

- Dog has an AKC CDX but does not have an AKC UD title.
- Not open to handlers who have trained or exhibited a dog that has earned an AKC OTCH title.

#### Utility B

- Dog has an AKC CDX and may have an AKC UD title.

### ELIGIBILITY SPECIFIC TO RALLY CLASSES

#### Novice A

- Both the handler and the dog have never earned any AKC obedience or rally titles prior to the close of entries.
- After earning an AKC RN title, dogs can continue to compete in this class for 60 days.

#### Novice B

- Any dog can be entered in this class until an AKC RA title is earned.

#### Intermediate

- Dog has an AKC RN title, but has not earned a qualifying score in an AKC Rally Advanced class.

#### Advanced A

- Dog has an AKC RN title and may have an AKC RI title.
- Dog does not have an AKC RA title or any AKC obedience titles.
- After earning an AKC RA title, dogs can continue to compete in this class for 60 days.

#### Advanced B

- Dog has an AKC RN title and may have an AKC RI or RA title.

- Dog can continue to be entered in this class indefinitely.

#### **Excellent A**

- Dog has an AKC RA title, but not an AKC RE title or any AKC obedience titles.

- After earning an AKC RE title, dog can continue to compete in this class for 60 days.

#### **Excellent B**

- Dog has an AKC RA or RE title.
- Dog can continue to be entered in this class indefinitely.

#### **Master**

- Dog must have an AKC RE title.
- Dog can continue to be entered in this class indefinitely.

#### **TRANSFERS**

Made a mistake in your obedience or rally entry and put down an A class instead of B? You can transfer from an A class to a B class at the same level (i.e., from Rally Novice A to B) by submitting a written request to the show superintendent or secretary before the start of the trial.

## **Check Your Pockets Before You Go in the Ring**

### **A True Story**

Several years ago, a well-known handler was showing in Open. The routine went really well and toward the end of the class the handler brought the dog out to warm up for a possible runoff. Sure enough, the handler was called back into the ring for the runoff, but realized, after entering the ring and passing the lead to the ring steward, that the food used for the warmup was still in a pocket. When the handler told the judge about the bait, the judge said, "Well, you just lost the run-off, but you can do the heelin, anyway!" The handler ended up with a second place and never made that mistake again!

## SAR Dog Tribute - Passing of the Harness

Breeding Chesapeakes is very rewarding, but to me, what is the cream of the crop, is training one (or more) for Search & Rescue/Recovery work. Here in the Pacific Northwest, we have a vast outdoor world, and with that comes the dangers of recreating in them. When a person goes missing and family activates the local law enforcement, many are mandated by the state to provide search & rescue resources to try to locate their missing person. But sadly, they do not work on a missing person case long, if lost in nature.

In SAR (Search & Rescue), the ultimate outcome is to find the person alive and well, but unfortunately that is not always the case, and then a recovery team is called in to search. Recovery teams work mass casualty like the Oso, WA, mudslide to the Twin Towers and the missing in National Forests often work closely with Law Enforcement.

Over my many years breeding Chesapeakes, I've shown all to their Championship as well as other performance events, but when all my dogs were finished Champions, I was wondering what else I could do. It was not until I talked to a Police Officer friend of mine, that he suggested training a cadaver dog. At the time there were no certified cadaver dogs in the Pacific Northwest.



I took on the task with Barry, who was my first dog certified in Forensic Cadaver (small trace evidence), Cadaver (finding the deceased), Trailing (following the scent of a live person) and Crime Scene Evidence (anything related to the crime). Barry was mostly taught from a book.



Barry excelled in it and loved working. He and I worked locally and out of state as a mutual aid on several cold cases. Then at age 13, Barry came down with Lymphoma. My heart was broken, but I had Truffle, another that I had bred started in cadaver as a relief dog for long searches. She and I had a great bond and I asked her to step up as the Primary Search dog and sent Barry over the rainbow bridge. Truffle did not disappoint, she provided recovery work for my Sheriff's Office and nationally as well, working cold cases and bringing the lost home. We worked several criminal cases, but at age 14, her body is starting to slow down. Another heartbreak. They just don't stay with us long enough. In 2017, Rose was born and I started imprinting her on cadaver scent. She caught on right away and loved working. She became Nationally certified and locally certified by two sheriffs' entities in cadaver work. When Truffle retired from SAR, she passed the harness on to Rose, her granddaughter. Rose has been in training for drowning victims as well as finding live persons and we hope to add those to her National Certification as well.

It is time consuming, but the love for helping to "find the lost" is our main goal. We do not charge families or Law Enforcement for our assistance .

Rose will likely be my last SAR K9, as I'm getting old and just can't seem to keep up with the physical demands of some of our search areas. Nothing is flat ground in a search area.

The Chesapeake is a versatile dog, excelling in all that I've asked them to do. I hope the newer people now working SAR K9's keeps up the Chessie tradition of service for others.

From the ACC Bylaws page 16-17, Section 7, Elections, B. Nominations, Subsections 2 and 3

“(2) Additional nominations of eligible members may be made by written petition addressed to the Secretary and postmarked on or, before August 1st, signed by five (5) percent of the current membership or 50 signatures, of members in good standing, whichever number is lower, and accompanied by the written acceptance of such additional nominee signifying his willingness to be a candidate. No person shall be a candidate for more than one position, and the additional nominations which are provided for herein may be made only from among those members who have not accepted a nomination of the Nominating Committee.

(3) If no valid additional nominations are received by the Secretary on or before August 1st, the Nominating Committee's slate shall be declared elected, and no balloting will be required. The new officers and directors will take office on October 1st.”

Finding time away from the field is hard, but over the years we have had a Champion - Master Hunter, and another Champion all-age qualified dog. I have been a member of the ACC Health Committee and served on numerous ACC Field Trial Specialty Committees. I am a member of the Mississippi Valley Retriever Club and the Missouri River Retriever Club. Since serving on the ACC Board of Directors

and as Vice President for the past year, I feel that through my association with other members, I have a better working knowledge of goals of the ACC. The ACC should be proud that it has dedicated members that are constantly striving to ensure the success of the Club and are committed to preserving Chesapeake Bay Retrievers as an all-purpose breed.

We have Master Hunter passes, and multiple field trial placements in our field work. Some of the proudest moments I've had is earning many of these ribbons, with dogs that I've both bred and trained myself. I've chaired ACC supported shows, and I've served as part of the ACC nominating committee in the past. Now I seek the office of treasurer for the American Chesapeake Club. - Regional Director for Maryland offering:
  - training/fun days
  - seminars
  - Info sessions at hunt tests
  - local events to educate the community about the breed and show our pride in our native Maryland dog
- Judged a WD/X/Q
- Judged Sweepstakes: Kennel Club of Philadelphia Supported Show and 2019 NSS
- Provided ringside mentoring at Supported Shows and National Show Specialties as an ACC approved Breed Mentor.

I have served for three years as a Director of the club and I am currently in my second year as Secretary. I focus on projects that document and preserve the history of our dogs and our club and that make that information available in a useful format for the Board, our members, and the public. Major projects include the club database and the new website. I'm excited about the potential for these projects to "tell the story" of our breed and our club. Less visible tasks include the work of modernizing the Board's use of technology in the ways we collect, archive, and access important club documents. I'm currently working on a project to begin use of cloud storage and collaboration tools to improve communication between the Board, Committees, and Project Leaders. Also, we are working to shift to video conferencing for meetings. **Todd Adams (AK) - Director** - I have sat on the Board for 1 year now as a Director for the ACC and have enjoyed the position. I would be honored to serve another year. About me: I made the move to Alaska in 1995 and my journey with Chesapeakes started shortly thereafter. I grew up in West Tennessee where waterfowl hunting was my favorite past time. Dogs, of course, came along with those pursuits and yes, I started with Labs. Life took me to Georgia, but the waterfowl hunting was too strong to avoid for long. We started hunting Arkansas every chance work would allow and eventually started guiding in flooded timber and rice fields. A friend of mine contacted Mary Howley of Candlewood kennels to help me get a "real dog" but I had to promise him I would never go to a field trial if my children were in school. Apparently, Don Strait knew my personality better than me. I brought that dog with me to Alaska when he was 8, he was well trained and did everything I ever ask of him but you could tell from his age, the cold water here affected him. That was the primary driver for me getting involved with Chesapeake Bay Retrievers. I bought my first Chesapeake in 1999, and my education began. I got involved with hunt tests and entered a few Derbies with her. I was able to get her Senior title and passed

Master test before starting to see her dragging her back feet. A local vet in Fairbanks suspected Degenerative Myelopathy. At the time, no test was available that we were aware of. When we saw her life turn miserable, we had a necropsy ran and worked with the University of Pennsylvania to help with DNA testing for the disease.

I was still impressed with the abilities and aptitudes of the breed and continued trying to figure them out. I had successes in hunt test and minor field trial stakes over the years with different dogs and currently have 2 males competing in all-age stake field trials. I have them with a pro in the winter and bring them back to Alaska in the summer for our field trial season. Both of my competing males also have their conformation titles, and that is what I want to see the breed maintain as it moves forward. The breeding and training techniques have evolved over the years to include the athletes that can work and show.

**Laurea Griggs (GA) - Director** - I got my first Chesapeake in 1997 and have been in love with the breed ever since. I have trained, handled and competed with multiple dogs, to include multiple Bred-By Champions, Sporting Group wins and placements, NOHS Group wins & Best in Show. I compete in multiple disciplines- Conformation, Field Trials, Hunt Tests, Obedience, Rally and Agility- and I feel that my participation in a wide range of dog sports will help me understand and serve the needs of the Club and its members from many angles. I currently serve as a Director, Program Director for the Working Dog Program, and have served on that committee since 2013. Last year I Chaired the very successful 2021 Field Trial Specialty, chaired a Supported Entry in Georgia, and have been invited to judge Sweepstakes at other Supported Entry Shows. For many years, I have volunteered, helped organize and set up the ACC Meet the Breed Booth at Royal Canin in Orlando. My dogs and I have also volunteered with the AKC Canine Ambassador Program, taking AKC sports into schools and educating young people about dog sports. I volunteer with my local 4-H Club's Dog Show and Dog Obedience programs. I have participated in Breed Rescue since 2011, having fostered, transported, pulled dogs from shelters and helped with rehabilitation. In addition to ACC membership since 2011, I am an active member of the Newnan Kennel Club, Old South HRC Club and Fall Line Retriever Club. For many years I rode, bred and showed horses, and was involved with multiple regional and national organizations in that field, as well as being a licensed Sporthorse judge.

**Carolyn Johnson (FL) - Director** - I am proud to continue on the Board as a Director for the American Chesapeake Club. I assist the Board with Public Relations/Education and ACC Rescue. All types of animals have been a part of my life since I can remember, including dogs, cats, birds, and various reptiles and amphibians. I grew up in New Jersey, and while enrolled in college, I worked

for a veterinarian as a surgical assistant and worked at a 75-run boarding/grooming/training kennel. I moved to Vermont in 1983, where I worked with Veterinarians specializing in large animal, small animal, avian and wildlife.

Later, with my husband George, we owned and operated a boarding/grooming/training kennel in Vermont that he built from the ground up. In 1994, we moved to Florida with our 9 dogs, 4 cats and 2 birds. In 1997, we launched our Limited Service Veterinary Business, employing over 150 people, and numerous veterinarians, both full and part time. I ran operations and employee training as well as several other tasks. I have started several small businesses of my own, including boarding, training, pet retail, pet sitting, grooming, and pet product representation. I am currently employed with Fromm Family Pet Foods as the Territory Manager for the Southeast US managing three states. We researched, met, and fell in love with Chesapeakes. We decided in 2005, to add our first Chesapeake to our family and named her Jersey Girl aka Ch. Silverbar's I'm a Jersey Girl, sadly we lost her in September 2018.

We have had three litters, and now have 7 Chesapeakes. We have titled our dogs in the BBE class including BOB wins and Group Placements. I have handled and titled through Junior and Started Hunt tests. Our dogs are currently active and titled in Conformation, Hunt tests, Dock Diving and CGC. We are working on Rally and Agility. Memberships include ACC, MFSPDA and HRC. For the past several years, I have helped organize, set up and work the Meet The Breed Booth that was set up annually at the Royal Canin Show. Our booth won Best in Show in 2019, winning over all other breed booths!

Currently I am organizing the AKC Meet the Breeds booth tour 2022, around the US. We currently have 7 Chesapeakes, a Chihuahua, 2 cats, salt tank, koi pond and 5 tortoises.

**Adam Levy (MN) - Director** - I have been involved with Chesapeakes for 15 years and have been an ACC member for 10 years. 14 years ago, I fell in love with this breed when getting into duck hunting on the eastern shore of New York. I became obsessed with big water sea ducks and the Chesapeake is the only breed that could handle those harsh conditions. After going from a chocolate Lab to a Chesapeake, there was no turning back for me! I have bred, trained, handled, owned and shown many Chesapeakes to championships, wins and placements across multiple sports. We have titled many Master Hunter Chesapeakes along with breeding multiple Champion/ Master Hunters with Field Trial Placements. It is my pleasure to also call my titled and competition dogs, personal gun dogs during hunting season. Calling upon my diverse experiences from the show ring to the field, I believe this gives me a unique perspective to best serve the ACC and to represent and understand the membership needs.

I have served the club in many capacities, which include: Co-Chair of the 2012 Working Dog Stakes in San Antonio, TX, Chair of the Hunt Test Committee and served as a member for approximately 6 years, Chaired two very successful ACC Supported Shows, Served on the Adhoc Membership Committee, Co-Chair of the 2021 Field Trial Specialty in Americus, GA, Currently a Director

of the ACC, Current Board Liaison to the Hunt Test Committee, JBEC and Editorial Committees. Since 2012, in support of the Specialties, my dogs have attended 5 Field Trial Specialties and all National Show Specialties.

Before becoming involved with Chesapeakes, I worked in the corporate world, learning all I could about running a business and was responsible for teaching management processes to other franchisees. I would be happy to continue to bring this experience to the Board.

**George Makatura (NC) - Director** - I joined the ACC in 1994, and very soon after started volunteering my time to the club. My professional background was in software engineering, computer programming, and website development. One of my last projects before retiring was database development for the Federal Aviation Administration. I enjoy programming so much, that I have used these skills to further my interest in making tasks easier for other volunteers. The online membership renewal system that the club uses today, started over 10 years ago when I was a member of the Electronics Communications Committee. I implemented the use of PayPal to make dues renewal easier and less time consuming for the club and member. I did several other coding projects for the club, including litter/stud ads and breeders list. My own interest in the breed's history is what led me to developing code for the CBR breed database. With so much of the past locked away in hardcopy and digital files, there was nothing readily available to members. Enter, Gina Downin and myself. ### MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

A regular meeting of the board of directors of the AMERICAN CHESAPEAKE CLUB, a California Nonprofit public benefit corporation was called to order at 6:09 PM Eastern on January 31, 2022. The meeting was held by telephone conference call through which all persons participating in the meeting could hear and speak to one another.

The following officers and directors were present: President Tim Carrion, Vice President Marlene Drag, Secretary Gina Downin, Treasurer Margi Palmer, Director Todd Adams, Director Laurea Griggs, Director Carolyn Johnson, Director Adam Levy, and Director George Makatura. President Tim Carrion served as Chair and Secretary Gina Downin served as Secretary of the meeting.

#### 1. Approval of Minutes

Minutes from the December 29, 2021 Board Teleconference were approved via email vote. See Motion 22:04 under Report of the Secretary.

#### 2. Report of the President

President, Tim Carrion, welcomed all to the meeting.

#### 3. Report of the Secretary

The Secretary reports the following motions have been approved by unanimous written consent of the Directors, effective on the dates noted, and the consents will be filed with the minutes of this meeting.

- b. To appoint Heidi Henningson to the Bylaws Revision Ad-Hoc Committee. 22:02 (Tim Carrion, Gina Downin) Approved 01/04/2022
- c. To approve minutes for the November 9, 2021 Board Teleconference. 22:03 (Tim Carrion, George Makatura) Approved 01/04/2022
- d. To approve minutes for the December 29, 2021 Special Meeting of the Board. 22:04 (Tim Carrion, George Makatura) Approved 01/04/2022
- e. To accept the November and December 2021 new members. 22:05 (Gina Downin, Adam Levy) Approved 01/30/2022

#### 4. Report of the Treasurer

- As of December 31, 2021, there is \$39,450 in the regular operating account. We have \$213,269 in the savings account and \$56,941 in the various other accounts.
- We are currently showing year to date net income of \$13,833 but we still need a couple of year end reports so this will change but not a lot.
- The 2021 NSS generated a profit of about \$14,558 and in addition raised \$7,984 for ACC Rescue. Under the financial policy the committee is submitting the eighty percent of the profits to the club treasury and retaining the other twenty percent for local activities.
- The 2021 NFTS had a profit of about \$5,200 and in addition raised \$750.00 for the ACCCT Trust.
- The California All-Breed Field trial and Rescue West reports are in process.
- Membership renewals are still a little slow compared to last year. As of noon EST, we have 796 memberships renewed which represents 1,039 members. And 122 memberships (160 members) which have not renewed yet. For 2021 there were 79 memberships not renewing. We have sent the ACCCT \$11,678.00 for the donations received from members through the dues renewal process.

#### 5. Reports of Committees

##### · Standing Committees

i. AKC Delegate (Heidi Henningson) AKC is promoting the Political Action group to combat animal rights legislation. The AKC is asking Parent Clubs to name a Junior Coordinator. The AKC will disseminate information to that contact. AKC approved that Parent Clubs can hold two single breeds hunt tests and those hunt tests do not need to be associated with a National Specialty. AKC approved that at hunt tests, handlers may put their birds in a bucket as opposed to handing them to the judges.

ii. Companion/Performance Events Committee (Carolyn Johnson) AKC Changes to COVID provision related to Obedience and Rally.

1. Effective December 31, 2021, the following regulations implemented to accommodate Covid restrictions will be terminated.

a. Obedience - the modified distance of 8 feet between dogs in Novice Obedience group exercises will return to a distance of 6 feet.

2. The following regulations will be extended through Thursday, June 30, 2022

a. Obedience/Rally/Agility - the Board extended the temporary modification for obedience, rally and agility lower-level classes and will allow titles to be earned under a single judge.

b. Obedience/Rally/Agility - The waiver of date and mileage restrictions of 30 days and 100 miles for Obed/Rally Judges and 200 miles for Agility Judges has been extended, allowing them to accept assignments without conflict through June 30, 2022

c. Obedience/Rally - the AKC Board extended the temporary modification for obedience and rally trials and will allow judges to judge the same class at more than two trials over the course of a cluster event.

iii. Field Trial Committee (Todd Adams) - The ACC FTC met by zoom on 1/24 9:00 PM EST to discuss 3 issues sent to us from the President and ACC members. Attendance Briedi Gillespie, Marlene Drag, Scott Bergman, Todd Adams and Tim Fenstermacher.

1. There was a discussion about the ACC position on Qualification for the National Open. At this time the FTC recommends that the ACC board support by vote no change to the yearly qualification rule.

2. The committee then discussed a proposal from a member for a FT to only include the following breeds: Golden Retrievers, Flat Coated Retrievers, and Chesapeake Bay Retrievers. This event would not be open to Labradors and would be held in NY either in the spring or fall. After much discussion a vote was taken with 4 against and 1 for having the event.

3. The third Proposal was to partner with the Labrador Club of Maryland to have an ACC FT every other year on the same date one year sponsored by the ACC and the next by the Labrador Club. This would be an Amateur/Qualifying/Derby only with no Open. This event is held by lab club every other year but due to AKC rules it cannot be done 2 years in a row by the same club. Discussion ranged from the effects on the ACC all breed trial and to the FTS. This discussion was carried over to a meeting to be scheduled as soon as there are answers to the committees' questions.

4. A fourth issue was brought up by Briedi Gillespie about the number of judges for the FTS. This was discussed. It is the general opinion that there should be at least 3 sets of judges.

iv. Health Committee (Marlene Drag) The Health committee has been approached to offer a health seminar for the 2022 NSS.

v. Hunt Test Committee (Adam Levy) - The committee has approved an application for a Chesapeake Only HT to be held in conjunction with the 2022 NSS in Michigan.

vi. Judge and Breeder Education (Adam Levy)

1. JBEC working on more articles for breeders education for the website.

2. Annual letter will be sent to all ACC mentors (25) asking if they wish to continue, have they done any mentoring in the last year and will they be available and attending the 2022 National Specialty Show in Midland, MI, Sept. 29th-Oct 1st in order to ringside mentor at that time.
